AGLAIA-(See Yellow Rambler.)

ALFRED COLOMB-Cherry-erimson; large globan erect grower and abundant ular flowers; bloomer.

ANNA DE DIESBACH (Glory of Paris)—A lovely shell-plnk; long pointed buds, very large petals and large, finely formed, compact flowers, very full and double; sweetly fragrant. A vigorous grower and bloomer.

ANNY MUELLER (Pink Baby Rambier)-Brilllant, shining pink flowers in profusion, with long petals, gracefully curved and slightly twisted. A cross between Crimson Rambler and George Pernet, same in habit as the Crimson Baby Rambler. Splendid for bedding and dwarf hedges; everblooming and hardy.

ANTOINE RIVOIRE—Creamy-white, delicately tinted with pink; extra large petals making a bloom of decidedly distinct and beautiful form; full and double.

ANTOINE VERDIER—Bright, glowing pink, shading to rich crimson; large, beautiful flowers; a good grower, free bloomer and fine bedder.

APPLE BLOSSOM-(See Empress of China).

AUGUSTE GUINOISSEAU - (See White La France.)

BABY RAMBLER (Mme. Norbert Levavasseur)
-The Crimson Rambier in dwarf form, with the same clear, brilliant, ruby-red color. Hardy and healthy everywhere, attaining a height of twenty inches, and blooming in profuse clusters until frost, and throughout winter if taken indoors.

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BARON DE BONSTETTEN-Large, fuil and quite double blooms; rich dark red passing to deep velvety-maroon; very fragrant and beautiful.

BEAUTY OF STAPLEFORD (Crimson La France)
—Clear, bright red, shaded to bright rosy-crimson;
beautiful in bud form; open flowers large, globular and sweet scented; a constant and free bloomer.

BESSIE BROWN-Of a distinct type in shape and color and marvelously beautiful. Erect stems; full. deep blooms with enormous petals; white, flushed with pink, growing deeper toward center.

BETTY-Coppery-yellow, overspread with gold-en-rose; glorious size and form of the Killarney type; vigorous, free and a profuse bloomer.

BLACK PRINCE—Intensely dark erimson, approaching black; eup-shaped, large and full.

BLUMENSCHMIDT-Pure citron-yellow, outer petals edged tender rose. A sport from Mile. Franzlsca Kruger, which it resembles in form and fo-

BON SILENE-Bright crimson rose; large, beautiful buds and blooms with very long petals; a well known old time favorite, ever fresh and new.

BOUGERE—Peach-pink, delicately shaded with Iliac; deep, full and double; famous since 1832.

BOULE DE NEIGE (Ball of Snow)—Pure white, nowing light flesb upon opening; elegantly elegantly showing formed, very full and double, with shaped petals evenly arranged; hardy. with beautifuily

BRIDESMAID—Clear, shining pink; buds of exquisite shape; stems long and stiff; a profuse bioomer. One of the very best pink Roses for out

of doors and equally good for forcing.

BURBANK-Bright rose-pink, a shade darker

than Hermosa and as free a grower.
CAPTAIN CHRISTY—Delicate flesh pink, shading deeper at center of magnificent double flowers of bright satiny appearance.

CAROLINE GOODRICH (Running Gen. Jack)-Light red, ever-blooming in clusters of decidedly

fragrant flowers.

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CATHERINE MERMET—Clear, shining pink with rich amber center; elegant buds and large, globular flowers; handsome bush with dark green

CATHERINE ZEIMET (White Baby Rambier)-Pure snow-white blooms in profuse clusters: dwarf habit, same as the Crimson and Pink Baby Ramblers; ever-blooming and hardy.

CHERRY RIPE-Light rosy-erimson, similar in color to Alfred Colomb; well formed and globular;

free as a Tea Rose, vigorous and hardy.

CHRISTINE DE NOUE (Double Papa Gontler)-Deep glowing red; long, finely pointed buds; a constant and free grower and bloomer; sweetly seented.

CHROMATELLA-(See Cloth of Gold),

CLIMBING CLOTHILDE SOUPERT-Ivory-white. shading toward center to slivery-rose; perfectly fuli and double; rapid elimber, abundant bloomer and entirely hardy.

CLIMBING DEVONIENSIS—A sport from the bush Devoniensis, with which it is identical except in climbing habit and greater vigor.

CLIMBING KAISERIN-(See Mrs. Robert Peary). CLIMBING METEOR—Grows ten to fifteen feet in a season; blooms freely and persistently; deep, rich, velvety-erimson; hardy with protection. Sometimes called the "Perpetual-blooming Jacqueminot."

CLIMBING PAUL NEYRON—(See Mme. Wagram.)

CLIMBING SAFRANO-(See Reve d'Or).

CLIMBING SOUVENIR OF WOOTTON-Velvety red; same in bloom as the bush Wootton, from which it is a sport; a strong, rampant elimber, profuse with spiendidly formed flowers; perfectly hardy.

CLIO-A vigorous grower producing handsome foliage; large globular flowers of flesh color shaded to the center with rosy-pink. Similar to Margaret

Dickson.

CLOTHILDE SOUPERT-A really wonderful Rose for bedding out or for pot culture; medium size and very double; white, shading to deep pink at eenter; a profuse bloomer and a strong dwarf grower, deliciously fragrant.

CLOTH OF GOLD (Chromatella.)—A favorite elimber in the South for verandas, etc.; large, very full and double; highly fragrant; a clear, golden-yellow in the true variety which we supply. Me-

dium hardy.

CONRAD FERDINAND MEYER-Pure, silverypink, surpassing all others of the Rugosa family in beauty of color and fullness of form; fragrant and hardy; will not mildew nor black-spot; handsome in follage and valuable as an ornamental shrub,

WILLIAM R. SMITH (Maiden's Blush.)-Creamywhite with shadings of pink; a seedling from Maman Cochet and Kalserin Augusta Victoria; from beautifui in form and colors; giossy foliage; long stiff stems; vigorous in growth; a superb summer bedder and hardy with light protection.

YELLOW MAMAN COCHET (Madame Derepas-Matrat)—A hardy, strong grower, producing heavy foliage and strong, still stems; buds grace-fully shaped and fine, open flowers of sulphur vellow, blooming from apply Spring until from yellow, blooming from early Spring until late frost. YELLOW RAMBLER (Agiala)—A hardy climber. Double, golden-yellow flowers in large clusters.

ORDERS must be for not less than ten plants of each variety at the hundred rate, and not less than 250 of each variety at the thousand rate.

TERMS—Cash (money order, draft or registered letter) with order will entitle purchaser to extra count equivalent to a 5% discount. C. O. D. orders must be accompanied with one-third of the amount in eash. Accounts opened only with known or favorably rated correspondents or those furnishing amply satisfactory references.

PACKING—Always free, usually in light boxes, ventilated in warm weather, well lined in cold weather and seenirely strapped. From one to two-thirds (and for very distant points all) soil removed and roots earefully wrapped in damp moss and paper.

SHIPPING—Invariably by the best known route, speed, safety and economy considered, or one designated by purchaser. The start may be temporarily delayed by reason of exceptionally severe weather.

EXPRESS shipment is alone recommended as ensuring prompt and safe delivery. At the special plant rates, which are from 20% to 33½% below regular merchandise rates, charges will never be excessive. Prepayment is necessary to only a few Pacific coast and other far-off points, at the Sc per pound rate, to cover which add one-fifth to remittance.

FREIGHT shipment will be made only upon explicit instructions and entirely at risk of purchaser. We assume no responsibility except to deliver properly packed and in good order to depot, bill and route correctly and follow with tracer.
