Located on U.S. 74-76 business between Whiteville and Chadbourn, SCC, while surrounded by rural communities, is within 50 miles of the Atlantic Coast and such major cities as Wilmington and Myrtle Beach. As one of North Carolina's largest and fastest growing community colleges, SCC serves over 6000 students annually in college transfer, vocational, and adult educational programs. While students are top priority, the college serves its community well with various services, including counseling, women's center, Resources for Student Learning, and Retired Senior Volunteer Program. SCC attracts students largely from the surrounding counties of Columbus, Bladen, Brunswick, Robeson, and New Hanover; but, students from such diverse areas as New York, the Virgin Islands, Jamaica, and even Iran, are not uncommon. It is this meshing of the familiar and the new, the urban and the rural, that makes SCC an important part of both the educational structure and the community.

THE ATLANTA BALLET



The Atlanta Ballet made its fourth appearance at SCC on October 11 in the college auditorium.

The performance featured "Allegro Brilliante," "Bagatelles," "L'Occurrence" and "O.P.U.S. 13" choreographed by nationally renowned choreographers. George Balanchine, perhaps the world's most famous choreographer, choreographed "Allegro Brilliante" while Ferdinand Nault choreographed "O.P.U.S. 13" and Tom Pazik of the Atlanta Ballet the remaining two selections.

The Atlanta Ballet, founded by Dorothy Alexander in 1929, is a part of the founding of the ballet movement in America and was the first ballet company to be formed outside of New York City. As the first regional ballet company, the Atlanta Ballet, in 1956, hosted the first regional ballet festival and was instrumental in establishing the guidelines and precedents which have led to the formation of over 400 regional ballet companies in the five regional jurisdictions; it is also one of four major companies in the National Association for Regional Ballet.



In 1973 the Atlanta Ballet Touring Ensemble was formed under the artistic direction of Robert Barnett. The touring ensemble is a member of the National Endowment for the Arts Dance Program and performs residencies throughout the country. This year alone, the dancers will have traveled more than 30,000 miles. In addition to the company's regular touring schedule, the company presents a full season of performances at the Fox Theatre and performs regularly in more than 20 of Atlanta's city parks.

The company offers lecture demonstrations in classical ballet technique, as well as demonstrations in basic movement, masterclasses, seminars, mini-concerts, workshops, history of dance and stage technology, and company management.

During their three-day residency at SCC, the troupe conducted masterclasses designed especially for area dance instructors and their students, and presented a mid-day performance on the history of dance.

This project was jointly supported by a grant from the North Carolina Arts Council and the National Endowment for the Arts in Washington, D.C. and the Southeastern Community College Performing Arts Committee.





which the Rams easily won 101-82.





The 1979-80 Edition of Who's Who Among Students in American Junior Colleges will carry the names of twenty-one students from Southeastern Community College who have


been selected as being among the country's most outstanding campus leaders.

Rams Win First ETJCC Title

The Rams beat Chowan in the last game of the regular season to win outright the Eastern Tarheel Junior College Conference title for the first time and then went on to win the ETJCC Tournament. The wins gave the Rams an automatic birth in the Region 10 Junior College Basketball Tournament in Anderson, S.C., where they defeated Mitchell Community in the first round but lost to Spartanburg Methodist in the second round.

Charles Webb was voted to the All ETJCC Tournament First Team as Clayton White was voted the tournament's Most Valuable Player. Webb and White led the Rams in the regular season finale over Chowan with 31 points, 8 rebounds and 24 points, 9 rebounds each, respectively. Audie Malone and Jeff Morrisey also played a big part in the victory scoring 11 and 19 points each, respectively.

"Everyone played a big part in our success this year and all are real champions," exclaimed Coach Harry Foley. "We have a lot to be proud of." — E.M.

Ram's Win First Kiwanis Klassic




Time out! The Rams discuss strategy during a close second half with Chowan.

The fighting Rams scored two consecutive victories over Craven Community College and Pitt Community College, respectively, to win the first Kiwanis Klassic Invitational Tournament held in the Whiteville High School gymnasium. Led by co-captains Mike Southerland and Charles Webb, the Rams scored identical 99point victories to defeat Craven by 16, 99-63, and Pitt by 34, 99-65. 
Jeff Morrisey goes high over a Methodist defender in a non-conference tilt.





Coach Susan Harmuth cited a height deficiency, lack of depth, and strong competition as the team's major problems. Next year, the team will prove much stronger.








DEVELOPMENT AND PUBLIC INFORMATION
