


Dearest Parents,







The time has come to be thankful To our parents, friends, and teachers all; They gave their talent and patience abundant As we walked down these well trodden halls.


The time has come to be happy; Our knowledge will always shine bright. Twelve years we have all toiled together To beam at the world like a light.
