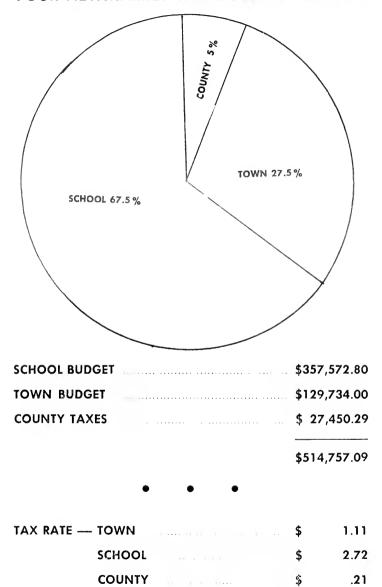
We, the Selectmen of the Town of Newmarket, respectfully dedicate this Town Report to the memory of George A. Varney.

WARRANT

STATE OF NEW HAMPSHIRE

Town of Newmarket

To the Inhabitants of the Town of Newmarket in the County of Rockingham in said State, qualified to vote in town affairs

You are hereby notified to meet at the Town Hall in said town on Tuesday, the 10th day of March, 1970, to act on the following subjects:

(POLLS WILL BE OPEN FROM 10:00 A.M. to 6:00 P.M.)

- 1. To choose all necessary Town Officers for the ensuing year.
- 2. To raise such sums of money as may be necessary to defray town charges for the ensuing year; as may be necessary for General Government including Town Officers' salaries and expenses, election and registration, town buildings, for the protection of persons and property, including the Police Department, for health and sanitation, vital statistics, general expenses of the departments, for education and the public library, for charities, including decoration of soldiers' graves, for recreation, for cemeteries, for indebtedness to other governmental divisions and to pay all other necessary charges arising within said Town.
- 3. To see if the Town will vote to authorize and empower the Selectmen to borrow money for necessary expenditures; in anticipation of the collection of taxes.

- 4. To see if the Town will vote to allow a discount of two percent (2%) on all taxes except poll and head taxes, if paid within fifteen days after receipt of bill.
- 5. To see if the Town will vote to accept the budget as submitted by the Budget Committee.
- 6. To see if the Town will vote to pay members of the Fire Department Ninety-Seven Dollars (\$97.00) in addition to that required by law. (Recommended by the Budget Committee).
- 7. To see if the Town will vote to restore the former name, Grant Road to that town highway now known as Epping Road. Grant Road will be that town highway running from Route 152 at a point known as Durell's Corner to the Epping Town Line.
- 8. To see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate the sum of One Thousand Dollars (\$1,000.00) for support of the Portsmouth Mental Health Clinic. (Recommended by the Budget Committee).
- 9. To see if the Town will raise and appropriate the sum of One Thousand Dollars (\$1,000.00) to become a contributing member in Regional District No. 17. (Recommended by the Budget Committee).
- 10. To see if the Town wishes to exclude from the plan service in any class or classes of positions of election officials or election workers for a calendar quarter in which remuneration paid for such service is less than Fifty Dollars (\$50.00).
- 11. To see if the Town will authorize the Selectmen to withdraw the sum of Thirteen Thousand Four Hundred Fifty Dollars (\$13,450.00) from the Public Works Capital Reserve Fund; said \$13,450.00 to be used for the purchase of a new tractor and snow blower. (Recommended by the Budget Committee).

12. To see if the qualified voters will vote to approve the application by the housing authority of the Town to the federal government for preliminary loans and to authorize the selectmen to enter into a cooperation agreement with the housing authority, by adopting the following resolution:

Be it Resolved by the Inhabitants of the Town of Newmarket, N.H., that there exists in the Town a need for low rent housing at rents within the means of persons and families of low income as defined in the United States Housing Act of 1937, as amended, which need is not being adequately met by private enterprise; that the application of the housing authority of the Town to the Department of Housing and Urban Development, Housing Assistance Administration for a preliminary loan in an amount not to exceed thirty thousand dollars (\$30,000.00) for surveys and planning in connection with low-rent housing projects not to exceed approximately seventy-five (75) dwelling units be and hereby is approved; and the selectmen are authorized to execute, on behalf of the Town, an agreement with the housing authority providing for the local cooperation required by the Housing Assistance Administration pursuant to the United States Housing Act of 1937, as amended, and to act in any manner relating thereto.

13. To see if the Town will vote to authorize the selectmen to borrow a sum of money, not to exceed Three Hundred Fifty Thousand Dollars (\$350,000.00), said money to be used to run the town affairs until the taxes are collected.

