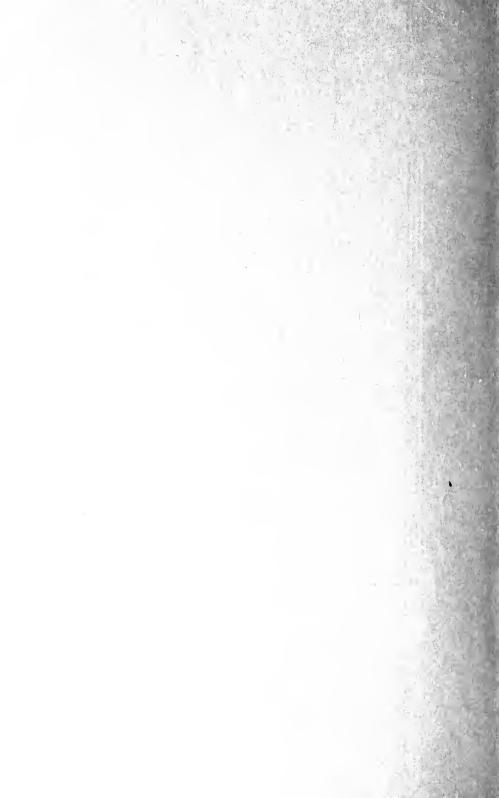

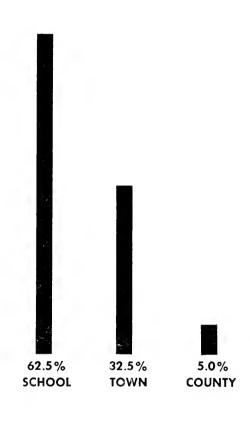

WARRANT

STATE OF NEW HAMPSHIRE

Town of Newmarket

To the Inhabitants of the Town of Newmarket in the County of Rockingham in said State, qualified to vote in town affairs.

You are hereby notified to meet at the Town Hall in said town on Tuesday, the 7th day of March, 1972, to act on the following subjects:

(POLLS WILL BE OPEN FROM 10:00 A.M. TO 6:00 P.M.)

- 1. To choose all necessary Town Officers for the ensuing year.
- 2. To raise such sums of money as may be necessary to defray town charges for the ensuing year; as may be necessary for General Government including Town Officers' salaries and expenses, election and registration, town buildings, for the protection of persons and property, including the Police Department, for health and sanitiaion, vital statistics, general expenses of the departments, for education and the public library, for charities, including decoration of soldiers' graves, for recreation, for cemeteries, for indebtedness to other governmental divisions and to pay all other necessary charges arising within said Town.
- 3. To see if the Town will vote to authorize and empower the Selectmen to borrow money for necessary expenditures; in anticipation of the collection of taxes.
- 4. To see if the Town will vote to allow a discount of two percent (2%) on all taxes except resident taxes, if paid within fifteen days after receipt of bill.

- 5. To see if the Town will vote to accept the budget as submitted by the Budget Committee.
- 6. To see if the Town will vote to pay members of the Fire Department Ninety-Seven Dollars (\$97.00) in addition to that required by law. (Recommended by the Budget Committee).
- 7. To see if the Town of Newmarket will authorize the Selectmen to withdraw the sum of Fifteen Thousand Dollars (\$15,000.00) from the Public Works Department Capital Reserve Fund for the purchase of a new truck (equipped) and a hot top spreader. (Recommended by the Budget Committee).
- 8. To see if the voters of the Town of Newmarket will vote to keep the term of office of the Town Clerk at three (3) years as provided for in Chapter 41-6a R.S.A.
- 9. To see if the voters of the Town of Newmarket will authorize the Selectmen to enter into an agreement with the State Tax Commission for the reappraisal of all property in the Town of Newmarket. The money for this purpose will be raised by taxes over a three year period, starting in 1973.
- 10. To see if the voters of the Town of Newmarket will vote in favor of the adoption of the Zoning Ordinance, as proposed by the Planning Board.
- 11. To see if the Town of Newmarket wishes to establish a three member Board of Sewer Commissioners, who shall have the powers and duties of the Selectmen as provided for in Chapter 252 R.S.A. Said Commissioners shall be elected by ballot for a term of one, two and three years respectively and thereafter, at every annual meeting, one commissioner shall be chosen to hold office for three years.
- 12. To see if the Town will vote to set up a Capital Reserve Fund for the improvement of water supply source. The amount to be set aside each year would be Three Thousand Dollars (\$3,000.00) and would come from water revenue. (Recommended by the Budget Committee).

