

You have filled our hours and days at Salem With loving care and devotion, certainly true; For these and other innumerable contributions,



HONOR GRADUATES






Seated: Hall, Gilliam, Shannon, Potter. Standing: Kidd, McKenzie, Halsey, Rogers.
