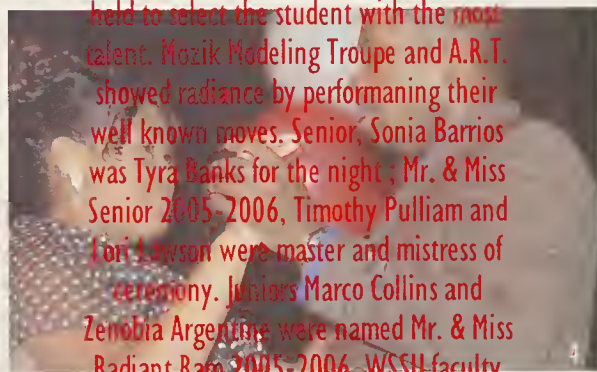

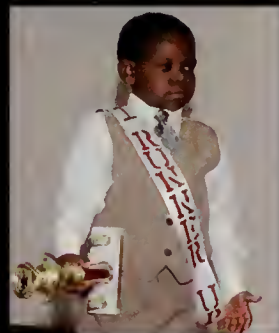

# Statue Unveiling and Pedestrian Mall Dedication



Caroline Heath King, a native of Winston-Salem and an internationally-known sculptor, was on hand for the unveiling of her work of art – the statue of Dr. Simon Green Atkins. Ms. King has been commissioned to create more than 300 pieces, some of which are located in sites in Winston-Salem such as Allegory Credit Union and Wake Forest University School of Medicine's Bowman Gray Plaza.

The mall has created a pedestrian-friendly campus and is also home to a four-faced clock tower, which includes inspirational quotes from Dr. Simon G. Atkins, Dr. Benjamin L. Mayo, Dr. Mayo Angelou, and Dr. Harold L. Martin, Sr.

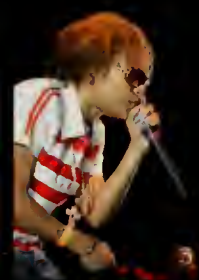
# HOMEcoming CONCERT FEATURING BABY SHARM (WSSU)

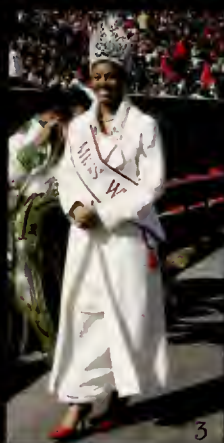

# Fall Commencement

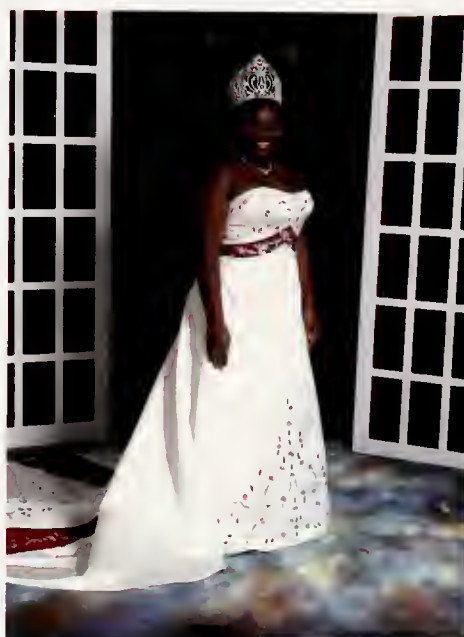

Lieutenant in the United States Army and has been assigned to the Army Nurse Corps.

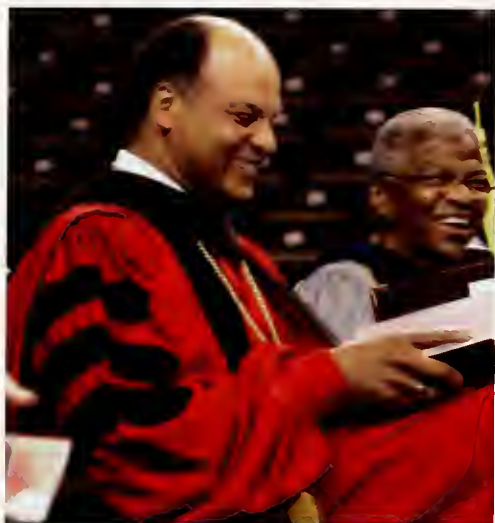

# Iota Phi Theta Fraternity, Inc.



Iota Phi Theta was founded on September 19, 1963 at Morgan State University in Baltimore, Maryland and was the last fraternity in the Divine Nine to be established. 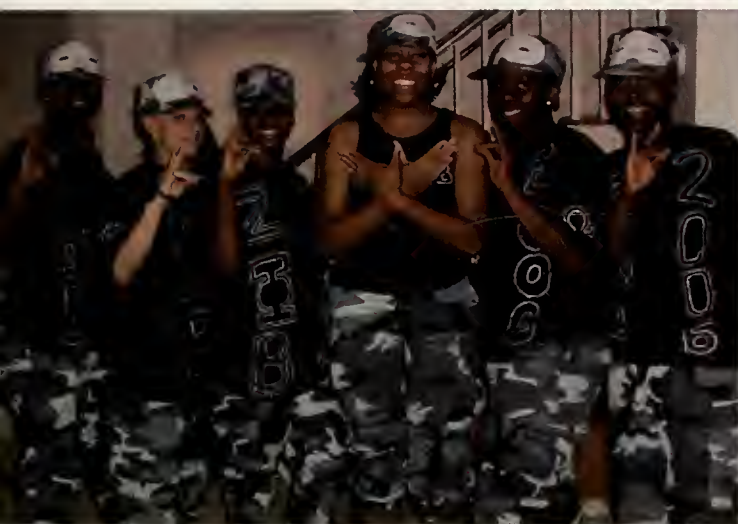
