HISTORY OF THE CLASS OF 1978

The graduating class of 1978 has seen many changes take place here at WSSU since our initial enrollment in 1974. First and foremost our gargantuan class size was itself a change agent. In fact, our Ireshman class was the largest class ever to enter WSSU. Just like the elephant being able to sleep anywhere it wants, it was so during our first days as fledging Rams and Ewes, all 900 strong. We caused the old dorms to reach way, way back for some of that old, old time religion as they moaned, groaned, and creaked under our weight. The realization that we were change agents occurred when three students were assigned to each dormitory room instead of the usual two. Secondly, Bickett Hall, which had formerly been a male dormitory, was changed to a female dormitory. And finally. Third Street Dormitory was set up to eliminate some of the overcrowding in Brown Hall.

In looking back over the past four years, another change agent not only existed in our midst, but it actually blossomed and flowered. It was none other than the heterogeneity of our class. This heterogeneity, a part of a nationwide awareness, manifest itself in the composition of our student body. As a microcosm of the larger society, we, too, were beginning to recognize the right of all people to fully participate in the pursuit of the American dream through a college education. As a result of this new awareness, our student body ages ranged from the late teens to the sixties, from the well-endowed to the handicapped, and from being a predominantly black institution to representing the four corners of the world.

A special word must be said where our handicapped students are concerned. Our being together the past four years has proven to be a most beneficial relationship. We have learned much from each other and, as a result, each of us is more aware of the richness and the diversity in the family of man. Many meaningful and provocative exchanges have transpired among us, whether we debated in Coltrane Hall or in the warm spring sun in front of Blair Hall.

A third area where the freshmen class of 1974 was to again be conduit for change was in the area of academics. Ours was the first class to have a large choice of major fields with the addition of the Urban Affairs major in the Social Science Department and the new emphasis placed on Business as a major field of study.

Our years also saw the fall of rigid dormitory rules and the word "visitation" became "THE WORD" during our sophomore and junior years. The articulate defenders of the right of adults to visit adults at any time and in any place were energetic and aggressive. They made mockery of the naiveté of campus authorities who still thought immorality could occur only in dormitories after dark. They argued that an undergraduate could commit all the immoral acts there are before the curfew deadline.

Near the end of the second semester of 1974, our class witnessed the opening and dedications erve of the Kenneth R. Williams Auditorium. Since then, our class has seen several other new buildings added to the distinctive WSSU skyline. These buildings include the new maintenance building, a new girl's dormitory, and finally but not least, the new gym, dedicated to the one and only, Clarence "Bighouse" Gaines. For the record, Coach Gaines won his 600th basketball game on December 31, 1977.

WSSU continued to enhance its academic programs during the 1975-1976 school year. The Education Department further strengthened its curriculum. Several new courses were added in Special Education. Students involved in reading education went to Public schools to assist students who had reading deficiencies.

Extra-curricular activities as far as sports are concerned were a little disappointing during the 1975-1976 school year. The Ram football team won only one game the entire season, but the basketball team lifted a student's morale by winning first place in the CIAA Southern Division.

The 1976-1977 school year was a year full of turmoil, directed primarily toward student activities. We wanted more input in this vital area of student life. However, all was not code red in 1976-1977. The bounce of the basketball provided us with more heart-rendering excitement. The Ram basketball team brought home the CIAA Championship title for the eighth time. We were also thrilled to be a part of a student body with an athletic program that afforded females an opportunity to excel.

The spring of our junior year was full of the air of anticipation. Students, faculty, and staff pondered and wondered who would be the chief administrator upon the retirement of Chancellor Kenneth R. Williams. Shortly before the end of the school year, the question of the year was answered when the Search Committee announced that Dr. H. Douglas Covington would be the new Chancellor for WSSU. He is the 6th in WSSU's history.

There are many memories that we have acquired over the past four years while attending WSSU. Dur last year at Winston-Salem State University was by far the best since we have the rare experience of being senior.

After several years of being in limbo, the Greek letter organizations found themselves. Brutality and old "frat" hubris had led to their being suspended. We are proud to say that they no longer direct the bulk of their energies toward a torturous road for the pledges. Instead, they direct the bulk of their energies toward the lofty ideals for which they were first founded. The Greek letter organizations have become more service oriented, emphasizing community consciousness and community involvement.

Ouring our four wonderful years, we have witnessed the influx of social fraternities with their wonderfully unique names and insignias. All of them march, all of them sing and all of them proudly wear their colors.

