

INTRODUCTION

1987 - The Year's Events

320 species were recorded in Scotland during 1987, and the year provided four firsts, for the Scottish list - Green-backed Heron, sadly found dead at Tyninghame, Lesser Crested Tern, very much alive and managing to elude many birders at Musselburgh, Savannah Sparrow on Fair Isle, and Yellowheaded Blackbird in various parts of Shetland. In addition, some BBRC decisions for 1985 have added four more species to the Scottish list; three of them new for Britain and Ireland. These are Brown Shrike, Daurian Starling, Red-eyed Vireo, and Chestnut-sided Warbler. Other major highlights of 1987, in what was an equally eventful year, included a big influx of Night Herons during the spring, the arrival of two Harlequin Ducks, the first Lesser Kestrel this century, a live Brunnich's Guillemot (and a dead one!), and amazing numbers of Red-rumped Swallows, Olive-backed Pipits, Greenish Warblers, and Two-barred Crossbills.

Other migrant "goodies" included American Wigeon, Blue-winged Teal, Ring-necked, and Ferruginous Ducks, Black, and Red Kites, an unspecified Pratincole, American Golden Plover, Broad-billed Sandpiper, Terek Sandpiper, Bonaparte's Gull, Ross's Gull, Gull-billed Tern, a load of Richard's Pipits, several Siberian Stonechats, Eye-browed, and Black-throated Thrushes, Paddyfield, Blyth's Reed, Great Reed, Subalpine, Arctic, Pallas's, Radde's, and Dusky Warblers, Rose-coloured Starling, 2 White-throated Sparrows, 4 Pine Buntings, and a bundle of Rustic, Little, and Yellow-breasted Buntings. The spread of records for these species meant that most twitchers experienced at least some pleasure during the year!

On the breeding front, 2 pairs of White-tailed Eagles bred successfully, and Ospreys reached the magical 50 breeding pairs. Corncrakes gave some indication of population stability, but time will tell! Both Wood Sandpiper and Temminck's Stint bred again, but Nightjar numbers continued to slide. Many of the commoner migrants appeared in good numbers e.g Sand Martin, Redstart, and Whitethroat, while the high-tops provided a good season for Dotterel and Snow Buntings. Chough (soon to become the slightly more logical Red-billed Chough?) appeared at one or two other places apart from Islay - wouldn't it be good to see this aerobatic corvid recolonise some of the mainland again? Finally, spare a thought for one of our *forgotten* species, the Mandarin. The Perth population mysteriously crashed during 1987, and must give some cause for concern about its future as a breeding species in Scotland.


Red-throated Diver Gavia stellata Best success in the North, but patchy in places. Breeding: **Shetland** had an average season, but poor on Fetlar; **Orkney** 60 pairs on Hoy, of which 42 were successful, 12 young were reared at the monitored sites on Mainland; **Highland** 14 sites were successful on Rhum, and 4 young were reared at 3 sites in Caithness District; **Central** a pair reared 1 young at one site; **Strathelyde** poor success on Arran where 5 pairs attempted, but a pair bred successfully in the South. Peak counts/passage: **Grampian** large autumn build-ups with 208 at Blackdog on 14 Sep, and 621 in Spey Bay on 23 Oct; **Tayside** up to 100 in Lunan Bay on 15 Feb; **Lothian** the highest count was 147 at Gullane on 11 Mar; **Strathelyde** 62 offshore from Tiree on 24 Jan; **Dumf & Gall** the L Ryan peak was 46 on 1 Nov.

Black-throated Diver *Gavia arctica* Not much change suggested in breeding success from main areas: West Isles 7 pairs bred on Lewis (5 other pairs possible); Central a pair lost 2 eggs at one site; Strathclyde still poor success in Argyll, and a pair failed in the SW. Peak counts/passage: no high spring counts but perhaps a slight increase in the Forth; Fife 30 in Largo Bay on 2 Apr; Lothian also showed a slight increase during winter-spring period, with 5 at Belhaven on 31 Jan; Strathclyde 23 between Girvan and Ballantrae on 26 Apr.

Great Northern Diver Gavia immer Winter-spring peaks: highest numbers in the North where Shetland had 39 at South Nesting on 15 Jan; Orkney 40 off Rendall on 12 Mar; Highland 28 in Dunnet Bay on 8 Apr; Grampian 37 off Peterhead during May; Strathclyde 55 between Kennacraig and Port Askaig on 13 Mar. Summer records included singles in Shetland, Highland, and Lothian, with 1 on two inland lochs in Tayside from 22 Jul-5 Aug. Autumn numbers were low e.g. Lothian 3N at Barns Ness on 21 Nov.

^{*} White-billed Diver Gavia adamsii Shetland adult at Whalsay Ferry from 1 Jan-27 Mar, and again on 8 Dec (BM,NDP,WS et al), 1st winter off Hascosay, Yell on 14 Jan (PVH,MH), slightly oiled adult in Dury Voe, Mainland from 7-15 Feb (DLC,PME,PVH), and an adult at Bluemull on 30 Oct (PME); Orkney adult off Papa Westray from 7-17 May (IPR); Highland adult found oiled in Dornoch Firth between 7 and 14 Mar was humanely destroyed (SRDdaP,ESdaP), adult in Sinclair's Bay on 14 Mar (EWEM,JS) and 1st summer found dead there on 19 Jul (KB et al); Strathelyde 2nd summer in L Sween from 21-24 Apr, and again from 4-6 Jul (Mr & Mrs JH,IMcG,RWJS et al). For additional BBRC records from previous years, see section at back of report.

^{*} Pied-billed Grebe Podilymbus podiceps Dumf & Gall 1 at Lochmaben from 24-25 Apr (NA,D & SS.RTS et al).

Little Grebe Tachybaptus ruficollis Breeding: in the North, Orkney had no proven breeding; Central 5 pairs reared 20 young from 9 broods at Airthrey; Lothian 9 sites held up to 24 pairs; Borders 21 sites held 23 pairs and 7 singles, with 7 broods seen; Strathclyde 80 pairs were reported from 43 sites. Counts/passage: Shetland 1 at Fair Isle on 6 Nov was unusual; Strathclyde 47 between Wandel and Crookboat on the R Clyde on 11 Jan.

Great Crested Grebe Podiceps cristatus Breeding: Grampian a pair successfully reared 2 young again in Moray District, and another pair reared 3 at Sand Loch; Lothian 4 sites held up to 17 pairs; Borders 11 sites held 12 pairs and 3 singles with 2 broods seen; Strathclyde 23 sites held 43 pairs; Borders 11 sites held 12 pairs and 3 singles with 2 broods seen; Strathclyde 23 sites held 43 pairs; Dumf & Gall poor success in L Ken/R Dee area. Counts/passage: more northern records with Shetland having 4 records of singles from Jan-Apr, and Dec, and Orkney having singles on 30 Jan, 23 Mar, and 8 Oct; Highland had 3 singles with 2 in the Jan-Feb, period and a juvenile at Scrabster from 29 Oct-18 Nov; in the South the Forth had 400 at Kinneil, Central on 29 Sep, and the Lothian peak counts were 251 between Cramond and Newhaven on 11 Jan, and 215 at Musselburgh on 9 Sep; Dumf & Gall the autumn build-up in L Ryan reached 111 on 1 Nov.

Red-necked Grebe Podiceps grisegena More than usual in the South-west in the winter-spring period: Highland had singles at Achnahaird Bay on 19 Jan, Dalcross on 15 Feb, and Dunnet Bay from 18 Feb-11 Apr; Grampian 1 was found dead at Forvie on 29 Jan; Tayside 1 at Carnoustie on 27 Jan; good numbers were seen in the Forth with Fife having 20 in Largo Bay on 11 Apr, and Lothian returning 50 at Gosford on 20 Feb, and 35 at Gullane on 12 Apr; Strathclyde 7-8 individuals were recorded between 17 Jan and 18 Apr, with most in Ayrshire; Dumf & Gall 1 in L Ryan on 13 Feb with 2 there on 13 Apr. A summering individual again appeared inland in Borders/Lothian on 22 Jun and 6 Jul and 2 were at Gullane, Lothian on 16 Jun. Autumn: Shetland had exceptional numbers with 5 birds from 7 Oct-30 Nov; Grampian singles at Strathbeg from 27 Aug-5 Sep, and between Hopeman and Findhorn from 19-24 Oct; Fife 1 on Cameron Res on 12 Jul; Lothian the Forth peak reached 35 at Gosford on 5 and 16 Sep; Strathclyde singles at Dunure on 14 Nov, and Stevenston on 26 Dec.

Slavonian Grebe *Podiceps auritus* Breeding: no breeding figures available, but little change suggested. Counts/passage: some high counts were made in the South, with the Forth and Islay figures being notable. Shetland Tresta Voe had 20 on 19 Feb, and about 38 individuals appeared in autumn from 5 Oct; Orkney 12 on L of Harray in Mar; Lothian the Gosford peak was 125 on 15 Feb; Borders a single was again present at several inland sites during the summer; Strathclyde 40+ at L Indaal, Islay on 16 Feb; Dumf & Gall 6 in L Ryan on 1 Nov.

Black-necked Grebe Podiceps nigricollis Breeding: in Central Scotland 2 pairs reared 2 young at one site, and a pair attempted twice at another site, hatching young on both occasions, the 1st brood perishing in Jun, the second brood of 2 during Jul. Counts/passage: unusual records from the North included 1 in West Isles at West L Ollay, S Uist on 23 Jan, and in Highland 1 at Salachan Pt on 24 Feb; Lothian had singles at Musselburgh from 21 Feb-1 Mar, and 6-7 Apr; Borders 1 at an inland site on 21 and 13 Jun; Strathclyde singles at Gadloch on 4 May, and Baron's Haugh between 23 Aug and 16 Sep; Dumf & Gall L Ryan only had 4 on 1 Nov.

* Black-browed Albatross Diomedea melanophris Shetland the Hermaness bird was present from 16 Feb-2 Jul, an earlier arrival and departure than usual (perJND).

Fulmar Fulmarus glacialis Breeding: a series of accurate colony counts showed marked increases in some Northern areas. Shetland productivity at monitored sites on Fair Isle was 0.53 chicks/nest, 46.800 sites were counted on Foula, and an increase averaging 3.2% since 1978 was noted at monitored sites elsewhere; Orkney increases were noted at monitored sites by as much as 10.7% on individuals counted: Highland the Seabird Colony Register count gave a total of 8611 apparently occupied sites at 7 locations in Caithness District, and 589 sites were counted on Rhum; Grampian 186 AOSs between Hopeman and Covesea showed a 19% increase on 1986; Fife 268 pairs were found between St Andrews and Kinkell Braes, and 92 chicks were reared on the Isle of May; Lothian 500 sites were recorded at Inchkeith, and 522 at Tantallon, inland 3 colonies held a total of 89 sites; Borders 1242 AOSs on the coast; Strathclyde 1419 AOSs on Tiree, but the South-west still showed poor success. Blue-phase birds: most were recorded in the North with 15 at Wats Ness, Shetland on 22 May, and 26 off Peterhead, Grampian during May. Passage peaks: Shetland 1200/hr past Sumburgh Head on 4 Oct; Highland 2000W/hour at Sandside Head on 14 Sep: Grampian 10,200N in 2 hours at Peterhead on 21 May.

* Cory's Shearwater Calonectris diomedea 3 birds were recorded: Orkney 1 off Mull Head, Papa Westray on 29 Jun (IPR); Fife 1 at Anstruther on 15 Jun (A-MS); Strathclyde 1N at Turnberry Point on 26 Aug (RHH).

Sooty Shearwater Puffinus griseus Recorded between 7 Feb and 24 Dec with high numbers in Northern waters. Max counts/passage: Shetland Sumburgh Head peak was 63 on 5 Sep; Orkney 1st off North Ronaldsay on 26 May, Aug peak was 350N on 31st, and Sep brought large movements of 350E in 5 mins at Brough of Birsay on the 9th, and 270N off North Ronaldsay on the 11th, the last bird appearing on 13 Oct; Highland 16W at Sandside Head on 14 Sep; Grampian 103 seen off Peterhead during Aug, and 1 very late bird there on 24 Dec; Tayside 1 was found dead at Elliot on the unusual date of 7 Feb, and an equally early bird was seen off Arbroath on 21 Apr, 21 birds between Arbroath and Usan from 13 Jul-30 Sep; Fife 23N at Fife Ness on 23 Aug; Borders 176 seen between 19 Jul and 28 Sep with a peak of 73N at St Abbs on 27 Aug; Strathclyde 8 between Kennacraig and Islay on 14 Aug.

Manx Shearwater Puffinus puffinus Breeding: Highland arrived back at Canna and Rhum on 16 Mar. Counts/passage: Orkney an early bird was seen off Hoy on 21 Mar; Fife 880W at Aberdour on 20 Aug; Lothian a late bird appeared at Hound Pt on 1 Nov; Strathelyde 7000 between Coll and Tiree on 16 Apr, 2500 off Doonfoot on 14 Aug. Balearic mauretanicus: Highland 1W at Sandside Head on 1 Jul; Grampian 1 off Peterhead on 28 Aug, 2 on 29 Aug; Lothian 2S at Barns Ness on 23 Aug, 1 from m.v. Gardyloo in Forth estuary on 8 Sep; Borders singles at St Abbs on 13 Jul and 19 Sep; Strathelyde 1S at Turnberry Point on 31 Jul.

Storm Petrel Hydrobates pelagicus Breeding: Shetland feral cats caused some mortality on Fetlar and Foula, birds ashore at night on Fair Isle from 18 Jun-11 Sep. Tape-luring: Highland 362 were tape-lured at Noss Head from late Jul-early Aug; Grampian 190 were caught at Collieston during Jul and Aug; Fife 21 were controlled on Isle of May on 18-19 Aug; Strathclyde c53 birds were ringed on Ailsa Craig in Aug. Counts/passage: Shetland 1 at Bluemull on 2 Nov was late; Orkney 102 in 90 mins off Papa Westray on 9 Aug; Grampian 114 were seen from Peterhead during Jul; Tayside dead birds outside the normal date range occurred at Montrose on 14 Apr, and L Tay at end Nov; Strathclyde 1 was found dead on Islay on 26 Nov.

Leach's Petrel *Oceanodroma leucorhoa* Counts/passage: the gales in mid-Sep brought very high numbers to the South-west. **Shetland** 7 were caught at night at a breeding area on Foula in Aug; **Orkney** 4 off Brough of Birsay on 14 Sep; **Highland** 5 singles in Sandside/Noss/Thurso area between 2 May and 13 Sep, 2W at Sandside Head on 14 Sep, 1 on Rhum on 31 Aug, 2 at Ardgour on 13 Sep, and 1 at Achnasheen on 13 Sep was released on the coast; **Grampian** singles off Peterhead on 27 Jul and 9 Aug, 1 tape-lured at Collieston on 3 Aug; **Strathclyde** unprecedented numbers in Ayrshire during the period 9-18 Sep, with maxima 170+S at Troon on 14 Sep, and 141S in 2 hours at Ayr on 15 Sep, 1 at Tighnabruaich on 13 Sep; **Dumf & Gall** 34S at Corsewall Point on 13 Sep.

Gannet Sula bassana Breeding: Shetland Fair Isle's breeding population increased to 304 nests with productivity in monitored nests 0.48 chicks/nest, 124 nests on Foula (cf 3 in 1976); West Isles 200+ pairs on the Flannan Isles; Lothian continued expansion at Bass Rock; Dumf & Gall increase to 830 nests on the Scare Rocks. Counts/passage: Grampian monthly peak was 8073 at Peterhead during Oct; Tayside 800N/hour off Usan on 20 Sep; Lothian 1250N/hour at Barns Ness on 11 Apr.

Cormorant Phalacrocorax carbo Breeding: Shetland 382 nests at 7 sites (cf 361 in 1986); Orkney 212 nests were counted at Calf of Eday, and 66 nests at Seal Skerry, North Ronaldsay; Lothian 347 nests counted on 4 Forth islands included 137 on Carr Craig; Borders 41 nests were counted on the coast; Dumf & Gall 211 nests counted at 4 colonies included an increase at one. Counts: winter totals included Grampian with 142 at Strathbeg on 2 Jan, Fife with 300 at Tayport on 25 Jan, Central with 262 on the Forth estuary on 20 Dec, and Strathclyde with 280 in the Clyde estuary on 15 Feb and 355 there on 22 Nov.

Shag Phalacrocorax aristotelis Breeding: indications of a good season in the North and an increase in the Forth. Shetland a Foula census produced 2400 nests (3357 in 1976), but the breeding season was better than average; breeding productivity at monitored nests on Fair Isle was 1.2 chicks/nest; Highland Canna numbers were back up to 1592 nests; Fife increase to 1916 nests on Isle of May; Lothian 6 Forth islands held 975 nests, including 465 on Craigleith; Borders 660 nests were counted on the coast; Strathclyde 364 nests were counted on McCormaig Isles; Dumf & Gall

decrease to 81 nests on the Scare Rocks. Counts/passage: **Shetland** 843 at Bluemull on 18 Feb; **Orkney** 450 in Widewall Bay on 1 Dec; **Grampian** 2385N off Peterhead on 27 Mar; **Fife** 4000W at Fife Ness on 12 Dec; **Strathclyde** 500 at Blackwaterfoot, Arran on 25 Sep.