- 14. To see if the voters of the Town of Newmarket will vote to authorize the Board of Selectmen to negotiate with Adelard Beaulieu, to purchase the Little League Park Area for the Town of Newmarket.
- 15. To see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate the sum of Nine Thousand and One Hundred Dollars (\$9,100.00) for the purpose of installing a storm drainage system on Lamprey Street. (Submitted with no recommendation).

ANNUAL PROGRESS REPORT OF THE SELECTMEN

It is our pleasure to present this annual report for the year 1969. We wish to take this opportunity to thank all of the department heads, town employees and fellow citizens of Newmarket, who have made our jobs pleasant throughout the year.

The sewer project is in the final stages of construction and hopefully will be in full operation by the summer of 1970.

The sidewalk program is progressing. During the year, sidewalks were rebuilt on Elm Street, South Main Street and part of Spring Street.

The Water Department, with the help of the public works crew, extended the water main on Route 152 to the road leading to the new well area.

The new rubbish truck arrived in March of 1969 and has been in operation since. We are pleased to hear that the citizens of Newmarket are generally quit happy with th new truck and the rubbish pick up system.

Some work with Town Road Aid funds has been done on Langs Lane during 1969; the Town plans to move its road project to the Bay Road in 1970. The main result will be the widening and some straightening of Bay Road.

Bids were asked for on a dump truck for the Public Works Department — Great Bay Motors Company was awarded the bid. The low bidder for gas and oil was Eddie's Service Station. The low bidder for heating fuel was H. R. Haines Co., Inc. The low bid for our temporary loans was the Durham Trust Company.

The selectmen's meetings are on the first and third Tuesday of each month. We welcome anyone who wishes to attend these meetings.

Gentlemen:

Submitted herewith is the report of an examination and audit of the accounts of the Town of Newmarket for the fiscal year ended December 31, 1969, which was made by this Division in accordance with the vote of the Town. Exhibits as hereafter listed are included as part of the report.

One of the enclosed audits must be given to the Town Clerk as part of the permanent records.

SCOPE OF AUDIT

Included in the examination and audit were the accounts and records of the Board of Selectmen, Treasurer, Tax Collector, Town Clerk, Public Library, Municipal Court, Special Sewer Construction Fund and Trustees of Trust Funds.

FINANCIAL STATEMENTS

Comparative Balance Sheets: December 31, 1968 and December 31, 1969:

(Exhibit A-1)

Comparative Balance Sheets as of December 31, 1968 and December 31, 1969 are presented in Exhibit A-1. As in-

dicated therein, the Net Debt increased by \$846,462.55 during 1969, from \$433,005.49 as of December 31, 1968, to \$1,279,468.03 as of December 31, 1969.

Analysis of Change in Financial Condition:

(Exhibit A-2)

An analysis of the change in financial condition of the Town during the year is made in Exhibit A-2, with the factors which caused the change indicated therein.

Comparative Statements of Appropriations and Expenditures Estimated and Actual Revenues:

(Exhibits A-3 and A-4)

Comparative statements of appropriations and expenditures, estimated and actual revenues for the fiscal year ended December 31, 1969, are presented in Exhibits A-3 and A-4. As indicated by the budget summary (Exhibit A-4), a net unexpended balance of appropriations of \$4,961.82, plus a revenue surplus of \$9,522.68, resulted in a net budget surplus of \$14,484.50.

Summary Statement of Receipts and Expenditures:

(Exhibit B-1)

A summary statement of receipts and expenditures for the fiscal year ended December 31, 1969 made up in accordance with the uniform classification of accounts, as presented in Exhibit B-1. Proof of the Treasurer's balance as of December 31, 1969, is indicated in Exhibit B-2.

Special Sewer Fund Construction Account:

(Exhibit G)

A statement of the activity in the special sewer fund construction account during the year is indicated in Exhibit G.

Statement of Long Term Indebtedness:

(Exhibit 1)

A statement of outstanding long term indebtedness of the Town, as of December 31, 1969, showing annual debt service requirements, is contained in Exhibit I.

AUDIT PROCEDURES

The accounts and records of all town officials charged with the custody, receipt and disbursement of public funds were examined and audited. Vouchers and cancelled checks were campared with supporting invoices and payrolls as well as entries in the books of record. Receipts were checked by source insofar as possible and totals of receipts and expenditures verified. Book balances were verified by comparison with reconciled bank balances made from statements submitted from depository banks. Verification of uncollected taxes was made by mailing notices to delinquent taxpayers as indicated by the Collector's records. The amounts of uncollected and unredeemed taxes as indicated in this report are therefore subject to any changes which may be necessitated by the return of verification notices.

GENERAL COMMENTS

Current Surplus:

The current surplus (excess of total assets over current liabilities) increased by \$14,537.45 durining 1969, from \$25,494.52 to \$40,031.97, as shown herewith:

Uncollected and Unredeemed Taxes:

The selectmen should review the Tax Collector's lists of uncollected taxes and abate such items included therein which are known or appear to be uncollectable.

