In presenting to the public this Catalogue of Fruits, Ornamental Trees and Shrubs, the subscriber informs those who have previously—or may hereafter favor him with their patronage, that he has turned over to his son, Archibald Brackenridge, all his Green Houses, and large choice stock of plants therein contained, who will hereafter conduct the Flower business on his own account, and will issue Catalogues of his stock. But all orders for Greenhouse or Bedding-out plants addressed to me, will be attended to with the same care as if I owned the stock.

We would respectfully state, that our Catalogue contains no plant or tree that we have not under cultivation and for sale; our aim has been to procure and grow only such kinds of fruits as are good, and known to succeed well in the Middle States. The situation of the Nursery ground is elevated, with a surface soil of what is usually termed a gravelly loam, the wet parts of which have been under-drained, and the whole deeply cultivated; trees grown on this land are furnished with numerous healthy roots and robust heads, so that there is little risk in transplanting them. The proprietor's long and extensive practice in the cultivation and transplanting of trees enables him to judge correctly of the care necessary in the lifting and packing of them for transportation; and those favoring him with their orders may rely on proper personal attention being paid to this operation, as well as to the correct labeling of all articles sold.

Packages of trees and plants ordered will be delivered in Baltimore, free of charge, to such Agent or Transportation line as the purchaser may designate, after which they will be at the risk of the purchaser.

The Nurseries are situated on the York Road, four miles from Baltimore where the Towsontown Horse-Cars start hourly from opposite the Holiday Street Theatre; which pass within four hundred yards of the ground.