- *Bittern Botaurus stellaris 3 birds were seen during the year. Shetland an emaciated 9 captured at Clumlie on 19 Oct was taken into care and released at Leighton Moss, Lancashire (DRB,PME,JDO); Grampian 1 was found dead at Ythan estuary on 29 Jan (RD); Lothian 1 at Duddingston on 18 Feb had stayed from 1986 (LLJV et al).
- * Night Heron Nycticorax nycticorax An outstanding year, with a remarkable surge of spring records. Shetland 4 singles comprised a 1st summer bird at Rae Wick, Mainland from 18-30 Apr (NAL,PMP), an adult at Brow from 27 Apr-12 May later found dead on 10 Aug (perJND), a 2nd summer bird in the Haroldswick-Baltasound area from 15-30 May (MS,ETh et al), and an adult at Baltasound from 31 May-15 Jun (CC,JND,CEV); West Isles singles a 2nd summer bird at Howbeg, S Uist from 26-30 Apr (TJD,WMcL et al); Highland 1 found dead on Canna on 23 Apr (RLS); Lothian adult at Drem from 30 May-1 Jun (AB,GDB et al); Borders a 2nd summer at St Abbs on 30 Apr was found dead at Coldingham on 4 May (KJR et al); Strathclyde an adult on Tiree on 20 Apr (MG,ACK) perhaps the same on Coll from 21 Apr-6 Jun (RM,GMdeM et al), and an adult at Douglas Water from 16-18 Jun (IE,AW,AY et al). Edinburgh Zoo's feral colony held 18 birds on 21 Sep, of which 16 were adults, and 9 of those were ringed.

^{*} Green-backed Heron Butorides striatus Lothian a first-winter bird found dead at Tyninghame on 25 Oct (DC, per PRG) had been recently killed by a predator. It showed characters associated with the North American race B s virescens. This constitutes the first Scottish record of this species.

* Little Egret Egretta garzetta West Isles 1 between Benbecula and Grimsay from 12-17 Nov (PRB,JJG,TDJ).

Grey Heron Ardea cinerea Breeding: Orkney 9 nests were found and at least 5 young fledged; Highland 32 occupied nests on Eilein Shona (52 in 1986); little overall change was suggested in the South, where Strathclyde had 148 pairs in 22 heronries. The only high count was in Strathclyde with 44 at Hunterston on 4 Feb.

- * Glossy Ibis Plegadis falcinellus Orkney the 1986 bird was still present in the Holm area until 10 Jan (BB); Grampian the 1986 Strathbeg bird was found dead in Jan (per JD).
- †* Chilean Flamingo Phoenicopterus chilensis Escaped individuals were recorded in Highland, Tayside, Lothian, Strathclyde, and Dumf & Gall.

Mute Swan Cygnus olor Breeding: generally a good season, especially in the South. Orkney at least 54 pairs were counted holding territory or nesting; Grampian 14 pairs reared at least 33 young; Fife 41 young were reared from 10 pairs; Lothian 106-110 young fledged from 32 pairs; Borders 58 pairs were recorded of which 30 were territorial, good breeding success with 26 broods producing 123 juveniles; Strathelyde 67 pairs were recorded in Ayrshire and inner Clyde area with a good success rate in Ayrshire; Dumf & Gall also had a good season in Stewartry District. Counts: Orkney 456 on L of Harray on 11 Dec included 109 juveniles; Grampian 187 on Strathbeg on 14 Aug; Tayside peaks included 302 at Montrose Basin in Jul, and 165 on L Leven on 13 Sep; Strathclyde 103 on Tiree on 17 Sep, and 101 on Clyde estuary on 25 Oct; Dumf & Gall 118 on Carlingwark L on 13 Dec.

Bewick's Swan Cygnus columbianus Low numbers during the winter-spring period: Grampian 9 on Ythan estuary on 3 Jan; Tayside 1 on L Leven on 2 Jan; Lothian 1 in Drem area from 1986 till 10 Jan, 2 on 8 Jan; Strathclyde 5-7 birds in Carnwath area from Jan-14 Mar, 1 at Inchinnan from 10-11 Feb; Dumf & Gall Caerlaverock peak was 16 on 20, and 30 Jan, last 3 there on 15 Mar. Autumn numbers higher: Shetland 1 in Spiggie/Scatness area from 14 Nov-end Dec; Grampian 2 at L Flemington from 2-3 Dec; Tayside up to 40 at L Leven in Nov; Fife 8 at Ballo Res on 21 Nov; Central 4 on L Watston on 15 Nov, 3 at Thornhill on 21 Nov; Borders 8 at the Hirsel on 20 Dec; Strathclyde 3 in Carnwath area from 21 Nov-27 Dec, 2 at Inchinnan on 10 Dec; Dumf & Gall 1st back Caerlaverock was on 14 Nov.

Whooper Swan Cygnus cygnus Breeding: in Strathclyde 3 feral pairs were present at Endrick Mouth, and 1 pair reared 4 young. Summering birds were present in Shetland (3-4), West Isles (3), Orkney (6), Highland (11), Tayside (1), Lothian (1), and Strathclyde (13). Winter-spring: Orkney 108 on L of Harray on 12 Feb; Grampian 136 at Strathbeg on 3 Jan; Central 116 at Thornhill on 21 Jan; Borders peaks were 136 on Tweed Haugh on 1 Feb, and 120 on Teviot Haugh on 10 Mar; Strathclyde 101 on Tiree on 24 Jan, and 120 on Stanely Res on 28 Jan; Dumf & Gall 120 between Wigtown Bay and Whauphill on 18 Jan, Caerlaverock peak was 220 on 22 Feb. Autumn arrival started on 25 Sep in Orkney and Strathclyde, although 7 were seen at L of Wester, Highland on the unusual date of 10 Aug. Shetland 338 were counted on 8 Nov, with the proportion of juveniles being 28.7%; Orkney large nos on L of Harray peaked at 485 on 11 Dec; Highland 363 at Invergordon on 22 Oct, Tarradale had 300 on 10 Nov, and Hallum held 566 on 14 Nov; Grampian 202 at Strathbeg on 19 Oct; Tayside the L Leven peak was 260 on 21 Nov; Borders peaks were 296 at Ruthven on 18 Dec, and 230+ at the Hirsel on 20 Dec; Strathclyde peaks of 100 Islay on 10 Oct, and 189 at Inchinnan on 15 Nov; Dumf & Gall 61 on L Connell on 10 Oct.

Bean Goose Anser fabalis Winter: West Isles 30 near Stornoway on 2 May, rose to 93 at Arnol on 9 May; Central/Strathclyde the Carron Valley flock peaked at 112 on 12 Feb; Dumf & Gall Castle Douglas had 5-10 birds on 13 Feb. Autumn: Shetland 1 at Gulberswick on 1 Nov; Grampian 2 at Findhorn Bay on 4 Oct, 1 on Ythan estuary on 19 Dec; Tayside 1 at Montrose Basin on 31 Oct; Strathclyde/Central Carron Valley was again the most important area with autumn arrival from 16 Sep when 9 were present, this was up to 60 on 27 Sep and peaked at 122 nearby on 5 Dec.

Pink-footed Goose Anser brachyrhynchus The winter-spring build-up reached its peak in most areas during the end of Apr, especially in the North. **Highland** 4000 at Tarradale on 26 Apr, and 8800 at Nigg Bay on 27 Apr; **Grampian** 11,350 at Strathbeg on 27 Apr; **Central** 5070 at L of Menteith on 23 Apr; **Borders** 6400 roosted at West Water on 21 Mar; **Strathclyde** 7500 at Rigside from 10-17 Jan; **Dumf & Gall** high numbers with 4000 at Auchencairn on 21 Jan, and 5000 at

Lochmaben on 15 Feb. A few birds summered and autumn arrival started in the period from 11-18 Sep in most areas. Autumn counts: **Highland** 631SE over Sandside Bay on 18 Sep; **Grampian** Strathbeg held 28,500 on 29 Sep; **Tayside** main roost held 23,000 (possibly up to 35,000) on 27 Sep, while Montrose Basin held between 35-40,000 in mid-Nov; **Fife** 9SW at Kinshaldy on 11 Sep, **Lothian** peak counts were 11,500 at Fala Flow on 4 Oct, and 15,100 at Aberlady on 30 Oct; **Borders** 1st on Hule Moss on 11 Sep, and West Water held 22,400 on 13 Dec; **Strathelyde** 10,700 at Dunsyre on 18 Oct; **Dumf & Gall** Caerlaverock peak was 3450 during Dec.

White-fronted Goose Anser albifrons Winter-spring: Orkney 79 at The Loons on 1 Apr; Highland 164 at Westfield on 1 Feb; Strathclyde 230 at Endrick Mouth in Feb; Dumf & Gall 710 at West Freugh in Mar, and 300 at L Ken on 19 Mar were the highest counts. Autumn: Orkney 54 on Stronsay on 2 Dec; West Isles 2 flocks totalled 41 from Oct; Highland 1st seen on 19 Sep over Reay, 180 at Westfield on 29 Nov; Strathclyde a Dec count on Islay revealed 7200-7300 with 22% young, and Endrick Mouth had 240 by mid-Dec; Dumf & Gall arrival of 107 L Ken on 10 Oct rose to peak of 370 on 18 Dec. Eurasian albifrons: Grampian 1-2 in Strathbeg area from 25 Jan-29 Apr, another on 30 Oct; Lothian 1 at Dirleton on 8 Jan, and 2 at West Fenton on 16 Dec; Strathclyde 2 near Carnwath on 26 Dec.

Greylag Goose Anser anser Breeding: successful nesting was again recorded on both Shetland and Orkney: in Highland breeding pairs were noted at Insh marshes, L Lurgain, and on Eigg: Strathclyde estimates gave 30 pairs on Coll and 20 pairs on Tiree. Winter-spring: West Isles census on 5-7 Feb gave a total 1424 for the Uists and Benbecula; Grampian 6250 at Strathbeg on 2 Feb; Tayside 4360 at Carsebreck on 1 Feb; Fife 2500 in Lomond Hills area on 22 Feb; Strathclyde had lower numbers than usual due to the mild winter, and the peak counts were 2500 at Rigside from 10-24 Jan, and 1250 near Maybole on 6 Mar; Dumf & Gall 2500 at West Freugh on 13 Feb, and the main departure was on 13 Apr. In the autumn Shetland had the first back on 25 Aug on Fair Isle and at Gulberswick; Orkney 1301 were counted on 14-15 Nov; Highland 16,500 at L Eye on 25 Oct, and 12,000 at Munlochy on 16 Nov; Grampian peak count at L Spynie was 10,400 on 23 Oct, while Skene held 12,250 and Davan 12,800 in Oct; Tayside 5900 on Drummond Pond on 1 Nov; Borders peaks included 2000 at the Hirsel on 11 Nov, and 1900 at Dowlaw on 15 Nov; Dumf & Gall 1017 at Lochmaben in Nov.

†* Bar-headed Goose Anser indicus Escapes appeared in West Isles at Stornoway from 29 Aug-end Dec, Highland at Loch of Wester on 13 Jun, and Strathclyde on Islay on 14 Jan.

†* Snow Goose Anser caerulescens A good scatter of records no doubt included some genuine migrants: Orkney 4 at War Ness, Eday on 18 Sep were unusual; Highland 2 at Torridon on 29 Apr; Grampian 7 records in Ythan-Strathbeg area during Jan-May included 2 blue-phase birds from 10-17 May, and up to 3 birds were recorded from 22 Sep-21 Oct; Tayside singles at L Leven on 22 Mar and 23 Nov, Perth on 27 Sep and 4 Oct, Carsebreck from 11-25 Oct, Longforgan from Oct-Dec, and Montrose on 20 Oct rising to 3 on 30 Oct-22 Nov and 1 till end Dec; Lothian 3SE Ormiston Hall on 16 Nov; Borders 2 at West Water from 26 Sep-Dec; Strathelyde 1 at Rigside from 7-11 Jan, the usual moult-flock on Mull reached 22 on 6 Jul, 2 on Islay in Feb and Dec, a single at Holy L on 1 Oct and early Dec, and 1 between Girvan and Ardrossan from 1 Aug-11 Nov; Dumf & Gall 1 near Kirkcudbright on 6 Dec.

Canada Goose Branta canadensis Breeding: an increase was noted in Dumf & Gall in Stewartry District. English moult migration: the Beauly Firth, Highland flock peaked at 350 on 20 Jul. Counts/passage (mostly in association with moult migration): Shetland flock of 10 on Fair Isle from 4-10 Apr: Orkney I6 flew over Kirkwall on 20 Jul: West Isles I at Broadbay. Lewis on 24 Jan: Tayside 43E at Montrose on 14 Aug, and 60S over Killiecrankie on 18 Aug; Lothian 38 at Tyninghame on 23 Jun; Strathclyde single Bc minima birds on Islay from 24 Mar-19 Apr. and 9-30 Oct. Bc hutchinsi type on Islay from 9-13 Oct, and again on 29 Dec: Dumf & Gall Caerlaverock peak was 323 on 6 Aug, a small-medium sized bird at L Ken from 6 Jan-25 Mar may have been Bc parvipes.

Barnacle Goose *Branta leucopsis* **Solway flock:** Caerlaverock held 10,500 during winter 1986/87, 9340 had returned by 29 Sep and the peak for winter 1987/88 was 11,400; **Islay flock:** peak count was 22,000 in Nov with a breeding success rate showing lower than normal at 12.0%; **Scapa Flow, Orkney flock:** peaked at 380-400 on 29 Mar-14 Apr, a small flock was present on South Ronaldsay on 18 Sep, and the autumn peak was reached on Switha with 620 on 9 Nov: **West Isles** census on 5-7 Feb gave a total of 1146 in the Sound of Harris/Uists area: **Highland** 220 on Eilean Hoan on 26 Jan: in **Strathclyde** 46 at Hyndford Bridge on 14 Feb may have been Solway birds. Autumn

passage commenced from 26 Sep in **Tayside: Shetland** 47 on Fair Isle on 30 Sep; **Grampian** 58 at Strathbeg on 7 Nov; the passage in **Lothian** was light and prolonged, with a peak of 150 at Gladhouse on 13 Oct.

Counts: Highland 172 at Munlochy on 22 Jan, and 208 at Nigg Bay on 30 Dec; Grampian Findhorn Bay held 245 on 12 Apr; Tayside 457 in Montrose Basin in Nov; Fife 1238 on Eden estuary on 15 Feb; Central 1264 at Kinneil on 6 Aug; Strathclyde 241 in L Gruinart, Islay in Feb, and 599 on the Clyde estuary on 15 Feb; Dumf & Gall the Caerlaverock peak was 400 on 15 Mar.

†* Mandarin Aix galericulata A decline in the Tayside population seems to have occurred with only one brood of 3 reported from Perth and a maximum count of only 14; elsewhere records included Lothian ♂ at Musselburgh from 12 Apr-15 Jun; Borders ♀ at Reston in Apr, and ♂ and 2 ♀♀ at Hawick on 20 Nov-21 Dec.



Gadwall Anas strepera Breeding: information scanty, but the species bred on Orkney where 3 broods on North Ronaldsay, Fife where pairs bred at a minimum of 2 sites, and Strathclyde where 2 \$\partial \text{seen}\$ seen with broods of 3 and 6 on Tiree. No high counts were recorded, most records being of 1-4 birds, the maxima being Strathclyde 7 near Ayr from 12-20 Dec, and Dumf & Gall the Caerlaverock peak was 8 in Nov-Dec.

Teal Anas crecca Breeding: **Borders** 29 pairs recorded, 12 broods totalled 24+ young. Counts: **Highland** 563 in the Longman-Alturlie areas on 25 Oct; **Grampian** the Strathbeg peak was 1200 on 19 Oct; **Tayside** 1400 on L Leven on 13 Sep; **Fife** 665 at Eden estuary on 20 Dec; **Central** 817 at Kinneil on 20 Dec; **Strathclyde** 690 on Tiree on 24 Jan; **Dumf & Gall** the Caerlaverock peak was 1493 in Oct. **Nearctic carolinensis**: Shetland σ on Tingwall Loch from 6-15 Jun (DRB,DS); **West Isles** σ on West L Ollay, S Uist on 2 Dec (TJD,JJG), perhaps same on St Kilda on 4 Dec (JJG); **Tayside** σ at Kinkell Bridge from 20 Mar-24 Apr (WTA et al); **Fife** σ at Eden estuary from 27 Feb-12 Apr (NE,JGS,GR et al).

Mallard Anas platyrhynchos Breeding: Shetland 1st ducklings were seen on 17 Apr; Borders a minimum of 291 recorded broods held 1432+ juveniles at varying stages of growth; Strathclyde a good breeding season was indicated in SW Scotland. Counts: West Isles 250 on Loch na h-Aibhne Ruaidhe, Lewis in Jul were of doubtful origin; Grampian 3450 at Strathbeg on 13 Dec; Tayside 1600 in Montrose Basin, and 1500 in outer Tay in Feb, 1060 on L Leven on 27 Sep; Borders 2137 were counted on river system during Goosander Census work on 28-31 Mar; Strathclyde 922 in Strathclyde Park on 25 Jan, and 870 on Gadloch on 8 Sep; Dumf & Gall Caerlaverock held 2100 in Sep.

Counts/passage: **Highland** 125 in Nigg Bay on 30 Dec; **Tayside** 74 in Montrose Basin on 14 Feb: **Fife** 41 at Eden estuary on 11 Feb: **Central** the Kinneil flock peaked at 48 on 15 Feb: **Dumf & Gall** Carse Bay held 823 on 25 Oct, and Caerlaverock peaked at 524 in Dec.

- * Garganey Anas querquedula An extremely poor year with only 12 spring birds: Shetland of at Hillwell from 24-27 May: Orkney of on North Ronaldsay on 12 May: West Isles of at Balranald on 26 Mar; Central of on Cambus Pool on 22 Apr; Lothian of at Aberlady on 21 and 28 May; Strathclyde of at Highfield, Prestwick from 17-18 Apr, a pair on Logan Resr on 30 Apr, and a pair near Drongan on 20 May; Dumf & Gall a pair at L Ken on 3 May.



Shoveler Anas clypeata Breeding: Orkney up to 9 pairs bred, with up to 13 pairs probable at 9 other sites: Borders 9 pairs bred, from which 4 broods produced 19 juveniles; Strathclyde 3-4 pairs bred at New Cumnock, single pairs bred at 3 other sites; 1-2 pairs bred in Highland, Grampian, and Tayside. Counts: Tayside 350 at Perth on 24 Oct, c400 on L Leven in Nov; Borders the Hirsel had 153 in Oct; Strathclyde 32 at Baron's Haugh on 18 Oct and 5 Nov; Dumf & Gall 93 at Annan Waterfoot on 22 Nov.