As indicated by the following tabulation, uncollected taxes of the levies of 1968 and prior years, and unredeemed taxes for which the two year period allowed by law for redemption has expired, amounted to \$9,000.84 at December 31, 1969.

We are happy to report that during the past year, five thousand feet (5,000') of eight inch (8") cast iron pipe was installed with four (4) hydrants giving added water protection, fire protection, and water services to the people on Lee Road.

We hope to continue the water main to the well site within the next few months, as soon as weather permits.

Our next project will be to pump water from the new well into our system, this being the first phase of the Future Planning of the Water Department.

At this time, a study is being made on the extension of water service to the Great Bay area along Bay Road and also to a proposed housing project in the Durham side area.

The sewer construction caused many breaks to mains and services which were very time consuming, but the cost was paid by the contractor.

The old artesian well has been repaired after a long wait for parts.

We wish to take this opportunity to thank the people of Newmarket for their help and support in making our task easier in the running of the Water Department.

LIBRARY REPORT 1969

In January, 1969, we welcomed our new librarian, Mrs. Ann Harding, who has put in a very busy year. This past summer, Mrs. Harding was awarded a scholarship for summer study at the University of New Hampshire, one of the few to be given this award.

One of the big jobs we tackled this past year was "weeding" the books. This consists of going through the stacks and checking over all the books, then removing from the stacks those that are too old or worn to endure further circulation, or those that have not been circulated at all for a long period of time, or have been rendered obsolete by later editions. These discards are then replaced with upto-date books or, in the case of the classic favorites, new editions of the old books.

The books thus discarded are often still readable, so many of these were then made available, at a very low price, to the children of Newmarket, at a book sale in February. Because of the good response to the sale, another one was held in April and more will undoubtedly be held in the future, for weeding is a job that goes on.

During the week of April 5-12, the Library held an Art Exhibit, featuring area talent from grade school through adult and including such work as watercolors, oil painting, and needle-and-craft-work.

In May, a shell exhibit was on display and, in addition to the regular visitors, the first and second grades from Central School made a special visit to see the exhibit.

In September, a mineral exhibit was featured and this time the third and fourth grades from St. Mary's School were special visitors.

The Tower Room is also in use this year by various groups, among them the Woman's Club, card club, and a regional pre-school mothers' group.

Eleven new books have been purchased and donated to the Library in memory of Mary Gordon, our former librarian. These books have been so designated with specially printed bookplates and put into circulation; we are most grateful to all who have made these gifts.

This year, the Library also received a large donation of phonograph records which have been in circulation.

Improvements in the Library have been the installation of a new set of cellar stairs, which was very badly needed, and the purchase of a metal trash can to attach to the pole outside the Library; hopefully this will cut down considerably on the litter problem by making a litter-basket readily available.

Other repairs and improvements are scheduled for this coming year, which should make for greater convenience as well as enhancing the appearance of the Library. We would like to take this opportunity to thank all those of you who have in any way contributed to making our Library year a better one for all.

As in the past, one of the major obstacles to be overcome by your department is the struggle to get the citizens involved in law enforcement, and if not involved, at least aware of the increasing problems, and the complexity of these problems now facing us.

As an example of the point that your department is trying to make; last year in the Town Report, the same problem of public apathy was spoken of, and the citizens were asked to come down and take an interest and find out what was going on, and what problems we faced. Net results? Two (2) people out of over three thousand (3,000) made it a point to find out about our, (and your) problems. Two out of over three thousand! Think about it.

The department is extremely pleased to report that Newmarket has not nearly the increase of the juvenile problem that is skyrocketing on the national average.

Granted, there are only a few that you hear so much about that causes many of the young citizens to be seen in an unfavorable light, but if you look at the accomplishments of the majority in Newmarket, we are proud of our young folk.

As you can see by the yearly totals, 1969 has been a busy year. If we examine most of the complaints or police actions, it will be found that most are brought about simply as a result of a thoughtless action, and most are needless. We can only hope that 1970 will be better.

We should all strive to get along better with our fellow man — we will be better for it.

The Newmarket Fire Department has satisfactorily handled the varied fire emergencies of the past year with its existing equipment kept in suitable running order, with its small complement of available men trained in the most practical manner, and with good workable cooperation from the Newmarket Police Department, the Public Works Department, and through financial support and citizen acceptance of necessary regulations.

With mounting costs in mind and paring expenses to a minimum, most of the department appropriation went for routine expenses. We bought a Scott Air Pack and three more sets of protective clothing. Another dry hydrant is on hand for installation this coming year. Four department members attended training schools held in Fitzwilliam and Guilford.

