We are thankful to God who in all of his omnipotence has directed our steps to the majestic heights of Parnassus.



ARTICLE 26–1. Everyone has the right to education. Education shall be free, at least in the elementary and fundamental stages. Elementary education shall be compulsory. Technical and professional education shall be made generally available and higher education shall be equally accessible to all on the basis of merit.

2. Education shall be directed to the full development of the human personality and the strengthening of respect for human rights and fundamental freedoms. It shall promote understanding, Tolerance and friendship among all nations, racial or religious groups, and shall further the activities of the United Nations for the maintenance of peace.

Coach Ross is a resident of Newark, N. J., and a graduate of Baldwin-Wállace College. He made a name for himself by winning the Pentathalon Championship in 1943 and 44. Since joining the staff in 1954, he has piloted the "Rams" to a national track power. Under his able tutelage, the potential abilities of Elias Gilbert, world title holder in 220 low hurdles and Fran Washington, holder of 3 American collegiate records, have been realized. 