* Red-crested Pochard Netta rufina Three birds were recorded: Orkney ♀ on L of Harray from 1-11 Jan; West Isles ♂ on West L Ollay, S Uist on 2 Dec; Strathclyde ♂ at Balgray Res on 6 Dec.

Pochard Aythya ferina Very few breeding records for this species: 2 pairs probably bred in **Grampian**, and the Hirsel. **Borders** held 3 broods totalling 15 on 3 Jul. Counts were generally lower, especially in the SW: **Orkney** the L of Boardhouse peak was 3755 on 23 Oct; **Highland** 281 on St John's Loch on 17 Oct; **Tayside** 703 on L Leven on 28 Nov; **Fife** 311 on L Gelly on 29 Nov; **Strathclyde/Dumf & Gall** both recorded low numbers with a peak of 176 at Strathclyde Park on 13 Dec.

* Ring-necked Duck Aythya collaris Dumf & Gall of on L Ken on 11 Dec (RGH).



* Ferruginous Duck Aythya nyroca Strathclyde 1st year of at Kilmarnock from 21-26 Oct (WAD et al).

Tufted Duck *Aythya fuligula* Breeding reports indicated patchy success: **Grampian** had a complete failure at Strathbeg, while **Tayside** had a good season in the South of the region; **Central** 9 prs bred at Airthrey, and 43 fledged from 8 broods; **Borders** a minimum of 93 pairs were recorded, and 28 broods with 153 juveniles showed a good survival rate. Counts: **Orkney** the L of Stenness peak was 1280 on 18 Jan; **Highland** 1060 at Kessock Narrows on 16 Jan; **Tayside** 720 in the outer Tay in Jan, and 2600 on L Leven on 30 Aug; **Lothian** 453 at Leith Docks on 11 Jan; **Strathclyde** 534 at Strathclyde Park on 12 Dec.

Scaup Aythya marila Summer birds included 7 in Orkney, and 4 in Strathclyde. Counts: Orkney 119 on L of Harray on 12 Feb; Highland 330 at Meikle Ferry on 13 Apr; Fife 950 at Leven in Feb; Lothian 127 in Gosford Bay on 14 Feb was the largest flock since 1982; Strathclyde 100 at West Ferry on 31 Jan; Dumf & Gall the Carsethorn flock increased further to 1890 on 13 Oct.

Eider Somateria mollissima A mixed breeding season was indicated in most regions, e.g. **Grampian** where the Forvie population was estimated at 5500, with 1200 breeding pairs producing a mean clutch size of 3.38, but only 25 chicks fledged due to disturbance from windsurfers and predation from foxes, and **Tayside** where 200+ pairs at Barry Buddon suffered a high rate of predation. Some areas experienced better fortunes: **Fife** saw an increase to c500 pairs on Isle of May: **Lothian** Dalmeny had a high count of 450 juveniles on 19 Jun, while Aberlady held an estimated 580 pairs: **Strathelyde** 134 young on Tiree in Jun. Counts: **Grampian** 1831 on Ythan estuary on 17 Oct; **Tayside** 2772 in Montrose Basin in Feb; **Fife** c20.000 at Tay estuary from 4-21 Nov; **Lothian** peak count was 4000 between Yellowcraig and Gullane on 5 Jul; **Strathelyde** 3000 at Troon on 20 Jul, and a record peak of 4325 in Clyde estuary on 13 Sep.

- * Harlequin Duck Histrionicus histrionicus Shetland a 1st winter of in Sullom Voe from 16 Jan-25 Feb was the first British record since 1965 (JND,MH et al); Strathclyde incredibly a second bird, a Q, turned up at Claggain Bay, Islay from 20-31 Oct (CB,MP,MAO).

Long-tailed Duck Clangula hyemalis Summer records included a pair in Shetland, and 1-2 birds in Highland, Lothian, Strathclyde, and Dumf & Gall. Counts: Shetland the Bluemull peak was 519 on 18 Feb; Orkney 874 were counted in the Wide Firth-Gairsay Sound-Rousay Sound area on 21 Feb; Grampian 3000 in Burghead Bay roost on 7 Mar, and 1330 at Findhorn on 3 Nov; Fife 440 at Kinshaldy on 8 Nov; Lothian's autumn arrival was from 19 Sep, and Gosford held a peak of 315 on 17 Jan.

Common Scoter Melanitta nigra Breeding reports coming from the usual areas included: Shetland 3 pairs hatched a total of 9, but only 2 fledged; Highland pairs were recorded from 3 lochs; Tayside pairs bred at the usual site with a brood of 6 on 4 Jul and a brood of 4 at another loch on 11 Jul; Strathclyde a pair plus 200 were present on L Lomond but no young were seen. Counts were low, with a shift into the St Andrews, Fife area: Grampian 947+ off Culbin Bar in Feb, and 890 in Blackdog/Ythan area on 14 Sep; Tayside 300 in Lunan Bay in Feb; Fife 3300 from Tentsmuir-St Andrews on 24 Jan: Strathclyde 178 in L Indaal, Islay in Mar; Dumf & Gall 300 in Luce Bay on 15 Feb. Black Scoter M n americana: Lothian a of in Gosford Bay on 31 Dec (AB).

* Surf Scoter Melanitta perspicillata Shetland a 1st winter of on Bressay from 23 Jan-27 May, also at Catfirth on 29 May (DRB,PD,PVH et al): Grampian a 2nd winter bird of in Balmedie Bay on 7 Nov, perhaps same at Rattray from 8-21 Nov (ALy,GMC,JSN,WNH), 1 off Culbin Bar on 26-29 Nov (BE,CC,AE)ø; Tayside a of in Lunan Bay on 10 Aug (RY); Fife 2of and 9 in Largo Bay from 20 Mar-1 May, 3of and 299 on 11 Apr, of on 7 Nov (CCMcG,JSN,JGS et al), a of in St Andrews Bay from 14 Oct-14 Nov, with 2of from 17-24 Oct (NM,SR et al) - the Fife and Lothian birds are obviously the same individuals, and the exact dates and numbers are complicated by the birds moving around in the area; Lothian 2 of and 9 in Gosford Bay on 16 Feb (KC,PRG), and a of on 3-4 Sep (AG,MG,PRG).

Velvet Scoter *Melanitta fusca* Counts again showed an increase in numbers in **Fife: Grampian** low numbers at main areas with 271 in Burghead Bay in Apr. and 163 at Blackdog on 7 Nov: **Tayside** 250 between Lunan Bay and Montrose from 9-15 Aug; **Fife** 1400 in St Andrews Bay on 28 Nov: **Lothian** Gosford peak was 124 on 20 Dec.

Goldeneye Bucephala clangula Breeding: in Northern Scotland 77 nests were occupied in main area - 35 broods hatched a total of 320 ducklings. 3 pairs nested outside this area. A small number of non-breeders summered. Counts: Shetland 278 in Spiggie/Easter L/Snarravoe area on 15 Nov; Highland 1568 at Ness on 6 Feb; Grampian 325 at Girdle Ness on 22 Jan; Tayside 400 at Broughty Ferry in Jan; Fife 1100 at Leven on 18 Jan; Lothian a high count of 636 at Musselburgh on 14 Feb; Strathelyde 354 at Doonfoot on 20 Jan. and a record count of 864 in Clyde estuary on 15 Feb. In Highland the σ Smew hybrid was again present at Ness Mouth between 24 and 27 Dec.

Smew Mergus albellus A summary of the year's records shows only a few birds at the start of a mild 1987-88 winter, while in **Strathclyde** the loch in Strathclyde Park held up to 12 birds from 1-8 Feb. and up to 5 birds in mid-Dec.

Red-breasted Merganser *Mergus serrator* Breeding: **Orkney** up to 28 pairs were recorded and 17 broods counted. Counts: **Orkney** 106 on L Stenness on 15 Feb; **Highland** 300 at Avoch on 28 Mar, and 500 in Inverness Firth on 3 Dec; **Tayside** 300-400 in Montrose Bay on 12 Jun; **Fife** 1100 at Kinshaldy on 8 Nov; **Strathclyde** 170 were offshore on Tiree on 24 Jan; **Dumf & Gall** L Ryan had a high count of 460 on 10 Oct.

Goosander Mergus merganser Breeding: Borders a total of 34 broods with 191 juveniles were found during the Goosander Census; Central/Strathclyde 14 broods totalled 73 young on L Lomond in Jul; Dumf & Gall 25 ♂ and 27-31 ♀♀ were recorded, but the post breeding flock on L Ken was only 51. Counts: West Isles 9 on L Mor, Barvas, Lewis on 19 Feb; Highland the Beauly Firth peak reached 1520 on 30 Dec; Grampian the Speymouth moult-flock reached 148 on 30 Aug; Tayside the Monifieth moult-flock held 140 on 26 Aug; Fife 225 at Tayport on 6 Sep; Borders 446 on the river system on 28 Mar, and 147 at the Hirsel on 22 Nov; Strathclyde 132 in Strathclyde Park on 12 Dec, and 59 on Martnaham Loch, Ayr on 20 Dec was a much higher count than usual; Dumf & Gall 120 at Lochmaben in Dec.

Ruddy Duck Oxyura jamaicensis Breeding: Tayside no breeding information from Kinnordy, but up to 8 °C and 2 °P were present, and a °C with 4 juveniles was seen on Dun's Dish on 25 Jul; Strathclyde a pair bred at Aird Meadow, but the brood of 2 disappeared soon after 23 Jul. Others included a °C at Hillwell, Shetland on 3-5 May, a °C in Lewis, West Isles on 4 May (1st record), a pair in the Meikle-Cotehill area, Grampian from 10 May-18 Aug, 5 on L Leven, Tayside from Nov-5 Dec, 3 on Kilconquhar L, Fife from 8 Apr-7 Aug, and 1-2 birds in the South-west of Scotland.

Honey Buzzard *Pernis apivorus* **Orkney** 1 flew over Papa Westray on 29 Apr; **Highland** 1, probably the same bird, between Reay and Thurso on 13-14 Jun, and 1 over Aviemore on 10 Sep; **Fife** 1 on the Isle of May on 20 Oct; **Borders** 1 over Reston on 16 Sep.

- * Black Kite Milvus migrans Dumf & Gall 1 at Lochanhead, Stewartry Distict on 28 Aug (GRo) had been feeding on a dead rabbit by the roadside.
- * Red Kite Milvus milvus Strathclyde an immature bird near Crosshill, Maybole on 20 May (RHH).
- * White-tailed Eagle Haliaeetus albicilla The re-introduction programme reached another milestone, with 2 pairs breeding, 1 pair rearing 2 chicks and the other rearing 1. Wandering birds included the following:- Orkney immature between Stronsay and Deerness from 15 Jan-16 Feb, also sightings of immatures on Hoy on 23 Apr and 6 Jul; West Isles 5 records between 2 Jan and 29 Aug including a wing-tagged immature; Highland singles on Eigg on 26 Mar, and in Glen Meanie on 30 Sep.
- * Marsh Harrier Circus aeruginosus 17 in spring, and only 5 in autumn: Shetland 9/immature at Norwick from 7-12 May; Orkney single 99 on Westray on 19 Apr, and Holm on 3 May; Grampian singles at Strathbeg on 10 May, and Glenfiddich on 15 May; Highland 1 at Insh Marshes from 5-16 Jun, with 2 on 8 Jun, other singles from 4 Jul-7 Aug, and 11 Aug-18 Sep; Tayside 1 at Montrose

Basin on 9 Aug; **Fife** singles on the Isle of May on 27 and 28 Apr, and at Dunbog on 24 Aug; **Lothian** singles at North Berwick on 8 May, Gladhouse on 8 May, and Tailend Moss on 3 Sep; **Borders** singles on Coldingham Moor on 19 Apr-3 May, another on 8 May, 1 at Kelso on 7 May, and 1 off the sea at St Abbs on 9 May; **Strathclyde** 1 on Islay on 24 Apr; **Dumf & Gall** 9 at L Ken on 11-12 May.

Hen Harrier Circus cyaneus Breeding: in Orkney 45 nests were found on 2 islands, 15 successful nests producing 40 young; Lothian/Borders had 3 confirmed breeding reports with 2 more possible; Strathclyde produced a good year on Islay, but poor on Arran and Ayrshire with only 1 pair out of 10 succeeding; Dumf & Gall was poor with about half of 14 known sites not breeding, and only 2 successful nests found. Migrants/etc: Shetland 1 on Fair Isle from 29 Apr-1 May; West Isles 9 at Barvas, Lewis on 29 Oct; Dumf & Gall more remained on high ground during winter 1987-88, peak roost count was 16 in Dec.

Goshawk Accipiter gentilis Breeding: in **Northern Scotland** some success was achieved at 2 or 3 sites, but disappointing in one area; in **Central and Southern Scotland** a pair reared 2 young at one site, and there was some suggestion of consolidation in another area.

Sparrowhawk Accipiter nisus Breeding: in Orkney 6 pairs were recorded, and 4 were successful; in the Grampian W Moray study area 11 pairs failed, but productivity was good with 17 pairs rearing 71 young. Migrants: Shetland had up to 3 at Kergord during Jan-Mar and again from 9 Sep-25 Dec, and spring passage on Fair Isle occurred from 2 Apr-31 May probably involving about 10 birds, the autumn passage running from 1 Sep-26 Nov with 1-3 birds on many dates.

Buzzard Buteo buteo Breeding: in **Orkney** a pair laid 3 eggs and reared 1 young; **Highland** had a very good year in Lochaber; in the **Grampian** W Moray study area 23 sites were occupied, 18 pairs laid and all hatched but poor weather in early Jun resulted in only 15 broods fledging at an average of 1.8 young/successful pair; in **Lothian/Borders** stability was suggested in Borders Region, and a pair bred again in Lothian; in **Strathclyde** Arran's population dropped to 17 pairs; but **Dumf & Gall** had a good season. Migrants: **Shetland** 1 on Fetlar from 11-12 Apr.

* Rough-legged Buzzard Buteo lagopus Very few records with only about 6 birds involved: Shetland 1 in Spiggie/Fitful Head area from mid Oct-end Dec; West Isles singles at Tigharry, N Uist on 24 Jan, and Sollas, N Uist on 24 Sep; Fife 1 found moribund at Pitlessie on 25 Nov; Strathclyde singles on Islay on 12 Oct, and Mull on 17 Oct.

Golden Eagle *Aquila chrysaetos* Breeding: in **West Isles** continued harrassment of adults and young was recorded; in **North-east Scotland** a good success rate saw up to 18 young fledge; in **Strathclyde** in the long-standing Argyll study. 8 pairs reared 9 young from 12 pairs which laid eggs. 1 pair reared 2 young on Arran; and in **SW Scotland** 3 pairs each laid 2 eggs and a total of 2 young fledged.


Osprey Pandion haliaetus Breeding: 50 pairs had nests in Scotland, 44 pairs laid, and 30 successful pairs reared 56 young. Arrival was from 10 Mar, and some late individuals were reported. Migrants: Shetland singles on Unst from 7-10 May, and Fair Isle on 18 May; Orkney 1 over Keelylang, Orphir/Firth on 16 May; Highland late singles were seen on Rhum on 30 Sep, and at Lochindorb on 28 Oct; Dumf & Gall singles in 3 areas from 10 Mar.

* Lesser Kestrel Falco naumanni Shetland a σ on Fair Isle on 23 Jun (AGP.NJR) was the first record of this species in Scotland this century.

Kestrel Falco tinnunculus Breeding: in **Orkney** up to 14 pairs were recorded: in **Strathclyde** recovery occurred in Ayrshire from 1986 with an average year in which 3.6 young were produced per successful pair.

Merlin Falco columbarius Breeding: in Shetland 22 pairs nested, 16 pairs successfully rearing 52 young: in Orkney 8 pairs nested, 7 pairs rearing 21 young: North-east Scotland had a poor year in W Moray, but better elsewhere with 75 young fledging and 42 territories holding a pair, the average number of young being 3/successful nest: in South Scotland poor weather caused problems in some areas, but 31 successful nests produced 94+ young. Migrants: Shetland autumn passage on Fair Isle ran from 22 Aug-25 Nov with a peak of 3 birds on 12 and 17 Oct.

* Hobby Falco subbuteo Up to 9 birds recorded: Shetland 1 at Eshaness on 23 Jun, and 1 on Fair Isle on 5 Jul; Orkney 1 on North Ronaldsay on 14 Sep; Highland 1 at Boat of Garten on 20 Jul, and 2 at Insh Marshes between 24 Aug and 29 Sep; Grampian 1 at Inverkeithny on 15 Jul; Fife singles at Tentsmuir Pt on 7 Sep, and Fife Ness on 13 Oct.

Peregrine Falco peregrinus Breeding: some areas reported a better year with improved numbers, e.g. **West Isles.** In Scotland 309 home ranges had birds present, and 158 successful pairs reared a total of 337 young.

Red Grouse Lagopus lagopus As usual, the best returns came from the East of Scotland. **Grampian** a good year in Upper Moray with shooting bags well up on several estates, similarly good numbers recorded after an early breeding season in the northern half of area, but both lower Deeside and Stonehaven study area showed low numbers; **Lothian/Borders** a better year with decreased chick mortality; **Strathclyde/Dumf & Gall** continues generally scarce.

Ptarmigan Lagopus mutus In Grampian the species had another bad year in Moray with heavy chick losses due to poor summer weather, but the spring stock in both the Cairnwell hills and Cairngorms was high, and breeding was both early and good, with some losses in May-Jun snowstorms; in **Strathclyde** 3 pairs probably bred on Arran.

Black Grouse *Tetrao tetrix* Numbers seem most stable in the Central and Eastern Highlands. **Grampian** increase noted in Forest of Birse where 40-60 on 17 Jan, numbers stable in Glen Tanar, and breeding succes was said to be fair; **Tayside** apparent increase in E Perthshire, and up to 90 of and 1999 at 12 leks in N Perthshire; **SW Strathclyde/Dumf & Gall** decrease continues in parts of the SW.

