







Farewell



Chancellor Harold L. Martin, Sr. Dr. Harold L. Martin, a Winston-Salem native, guided Winston-Salem State University through a critical time of change and transition. Under his leadership, enrollment doubled between 2000-2006, making WSSU the fastest growing institution in the University of North Carolina system for three consecutive years.

Reflecting his steady and resourceful guidance, WSSU has been ranked #1 among the Top Southern Public Comprehensive Colleges by U.S. News and World Report for five consecutive years. Dr. Martin distinguished himself as a top-notch academic administrator, researcher and scholar.

Dr. Martin also led WSSU's reclassification from a Baccalaureate I to a Master's II institution, which created a School of Graduate Studies and Research. In addition, seven master's degree programs were implemented along with stronger working relationships with internal and external constituencies. Major initiatives were launched to strengthen academic quality, which resulted in higher enrollment and graduation rates.

Dr. Martin earned Bachelor of Science and Master of Science degrees in Electrical Engineering from North Carolina A&T State University, and a Doctorate degree from Virginia Polytechnic Institute and State University.

In July 2006, Dr. Martin concluded his tenure as Chancellor of Winston-Salem State University and moved to the University of North Carolina General Administration office in Chapel Hill to take the helm as Senior Vice President for Academic Affairs.









One Hundred-Fourteenth Founder's Day Convocation




Simon G. Atkins, WSSU founder, served as president of the university from 1892-1904.

Winston-Salem State University was founded as Slater Industrial Academy on September 28, 1982. It began in a one room frame structure with 25 pupils and one teacher.

Since its beginning, WSSU has grown to more than 30 buildings and 5500+ students.

Foundation Heights New Dormitory Groundbreaking

Winston-Salem State University broke ground on a new \$18.7 million-dollar residence facility, which will honor the substantial commitment of the WSSU Foundation.

The new 114, 000 square-foot, 316-bed living and learning environment will include several eight-person occupancy mega suites for academic interest groups. Each suite and apartment is designed with a living room, full-sized kitchen and access to a community computer lab, fitness center and laundry room.

The new co-ed dormitory will be located between Brown Hall and the C.E. Gaines Center.

Foundation Heights is projected to open in the fall of 2007.







Dr. Martin Luther King, Jr. Celebration January 15, 2007

At 7:00 p.m., guests of all ages attended the Seventh Annual MLK ceremony held in Dillard Auditorium to celebrate a man of great achievements, Dr. Martin Luther King, Jr. The keynote speaker of the evening was Ms. Myrlie Evers-Williams, a civil rights activist and former chairperson of the NAACP.

Spring Commencement 2007

Held May 5th 2007, the 115th Spring Commencement was held at Lawrence Joel Veterans Memorial Coliseum at 9.45 am. Over 54 percent of the 2007 graduates received baccalaureate and master's degrees in the sciences, math, and other technical fields. More than half of WSSU's Class of 2007 were classified as non-traditional students, a trend that continues to grow among colleges and universities across the country.

The highest GPA obtained in the class came from Darien Davis of Charlotte, NC, who graduated with a Bachelor of Science degree in Finance and Economics with a 4.0 GPA. More than 180 students will graduate with Latin honors, having maintained cumulative grade point averages ranging from 3.0 to 4.0.




Structures, from a simple sitting area to a skyscraper, provide insight into the culture and history of the people who created or used them. President Thomas Jefferson once said, "Architecture is my delight, and putting

up and pulling down is one of my favorite amusements." The campus of Winston-Salem State University is evidence of this kind of "putting up and pulling down" process, as it has undergone many


changes since beginning as a one-room schoolhouse in 1892. This evolution provides a glimpse into the history, not only of Winston-Salem State University, but also of American higher education and the legacy of African-Americans.









Since 2004 when the clock tower was constructed, it remains the focal point of the University. It contains quotes from Chancellor Harold L. Martin, school founder Simon Green Atkins, African-American educator Benjamin E. Mays, and celebrated author Maya Angelou on each side.



Pedicated to Dr. Simon Green Atkins in 1936, the two arches are located between the Hauser Building and Hill Hall, and served as the gateway to the campus from the west.



Constructed in 1984, Garden Ruins is a strong, emotional piece composed of giant stones. It is a monument to a previous time and culture, a romantic statement, filled with melancholy and dignity.



The sculpture "(Other) Voices", by artist Dennis Peacock, echoes the theme of ascension and the choices found along life's pathways in a non-representational, three dimension form. This sculpture can be found at the entrance to the Cleon F. Thompson Student Center.



The first sculpture in the "sculpture garden" at Winston-Salem State University was Southern Sunrise, an abstract, stainless steel piece by Melvin Edwards. It is composed of geometric elements and flat planes with brushed surfaces. Surface textures interact with the sunlight and enliven each form, so that the simple shapes offer an endless array of readings.
