

Class History

As we turn the pages of our Salem Scrapbook, the many souvenirs bring back cherished memories of all the wonderful things we have done during the past four years. From these remembrances, we weave the story of the class of 1950, which began with the letters received before we arrived and now ends with our graduation diplomas.

Opening the Scrapbook, we recall that September day in the fall of 1946 when sixteen scared Freshmen entered the portals of Salem Academy far the first time. With a feeling of importance at our first class meeting, we elected Aurelia Gray, President; Mary Kathryn Burton, Vice-President; Jean Borders, Secretary; and Ann Kester, Treasurer. With the help of Miss Bibb, our sponsor, we freshmen at once made plans for activities to show the rest of Salem that we were not an ordinary class. Our enthusiasm and ideas resulted in the Freshman Carnival, our main project for the year. The feature attraction was two blind dates awarded as prizes for two lucky girls. During a Chapel program, we presented a skit in pantomime entitled "Pokeyhuntus." At the end of the year, a farewell party to the Seniors was given in the form of a marshmallow roast. We gave an electric clock for the library, and money was donated to the World Student Service Fund.

Turning the pages, we find reminders of the many activities during our years as Sophomores. Under the leadership of our President, Caroline Van Zandt; Vice-President, Mary Kathryn Burton; Secretary, Sis Roddy; and Treasurer, Clara Ashe, we gave a spaghetti supper in the form of the "Copabanana Night Club." A floor show of song and dance was the highlight of the evening. Guided by Miss Rice, our faculty advisor, we sophomores sold fudge on the halls and brought back laundry from across campus. Since all of us had been thrilled with the fascinating movie, "Gone With the Wind," we gave its book form to the library during Book Week. In the spring, on the afternoon of Junior-Senior, the social room, decorated with colorful, fresh flowers and Spanish moss, and filled with soft strains of music coming from the orchestra on the stage, was the scene of the Sophomore Tea Dance. A dozen red roses were presented to the queen of the beauty contest which we had conducted for the past two weeks. Our gift to the school was money with which to start a Modern Book Fund. A sum was olso contributed to the World Student Service Fund.

Much of the Scrapbook is filled with the events of our junior year. Everything led up to the all-important Junior-Senior. As officers, Bettie Allison was chosen to be our class President; Jean Borders, Vice-President; Anne Covington, Secretary; and Teena Greer, Treasurer. Our sponsor, Miss Gueth, helped us to present a fashian show before Christmas at which timely holiday clothes were modeled from Montaldo's. In February, a card party was given in the social room and prizes were awarded. Again, we held a fashion show—this time in the spring with clothes from Snead and Craven. To supplement these projects, coffee and doughnuts were sold on Sunday mornings to sleepy-heads; cake from the local bakeries was taken around on the halls, and refreshments at the various school activities were sold. On April 30, after many weeks of preparation, sixty Juniors and Seniors danced in the gym to the strains of "Midnight Masquerade." A gaily decorated mask, the color of her dress, was given as a favor to each senior. With the money that remained, a contributian was given to the World Student Service Fund, and electric clocks were bought for the classrooms.

The last portion of the Scrapbook bulges with the many favors, clippings, and other souvenirs we have collected during our senior year. Jean Borders, having been elected as our President the preceding spring, served with the other new officers: Aurelia Gray, Vice-President; Barbara Zeigler, Secretary; and Ann Williams, Treasurer. At the Birthday Banquet, at the first of school, we each cut a slice of cake and realized that this would be the last year to sing "Standing at the Portals." Friday, October 14, was Senior Day, and we thoroughly enjoyed taking over the jobs and the privileges of the faculty. The most exciting event of the fall was the Senior Ring Banquet, at which, much to everyone's surprise, we received the long awaited class rings. With the Christmas spirit in December, came the senior bazaar, where Christmas gifts are sold from the leading Winston-Salem stores. Also, at Christmastime, orders for Moravian cookies were taken. On the morning of the last day of school before Christmas, the seniors went caroling through the building. Again, the Junior-Senior was a highspot of the year, but this time, the halfcentury class promenaded in the "lead-out" to the tune of "A Pretty Girl is Like a Melody." Last minute cramming is over; exams have been completed with many a sigh and a groan; our names have been entered in the Senior Farewell Book at the Quill Pen Banquet; and graduation is now at hand. As we close our Scrapbook, we know it is a living reminder of the joyous days we have spent at Salem. Grateful thanks go to our faculty advisor, Miss Mary Moran, who has helped to make this year a great success. With mixed emotions, of joy and sorrow, we leave behind these happy days here at Salem to begin another Scrapbook af the years to come.