Capercaillie *Tetrao urogallus* Numbers still appear to be low in many areas. **Highland** 28 in North Abernethy on 10 Jan; **Grampian** increase in sightings in Darnaway area, but another poor year elsewhere.

Red-legged Partridge Alectoris rufa (most records of this species refer to Red-leg x Chukar hybrids) The following areas reported an increase in sightings and releases:-Highland/Grampian/Fife/Borders; in Strathclyde releases on Islay included at least 1 pure-bred Chukar (A chukar).

Grey Partridge Perdix perdix Breeding success varied greatly, with the best success in the East: Highland an increase in reports from Caithness District included a pair with 11 young at Dunnet; Grampian low success in Moray District, but increasing at Strathbeg; Tayside/Fife good season suggested in many areas; Dumf & Gall decline continues almost everywhere.

* Quail Coturnix coturnix Up to 18 birds reported: Shetland singles on Fetlar from 10-12 Jul, and on Fair Isle on 26 Aug; Orkney 1 found dead at Firth on 6 Jun; West Isles 1-3 at Balranald on 14 Aug; Highland 1 at Reiss on 21 Jun; Tayside 1 at Errol on 9 May; Fife 1 near Kirkcaldy from 9-13 Aug; Lothian 5 recorded between 10 May and 28 Aug; Borders 1 at Auchencrow during Jun, also a report of birds released at Bowhill; Strathelyde 1 near Prestwick from 14-19 Jul, with 2 on 15 Jul; Dumf & Gall 1 at Cairnsmore of Fleet NNR on 28 May.

† Reeve's Pheasant Syrmaticus reevesii Lothian 2 oo at Archerfield during the year were thought to have been released in 1985.

Pheasant Phasianus colchicus Lothian 15 territories at Aberlady is an increase on 1986; Dumf & Gall 6500 released at Hensol.

† Golden Pheasant Chrysolophus pictus Strathclyde a small feral population persists on Mull; Dumf & Gall now scarce in main areas, 1 at Moffat on 14 Oct was outwith normal area.

Water Rail Rallus aquaticus Breeding: **Orkney** a pair bred for the first time since 1968 on North Ronaldsay; **Strathclyde** 17+ pairs were recorded from 10 sites. Migrants: **Shetland** singles were noted on Fair Isle up to 12 May, and from 8 Oct-8 Dec, with 2 on 13 Nov, elsewhere on Shetland singles were reported from 8 locations mainly in Nov.

* Spotted Crake Porzana porzana A better year, with up to 13 birds reported: Shetland singles on Fair Isle on 4 May, Out Skerries on 5 Oct, and Fair Isle from 13-14 Oct; Orkney 1 found dead on Sanday on 4 Oct; West Isles 1 at Askernish, S Uist from 24 Apr-2 Jul; Highland 5-7 singing birds were heard on Insh Marshes between 26 May and 6 Jul; Strathclyde 1 at Aird Meadow from 14-21 May; Dumf & Gall 1 at L Ken on 10 Jun.

Corncrake Crex crex Breeding numbers showed signs of stability in the Northern and Western Isles: Orkney more reports, with up to 21 calling birds and 1 nest found - 1st heard on 20 Apr; West Isles population apparently showed no change in 1987 - 1st in S Uist on 24 Apr, last bird at Uig. Lewis on 3 Oct; Strathclyde a minimum of 98 calling birds on Tiree, and 20 on Coll. Other records (mostly calling birds or migrants): Shetland calling singles at Haroldswick from 31 May-13 Jul, and Baltasound from 8-30 Jun, migrant birds at Fair Isle on 23 Jun, 6, and 13-14 Oct, and at Quendale from 20-21 Oct; Highland about 10 individuals reported from Caithness District between 28 May and 26 Jun; Grampian singles at Glen Clunie on 25 May, and Tillylodge on 20 Sep; Borders 1 at Hassington from 5-6 Jun; Strathclyde 2-3 called at Shiskine, Arran from 28 May-27 Jul, and breeding may have occurred, singles near Drongan on 20-24 May, Tarbolton in mid-May, and near Drymen from end May-early Jun; Dumf & Gall 1 at Stranraer on 11 Aug.

Moorhen *Gallinula chloropus* Breeding: **West Isles** a juvenile on Lewis on 12 Aug was unusual since the species was thought to be extinct in the area: **Borders** 22 broods produced 56 juveniles: **Strathclyde** 110-116 pairs were recorded from 18 sites in the inner Clyde area. Counts/passage: **Orkney** 40 on Crantit Ponds on 16 Jan: **Tayside** 79 on Forfar L in Jan; **Strathclyde** 52 at Baron's Haugh on 6 Sep.

Coot Fulica atra Breeding: Borders 207 pairs found, with 72 broods producing 230 young. Counts: Orkney peak count was 393 Loch of Stenness on 17 Jan: West Isles 1 on Lewis on 20 May was also unusual since it was regarded as extinct here: Highland 260+ on L Scarmclate on 29 Sep: Grampian 550 at Strathbeg on 12 Sep: Tayside 960 on Forfar L at end-Aug, 1180 on L Leven on 11 Oct: Fife 520 on Kilconquhar L on 22 Sep: Central 342 on L of Menteith on 15 Nov: Lothian 618 at Linlithgow on 13 Dec: Borders 519 at Yetholm on 13 Dec: Strathclyde 420 on Hogganfield L on 24 Jan: Dumf & Gall 330 on L Ken in Dec.

* Crane Grus grus Shetland singles on Fair Isle on 4 Jun (MrsCT), and Exnaboe, Mainland on 5 Jun (RLH): Orkney a pair at L of Boardhouse, Birsay from 27 Apr-2 May (GC,BS et al): Highland a pair at Insh Marshes from 3-9 May (ZB)ø: Grampian 2 frequented the Strypes-Teindland area from 25 May-9 Jun (MJHC,MB,RHH), IN at Newburgh on 12 Sep (KD,AJL et al)ø: Borders 2 at Reston from 8-15 May were seen flying N at St Abbs on 16 May (AB,DG,KJR): Strathclyde adult near Trabboch from 15-25 Oct (DBG,WR): Dumf & Gall 1 at Cummertrees/Priestside Bank from 27 Oct-21 Nov (perADW) may have been the Strathclyde bird.

Oystercatcher Haematopus ostralegus Breeding: Shetland only 50 pairs located on Fair Isle; Orkney over 830 pairs or nests recorded; Highland 104 pairs on Eigg had a very successful season; Strathclyde estimates gave 300 pairs on Tiree, and 100 pairs on Coll. Counts/passage: Highland/Grampian peak counts were 2586 in Findhorn Bay, and 2537 at Nairn-Culbin Bars on 18 Jan, and 4527 in Cromarty and Inverness Firths on 20 Dec; Tayside 4200 in Montrose Basin in Feb; Fife 4100 at Eden estuary on 17 Jan; Lothian Musselburgh held 2270 in Nov; Strathclyde 3596 in Clyde estuary on 15 Feb; Dumf & Gall high counts included 17,000 at Caerlaverock on 22 Nov, and 6900 at Southerness on 25 Nov.

- * Avocet Recurvirostra avosetta Grampian 1 at Cults from 24-31 Oct (BJS et al); Lothian 1N at Barns Ness on 8 Apr (MP), same at Tyninghame from 9-13 Apr (IJA,MG et al), and 2 at Aberlady on 2 May (MG,BDG,PRG,GLS).
- * Stone Curlew Burhinus oedicnemus Grampian 1 at Dunphail from 4-7 Jun (ST).
- * Pratincole sp Glareola pratincola/G nordmanni Shetland 1 near Uyeasound, Unst on 25 May (IS).
- * Little Ringed Plover Charadrius dubius In Central Scotland 2 birds were seen at one site between 6 May and 28 Jun, breeding not proven but distraction display given, area was bulldozed later.

Ringed Plover Charadrius hiaticula Breeding: Shetland had a good season; Orkney up to 63 pairs recorded; Lothian 27 pairs bred at Aberlady; Strathclyde estimates gave 200 pairs on Tiree, 20-30 pairs on Coll, and 61 pairs at 19 inland sites in the inner Clyde area. Counts/passage: Grampian very heavy passage with a peak of 1500 in Findhorn Bay on 8 May; Fife 700 at Tayport on 19 May; Dumf & Gall 800 at Newbie on 13 May.

Dotterel Charadrius morinellus Breeding: **Highland/Grampian** snowfalls in Jun killed many chicks in Northern part of area, but success was higher in the South. Migrants: **Shetland** an exceptional year with 3 on 13 May and 1 on 24 May, in the autumn 1 on Yell on 6 Aug preceded 7 at Uyeasound on 27 Aug, Fair Isle records comprised 3 on 11 Aug, and 1 on 28 Aug; **Orkney** 3 at Deerness on 16 May, 2 other singles between 20-30 May, and 1 on 17 Aug; **West Isles** 7 at Rangehead, S Uist on 2 May; 06 Highland 1 on Cairngorm on 30 Apr; **Borders** had trips of 4 on 5 May, 6 on 25 May and 2 on 29 May; **Strathclyde/Dumf & Gall** had a good spring with 5 in Glen Etive on 30 Apr, 2 on Islay on 13 May, and 5 at High Auchneel on 5 May.

* American Golden Plover Pluvialis dominica Shetland 1 on Fair Isle from 28 Sep-11 Oct (ABa,NB,BR et al).

Golden Plover Pluvialis apricaria Breeding: Orkney 52 pairs were recorded; Strathclyde 42 pairs were recorded at 6 sites in the SE; Dumf & Gall shows signs of decrease except perhaps on highest ground. Counts/passage peaks included Orkney 2000 on Stronsay from Nov-Dec; Highland 1050 at Killimster on 17 Oct; Grampian 1300 at Oldmeldrum on 12 Sep; Fife 1400 at Fife Ness on 1 Sep; Lothian the mild winter saw flocks of 200 on Braid Hills on 5 and 22 Dec and at Gilmerton on 26 Dec; Strathclyde 1000 on Tiree from Jan-mid Apr, 3200 near Carnwath on 20 Sep; Dumf & Gall 1050 at Caerlaverock on 28 Dec.

Grey Plover Pluvialis squatarola West Isles 114 at South Ford in Jan; Grampian Ythan peak was 43 on 11 Oct; Fife 480 at Eden estuary on 15 Feb; Lothian a record regional count of 510 was recorded at Aberlady on 18 Mar; Strathclyde 28 on coast of Tiree on 25-26 Jan; Dumf & Gall 80 at Caerlaverock on 4 Jan.

Lapwing *Vanellus* vanellus Breeding: **Orkney** over 490 pairs were recorded; **Lothian** decline at 4 sites from 71-73 pairs in 1986 to 46-52 pairs. Counts/passage: many overwintered into 1988 due to the mild weather; **Orkney** 1500 on St Ola on 30 Dec; **Tayside** 3050 at L Leven on 11 Oct; **Central** 1172 on Forth estuary on 20 Dec; **Lothian** the highest flock count was 2000 at Braid Hills on 5 Dec; **Borders** 2500 at Redden on 27 Aug; **Strathelyde** 11,750 between Lamington and Hyndford Bridge on 5 Sep. 5498 on Clyde estuary on 22 Nov.

Knot Calidris canutus **Shetland** autumn passage began on 11 Jul; **Tayside** 2000 in Montrose Basin in Jan; **Fife** 2000 at Largo Bay on 8 Jan, and 1400 at Eden estuary on 17 Jan; **Central** 4045 at Kinneil on 20 Dec; **Lothian** Aberlady held 3950 on 28 Jan; **Dumf & Gall** 4000 in Gillfoot Bay, and 1300 at Southerness on 15 Nov.

Sanderling Calidris alba Winter-spring: Grampian 69 between Blackdog and Ythan on 14 Mar; Tayside 400 in the outer Tay area in Feb: Fife 260 at Tentsmuir Pt on 15 Feb: Lothian 151 at Aberlady on 31 May; Strathclyde 353 on coast of Tiree on 25-26 Jan. Autumn: Shetland passage began on 14 Jul; Orkney the peak count was 384 on North Ronaldsay on 7 Sep; Tayside 450 in the outer Tay on 17 Dec; Lothian the Tyninghame peak was 160 on 22 Jul.


Little Stint Calidris minuta Spring: Shetland singles on Fair Isle on 5, and 7 May; Fife 1 at Anstruther on 3 May; Lothian 2 at Musselburgh from 14-16 Jun; Strathclyde 3 on Tiree on 10 Jun. Autumn passage was again poor and numbers in most areas were low: Shetland 1-3 on Fair Isle on 11 dates from 13 Aug-22 Sep, and 1 at Virkie on 14 Aug followed by 1-5 from 5 locations on Mainland and Unst, the last being on Virkie on 9 Oct: Orkney scarce with only 4-5 birds between 19 Aug and 7 Oct: West Isles 20+ at Borve, Benbecula on 13 Aug, 10 at Luskentyre, Harris on 18 Aug; Highland had 2 between 11 and 29 Sep; Grampian Lossiemouth had 4 on 15 Aug, 19 and 27 Sep, and Culbin Bar had 7 on 31 Aug, Peterhead-St Fergus held 10 on 22 Sep; Tayside had a late bird at Carsebreck on 31 Oct: Lothian passage began on 20 Jul, but peaks were only 3 at Aberlady on 25-30 Aug, and 3 Pefferside on 30 Aug; Strathclyde/Dumf & Gall 2 at L Indaal, Islay on 16-17 Sep, and 10 birds in SW between 19 Aug and 15 Sep.

Temminck's Stint Calidris temminckii Breeding: 4 broods were seen in usual area. Migrants: **Shetland** 1 on Fair Isle from 25-26 May, 2 at Baltasound from 27-28 May; **Tayside** 1 at Kinkell Bridge on 1 Jun; **Central** 1 at L Tay on 12 Jul; **Lothian** 1 at Musselburgh on 24 Jun.

* Pectoral Sandpiper Calidris melanotos Highland 1 at Sandside Bay on 7 Oct; Central 1 at Cambus from 24-25 May, and 1 at Kinneil Kerse on 8 Sep; Lothian a juvenile at Musselburgh on 4-5 Sep; Strathclyde 1 An Fhaodaill on 17 Sep. and 1 near Carnwath from 30 Sep-3 Oct.

Curlew Sandpiper Calidris ferruginea Spring: Orkney 1 at L of Tankerness on 13 Jun: Grampian 1 at Findhorn Bay on 19 Apr. 1 at Meikle from 23-25 May, and 5 on the Ythan on 25 May: Central 1 at Skinflats on 17 May: Lothian 1 at Aberlady from 24-25 Apr: Strathclyde 1 at Bogside on 26 May. Autumn passage was generally poor with low numbers in most areas: Shetland 1 at Virkie on 18 Jul, but only 13 other birds up to 25 Oct: Orkney had 9-12 birds between 12 Aug and 16 Oct: Highland 3 on Wick River on 4 Sep. and 4 more singles from 5 Sep-3 Oct: Tayside had c9 birds between 28 Jul and 11 Oct: Grampian 3 in Findhorn Bay on 13 Aug. then 10 on 20 Sep. and 14 on the Ythan on 30 Aug: Fife had 12 birds between 8 Aug and 27 Sep: Central up to 5 at Kinneil between 30 Sep and 18 Oct: Lothian's peak was only 3 Aberlady on 18 Aug: Strathclyde had c9 birds between 5 Sep and 3 Oct. with a late bird at Westport on 7 Nov.

Purple Sandpiper Calidris maritima Counts/passage: Shetland 1st back on Fair Isle was on 14 Jul. 80 at Sandness on 13 Nov: Orkney recorded a high total of 1222 on Sanday on 25-27 Jan: Highland 1 at Mey on 9 Jul. autumn peak was 90 at Sandside on 29 Dec: Grampian 224 at Buckie on 14 Feb. 344 between Fraserburgh and Rosehearty on 15 Apr: Tayside 200 at Arbroath on 4 Jan: Lothian Gullane-North Berwick held 155 in Feb: Strathclyde 288 on the coast of Tiree on 25-26 Jan. 125 at Girvan on 16 Apr: Dumf & Gall 32 at Southerness on 25 Oct.



Dunlin Calidris alpina Breeding: **Orkney** up to 53 pairs were recorded; **Lothian** a pair failed at Musselburgh, but 2 young were seen at Tyninghame on 20 Jun; **Borders** up to 7 pairs were seen at 3 sites; **Strathelyde** estimates gave 250-300 pairs on Tiree, and 20 pairs on Coll. Counts/passage: **Orkney** 1394 on Sanday from 25-27 Jan; **Highland/Grampian** 1150 at Redcastle on 17 Jan, and 1921 at Nairn-Culbin Bars on 18 Jan; **Tayside** 2500 in outer Tay area in Feb, and 2500 in Montrose Basin in Dec; **Fife** 1800 at Eden estuary on 17 Jan; **Central** 4614 in Forth estuary on 20 Dec; **Lothian** the Aberlady peak was 1900 on 15 Feb, while Dalmeny held 2100 in Dec; **Strathelyde** 964 on Clyde estuary on 18 Jan; **Dumf & Gall** peak count was 5350 at Caerlaverock on 11 Nov.

- * Broad-billed Sandpiper Limicola falcinellus Shetland 1 at Urafirth, Mainland on 26 May (JND).
- * Buff-breasted Sandpiper Tryngites subruficollis Strathclyde 1 at Killean, Kintyre on 20 Jun (AJR).

