## Senior School Of Nursing Director's Message

Nursing as a profession has become a vital force in society in attempting to meet the health needs of man. Health and medical agencies are in a period of rapid expansion. Although more people are now engaged in nursing than in any of the other groups of health professions, the demand for additional professional nurses far exceeds the supply.

The enlarging scope of nursing and the increasing complexity of the nurse's role have changed patterns of nursing service; thus, the basic preparation of the nursing student has undergone some important changes. Collegiate education for nurses is one of the most notable changes which evolved to meet the challenge of our present health needs. In the collegiate pro-

gram for nurses the curriculum includes general education courses which are selected to give the student the background she needs to understand herself and her patient, to understand more fully the scientific facts underlying her work, and to work cooperatively with others in solving health and related problems. Nursing education in a college setting gives the nursing student an opportunity to attend classes with students of other programs and to share in all college activities. The opportunities the student has for gaining insight into human relationships are rich and varied. All these help to prepare the student for a profession which is rich in associations with people and in personal satisfaction which comes from serving others.