- 13. To see if the Town will vote to extend the eight inch (8") water main approximately two thousand feet (2,000') on Langs Lane. The cost of this project would be approximately Twelve Thousand Dollars (\$12,000.00) and would be raised from taxation. (Not recommended by the Budget Committee).
- 14. To see if the Town will vote to authorize the establishment of a capital reserve fund for the future purchase of an ambulance. The sum of Two Thousand Dollars (\$2,000.00) to be raised. (Submitted without Recommendation by the Budget Committee).
- 15. To see if the Town of Newmarket will vote to purchase the property at 180 Main Street (Land and Building). Said property to be used in the future to enlarge the present fire station. Amount to be raised is Twenty-One Thousand Dollars (\$21,000.00). Eighteen Thousand Dollars (\$18,000.00) for purchase of property and Three Thousand Dollars (3,000.00) for demolition of building. This money to be raised on Long Term Notes, to be repaid over a three year period. (Submitted without recommendation by the Budget Committee).
- 16. To see if the qualified voters will vote to approve the Application by the Housing Authority of the Town to increase the number of authorized dwelling units from 75 dwelling units to 200 units by adopting the following Resolution:

Be it resolved by the inhabitants of the Town of Newmarket, New Hampshire that there exists in the Town a need for low-rent housing at rents within the means of elderly persons and persons and families with low income as defined in the U. S. Housing Act of 1937, as amended, which need is not being adequately met by private enterprise; that the Application of the Housing Authority of the Town to the Department of Housing and Urban Development, Housing Administration for a preliminary loan in an amount not to exceed

Twelve Thousand Five Hundred Dollars (\$12,500.-00) for service and planning in connection with low-rent housing projects for 125 additional dwelling units for the elderly and for persons and families of low income be and here by is approved; and the Selectmen are authorized to execute, on behalf of the town, an agreement with the housing authority providing for the local cooperation required by the Housing Assistance Administration pursuant to the United States Housing Act of 1937, as amended, and to act in any manner relating thereto.

- 17. To take the sense of the qualified voters whether the amendments of the Constitution proposed by the 1971 session of the General Court shall be approved.
- 18. To see if the Town of Newmarket will appropriate the sum of One Thousand Dollars (\$1,000.00) for the Newmarket Day Care Center. (Submitted without recommendation by the Budget Committee).
- 19. To see if the Town of Newmarket will vote to combine the offices of Town Clerk and Tax Collector as provided for in Chapter 41:45-a R.S.A. and to make the term of tax collector three years (3), as so provided.

ANNUAL PROGRESS REPORT OF THE SELECTMEN

The Board of Selectmen respectfully submit to the citizens of the Town of Newmarket, a summary of projects that were undertaken during the past year, their status and projects planned for the coming year.

The Lamprey Street drainage system has been completed and is in operation.

This years T.R.A. work saw the completion of Langs Lane and additional work on ledge removed on Bay Road.

The Public Works crew removed the ledge outcroppings on Ash Swamp Road and extended several culverts thus widening this stretch of road and reduced considerably the many dangerous stretches.

More work is planned for this road in the coming years.

The State has now taken over Gerry Avenue and a joint State-Town project is scheduled to begin this spring on this road. Sidewalks and curbing will be installed, new storm drainage will be built and the street will be resurfaced.

The sidewalk program saw the addition of sidewalks on Elm Street to the Railroad Crossing, also in front of the new American Legion building.

The fuel oil and gasoline bids for the town were won by the H. R. Haines Co., Inc.

The Public Works Department will start in 1972 on a system of hot topping our road and street system thus gradually doing away with the old system of tarring our roads.

The new sewer system is operating well and starting with the April 1st quarter of 1972, the sewer charges will be reduced by 25%.

The Selectmen's meetings are held on the first and third Tuesday of each month. We welcome anyone who wishes to attend these meetings.