Ruff Philomachus pugnax Winter: in the North Orkney had 2 at Tankerness on 4 Jan, Grampian 1 at Nairn on 8 Jan, Fife singles at Eden estuary on 2 Jan, and Inverkeithing on 16 Jan and 8 Mar, Lothian 2 at Prestonpans in Feb-Mar, and Dumf & Gall 4 singles from Feb-Apr. Spring passage was good and included singles on Lewis and Balranald, West Isles between 25 May and 3 Jun, 3 at Noss Head Highland on 3 Jun, a peak of 19 at Strathbeg, Grampian on 19 Apr, and 7 near Maybole, Strathclyde from 16-19 Apr. By contrast the autumn was very poor with the highest numbers being 19 at Shebster, Highland on 13 Sep, 11 at Meikle, Grampian on 12 Sep, 11 at West Haven, Tayside on 21 Aug, 11 at Eden estuary, Fife on 13 Aug, 39 at Bogside, Strathclyde on 19 Sep, and 37 near Carnwath, Strathclyde on 20 Sep. Wintering birds included 1 at Gosford, Lothian on 30 Nov, and 2 at Ruthwell, Strathclyde on 27 Dec.

Jack Snipe *Lymnocryptes minimus* Generally low numbers, the highest counts being a peak of 8 on Fair Isle, **Shetland** on 29 Sep, 9 on North Ronaldsay, **Orkney** in Oct, 6 at Kinneil, **Central** on 17 Jan, and 14 at Paisley Moss, **Strathclyde** on 23 Nov. Autumn arrival was from 15 Sep on Fair Isle, **Shetland**.

Snipe Gallinago gallinago Breeding: **Shetland** 21 drumming birds counted on Fair Isle; **Strathclyde** up to 500-1000 pairs estimated on Tiree, and 200-400 pairs on Coll. Counts/passage: **Shetland** 100 at Spiggie/Brow on 13 Oct; **Orkney** 225 on North Ronaldsay on 8 Oct; **Strathclyde** 200 at New Cumnock on 16 Aug.

- * Great Snipe Gallinago media Shetland at least 4 birds on Fair Isle with 1 on 26-27 Aug (SJA,NJR), 1 from 15-18 Sep (RJA,NJR), 1 from 17-24 Oct (NJR,STh,JW), and 1 from 4-6 Nov (SJA et al).
- * Long-billed Dowitcher Limnodromus scolopaceus Highland an adult near Arisaig on 23 Jul (GFJB).

Woodcock Scolopax rusticola Counts/passage: **Shetland** the spring passage peak on Fair Isle was 10 on 11 Apr, autumn passage started on 30 Sep with peaks of 25 on 21 Oct and 100 on 9 Nov; **Grampian** had a poor autumn passage, and low autumn numbers were reported from most other areas.

Black-tailed Godwit *Limosa limosa* Breeding: **Shetland** 1 pair reared 2 young at usual site; **Tayside** pairs at 2 sites but no evidence of nesting. Counts/passage: **Orkney** 50 over Widewall Bay, South Ronaldsay on 5 Jul; **Highland** 24 at Longman on 16 Oct, and 24 at Lentran on 25 Oct; **Grampian** had a high count of 26 in Findhorn Bay on 15 Sep; **Fife** the Eden estuary peak was 146 on 10 Apr; **Strathclyde** 30 at L Bhassapol, Tiree on 21 Apr; **Dumf & Gall** numbers on the Nith were low.

Bar-tailed Godwit *Limosa lapponica* Counts/passage: **Orkney** 601 on Sanday between 25 and 27 Jan: **Highland/Grampian** 1860 at Nairn-Culbin Bars on 15 Feb. and an unusual record of 800NE at Glenfintaig on 28 Feb: **Tayside** 1500 in the outer Tay in Oct; **Fife** 1800 at Eden estuary on 17 Jan, and 1500 at Tayport on 17 Feb: **Lothian** the Aberlady peak was 2300 on 15 Feb: **Dumf & Gall** 950 at Gillfoot on 22 Nov.

Whimbrel *Numenius phaeopus* Breeding: **Shetland** had a poor year with most pairs on suboptimal habitat failing to rear young: **Orkney** had between 7 and 10 pairs breeding or attempting. Spring passage began with a very early bird at Eden estuary. **Fife** on 1 Mar. Passage figures included:

Shetland with peaks on Fair Isle of 12 on 9 May and 14 on 26 Jul, and a late bird on 11 Oct; Grampian with an early bird in the Fraserburgh area on 21 Mar, 15S at Peterhead on 16 Aug, and a late bird at Foveran on 23 Oct; Fife with 30 on Isle of May on 30 Aug, and a late bird there on 19 Oct; Lothian where the 1st bird was on 12 Apr, Tyninghame with 34 on 22 Jul, and a late single on 31 Oct; Borders with 122 birds recorded between 27 Jun and 3 Oct; and Strathclyde where a heavy spring passage involved 47 at Martnaham Loch on 5-6 May, and 100+ on Tiree on 11 May, the last autumn bird was seen on Islay on 6 Nov.

Curlew *Numenius arquata* Counts/passage: **Orkney** 1500 at Work Skerry on 23 Oct; **Grampian** 1354 at Ythan estuary on 16 Aug; **Central** 953 in Forth estuary on 15 Feb; **Strathclyde** 2300 near Carnwath on 20 Sep, 1027 at Greenan, Ayr on 12 Sep; **Dumf & Gall** 3300 at Caerlaverock on 20 Aug.

Spotted Redshank *Tringa erythropus* Winter-spring: Shetland 2 in the Spiggie/Virkie/Hillwell area from 30 Apr-6 May, another on Unst on 16 May; West Isles 2-4 singles on Benbecula and Harris between 2 Jan and 1 Apr; Grampian 1 in Findhorn Bay on 10 May; Tayside 1 in Montrose Basin on 12 Apr; Fife 1 at Eden estuary on 26 Apr; Central 1 at Cambus Pool on 1 Jun; Lothian 1 at Tyninghame on 14, and 18 Apr; Strathclyde singles at Cardross from 2-17 Jan, and at Doonfoot on 12 Mar. Autumn summary:

Greenshank Tringa nebularia Breeding: Shetland sites not checked although young seen at 3 locations; Highland birds present at 6 potential breeding sites in Caithness District. Counts/passage: Grampian 17 in Findhorn Bay on 19 Aug; Fife 13 at Eden estuary on 24 Sep; Central max 15 at Kinneil on 13 Aug; Lothian higher numbers than usual with 16 at Aberlady on 15 and 31 Aug, and 18 at Tyninghame on 6 Sep; Strathclyde autumn peaks included 22 between Lamington and Hyndford Bridge on 30 Aug, and 19 from Woodhall-Cardross on 25 Oct; Dumf & Gall 11 at Caerlaverock on 3 Sep. Wintering birds: Highland 1 wintered in Caithness District in Feb and Dec, elsewhere 7 in Jan, 4 in Dec; Grampian winter maxima were 6 in Jan, and 8 in Dec; Fife had 3 in Jan, and 1 in Dec; Lothian 3 at Tyninghame from Jan-9 Apr, 4-5 birds in Nov-Dec; Borders 3 at Tweedbank on 7 Nov, and 1 at Hule Moss on 26 Dec; Strathclyde 4 or 5 wintered on Tiree and Mull (Jan, Dec), 5-6 birds wintered in SW in Jan, and up to 17 in Dec.

Green Sandpiper Tringa ochropus Winter-spring: Shetland 10 birds between 23 Apr and 27 May; Orkney 1 on North Ronaldsay on 2 May; West Isles 1 at Liniclate. Benbecula on 18 Jun: Grampian 1 at Don on 10 May; Tayside 1 near Barry Buddon on 18-19 Apr; Lothian 1 at Tyninghame on 13 Mar; Strathclyde wintering singles were found in Jan at Erskine harbour, and Barr L. with 2 at Coulter, passage singles appeared at Barr L from 24-27 Apr, and on Islay on 17 May. A good autumn passage involved about 136 birds, with 25 in Grampian. 17 in Lothian, and 23 in Strathclyde. Passage in autumn spanned the dates from 23 Jun-31 Oct. Winter: Borders 1 on Oxnam Water from 7 Nov; Strathclyde 1 at Balfron on 9 Dec; Dumf & Gall 1 at Caerlaverock on 21 Dec.

Wood Sandpiper *Tringa glareola* Breeding: Highland at one site from 7 May-10 Jul, one brood on 10 Jun and probable second brood on 10 Jul, pair with young at another site on 26 Jun, and singles at another site on 22 and 24 May, with 2 on 7 Jun. Passage birds: Shetland up to 9 birds between 17 May and 5 Jun, in autumn up to 13 birds between 18 Jul and 6 Sep, with a very late individual at Catfirth from 23 Oct-8 Nov: Orkney singles on Sanday on 30 Apr and North Ronaldsay on 4-6 Jun, 1 at The Loons on 29-30 Sep; West Isles singles at Vatersay on 20 May, and

Spring arrival: early birds noted in Grampian where 1 at the Ythan on 7 Feb, Borders where 1 at Tushielaw on 29 Mar, Mull Strathclyde with 1 on 5 Apr, and Shetland with 1 on Fair Isle on 6 Apr. Counts: Shetland peak of 15 on Fair Isle on 20 Jul; Lothian 1 at Musselburgh on 13 Apr, peak of 20 at Tyninghame on 9 Jul; Strathclyde 27 at Bogside on 27 Jul. Late singles: Oct birds were seen in Shetland, Orkney, Grampian, Tayside, Fife, and Lothian, while 1 at Cambus, Central on 21 Nov was exceptionally late.

Turnstone Arenaria interpres Counts: **Shetland** spring passage peak of 350 on Fair Isle on 28 Mar; **Orkney** Sanday peak was 1309 on 25-27 Jan; **Grampian** 743 between Fraserburgh and Rosehearty on 15 Apr; **Tayside** 500+ between Carnoustie and Elliot in Dec; **Lothian** Musselburgh held 930 on 29 Apr, and Gullane-Tyninghame had 710 in Nov; **Strathclyde** 1196 on coast of Tiree on 25-26 Jan.

* Wilson's Phalarope Phalaropus tricolor Grampian a juvenile in Findhorn Bay from 8-13 Sep (RAM,RP); Lothian 1 at Aberlady and Musselburgh on 29 Aug was presumed to be the same bird (AAG,PRG,LLJV).

Red-necked Phalarope *Phalaropus lobatus* Breeding: **Shetland,** arrival on Fetlar on 22 May, 12 broods located, and 2 pairs nested at another site, last 1 on Fetlar was on 1 Aug; no breeding recorded on **West Isles**: **Strathclyde** 3 birds present at 1 site in Jun. Passage: **Orkney** \circ on Westray on 14 Jun; **West Isles** \circ on St Kilda from 2-22 Jun.

* Grey Phalarope Phalaropus fulicarius Shetland 1 at Grutness on 13 Sep; West Isles large nos in Sep gales, 11 in Uists and Benbecula between 6 and 29 Sep, another on 22 Oct, 5 in Minch on 14 Sep; Highland 1 off Sandside Head on 31 Jan: Borders 1 at Mayfield on 18 Oct.

Pomarine Skua Stercorarius pomarinus An overwintering bird appeared in Grampian off Lossiemouth on 29 Dec. Spring: Shetland 1 off Unst on 20 May, then 11 at Wats Ness on 21-22 May, 1 off Sumburgh on 26 May: West Isles 936 passed N Uist between 10 and 19 May: Strathclyde a few flocks on Tobermory-Coll crossing totalled 140 on 12 May. Autumn passage: Orkney 7 between 26 Jul and 28 Sep; Highland 5 at Dunnet Bay on 8 Sep. 1 at Chanonry on 20 Nov; Grampian peaks included 8N at Newtonhill on 8 Aug, and 6 at Buckie on 26 Aug; Tayside 7 between 7 Aug and 8 Oct; Fife only 10 seen between 26 Aug and 17 Nov; Central 2 at Kinneil on 4 Oct; Lothian peak counts were 10S at Barns Ness on 26 Aug, and 14W at Hound Pt on 23 Nov; Strathclyde/Dumf & Gall an outstanding autumn in SW with up to 16 birds between 2 Aug and 20 Sep.

Arctic Skua Stercorarius parasiticus Breeding: Shetland increase to 23 nests at Hermaness, but decline noted on Noss, and poor season on Fetlar, 95 pairs on Fair Isle: Orkney 310 pairs located with 1st eggs on 14 May; Highland 18-22 pairs were located at 9 sites in Caithness District; Strathclyde a survey revealed 47-52 pairs on Coll, and 45-50 pairs on Jura. Wintering birds: Lothian singles were noted at Musselburgh on 2, and 12 Jan. Migration: Shetland last 1 at Sumburgh on 8 Nov: Orkney seen from 12 Apr, large movement of 80-100E in 30 minutes at Scapa on 3 Sep; Grampian 76N and 75S in 4 hours at Peterhead on 7 Aug; Fife 35S at Fife Ness on 23 Aug; Lothian 123S Barns Ness on 26 Aug; Borders heavy movement of 88S at Eyemouth on 22 Aug, 1 at Roxburgh on 11-18 Nov died later: Strathclyde autumn peaks in SW were 15 on 5 Sep, and 9 Sep.

Long-tailed Skua Stercorarius longicaudus Shetland 2 at Wats Ness on 20 May preceded 51 there on 21 May, singles off Fair Isle on 17 May and 7 Aug. 1 dead at Eshaness on 3 Nov; Orkney 6NE at Scapa Flow on 12 May, singles off Evie on 13 Jun. Papa Westray on 10 Aug. and North Ronaldsay on 31 Aug; West Isles 105 passed N Uist between 10 and 19 May; Fife juvenile at Aberdour on 20 Sep: Lothian singles at Musselburgh on 13 Aug. Barns Ness on 27 Aug. with another on 4 Oct: Borders 1 at St Abbs on 27 Jul; Strathclyde 2 between Tobermory and Coll on 12 May, and 2 off Tiree on 13 May.

Great Skua Stercorarius skua Breeding: Shetland 850 pairs at Hermaness colony, 72 pairs on Fair Isle: Orkney up to 280 pairs located: West Isles 40-47 pairs on Hirta: Highland 4 pairs were found at 2 sites in Caithness District. Winter: Fife 1N at Fife Ness on 6 Dec; Lothian 6 records of Jan birds included 2 at Musselburgh on 13 Jan. 

Counts: **Grampian** Skene held 34,000 on 7 Nov; **Fife** 6000 at Leven on 8 Jan; **Lothian** 5000 at Musselburgh on 25 Jan; **Strathclyde** 27,000 were roosting in the Clyde estuary on 15 Feb

* Ring-billed Gull Larus delawarensis Shetland a 1st summer bird at Hillwell from 27 Apr-9 May (PVH et al); Strathclyde adult at Doonfoot from 19 Jan-28 Feb (RHH et al), and a 1st winter bird at Ardnave, Islay on 21 Apr (SH,JS).

Common Gull *Larus canus* Breeding: **Orkney** 1177 pairs were recorded; **Grampian** 600-700 pairs at Mortlach; **Strathclyde** 350 pairs reared at least 200 young at L. Thom. Counts: **Shetland** passage on Fair Isle from 12 Apr-1 May with a peak of 70 on 20 Apr, in autumn 210 on 13 Aug; **Lothian** 5000 at Musselburgh on 1 Feb; **Strathclyde** 15,000 at Doonfoot from early-mid Oct.

Lesser Black-backed Gull Larus fuscus Breeding: Orkney had up to 250 pairs; Highland 70 pairs on Rhum; Lothian 3663 nests were counted on the Forth islands; Strathclyde 1500 nests were estimated on Ailsa Craig, 129 pairs on Tiree, up to 152 pairs on Coll, and an increase in roof-top nesting was noticed in Dumbarton, Cumbernauld, and elsewhere; Dumf & Gall 1500 nests were counted at Almorness Pt. Counts/passage: Shetland late arrival of 6 on Fair Isle on 9 Apr, post breeding influx of 165 on 10 Jul; Highland 1 at L Garten on 25 Jan; Lothian 260 in 2 hours at Barns Ness on 29 Mar; Strathclyde a huge roost of 4500 at Strathclyde Park on 9 Sep. Winter: usual small nos in South Scotland Jan/Dec, but 95 at Balgray, Strathclyde on 23 Dec may have been due to milder winter weather. Other races: Lf fuscus 11 birds were recorded in Northern Scotland between 18 Mar and 29 May. Counts: **Shetland** 180 at Spiggie on 16 Feb; **Orkney** 700 at Aikerness, Westray on 8 Jul; **Grampian** 500 at Lossiemouth on 26 Apr, 1370 at Strathbeg on 17 Oct; **Fife** 900 on Isle of May on 7 Oct.

* Ross's Gull Rhodostethia rosea Grampian adult at Girdle Ness from 26-28 Sep (KAS,KDS et al).

Kittiwake Rissa tridactyla Breeding: Shetland 4350 nests were found on Foula (a decrease of 22% since 1977), decline also noted on North Unst where 4243 nests (4367 in 1981), productivity at monitored sites on Fair Isle produced 1.00 chicks/nest, but gales resulted in much higher than average post-fledging mortality; Orkney 5210 pairs on Rousay, increase in nests of 11.6% at monitored sites: Highland 3646 nests were counted at 3 sites in Caithness District, and 2213 nests were found on Rhum; Grampian both Moray colonies showed increases; Fife 6765 nests (highest ever number) on Isle of May suffered massive chick mortality in early Aug; Lothian over 4000 nests were counted on 5 Forth islands, 495 pairs at Dunbar showed a productivity rate of 1.41 large young/nest; Borders increase to 23,094 nests mostly at St Abbs; Strathclyde 2988 nests were counted on Ailsa Craig, but success rate was very low; Dumf & Gall 66 nests on Scare Rocks on 14 Jun. Counts/passage: Orkney 6000/hour off Mull Head, Papa Westray on 13 Jul; Grampian 14,600N and 860S in 2 hours at Peterhead on 27 Sep; Central '60W at Kinneil on 21 Mar.

- * Gull-billed Tern Gelochelidon nilotica West Isles 1 at Drimsdale, S Uist from 3-6 May (TJD,AH,DBJ).