We still intend to purchase a pumper-tanker with our accumulated Capitol Reserve funds but plan to locate the best buy available before asking for voter permission to expend this money.

FIREMEN'S AUXILIARY

In September of 1969 an auxiliary to the fire department was organized to cooperate with and assist the fire

department. The group has selected the name "Smokettes," has drawn up by-laws and regulations and meets regularly on the second Wednesday monthly. At present there are 17 active members. Officers serving are, President, Mrs. Fred (Betty) Harclerode; Vice President, Mrs. Leonard (Cathy) Provost; Treasurer, Mrs. Charles (Louise) Clark and Secretary, Mrs. Richard (Madeline) Homiak.

FIRE PERMITS

A fire permit is needed for all outdoor fires anytime the ground is not covered with snow. This includes household waste burning, even if in an incinerator, grass burning, garden trash, as well as brush burning. Such burning is restricted by regulation and is to be done prior to 9:00 a.m. and after 5:00 p.m.

EXCEPTIONS

Camping or cooking fires are allowed on your own property with permission of the fire warden. On anothers' property with written permission of the land owner and permission of the warden. The warden can forbid such fires if in a hazardous area or in the case of hazardous weather conditions.

To make living with these regulations as convenient as possible, the fire department offers the following phone numbers where a burning permit may be obtained: Warden, Robert Keller, 659-3286; Deputy Wardens, Herbert Philbrick, Mrs. Herbert Philbrick, 659-3216 and Deputy Warden, Wilfred Beaulieu, 659-5927.

JANUARY -

Your local Director made application for a Medical Self Help Course and a Radiological Defense Course through the State Civil Defense Headquarters.

FEBRUARY -

Medical Self Help School held at the firehouse, an eight week course with 21 local citizens attending. Mrs. Robert Goodrich, R.N. at the Exeter Hospital, taught the course.

Radiological School started at the high school with an attendance of nine local citizens, five of them high school seniors.

Flood-warning information sent to all local directors in case of heavy water run-off.

MARCH -

Town Meeting month with a Civil Defense budget of \$1,000.00 approved for 1969.

Application made for surplus vehicles; a ton-and-one-half truck and a pick-up truck.

Diplomas presented to all attending Medical Self Help and Radiological School.

More flood warning issued by no heavy spring run-off.

APRIL -

Surplus vehicle request approved with Newmarket going on a waiting list.

Statewide radio and telephone alert; this was for testing purposes only.

MAY ---

1969-70 Progress Report sent to the State Civil Defense Headquarters; the report was approved by the regional office.

JUNE ---

Telephone test alert — testing purposes only. Civil Defense Emergency Auto Window Stickers were distributed to local Civil Defense personnel.

JULY --

Bulletins sent out on severe weather conditions, strong winds and thunder showers, etc.

AUGUST ---

Hurricane information sent out by the State Civil Defense in case of hurricanes.

SEPTEMBER ---

Your Director was asked to speak to the C.D.A. on Civil Defense. More hurricane information received but thanks to Mother Nature, no hurricane alert was needed.

OCTOBER - NOVEMBER -

Heavy Fall rains caused some concern for flooding; our area not in an immediate danger zone.

DECEMBER -

Another progress report sent to State Civil Defense in Concord.

Through a statewide communications network, in conjunction with the local communications network, our community will be warned in advance of any emergency that might exist.

We now have six mobile units in the highway department — three portables, a base station in the town hall and a radio at the water works.

The fire department has three mobile units — two portables, a base station at the firehouse and several monitoring sets in private homes which were bought by the individuals themselves.

The police department has one mobile, one portable and a base station in the police station.

It should be mentioned that these three departments each have their own radio frequency and can be linked together by telephone in case of emergency.

The firehouse and water works have auxiliary generators so that operations can be carried on as usual in case the electric power is lost. We have a generator at the town hall which we are going to hook into that building this year so that all three departments can operate an auxiliary power.

I wish to take this opportunity to thank all those who so faithfully have given of their time and energy during the past year to make our town a better one.

Included in the standing committees are physicians, registered nurses, a registered physical therapist, a registered dietitian, an attorney and lay persons.

The office of the agency is located at No. 1 Madbury Road, Durham, where the nurse can be reached Monday through Friday. Telephone, 868-5055 from 8 a.m. to 4 p.m. or through ones own physician. During the hours when the nurses are out on calls one may leave a message through the answering service at the same phone number. Funds for the support of the Association come from contributions from organizations and individuals, membership and nursing fees, grants and funds voted by the participating towns. Memberships (\$1.00) and contributions are tax deductible.

Continued support from the four towns through appropriations to be made at the 1970 Town Meetings is anticipated.