Summary of Findings and Recommendations

Board of Selectmen Newmarket, New Hampshire

Gentlemen:

Submitted herewith is the report of an examination and audit of the accounts of the Town of Newmarket for the fiscal year ended December 31, 1971, which was made by this Division in accordance with the vote of the Town. Exhibits as hereafter listed are included as part of the report.

One of the enclosed audit reports must be given to the Town Clerk for retention as part of the permanent records.

SCOPE OF AUDIT

Included in the examination and audit were the accounts and records of the Board of Selectmen, Treasurer, Tax Collector, Town Clerk, Public Library, Municipal Court. The accounts of the Trustees of Trust Funds were not examined during the course of this audit. An examination of these accounts will be made at a later date and a supplemental audit report of our findings concerning the condition of these funds will be issued.

FINANCIAL INFORMATION

General Fund:

Comparative Balance Sheets - General Fund - as of December 31,1970 and Decmber 31, 1971, are presented in Exhibit A-1. As indicated therein, the Current Surplus increased by \$8,442.03, from \$15,081.40 to \$23,523.43 during 1971.

Comparative statements of general fund appropriations and expenditures, estimated and actual revenues for the fiscal year ended Dcember 31, 1971, are presentd in Exhibits A-3 and A-4. As indicated by the Budget Summary (Exhibit A-4,) a revenue surplus of \$12,420.98 less a net overdraft of appropriations of \$3,463.70 resulted in a budget surplus of \$8,957.28.

Long Term Indebtedness:

Comparative Balance Sheets - As of December 31, 1970 and December 31, 1971:

Comparative Balance Sheets of the outstanding long term indebtedness of the Town as of December 31, 1970 and December 31, 1971 are shown in Exhibit A-5. A statement of annual debt service requirements is contained in Exhibit A-6.

During 1971, matured Sewer Bonds totalling \$50,000 were paid. In addition, payments of \$5,100.00 were made on outstanding Water Works notes. The Little League Park note of \$10,000.00 which was due on June 1, 1971 was paid. A new note of \$7,000.00 on account of the Little League Park was issued during the year and will mature on June 8, 1972. The proceeds of the latter note were used to provide funds for complete liquidation of the note which matured in 1971. The new note was issued without formal authority of the Town.

In this connection, we direct your attention to Section 8 of the Municipal Finance Act (R.S.A., Chapter 33) which requires that the issue of bonds or notes by a municipal corporation shall be authorized by a vote of two-thirds of all the voters present and voting at an annual meeting.

AUDIT PROCEDURE

The accounts and records of all town officials charged with the custody, receipt and disbursement of public funds were examined and audited in accordance with generally accepted auditing standards and accordingly included such tests of the accounting records and such other auditing procedures as were considered necessary in the circumstances.

Verification of uncollected and unredeemed taxes was made by mailing notices to delinquent taxpayers as indicated by the Tax Collector's records. Consequently, the amounts of uncollected and unredeemed taxes as indicated in this report are subject to any changes which may be necessitated by the return of verification notices.

GENERAL COMMENTS

Overdraft of Appropriations and Application of Municipal Budget Law:

It is noted that during 1971, there was a net overdraft of total appropriations voted by the Town in the amount of \$3,463.70, as indicated in Exhibit A-3. Authority to exceed

appropriations in an amount not to exceed \$4,000.00 was duly granted by the Tax Commission to the Board of Selectmen on September 10, 1971, under the provisions of R.S.A. 32:10-a.

We again recommend that the Selectmen review the Tax Collector's lists of uncollected taxes and abate such items included therein which are known or appear to be uncollectable.

In addition, the Tax Collector should execute tax deeds to the Town for any real estate on which redemptions are in default after expiration of the two year redemption period allowed by law.

Capitol Reserve Funds - \$63,222.07:

Inasmuch as the records of the Trustees of Trust Funds were not available for audit, we were unable to verify the amount of Capitial Reserve Funds in custody of the Trustees at December 31, 1971. Therefore, we cannot express an opinion as to the accuracy of the above amount which is reflected in Exhibit A-1.