Lest we forget, we also witnessed the exodus of monoliths and boulders in various departments. Their names read like a who's who: Dr. Charlie B. Hauser, Wilma Lassiter, Cora Massey, Louise Gather, Carrie Robinson and Leon Brown. At the apex of these monoliths and boulders stood the one and only, Ruth Greene, the last of a species. We loved all of you madly. As Seniors, the Class of 1978 entered the campus of WSSU anticipating a year filled with laughter, togetherness and love. By no means did we have time



The mighty marching Rams ruled the day as they blew South Carolina State "away". Apart from the athletics, the stellar academicans among us were quietly but steadily gathering honors in their respective areas of concentration. Although

By noting a few facts and fancies it may, however, evoke in each reader a personal set of reflections and thus provide a permanent portable chunk of WSSU to which all of us, smothered by future "getting and spending," may repair at leisure to relive those days of joy and sorrow beneath the banners and emblems of our alma mater.

A TRIBUTE TO DR. JOSEPH N. PATTERSON By Dr. Howard Thurman

The time and the place of a man's life is the time and the place of his body. But the significance of his life is as far reaching as his dedication, his commitment, and his sense of purpose can make it. It is a special privilege for me to share in the celebration of the life of our friend, Dr. Patterson, and to mark his leave-taking from our midst. There are those present on this occasion who knew him far more intimately and longer than I did; who came directly under his influence as a teacher, guide, and friend; or who shared ties of blood and affection. Memories of him sit side by side with you as you remember other days, other places, and other times. I dare not intrude where lights of passage do not give me leave.

Two years ago it was my enrichment to have worked with him in an intensive seminar, to share the hospitality of our home for five days. It was here that the vast stretches of his mind and spirit became available to us all as he shared insights from his treasures of scholarship and seeking. We were all warmed by the fires of his learning and his erudition. But this is not the secret of the man; rather was that to be found in the warmth of his heart, his spiritual dedication, the contagion of his leaghter and the furrow in his brow, announcing the revealing of a rare and significant insight. His love of life readied him for the launching of his spirit into the eternal.

In the closing pages of Pilgrim's Progress, Bunyan describes the Land of Beulah in which the pilgrims enjoy a brief period of rest after the hardships of their pilgrimage and wait for the summons to enter the Celestial City. After this, says Bunyan, "I beheld until they were come into the Land of Beulah, where the Sun shineth Night and Day. Here, because they were weary, they betook themselves a while to rest. And because this Country was common for Pilgrims, and because the Orchards and Vineyards that were here belonged to the King of the Celestial Country, therefore, they were licensed to make bold with any of his things. But a little while soon refreshed them" and they were on their way: "Then the Pilgrims got up and walked to and fro; but how were their Ears now filled with Heavenly Noises, and their eyes delighted with Celestial Visions! In this place there was a Record kept of the names of them that had been Pilgrims of old, and a History of all the famous Acts that they had done. After this it was noised abroad that Mr. Valiant-for-truth was taken with a Summons by the same Post as the other, and had this for a Token with a Summons by the same Post as the other, and had this for a Token that the Summons was true, That his Pitcher was broken at the Fountain. When he understood it, he called for his Friends, and told them of it. Then said he, I am going to my Fathers, and tho' with great difficulty I am got hither, yet now I do not repent me of all the Trouble I have been at to arrive where I am. My Sword I give to him that shall succeed me in my Pilgrimage, and my Courage and Skill to him that can get it. My Marks and Scars I carry with me, to be a witness for me that I have fought his Battles who now will be my Rewarder. When the day that he must go hence was come, many accompanied him to the Riverside, into which as he went he said, Death, where is thy Sting? And as he went down deeper he said, Grave where is thy Victory? So he passed over, and all the Trumpets sounded for him on the other side. But glorious it was to see how the open Region was filled with Horses and Chariots, with trumpeters and Pipers, with Singers and Players on stringed Instruments to welcome the Pilgrims as they went up, and followed one another in at the beautiful Gate of the City.

Our Alumni Association At Work

Since 1936 the Alumni Association has played an important role in the University's history and growth. In every undertaking of the institution, graduates have joined forces to make its influence felt throughout the nation. Today as the university faces a more demanding future, the WSSU Alumni Association stands ready and able to continue its colorful heritage for this great institution.







ATKINS HALL, Dormitory for Sophomore Women, built in 1915 — Named for Simon Green Atkins, tounder and first president of Slater Industnal School, an institution which later became Winston-Salem State University

BICKETT HALL, Dormitory for Women, built in 1921 — Named for Thomas W. Bickett who served as Governor of North Carolina from

1917 to 1921.

BLAIR HALL, Administration Building, built in 1940 — Named for W. A. Blair, President of Peoples National Bank and a member of the first Board of Trustees of Winston-Salem State University

BRDWN HALL, Dormitory for Men, built in 1965 — Named for Thomas J. Brown who served Winston-Salem State University from 1911 to 1961 in a variety of capacrites, including Chairman of the Social Science Department, Purchasing agent, Director of Extension and Postmaster.