Winter: Highland/Grampian 1 off Peterhead on 13 Feb, and 1 at Nairn on 15 and 22 Feb was possibly the same bird. Counts/passage: Orkney seen from 30 Mar-6 Nov: West Isles 15 sightings from Jul-Sep; Grampian 1N at Peterhead on 19 Mar, 337 at Lossiemouth on 13 Aug; Fife 1500+ at

Tentsmuir Pt on 3 Aug, a late bird at Anstruther on 31 Oct; Lothian peak count was 420 at Aberlady in Jul, late singles at Gullane Pt on 28 and 29 Nov; Strathclyde 1 near Girvan on 29 Mar.

Roseate Tern *Sterna dougallii* Breeding: **Lothian** 20 nests were found on Inchmickery. Counts/passage: **West Isles** 1 off Benbecula on 12 May; **Grampian** 1 at Balmedie on 1 Aug; **Fife** 14 at Burntisland on 9 Aug; **Strathclyde** 2 off Coll on 18 'May.

Common Tern Sterna hirundo Breeding: Shetland a poor season with few fledged young, similarly 37 pairs on Fair Isle experienced complete failure of later chicks and eggs; Grampian 163 pairs at Forvie reared c1 young/pair, and 78 pairs at Strathbeg reared 28 young, 75-100 pairs nested on Kinloss airfield; Fife 62 chicks were ringed on Isle of May; Lothian 210 nests on Inchmickery, 382 nests at Leith Docks, and 73 pairs reared at least 107 young at 2 other coastal sites; Strathclyde all major Argyll islands were surveyed, revealing 1028-1033 pairs, Hunterston held at least 94 nests, but chick mortality was high due to bad weather; Dumf & Gall 29 nests of Common/Arctic on Murray's Isle on 5 Jul. Counts/passage: Grampian a late bird was at Peterhead on 18 Oct; Lothian 4, Commics, at Dalmeny on 8 Apr, and a late bird at Hound Pt on 15 Nov; Strathclyde a late bird was at Doonfoot on 18 Oct; Dumf & Gall 1 in New England Bay on 11 Apr.

Arctic Tern Sterna paradisaea Breeding: Shetland out of 120 colonies checked, only 1 fledged chick was found, and an increase to 211 nests on Fair Isle saw poor weather virtually wipe out all fledging success; Orkney better success than in 1986 with 1440 pairs on Westray, and 1000 pairs on North Ronaldsay; Grampian 49 pairs at Forvie reared c1 young/pair; Fife 67 chicks were ringed and fledging success was reasonable on Isle of May; Lothian 73 pairs at 2 coastal sites reared only 18 young; Strathclyde Argyll island survey revealed a total of 1650-1690 pairs. Counts/passage: arrival in Lothian and Orkney was on 21 Apr, while in Shetland a late bird was seen on 27 Oct.

Little Tern Sterna albifrons Breeding: **Highland** 9 pairs at 1 site in Caithness, where only 2 chicks fledged in poor weather: **Grampian** a poor year with only 2 young from 27 pairs at Forvie, and failure at St Cyrus; **Tayside** 11 juveniles seen at Barry Buddon; **Lothian** 20 pairs at 2 sites reared 13 young; **Strathclyde** Argyll survey revealed 91-102 pairs, all on Coll, Tiree, and Islay. Counts/passage: arrival in **Lothian** was on 18 Apr, while in **Highland** a late bird was seen at Thurso on 24 Sep.

Black Tern Chlidonias niger 5 in spring: Shetland 1 at sea near Skeld on 14 Jun; Orkney 1 on Westray on 22 Apr; Highland 1 early bird at Boat of Garten on 19 Apr; Strathclyde 2 early birds at Martnaham Loch on 20-21 Apr. Autumn: Orkney 2 at Brough of Birsay on 10 Sep, 1 on North Ronaldsay from 13-14 Sep; Highland 1 at Sandside on 4 Sep, another on 24 Sep, with 2 on 25 Sep; Grampian singles at Peterhead from 3-19 Sep, Newtonhill on 23 Sep, and Girdle Ness on 26 Sep; Tayside 1 on Forfar L on 19-20 Jul; Fife singles at Fife Ness on 14 Aug, and Tayport on 24 Sep; Central 1 at Kinneil on 1 Aug; Lothian/Borders 15 birds were recorded between 14 Jul and 21 Sep; Strathclyde/Dumf & Gall 6 birds were recorded between 19 Jul and 22 Oct.

Guillemot Uria aalge Breeding: Shetland had a good breeding season. Foula census recorded 37,500 birds on ledges (cf 60,021 in 1976), and a census of Fair Isle's breeding population produced 32,437 individuals, with good fledging success in first half of Jul; Orkney showed an increase of 10% at 5 monitored sites; Highland 6266 were counted at 4 sites in Caithness District; Lothian 2700 birds on cliffs of Bass Rock on 30 May; Borders showed an increase to 29,394 birds on nesting ledges along the coast; Strathclyde 4788 nests were counted on Ailsa Craig; Dumf & Gall 3000 birds on the Scare Rocks on 14 Jun. Counts; Shetland tens of thousands remained in voes during late autumn and winter feeding on small fish; Orkney 1750/hr in Burra Sound on 13 Sep; Highland 3000 in Kessock Narrows on 30 Nov and 7 Dec; Grampian 12,300N in 2 hours off Peterhead on 6 Apr.

* Brunnich's Guillemot *Uria lomvia* Shetland 1 at Hamnavoe, Burra from 3-7 Feb (CDRH et al), and another found nearby freshly dead on 7 Feb (DC et al).

Razorbill Alca torda Breeding: Shetland had a good breeding season with Foula census recording 6200 birds (cf 10.576 in 1976), also good fledging success on Fair Isle; Orkney showed an overall increase of 26.3% at 5 colonies from 1986; Highland 1116 at 4 sites in Caithness District; Fife 1200 pairs on Isle of May; Lothian 326 birds were counted on 5 Forth islands during late May-early Jul; Borders 1168 apparently occupied nests along the coast is an increase; Strathclyde 700 nests were counted on Ailsa Craig; Dumf & Gall 22 nests on the Scare Rocks.

Black Guillemot *Cepphus grylle* Breeding: **Highland** Rhum census produced 107 birds; **Grampian** a pair reared 1 young at Portknockie; **Strathclyde** signs of continued expansion in SW. Counts: **Shetland** 564 in Bluemull area on 18 Feb, and pre-breeding counts at monitoring sites produced 4440 adults; **Borders** 2 at St Abbs on 30 Aug.

Little Auk Alle alle Shetland scarce in early part of year with peak of only 4 in Yell Sound on 3 Jan, but good numbers in autumn with 153S in 1 hour at Sumburgh Head on 15 Nov; Orkney 57 in 30 minutes off North Ronaldsay on 26 Nov; West Isles an exceptionally early bird was seen near Stornoway on 6 Aug; Highland huge Nov influx with 1185 at Chanonry on 29 Nov, 400 on 30 Nov, and 500 on 2 Dec; Grampian large numbers in late Nov-early Dec, peaks included 968W in 2 hours Lossiemouth on 29 Nov, 758W in 1 hours on 3 Dec, 475 birds were seen at Peterhead during this period; Fife 7 in Largo Bay on 4 Apr, large influx with 666 past Fife Ness on 8 Nov, and 554NE at Anstruther on 23 Nov; Lothian largest ever autumn influx in region with 376 at Hound Pt on 23 Nov, 320 at Yellowcraig on 6 Dec, and 1000 at Tyninghame on 13 Dec; Borders big autumn influx with 200 off St Abbs in mid Nov; Strathclyde/Dumf & Gall had a few in the Oct-Dec period with 2 in Islay on 20 Oct, 4 on L Ken on 24 Nov, 4N at Turnberry Point on 6 Dec, and up to 7 other scattered singles.

Puffin Fratercula arctica Breeding: **Shetland** overall a poor season was suggested due to shortage of sandeels, Hermaness census indicated a breeding population of between 22,960-27,866 pairs, on Foula 48.000 occupied burrows were counted (a 32% decrease since 1976), a sample of 93 nests on Fair Isle produced 0.7 chicks/nest; **West Isles** 1st back on St Kilda was on 6 Apr; **Highland** 1401 at 4 sites in Caithness District; **Lothian** 1165 birds on Craigleith on 13 Jun.

Rock Dove/Feral Pigeon Columba livia Counts: Shetland 200 at Geosetter on 21 Oct; Orkney 300 on Burray on 24 Jan; Highland 150 at Tannach on 29 Jan; Lothian 360 at West Fenton on 2 Jan; Strathelyde 350 at Prestwick on 27 Jul.

Stock Dove *Columba oenas* Breeding: **Dumf & Gall** long-term decline continues. Counts: **Shetland** 1 at Sandwick on 3 Apr; **Lothian** a very high count of 250 at Dalmeny on 10 Feb.

Woodpigeon *Columba palumbus* Counts: **Grampian** 2500 at Ludquharn on 14 Jan: **Fife** 2500S over R Tay on 11 Jan; **Central** 5000 at Lecropt on 17 Jan; **Lothian** 6000 at Fenton Barns on 19 Jan, and 3000 at Whittinghame-Papple on 15 May were above average counts; **Strathclyde** 3000 at Monkton from 31 Jan-3 Feb.

Collared Dove *Streptopelia decaocto* Breeding: **Strathclyde** 27+ pairs estimated for Arran. Counts/passage: **Shetland** 3 during May on Fetlar, and 5 from late Jun-early Jul on Foula: **Orkney** highest count was 47 at Crantit. St Ola in May and Nov: **Highland** 41 at Scrabster on 14 Nov: **Lothian** 86 at Turnhouse on 11 Sep: **Strathclyde** 70 at Auchincruive, Ayr on 7 Jan.

Turtle Dove Streptopelia turtur Migrants: Shetland 1 on Fetlar on 16 May, with 2 on 18 May, 3 other May singles elsewhere, and 2 at Helendale on 17 Jun, up to 1-5 daily on Fair Isle between 2-18 Jun, only a few singles in autumn with late birds on Fair Isle on 15 Oct, and Strand on 13 Dec; Orkney passage from 28 Apr-30 Jun with 8+ birds, 4 in autumn between 20 Sep and 3 Oct; West Isles singles on St Kilda in Jun, and Jul, singles on N Uist in May, Jun, and Oct; Highland singles at Kiltarlity on 4 Jun, Noss Farm on 7 Jun, 1-2 birds on Rhum from 1-7 Jul, and 1 at Ackergill Drive on 23 Oct; Grampian singles at Ludquharn from 19-21 May, and in Aberdeen on 24 Jul; Fife 7 birds between 24 May and 1 Jul, and a late bird at Fife Ness from 21-25 Oct; Central 1 at Skinflats on 13 Jul; Lothian 1 at Aberlady on 29 May, and 2 at Drem on 30 May; Borders singles at St Abbs on 10 Jun, and Reston on 8 Aug; Strathelyde 8 birds in Argyll between 24 Apr and 17 Jun, also 1 at Lamington on 30 Aug; Dumf & Gall 2 near Mull of Galloway on 25 Apr.

Cuckoo Cuculus canorus Counts/passage: **Shetland** early arrival on Fair Isle on 17 Apr, influx with 8 sightings in North isles on 15-17 Aug, last record was a juvenile on Unst on 12 Sep; **Orkney** last seen on 7 Sep: **Highland/West Isles/Grampian-Borders/Dumf & Gall** most arrivals from 18 Apr.

Barn Owl *Tyto alba* Breeding: **Grampian** 2 pairs bred in Moray with birds at 2 other sites; **Borders** reported from 28 localities; **Strathclyde** an increase in reports, with 5 pairs rearing 10 young on Islay, a good year partly due to a peak in the vole population in the SW and Arran - similarly, **Dumf & Gall** had a very good season with mean brood size of 3.88 from 40 successful nests.

- * Snowy Owl Nyctea scandiaca Shetland 299 on Fetlar from Jan-26 Apr, perhaps up to 30 Aug, and at least 1 till end Dec, 1 laid an infertile clutch, 1 at Uyeasound, Unst from 26 Apr-1 Oct; Orkney a single σ was seen at three locations between 6 Mar and 6 Apr; Highland/Grampian a 9 was present on the Cairngorm plateau from 21 Jun-4 Sep.
- * Little Owl Athene noctua Lothian a pair was present at a site occupied in 1986 and may have bred; Borders singles noted at Kelso on 1-12 Feb, and Maxton on 1-13 Nov; Dumf & Gall pair bred in usual area, rearing 2, one of which was killed by a car in Aug.

Tawny Owl Strix aluco Breeding: most areas reported a successful breeding season.

Long-eared Owl *Asio otus* Breeding: **Strathclyde** 20 pairs were reported from 14 sites in the centre of the region. Counts/passage: **Shetland** 8 at Gott on 4 Feb, but low numbers on Fair Isle with 5 singles; **Orkney** Berstane Wood held 13 in Jan, and 14 in Feb; **West Isles** 1 in Stornoway Woods on 2 Jul; **Lothian** proven breeding at 2 sites; **Strathclyde** 8 roosted at Cumbernauld during Dec; **Dumf & Gall** 14 roosted together at Cairnhead on 26 Jul.


Short-eared Owl Asio flammeus Breeding: **Lothian** a very poor year in the Lammermuirs, but **Dumf** & Gall had a good season except in Glentrool. Counts/passage: Shetland autumn peak on Fair sle was 7 on 16-17 Oct, and Sumburgh Head held 3 from 14-22 Oct; **Lothian** Tailend Moss had a roost of 18 on 17 Nov; **Dumf** & Gall good numbers remained in upland areas in winter 1987-88 due to high numbers of voles.

Nightjar Caprimulgus europaeus Breeding: **Strathclyde** 3-4 pairs at Brodick, Arran suggests a continued decline, singles were heard at 2 other sites for one day only, elsewhere in the region 2 were heard churring in Glenan Forest in Aug, and a single at Portavadie on 22 Jun, and 21-22 Jul; **Dumf & Gall** only 2 churring at site near Dumfries, 1-2 at New Galloway in Jun-Jul, 2 other new areas in Wigtown District held single birds in Jun and Jul.

Swift Apus apus Counts/passage: Shetland early singles at Mavis Grind on 30 Apr and Sumburgh Head on 1 May, peak on Fair Isle was 24 on 20 Jul, the last bird being seen on 21 Sep: Grampian/ Tayside early birds were seen on 14 Apr and 19 Apr; Lothian late birds were seen at East Linton on 22 and 24 Oct: Borders had a huge autumn passage of 6000S/hour over Eyemouth on 19 Jul: Strathelyde a very early bird was on Colonsay on 16 Apr, 500 were at Barron's Haugh in mid-Jun, and a very late bird was seen at Condorrat on 11 Nov: Dumf & Gall 800 at Lochmaben on 1 Jul was a high count.

Kingfisher Alcedo atthis Breeding: **Tayside** had 2 breeding records: **Strathclyde** 20 pairs were reported from the inner Clyde area, and more reports came from the SW including 2 successful nests: **Dumf & Gall** had a good season. Others: **Orkney** 1 on Birsay from 19 Oct-17 Nov: **Highland/Grampian** 1 at Tarradale from 22 Jan-13 Feb. and 1 at Findhorn Bay from 1986 was last seen on 24 Feb. 1 at Inverness on 23 Mar.

* Hoopoe Upupa epops Shetland singles on Bressay on 29 Apr, and Kergord/Whiteness on 19-23 Oct; Orkney singles on Stronsay on 4-5 Apr, and Westray on 27 Apr; West Isles 1 at Balivanich from 19-22 Apr; Highland 1 at Auldearn from 29-30 Apr; Grampian 1 at Wells of Ythan from 12-14 Oct; Fife 1N at North Queensferry on 13 Sep, and 1 at Shell Bay on 25 Oct; Lothian 1 at West Barns on 17 Apr; Borders 1 at St Abbs from 9-10 May; Strathclyde 1 at Lamlash, Arran from 4-5 Sep.

Wryneck Jynx torquilla Breeding: Highland up to 4 singing birds, but no proven breeding. Passage: Shetland had a poor year with only 3 spring singles from 21-27 May, 7 individuals in autumn between 15 Aug and 22 Sep, on Fair Isle 2 singles from 25-26 Apr and 26-31 May were followed by up to 10 autumn records, with a maximum of 4 on 21 Sep; Orkney 1 on North Ronaldsay on 25 Apr, and up to 5 between 23 Aug and 22 Sep; Tayside 1 at Broughty Ferry on 6 Sep; Fife singles at Fife Ness on 25 May, and from 28 Aug-1 Sep, then 1 on Isle of May from 21-24 Sep, and another at St Andrews on 16 Oct; Lothian singles at Tailend Moss on 1 May, and Barns Ness from 29 Aug-1 Sep; Borders 2 at St Abbs on 28 Aug, 1 till 30 Aug; Strathclyde 1 on Sanda on 6 Oct.

Green Woodpecker *Picus viridis* Breeding: **Grampian** still largely confined to Deeside: **Fife** expansion of range indicated; **Central** stated to be common along Ochil scarp; **Lothian** more breeding reports from fewer sites than in 1986; **Borders** 32 territories were reported; **Dumf & Gall** continues widespread in small numbers in hardwoods.

Great Spotted Woodpecker *Dendrocopos major* Breeding: **Lothian** had the highest number of potential breeding sites yet reported in the region. Others: **Highland** 1 on Eigg from 28 Nov-17 Dec was a first record for the island.

* Short-toed Lark Calandrella brachydactyla Shetland 1 on Fair Isle on 29 May (SJA), 1 at Scatness on 28 Sep (CFMcK), and another at Grutness on 6 Oct (JDO); Orkney 1 on North Ronaldsay from 2-3 May (MGP,KFW).

Skylark Alauda arvensis Breeding: Shetland early young were seen at Camb on 14 May; Lothian 45 territories were found at Aberlady. Counts/passage: Shetland good passage on Fair Isle from 10-26 Mar with 300+ on 12 Mar, autumn influxes on 20 Sep and 8, 14 Oct with 250+ on each date; Highland 500 at Murkle on 15 Feb; Grampian 200+S/hour at Muchalls on 11 Jan; Fife 4000+

arrived at Fife Ness on 24 Oct; Lothian 800 at Musselburgh on 18 Jan; Strathclyde huge movement of 2500S/hour over Doonfoot on 13 Jan, and 2500 at Rigside on 17 and 18 Jan; Dumf & Gall a large movement in mid Jan included 1000+ over Kirriereoch on 20 Jan.