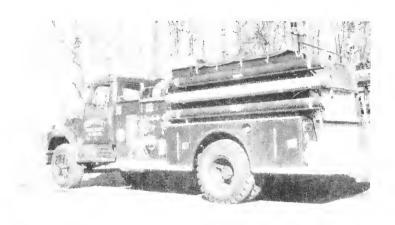

NEW FIRE TRUCK

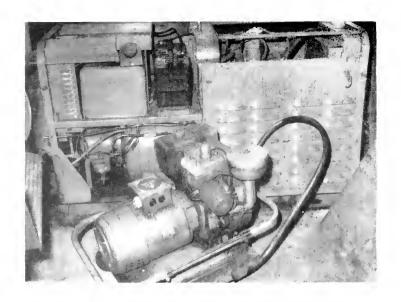


The new fire truck voted at the last town meeting arrived on December 31, 1971. This truck is now in service after much volunteer time was spent to install equipment and practice in using this new pumper.

The fire truck is an American LaFrance Pumper mounted on an International chasis. It is a combination pumper which carries 750 gallons of water and has a pumping capacity of 1000 gallons per minute from rivers, ponds or from the hydrant system. There is 2000 feet of $2\frac{1}{2}$ inch hose and 700 feet of $1\frac{1}{2}$ inch hose on this truck; it also has a Stang deck gun with various tips and a 2500 watt generator which is electrically started for use in night emergencies.

Those of you who have not seen this truck are cordially invited to visit the fire house for a tour.





GENERATORS AT THE FIRE HOUSE

Generator (rear) Value new: \$1565.00, Acquisition cost to town \$150.00 This generator is installed at the Newmarket fire house to supply power to operate the building in case of emergency.

Generator (front) Value \$300.00, bought through matching funds, \$150.00 town, \$150.00 federal government. This generator is portable and is used for power at emergencies at night by the fire department and the highway department.

ANNUAL REPORT OF THE

BOARD OF WATER COMMISSIONERS

We wish to announce that the well on the plains has produced over 74 million gallons of water during the last year. This has been half of the water supply needed for the town. No treatment of the water has helped to reduce the cost of operating the well.

A capital reserve fund is being proposed March 7, 1972, to further develop a gravel pack well in the future.

The 8" cast iron water main on New Road was extended 1,155 feet. The materials for this job were paid for by the developer. The cost of laying the water line was paid by the Newmarket Water Works and the work was performed by the Public Works Department.

Also an extension of 440 feet of 8" cast iron pipe was installed at Pulaski Drive (Route 108 - Durhamside). One hundred percent was paid for by the developer. At the present time, this serves three 12-unit apartments.

The water commissioners have applied for a Federal Grant to modernize the present water treament plant and to build a one million gallon water tank on Great Hill. The Board meets the second Monday of every month at the Newmarket Water Works on Packers Falls Road at 7:00 P.M.

LIBRARY REPORT 1971

On April 18 of this year, we were saddened by the death of our Chairman, Mrs. Elizabeth Gowen, who had served as Library Trustee for many years and was active in local affairs. We have lost not ondy a co-worker, but a good friend. Several books have already been given to the Library by local and out-of-town groups, in memory of Mrs. Gowen.

In January the Library received a gift of a "List of Revolutionary Soldiers from Newmarket" from the Granite Chapter of the D.A.R. Also beginning in January, movies for the Day Care Center children were shown twice a month on Tuesday mornings, by Mrs. Harding; this program continued through until May.

In April, during National Library Week ,an Ecology Contest was held for the Elementary School children, with the theme, "How I Can Improve My Town". The Library presented three book prizes for the best essays in the first six grades. Winners were Romi LaBranche, Robert Crichett, and Steven Bernier. During this time, there was an ecology exhibit in the Library, with books and movies at school and at the Library.

In May, we received as a gift a fifteen-volume set of the Encyclopedia of Technology and Science, from the Librarian of the Peabody Institute, Mr. Robert Dysinger. This gift was much appreciated.

In July, the Women's Club planted some chrysanthemums at the Library, and Mrs. Harding planted seventyfive jonquil bulbs in memory of the late Mr. Harding. During her annual vacation period, Mrs. Harding received another scholarship and completed two more courses at the University of N.H. in Library Techniques. In September, a Hobby, Arts and Crafts Show was held in the Tower Room, with Girl Scouts, Cub Scouts and local townspeople exhibiting, with accompanying books on the subjects. In the main Library, there was a rock exhibit for the fifth-grade students.