CDLSON HALL, Dormitory for Freshman Women, built in 1921 as an Annex to Atkins Hall with the connecting link sealed off in 1945 — Named for Mrs. Kate D. Colson the first Matron of Atkins Hall who also served in the capacity of Dean of Women.



COLTRANE HALL, Classroom Building, built in 1967 — Named for David S. Coltrane who served as Assistant Director of the Budget for the State of North Carolina and as Chairman of the North Carolina Good Neighbor Council.

DILLARD HALL, Dormitory for Senior Women, built in 1971 — Named for Nicholas Dillard who served as Public School Principal in Caswell County for 38 years and as a member of the Board of Trustees of Winston-Salem State University





ELLER HALL, Classroom Building housing the Department of Business, built in 1940 — Named for A. H. Eller, Trust Officer of Wachovia Bank and Trust Company and a member of the first Board of Trustees of Winston-Salem State University.

HILL HALL, Classroom Building housing the Departments of Science and Mathematics, built in 1965 — Named for James S. Hill a Black Banker and Edücator who traveled for eight years at his own expense to raise money to support Slater Industrial School which later became Winston-Salem State University.



People Change . . .



KENNEDY HALL, Food Service Building, built in 1938 — Named for Francis M. Kennedy, a teacher at Slater Industrial School who served as Interim President of the institution while Simon Green Atkins, the president, took a leave to serve as Secretary of Education for the AME Zion Church.

MDORE HALL, Dormitory for Women, built in 1962 — Named for C. Beatrice Moore who served as assistant Director of Atkins Hall for six years and as University Dietitian from 1933 to 1963.





NURSING BUILDING, houses the School of Nursing, built in 1955.

C. G. O'KELLY LIBRARY, the University Library, built in 1967 and enlarged in 1971 — Named for C. G. O'Kelly, a teacher at Slater who served as Interim President of the institution in 1913 while Simon Green Atkins, the president, was on leave to serve as Secretary of Education for the AME Zion Church.







PRESIDENT'S HOUSE, home of the University President, built in 1924.

ALUMNI AND PUBLIC RELATIONS BUILDING, — built in 1918 as the Home Economics and Practical Arts Building, renovated in 1945 and named the Alumni and Public Relations Building.

PEGRAM HALL, Dormitory for Women, built in 1940 — Named for Oleona Pegram Atkins, the wife of Simon Green Atkins, Founder and first President of Winston-Salem State University

WHITAKER GYMNASIUM, University Gymnasium, built in 1953 — Named for John C. Whitaker of Reynolds Tobacco Company who was the first Vice Chairman and later the Chairman of the Board of Trustees of Winston-Salem State University. This facility has been incorporated into the C. E. Gaines Athletic Complex now under construction.







His name is Henry Taylor, but he is internationally known as "Buddy". Buddy is the athletic trainer of WSSU. A native of Richmond, Virginia, Buddy began his career as a trainer with a semi-pro football team, the Richmond Rams in 1948. He was next associated with the Richmond Rebels from 1949 to 1950.

Buddy expanded his athletic training expertise during his stint in the military.

Entering the Army in 1951, he served as Post Athletic Trainer until 1953 at Fort Campbell. Upon receiving his honorable discharge, Buddy entered the Chicago College of Swedish Massage. Though accumulating much practical experience, Buddy still wanted to realize one of his life-long goals: to be the proud receipent of a college degree. In 1953, he entered Morgan State University in Baltimore, Maryland where he received his B.S. in Health and Physical

Education. He furthered his formal training at Indiana University where he received the Masters Degree in Professional Athletic Training in 1958.

Armed with two degrees and ample demonstrated skills, Buddy accepted the position of Head Trainer at Virginia Union University. He served in this capacity from 1958 to 1961. In 1961 he moved to Tennessee State University in Nashville. There he had the

opportunity to work with many future Olympic Gold Medal Winners in Track and Field, namely Ralph Boston, Wilma Rudolph, Edith McGuire, Madaline Manning and Wyomia Tyus. His experiences at Tennessee State University thrust Buddy into the national and international spotlight. He is highly regarded and respected by his peers.

His rise to international recognition began in 1967, when he was the American emissary

serving as trainer for the United States teams at the "Little Olympics" in Mexico City, Mexico. He served in the same capacity in 1968 at the Olympic Games in Mexico City and again at the 1972 Olympic Games in Munich, Germany. He also served as trainer for the Maccabiah Games in Tel Aviv, Israel and again in 1973. In 1974 Buddy joined the faculty of WSSU in the position of athletic trainer. Additionally, Buddy is co-author of a very fine and widely used book

entitled: Training and Conditioning of Athletes: Manual for Trainers and Physicians, (published in 1970)

WSSU is indeed fortunate to have a gentleman of Buddy Taylor's stature on its faculty.

Buddy is married to the former Mildred Thomas and has two children, Monty 15 and Rodney 9.