Shore Lark Eremophila alpestris Shetland spring singles on Fair Isle on 28 Apr and 3-4 May, 1 at Noss on 14 Jun, and 1 on Fair Isle on 19 Oct was only autumn record; Orkney 1 at Evie on 9 Apr; Tayside 3 at Montrose on 24 Mar; Lothian 1 at Musselburgh till 18 Jan, 4 at Tyninghame early in Jan increased to 6 from 23 Jan-28 Feb, with last 3 on 8 Mar, 2 at Aberlady from 10-18 Jan and 13-17 Mar, with 1 till 18 Apr, in the autumn 1 at Tyninghame on 19 Oct rose to 6 from 26 Dec to the end of the year.

Sand Martin Riparia riparia Breeding: Grampian further increase noted; Tayside 1052 pairs located in Angus District, while a survey in Perth & Kinross District located 1246 pairs (the latter a 43% increase on 1986); Central 362 nests at Barbush; Lothian however, showed no evidence of resurgence in numbers: Borders recovery with 63 colonies holding 2405 burrows; Strathclyde 3483 occupied burrows were reported from the inner Clyde area, and increases were noted elsewhere as well as in Dumf & Gall. Counts/passage: Shetland/Orkney records ran from 21 Apr-29 Sep; Grampian 500 were at Davan on 4 May; Fife an extremely late bird was seen at St Andrews on 18 Nov; Dumf & Gall arrival from 30 Mar, peak count was 1100 at roost Lochmaben on 8 Jul.

Swallow Hirundo rustica Breeding: Shetland a pair reared 4 young on Foula. Counts/passage: Shetland highest numbers on Fair Isle were from 29 May-5 Jun with 50 on 1 Jun; Highland 600 at Loch Watten on 19 Aug; Grampian last 1 at Lossiemouth on 22 Nov; Fife last 2 at Tayport on 18 Nov; Borders 1600 roosted at Pot Loch on 6 Sep; Strathclyde 3500 roosted at Bishop L, Glasgow on 13 Aug, 2 late juveniles were at Turnberry on 28 Nov; Dumf & Gall arrival was on 27 Mar, 1500 at Cumstoun, Kirkcudbright on 30 Aug.

* Red-rumped Swallow Hirundo daurica An amazing run of records for this South European species: Shetland 1 on Fair Isle on 24 Oct (SJA), 1 at Clickimin on 31 Oct (MH et al), and 2 at Holmsgarth on 3-8 Nov (DC.IS et al); Grampian 1 at Nigg on 16 May (AJL); Tayside a 1st winter bird at Broughty Ferry from 7-8 Nov (RDG.SG et al); Lothian 3 at Cammo Park, Edinburgh on 6 Nov (KH).

House Martin Delichon urbica Breeding: Shetland 2 fledged at Baliasta, Unst; Orkney 10 nests were built at 2 sites; Tayside 500+ cliff-nesting pairs were located between Arbroath and Lunan Bay; Lothian 133 cliff nests were recorded at 3 sites; Strathclyde a late nest at Drongan still had young on 28 Sep. Counts/passage: Shetland early singles on Fair Isle and at Eshaness on 19 Apr, peak of 30 on Fair Isle on 1 Jun, with the last 2 at Holmsgarth on 7 Nov; Fife 3 at St Andrews on 18 Nov; Borders an early bird was at Hawick on 9 Apr, but Strathclyde had 1 at Prestwick on 7 Apr, late records included 4 at Whiting Bay, Arran on 14 Nov, 5 at Connel on 17 Nov, and 1 at Culzean on 27 Nov.

- * Richard's Pipit Anthus novaeseelandiae A large autumn influx ran from 21 Sep to 24 Nov, and involved some 27+ birds. Shetland large numbers arrived on the Northern isles, and Fair Isle had a strong passage from 21 Sep-20 Oct with a maximum of 6 on 1 Oct, further arrivals occurred with 1 on 30 Oct and 1-3 birds from 4-10 Nov (per JND.NJR et al), outside Fair Isle the Out Skerries had 2 on 22 Sep. 1 staying till 24 Sep, and singles on Whalsay on 4 Oct, and Norby on 8 Nov; Orkney singles on Holm from 27-28 Sep (ERM/PD). North Ronaldsay on 5 Oct (REI/CB), another from 15-16 Oct (EJW), 3 on Stronsay on 19 Oct, with 1 till 23 Oct, other singles on 2 Nov and 24 Nov (JFH); Highland 1 at Tarbatness on 3 Oct (RHD); Grampian singles at Foveran, and Drums on 21 Oct (RDS,JAS,MH,JL), and Netherton, Findhorn Bay from 4-9 Oct (RHD et al); Fife 1 near Fife Ness from 14-16 Nov (AH,GF,DT); Borders 1 at St Abbs on 4 Oct (DJB/RHH).
- * Tawny Pipit Anthus campestris Shetland 1 on Fair Isle from on 2-7 May, another on 29 Oct-7 Nov (per NJR); Grampian 1 at Foveran from 24-25 Oct (RDS.JAS.AGS,GS).
- * Olive-backed Pipit Anthus hodgsoni Another quite outstanding influx, involving between 8 and 11 birds. Shetland 1 at Grutness/Sumburgh from 29 Sep-3 Oct (JND,CFMcK), and exceptional numbers on Fair Isle with 1 from 2-20 Oct (PHA,SJA et al), another from 14-20 Oct (SJA,KO), another 3 on 15 Oct (KB,CD et al), at least 5 to at least 20 Oct, 2 till 22 Oct, and 1 till 23 Oct (JND,NJR et al), another on 22 Oct (SJA), another from 28 Oct-1 Nov (KO et al), and yet another from 30-31 Oct (SJA); Orkney singles on North Ronaldsay from 5-9 Oct (MGP,KFW et al), and 30 Oct-6 Nov (AED,MGP et al).

Tree Pipit *Anthus trivialis* Breeding: **Dumf & Gall** good numbers are now into clearfells. Counts/ passage: **Shetland** peaks on Fair Isle were 12 on 18 and 26 May, with 10 on 1 Oct. the last one being at Toab on 14 Nov: **West Isles** 2 on St Kilda on 21 May, 1 at Stilligarry on 10 Sep; **Highland** a very early bird at Glencripesdale on 1 Apr; **Lothian** singles at Aberlady and Craigielaw on 13 Apr, and in **Strathclyde** arrival started on 9 Apr.

Meadow Pipit *Anthus pratensis* Counts/passage: **Shetland** peak numbers on Fair Isle lasted from 9 Apr-9 May, with a maximum of 250 on 8 May, in the autumn the peak was 600 on 28 Aug; **Orkney** 275 on North Ronaldsay on 20 Sep: **Lothian** 500N/hour at Barns Ness on 9 Apr: **Strathclyde** a massive northwards passage along Ayrshire coast peaked at 4000/hour at Doonfoot during 6 Apr.

* Red-throated Pipit Anthus cervinus Shetland 1 on Fair Isle on 28 Aug (SJA et al).

Rock Pipit Anthus petrosus Counts/passage: Orkney 57 on North Ronaldsay in Jan. indication of passage with 73 on 24 Sep. Scandanavian *littoralis*: Highland 1 at Latheronwheel on 14 Apr: Lothian far more birds of this subspecies are being picked up on spring passage, and a peak of 22 was recorded at Barns Ness on 28 Mar: Borders 1 at Burnmouth on 10 Jan. 4 on 22 Mar. and 2 on 29 Mar; Strathelyde 1 at Heads of Ayr on 7 Apr.

* Water Pipit Anthus spinoletta Tayside 1 at Elliot Burn from 18 Jan-6 Apr (JGS et al).

Yellow Wagtail Motacilla flava Breeding: Shetland a pair considered to be thunbergi reared 3 young near Hillwell: Grampian a pair reared 5 young at Durris: Lothian 4 pairs bred, rearing up to 8 young. Borders a minimum of 18 territories was recorded: Strathclyde 7 pairs were found in Avondale, and 5 pairs near Carnwath. Counts/passage flavissima or unspecified: Shetland singles on Fair Isle on 18 May and 7 Jun. in autumn 2 eastern. grey-morph birds on 2 Oct. and a very late bird at Seafield on 23 Oct: Orkney a very late bird on Sanday on 13 Nov: Tayside 1 at Kinross on 10 Oct: Fife 1-2 birds on Isle of May between 28 and 30 May, 1 on 5-6 Sep: Borders singles at Birgham and Reston on 18 Apr: Strathclyde 1 on Islay on 16 Oct. Blue-headed flava:

Grey-headed thunbergi: Shetland 1 on Fetlar on 19 May, 2 on Fair Isle between 28-31 May; West Isles 1 on St Kilda from 2-9 Jun; Highland singles at L Mhor on 24 May, and Tarbatness on 26 May; Lothian 2 in Jun.

* Citrine Wagtail Motacilla citreola Shetland a 1st winter bird on Fair Isle from 1-2 Sep (SJA et al); Orkney 1 at Deerness on 4 Oct (EJW, JBR et al).

Grey Wagtail *Motacilla cinerea* Breeding: **Borders** 153 territories were recorded. Counts/passage: **Orkney** singles on Evie on 1 Apr. and Harray on 29 Apr; **West Isles** 1 at North Bay. S Uist on 11 Oct.

Pied Wagtail Motacilla alba Roost counts/passage: Highland 250 at Wick River roost on 18 Aug; Grampian 600 at Dyce roost on 29 Sep. 450 at Forres on 2 Oct; Strathclyde 600 at Inchinnan on 22 Jul. and 500 at Lamington on 30 Aug; Dumf & Gall 519 at Sandside, Kirkcudbright on 23 Sep. White alba: Shetland main passage on Fair Isle was from 30 Apr-13 May with a maximum of 20 on 10 May, and from 23 Aug-11 Oct with a maximum of 65 on 28 Aug; Orkney passage between 4 Apr and 26 May, peak of 30 Papa Westray on 8 May; Lothian 49 at Barns Ness on 18 Apr; Borders 1 noticed nest building at Hoselaw on 28 Jun is unusual; Strathclyde 30 on Colonsay on 24 Apr.

The largest group was 43 in Aberdeen, Grampian on 5 Apr.

Dipper Cinclus cinclus Breeding: **Borders** up to 178 territories were recorded largely due to Goosander Census work: **Strathclyde** 75+ pairs were recorded on the R Clyde catchment up to Lamington. **Black-bellied** *cinclus*: **Fife** 1 at Crail from 3-8 Apr carried a Swedish ring (TCS).

Wren Troglodytes troglodytes Fair Isle fridariensis: successful breeding was confirmed at 9 sites, with singing of at 15 other sites unlikely to have bred, at 9 other sites the outcome was unknown-34 young fledged from the 9 successful sites. Elsewhere: Shetland 19 pairs bred on Noss, and 2 pairs nested for first time on Out Skerries; local increases were noted in Lothian, and a recovery in numbers in Dumf & Gall.


Dunnock *Prunella modularis* Passage: **Shetland** peak on Fair Isle from 4-12 Apr with 200 on 5 Apr, when 80 on Out Skerries; **Borders** 110 at St Abbs on 20 Sep.

Robin Erithacus rubecula Breeding: **Dumf & Gall** a big decrease was noted at Wood of Cree where 19 pairs compared to 46 pairs in 1986. Passage: **Shetland** main passage on Fair Isle ran from 4-14 Apr with a maximum of 250 on 5-6 Apr, 100 on Out Skerries on 10 Apr, in autumn the peak occurred on 20-23 Oct with 150 on Fair Isle, and 135 on Whalsay; **Orkney** had an autumn fall of over 250 birds on 20-21 Oct; **Highland** 50 at Noss on 20 Oct; **Lothian** 70+ at Barns Ness on 20 Oct.

Nightingale Luscinia megarhynchos Shetland 1 at Virkie on 26 Apr (PME.JDO et al). Nightingale sp Luscinia sp Fife 1 on Isle of May on 22 May was probably L megarhynchos.

Bluethroat Luscinia svecica Shetland 7 spring records from 25 May-1 Jun, and 9 in autumn from 19 Sep-1 Nov, on Fair Isle seen daily from 23 May-1 Jun with a maximum 12 on 26 May, another on 4-5 Jun, and 1 on 8 Jul was unusual, autumn singles comprised 1 on 26 Aug, 21 Sep and 29-30 Oct; Orkney at least 19 records with 6 in spring and 4 on North Ronaldsay from 1-4 Oct, plus a very late bird on 16 Nov; West Isles of at Askernish, S Uist on 2 Oct; Highland singles at Burn of Brims on 23 May, Noss Head on 23-24 May, Portmahomack on 23 May, Boat of Garten on 23 May, 2 at Tarbatness on 26 May, and 1 at Wilkhaven on 27 May - the remains of 1 were found on Cairn Lochain on 23 May; Grampian singles at Fraserburgh on 23 May, Newburgh on 24 May, Newtonhill on 26 May, and Miltonduff in late May; Fife influx of 25 on the Isle of May on 22 May dwindled to 3 on 27 May, by contrast only 2 at Fife Ness on 23 May, and 1 on 3 Oct; Lothian singles at Skateraw on 26 May, and Musselburgh on 30 May; Borders singles at St Abbs on 22 May, 24 May and 27 May.

Black Redstart *Phoenicurus ochruros* Winter: **Shetland** 1 on Fair Isle till 8 Jan; **Lothian** 1 at Cramond from 3-7 Jan; **Strathclyde** 1 at Stevenston Point from 31 Jan-29 Mar, and 1 at Saltcoats from 12-end Dec. Passage: **Shetland** on main islands 36 in spring from 24 Mar-23 Apr, with peak of 10 on 29 Mar, on Fair Isle 1 on 12 Mar was followed by 1-5 birds between 23 Mar-13 Apr and 1-2 birds on 15 dates from 25 Apr-31 May, singles on 8 Jun and 2-4 Jul preceded autumn passage from 23 Sep-9 Nov when a peak of 5 was reached on 20 Oct, on main islands 37 birds from 17 Oct-

11 Nov with a peak of 13 on 23 Oct; **Orkney** 6 birds between 31 Mar and 3 Jun, minimum 16 in autumn between 16 Oct and 9 Nov; **West Isles** singles on St Kilda on 25 Apr, Kilphedar, S Uist on 27 Apr, and L Hallan on 31 Oct; **Highland** singles at Noss Farm on 1 May, Noss Head on 19 Oct, Eigg on 3 Nov, and Ryvoan Pass on 18 Dec; **Grampian** 1 at Kingston on 8 Apr; **Tayside** 1 at Arbroath on 21 Oct, 6 at Kinnaber on 22 Oct; **Fife** 12 birds from 5 Apr-19 Jul, then Oct influx on Isle of May with a peak of 20 on 21 Oct, last 2 at Fife Ness on 24 Oct; **Lothian** 3 birds between 4 and 7 Apr, another 9 from 20 Oct-24 Nov; **Borders** up to 5 at St Abbs between 6 and 25 Apr, 1 on 14 Jun, 1 near Hawick on 30 Jul was unusual, then 3 birds at St Abbs between 3 and 24 Oct; **Strathclyde** singles at Dunure on 25 Mar, Castle Sween on 28 Mar, Ailsa Craig on 21 Apr, and Islay on 26 Oct.

Redstart Phoenicurus phoenicurus Breeding: Highland very high numbers in Glenurquhart with twice the normal nestboxes occupied; Central 54 pairs at Trossachs nestbox colony. 279 young fledged; Borders 121 territories were recorded suggesting that the species is more numerous than previously thought; Dumf & Gall good numbers bred. Passage: Shetland autumn peak of 12 on Fair Isle on 21 Sep was mirrored by peak of 34 on main islands on 22 Sep. last 1 at Cunningsburgh on 1 Nov; Orkney last bird on 3 Nov; West Isles 9 on St Kilda on 2 Jun, 1 at Newton Ferry, N Uist on 20 Oct; Grampian a spring fall between 5 and 12 Apr involved 8 birds, while a larger autumn fall between 5 and 29 Oct brought in around 27 birds; Fife 40 on Isle of May on 2 Oct; generally arrival in the South was around 18-20 Apr.

Whinchat Saxicola rubetra Breeding: Strathclyde at least 30 pairs on Arran. Passage: Shetland migration peaks on Fair Isle were 8 on 27 May and 24 on 5 Sep, autumn peak on main islands was 60 on 6 Sep; Orkney a late bird on North Ronaldsay on 6 Nov; Tayside early bird at Aberfeldy on 7 Apr; Lothian a late bird was seen at Barns Ness on 28 Oct; Strathclyde an early bird was seen at Cumbernauld on 4 Apr.

Stonechat Saxicola torquata Breeding: Orkney increase on Hoy with up to 29 pairs; Grampian still 4 pairs between Hopeman and Covesea, and 1 pair bred at Forvie: Strathelyde numbers appear stable on Argyll islands and Arran, but little or no sign of increase following 1982 crash in Ayrshire population: Dumf & Gall slight increase suggested at some coastal sites but otherwise a decline inland. Passage: Shetland singles on Fair Isle on 28 Apr. 19-30 Aug. and 9-22 Oct included a juvenile-plumaged bird on the middle dates. Eastern St maura/stejnegeri: Shetland \$\forall \text{immature} at Quendale on 27 Sep (AFT & GJF), a \$\sigma\$, and up to 4\$\text{QP/immatures} on Fair Isle on 29 Sep, 2 till 30 Sep, and 1 till 4 Oct (SJA.RP.NJR et al), and 2\$\text{QP/immatures} on 29 Oct, 1 till 1 Nov (SJA.NJR et al), \$\text{Q}\$/immature at Bridge of Walls from 2-6 Oct (CM), 1 on Whalsay on 23 Oct (BM); Orkney singles on Stronsay from 20-21 Oct, and 1-4 Nov (JFH); Highland 1 at Noss Head on 3 Oct (KWB.SAMM); Fife \$\text{Q}\$/immature at Balcomie on 3 Oct (JGS.JSN).