In October, the Library was broken into and some money was stolen; the person responsible has since been apprehended.

In other Library activities this year, the Library and the Librarian have benefited greatly by the volunteer services, once each week, of Mrs. Carrie Grey of Durham, a retired librarian, formerly of Rindge, N.H.

The Newmarket Extension Service has used the Tower Room on the second Wednesday of each month during the year. The Rockingham Craftsmen held several meetings there, as did the Rockingham County Extension, for training classes. The Newmarket Historical Society also met in the Tower Room during the months that their building was closed

Chess and checker games are now available in the main Library, and many of the young people like to challenge each other during the afternoons and evenings.

Talking books and the machines for them were obtained by the Library for two blind local patrons, through the "Services fo the Handicapped" division of the State Library. These are provided free of charge.

In the area of repairs and improvements, during vacation week the main Library floor was refinished; we also have installed a new tile floor in the hall. A new utility sink was added to the janitor's room, which previously had no

sink at all; this has been a great help in cleaning and maintenance. Repairs were also made to the flourescent lights in the main Library. Steve Dompkowski contributed his time and labor to build some protective frames for the lilac trees near the Library parking lot at the side.

This has really been a busy and productive year at the Library, and we look forward to 1972 and hope to see you at the Library! Remember, it belongs to you, the taxpayers, and can serve you in many ways.

A new Fire Truck was purchased for the town of Newmarket and was delivered January 1, 1972. It is an American LaFrance combination pumper tanker capable of pumping 1000 GPM and carrying 750 gal. of water in its own tank. This truck is fully equipped. Some of the items carried on this vehicle are Stang Deck gun, 2500 Watt generator, 2 Scott Air Packs, 2000 ft. 2½ inch hose, 700 ft. 1½ inch hose, 500 ft. booster line, and smoke ejector. This truck also carries many other items too numerous to mention in this report. It has been tested by the Board of Engineers and has met all requirements and tests and now stands in service.

A new transceiver radio was purchased for the Chief's car and was paid for with funds from both Civil Defense and Fire Dept. It has proven to be a big asset in answering both regular firecalls and especially the still alarms late at

night. A slow but steady progress is being made in bringing the communications systems up to date. Three more monitoring radios have been purchased by the dept. this year. New hand lights have been purchased along with protective clothing such as coats, boots, and quick hitches.

Men from the dept. attended fire training schools at Fitzwilliams and Lily Pond, N.H. This training is paid for by the town. In this manner advanced methods of Fire fighting are learned and can be passed on to the members of the dept. at our training sections that are held each month.

We feel that in the past year that the calls received for both grass and brush fires has been held to a minimum due largely to the fine cooperation on the part of the townspeople in acceptance of the state wide regulations governing all outdoor burning. Remember these regulations are still in effect, namely that all fires must be before the hour of 9:00 A.M. or after the hour of 5:00 P.M. ANNUAL REPORT OF THE HOUSING AUTHORITY

On December 16, 1971, the Newmarket Housing Authority was notified by the Department of Housing and Urban Development in Manchester that its selection of a developer had been approved. The successful bidder at a figure of \$877,400.00 was the S&S Contractors Inc. of Redmond, Washington.

This will be the first project in the Northeast for this highly respected national home builder. They have notified the Newmarket Housing Authority of their acceptance of the award and many meetings have occurred since the acceptance.

The location of the project is a 20 acre site off Exeter Road (Route 108) approximately across from Priest's Garage.

All buildings will be located well away from abutting property.

The program is a total of 50 apartment units; including 12 one bedroom, 16 two bedroom, 20 three bedroom and 2 four bedroom units.

There will be a community building for the use of project tenants. A 32 x 36 meeting room complete with kitchens will be evailable in this structure.

It is hoped that the developer completes all criteria required by the Planning Board and Subdivision Regulation form and that general breaking should be in the Spring of 1972

The Housing Authority is seeking 125 more units for Elderly and Low Income for future expansions to fill the needs of the Town.

The Newmarket Housing Authority is continuously working in the interest of people of the Town of Newmarket.
