In presenting this Price List to the public we would call special attention to the quality of our stock,—particularly our Apple Trees, Evergreens and Seedlings.

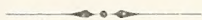
We do not claim to sell at lower prices than any one else, but we do aim to handle *only good* stock, and at as reasonable rates as it can be afforded by any one.

TERMS AND CONDITIONS.

Terms NET CASH,—with order, or before shipment of stock.

Where stock is ordered sent by Express, C. O. D., one-fourth cash must accompany the order. We *positively cannot* send out goods on any other terms.

Money can be sent safely by draft, P. O. order, or by express, charges prepaid.

Special attention given to packing, for which we charge cost of material and labor. All stock delivered at Depot or Express office free of charge, after which it is entirely at the risk of the purchaser.

Any errors which may occur in filling orders, cheerfully corrected, if notified of same within 10 *days after receipt of goods*, otherwise no claims for deduction allowed.

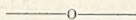