Wheatear Oenanthe oenanthe Passage: Shetland arrival of 2 on Fair Isle on 28 Mar and a peak of 180 on 24 Apr; Orkney peak counts were 120 on North Ronaldsay on 25 Apr, and 200 on North Ronaldsay and Sanday on 4 Sep, last bird on 9 Nov: West Isles 1st bird at Stoneybridge. S Uist on 25 Mar; Highland 41 at Delnies on 18 Aug; Grampian 2 at Greg Ness on 20 Mar; Borders an extremely early bird was at Eyemouth on 27 Feb, 40 at St Abbs on 18 Apr; Strathclyde another early bird on Ailsa Craig on 10 Mar. Greenland leucorrhoa: the usual scatter of records included Orkney 12 on Sanday on 4 Sep, and Strathclyde up to 30 on Colonsay on 24 Apr.

Ring Ouzel Turdus torquatus Breeding: Strathclyde 5 sites on Mull, and 52 pairs found in Clydesdale District; Dumf & Gall had low numbers. Migration: Shetland first bird was at Sumburgh Head on 29 Mar, large numbers on Fair Isle in autumn with 125 on 14 Oct, last bird on 3 Nov; Orkney 89 on Hoy and North Ronaldsay on 13-14 Oct; West Isles σ on 5t Kilda on 2 Jun; Highland 1 on Rhum on 27 Mar; Fife 20 on Isle of May on 15 Oct; Strathclyde extraordinary record of a σ at Killearn on 13 Jan must have involved overwintering, 1 near New Cumnock on 23 Mar, and last 1 on Mull on 2 Nov; Dumf & Gall a late bird was seen on 4 Nov.

Blackbird *Turdus merula* Migration: **Shetland** unusual arrival of 100 on Fair Isle on 15-16 Jan, spring passage was poor but autumn maximum reached 1000 at South Nesting on 25 Oct, and 800 on Fair Isle on 30 Oct; **Orkney** a fall on 13-14 Oct produced 150 on North Ronaldsay and over 850 on 6 islands on 19-21 Oct; **Grampian** a fall on 19-21 Oct provided up to 300 birds at 3 locations; **Fife** 4500 on Isle of May on 21 Oct; **Lothian** 300 at Barns Ness on 20 Oct, and 300 at Ormiston in early Nov; **Strathclyde** hundreds on Islay in last few days of Oct.

- * Eye-browed Thrush Turdus obscurus Shetland a 1st winter bird on Fair Isle from 7-15 Oct (KO.NJR et al).

Migration: **Shetland** spring peak on Fair Isle was 290 on 10 Apr. 1 unusual migrant on 20 Jul, 2 on 1 Sep, an exceptionally heavy passage in autumn between 20-28 Oct. up to 1,000,000 estimated on the islands with 21 Oct producing 10,000 at Dunrossness and 6600 elsewhere, on 27 Oct c60,000 were counted between Tingwall and Eshaness. Fair Isle had 5-6000 each day from 21-23 Oct; **Orkney** a massive arrival on 20-21 Oct with 20,000+ on 6 islands; **West Isles** immense numbers on Lewis on 22 Oct; **Highland** 3000+ in Strath of Watten on 28 Oct; **Borders** early arrival in autumn at St Abbs with 1 on 1 Sep; **Strathclyde** large numbers in SW during 1-3 Nov when 900 on Arran, 1000+ at New Cumnock, and 1500 at Killwinning: **Dumf & Gall** first 7 at Anwoth were on 20 Aug, 1000 at Killantringan on 16 Nov.

Redwing *Turdus iliacus* Breeding: Shetland a singing σ was seen at Upper Kergord on 2 Jul; Highland no details from main areas, but probably bred at Shebster; Tayside 1 in song in W Perthshire on 28 May. Migration: Shetland large falls on Fair Isle between 13-31 Oct with 8000 on 14 and 22 Oct, on main islands 10,200 were counted on 21 Oct; Orkney large falls on 14 Oct when 5450 on 4 islands, followed by 17,500 on 4 islands on 20-21 Oct; West Isles immense numbers on Lewis on 22 Oct; Tayside 600W in 2 hours in Glen Quaich on 24 Oct; Fife 1000's at Fife Ness on 20 Oct, and 2500 on the Isle of May on 21 Oct; Lothian 1 at Ormiston on 23 Aug, 1000+ at Barns Ness on 20 Oct; Borders 650N at Jedburgh on 26 Mar, autumn passage concentrated mostly to 14-21 Oct; Strathclyde 1200+ in Garnock Valley on 27 Oct, 1500 L na Keal, Mull on 2 Nov.

Mistle Thrush *Turdus viscivorus* Migration and post-breeding flocks: **Shetland** a large flock of 23 on Fair Isle on 4 Apr; **Grampian** an exceptional flock of 84 at L Spynie on 11 Sep; **Tayside** 60 at Rannoch on 29 Aug; **Lothian** 50 at Pefferside on 11 Oct; **Borders** roost of 52 Craigurd on 26 Sep; **Strathclyde** 49 in Ayr on 25 Sep.

* Lanceolated Warbler Locustella lanceolata Shetland singles at Scatness on 17 Sep (DRB,PME,PVH), and on Fair Isle on 19 Sep (PM,KO), 20 Sep (PM,NJR,WU), and 26 Sep (HJ,NJR).

Grasshopper Warbler *Locustella naevia* Breeding: **Lothian** had its best numbers since 1978, while in **Strathclyde** 105 pairs or territories were recorded in the inner Clyde and Ayrshire areas. Migration: **Shetland** singles on Fetlar from 26-28 Apr, Fair Isle on 26 Apr, 17 May, 6-7 Sep, 23 Sep, and Fetlar on 22-27 Sep; **West Isles** 1 at Garynahine, Lewis on 28 May; arrival was generally widespread on 23 Apr but **Strathclyde** and **Borders** had 1-2 on 21 Apr, while **Tayside** had a late bird at Killiecrankie on 3 Oct.

* Aquatic Warbler Acrocephalus paludicola Shetland 1 on Foula from 15-22 Aug (RWGC, JND,CEV)ø.

Sedge Warbler Acrocephalus schoenobaenus Breeding: Lothian had an increase in numbers at most sites: Borders a total of 258 territories was recorded; Strathclyde numbers were stable or slightly up in SW, with 150+ pairs at Lochwinnoch; Dumf & Gall also showed an improvement. Migration: Shetland arrival on Fair Isle on 19 Apr, late singles on 14 Oct, and at Quendale on 15 Oct; Central 50 at roost Kinneil in early Aug.

Migration: Shetland spring influx of c15 birds between 26 May and 11 Jun, last bird on Whalsay on 22 Oct; West Isles singles at Liniclate and South Lochboisdale on 3 Oct; Fife a very late bird was seen at Fife Ness on 31 Oct; Lothian a late bird seen at Barns Ness on 20 Oct; Strathclyde arrival was from 23 Apr.

Garden Warbler Sylvia borin Breeding: Lothian good numbers were reported; Borders an increase to 96 singing & was recorded; Strathclyde numbers were stable in S Ayrshire; Dumf & Gall 23 pairs at Wood of Cree. Migration: Shetland an early arrival on Unst on 20 Apr, with main arrival from 25 May-18 Jun with about 30 birds, spring peak on Fair Isle was 9 on 25 May, autumn passage from 11 Aug-17 Oct reached its peak with 25 on 28 Aug, the last bird on 6 Nov; Orkney peak of 10 on North Ronaldsay on 21 Sep, and the last one on 6 Nov; West Isles 1 on St Kilda on 6 Sep; Borders/Strathclyde generally arrival was from 28-29 Apr, but an early bird at was at Culzean, Strathclyde on 20 Apr.

Migration: **Shetland** Oct passage on Fair Isle provided peaks of 250 on 14 Oct and 75 on 20 Oct; **Orkney** peak of 140 on North Ronaldsay on 14 Oct; **West Isles** had large numbers on all islands in Oct; **Fife** 200 on the Isle of May on 16 and 21 Oct; **Strathclyde** earliest arrival was on 11 Apr in Culzean. Winter records: a summary of birds occurring during this period gave 91 from Jan-Mar, and 37 in Dec.

Wood Warbler Phylloscopus sibilatrix Breeding: Highland 1 observed carrying food at Langwell, Caithness District on 7 Jun, and well above usual numbers in Glenurquhart; Strathclyde a good year reported from most of the region. Migration: Shetland Fair Isle's maximum was 4 on 26 Aug, while the main islands had 18 birds between 15 Aug and 17 Oct; West Isles 4 were recorded from May-Sep: Strathclyde/Central arrival noted from 23 Apr, but an early one was seen at Wood of Cree, Dumf & Gall, on 9 Apr.

Chiffchaff Phylloscopus collybita Breeding: Grampian 18 singing of were found at 14 sites in Moray. Migration: Shetland the main spring passage on Fair Isle was between 24-27 Apr when up to 20 birds were present, in autumn the main passage lay between 1 Oct and 12 Nov with 25 on 2 Oct: Orkney an influx on 19-21 Oct produced 24 birds on 3 islands; Lothian a coastal influx from 4-31 Oct gave rise to several Northern race birds; Dumf & Gall had 1 at Craigcaffie on 3 Apr. Winter records: a summary of birds occurring during this period gave 24 from Jan-Mar, and 26 in Dec.

Willow Warbler Phylloscopus trochilus Breeding: Highland a drop in numbers was noted at both L Garten (31 pairs), and on Eigg (33% reduction from 1987); Central a transect survey carried out by Stirling SOC showed a substantial drop in numbers compared to previous surveys in R Devon area; but a possible increase was reported in central Strathclyde and Dumf & Gall. Migration: Shetland a poor spring on Fair Isle, but 90 were present on 26 Aug; Orkney the last 1 on North Ronaldsay was on 4 Nov; Fife 150 on the Isle of May on 31 Aug; Borders/Strathclyde 1st arrivals were on 3 Apr, but main arrival was still early from 10-18 Apr.

Goldcrest Regulus regulus Breeding: Dumf & Gall noted an increase. Migration: Shetland poor passage with only 28 on Fair Isle on 4 Apr, but strong evidence of passage during Nov in Calderglen Country Park, Strathclyde.

* Firecrest Regulus ignicapillus West Isles 1 at Keose, Lewis on 26 Oct; Fife 1 at Fife Ness on 6 Apr; Borders singles at St Abbs on 20 Sep and 10 Oct.

Spotted Flycatcher *Muscicapa striata* Breeding: **Orkney** 3 pairs were seen with fledged young; **Strathelyde** an excellent year in SW. Migration: **Shetland** low numbers on Fair Isle with a peak of 9 on 1 Jun; **Orkney** last 1 on South Ronaldsay on 25 Oct; **West Isles** a pair was on Barra on 14 Jun; **Fife** 50 on Isle of May on 26 May; **Strathelyde** early arrival with 1 at Croy, Ayr on 19 Apr, followed by singles on Arran on 24 and 25 Apr.

* Red-breasted Flycatcher Ficedula parva About 31 individuals were recorded during the year. Shetland a \$\sigma\$ at Seafield on 1 Jun was the only spring record, 5 singles in Sep were followed by 6 more in Oct, with the last at Swining on 24 Oct; Orkney spring singles at Holm on 6-7 Jun, and Eday on 11 Jun, 4 on North Ronaldsay between 21 Sep and 2 Oct, 1 remaining till 13 Oct, singles on South Ronaldsay on 22 Sep, and Holm on 5 Oct; Grampian 1 at Muchalls on 3 Oct, and 2 there on 4 Oct, 1 at Foveran from 16-17 Oct, and a \$\sigma\$ at Rattray on 19 Oct; Tayside 1 at Arbroath on 9 Oct; Fife 1 on Isle of May from 21-22 Sep, another on 1 Oct, and 2 on 2 Oct, 1 till 3 Oct; Borders singles at St Abbs on 26 May, 1 Oct and 3-4 Oct.

Pied Flycatcher *Ficedula hypoleuca* Breeding: **Highland** 10 pairs bred in Aviemore area; **Tayside** 8 pairs reared 35 young at Killiecrankie; **Central** 64 prs at Trossachs nestboxes, 402 young fledged; **Strathclyde** 31 pairs bred at Inversnaid, and the species continued to do well after a recent recovery in **SW**; **Dumf & Gall** an increase was noted with 21 pairs at Wood of Cree. Migration: **Shetland** 21 individuals between 26 May and 17 Jun, a better autumn with 13 on Fair Isle on 26 Aug, and c30 between 19 and 26 Sep, a late bird was at Sullom Voe on 11 Nov; **Orkney** influx on 21 Sep when c33 at 9 localities; **Borders** arrival was noted on 19 Apr, while in **Dumf & Gall** arrival was from 22 Apr.

Long-tailed Tit *Aegithalos caudatus* Counts: **Grampian** 45 at L Spynie on 29 Dec; **Tayside** 50-60 at Lethnot on 20 Nov; **Strathclyde** 50 at Inversnaid in Oct.

Marsh Tit Parus palustris Lothian provided a few scattered records and no confirmed breeding, while Borders suggested no great change in status.

Willow Tit Parus montanus Strathclyde the species almost certainly bred again at Dalmellington, and perhaps also New Cumnock, but 1 at Newton Lochranza, Arran on 16 Jul was well outside its normal range: Dumf & Gall had a good breeding season with large numbers of young seen at Moss of Cree.

Crested Tit Parus cristatus Breeding: Highland a pair with young at Bunloit was new for that area, also 6 were seen in Glen Affric on 2 Mar; Grampian an excellent season in Culbin Forest where 13 pairs using nestboxes averaged clutches of 5.8, and 5.5 fledged young/pair. Outside the normal area 1 was seen at Kemnay, Grampian from 14 Feb-23 May.

Coal Tit Parus ater Migration: Orkney 1 at St Margaret's Hope on 22 Oct; West Isles 1 in Stornoway Woods in Jun was the first for 5 years.

Blue Tit *Parus caeruleus* Migration/counts: **Orkney** 1 at Stenness on 2 Oct; **Lothian** an exceptional count of 160 was made at Threipmuir on 29 Aug.

Great Tit Parus major Migration: Shetland 2 on Fair Isle on 4 Apr, 1 till 6 Apr.

* Nuthatch Sitta europaea Borders 1-2 at St Abbs between 2 and 21 Apr.

Treecreeper *Certhia familiaris* Migration: **Shetland** 1 on Fair Isle on 30 Oct; **Orkney** singles on Stronsay on 25 Oct, and Binscarth from 29 Nov-end Dec, the latter showing characteristics of **Northern** *C f macrodactyla*.

Golden Oriole Oriolus oriolus Migration provided up to 13 individuals: Shetland 2 at Kergord on 24-30 May, with 1 till 16 Jun, a σ Unst on 2 Jun, and singles at Garthsness on 2 Jun, and Exnaboe on 9 Jun; West Isles single $\sigma\sigma$ on S Uist on 24 Apr, and St Kilda on 17 Jun; Grampian 1 at Forglen on 27 Apr; Borders 1 at St Abbs on 29 Apr; Strathclyde 2 $\sigma\sigma$ at Port Askaig, Islay on 15 Apr, 1 on 17 Apr, σ on Mull on 15 Apr, and 1 Crossaig, Kintyre in early May.

* Isabelline Shrike Lanius isabellinus Shetland 1 at Eswick on 23 Oct (PVH,MH,TR).

Red-backed Shrike Lanius collurio Migration: Shetland at least 24 between 25 May and 23 Jun, singles on Fair Isle on 3-4, and 8 Jul, 11 in autumn between 26 Aug with the last one at Geosetter on 31 Oct; Orkney up to 12 or 13 birds between 26 May and 11 Jun, 1 found dead on Hoy in 3rd week of Jul; West Isles single ♂ on Barra on 4 Jun, and St Kilda on 13 Jun; Highland 2 at Noss Farm on 6-7 Jun; Grampian 2 at Ythan in mid-Jun, 1 perhaps till 9 Aug, singles in Deeside on 21 Jul, and Girdle Ness on 25 Aug; Tayside singles at St Vigeans on 16 Jun, Glen Clova on 30 Jun, and Kinnaber on 26 Jul; Fife 4 singles on Isle of May between 22 May and 16 Jun, 1 at Fife Ness on 5 Jun; Borders singles at St Abbs on 11 Jun and 20 Sep; Strathclyde 1 on Islay on 31 Oct.

Great Grey Shrike Lanius excubitor A slight improvement with up to 30 individuals recorded. Shetland singles at Wester Quarff on 5-6 Apr. and on Fair Isle on 19 Apr. 8-9 birds in autumn between 3 and 26 Oct; Orkney singles on North Ronaldsay on 14 Oct, and South Ronaldsay on 23 Oct; Highland singles at Abernethy on 2 Jan, Leanachan Forest on 13 Jan, L Garten from 29 Mar-27 Apr. Strathconon on 13 Oct, Brims on 21 Oct, Balavil from 12 Nov-17 Dec, Tomnachrasky on 26 Nov, and Glen Convinth on 5 Dec; Grampian singles at Cruden Bay on 23 Oct, and Inverey in Dec; Fife singles at Fife Ness from 4-11 Apr and on 20 Oct; Lothian 1 at Barns Ness on 2 Oct; Borders 1 near Hoselaw on 1 Feb; Strathclyde 1 at Ferter, Barrhill on 4-5 Nov perhaps till end Dec; Dumf & Gall 1 in L Ken area from 3 Jan-21 Feb, only 2 in autumn with 1 near Big Fleet viaduct on 4-5 Nov, and another Sanquhar on 25 Nov.

Jay Garrulus glandarius In Highland singles were noted at Leanachan on 25 Jan, Speanbridge on 2 Sep, and 1 at Millbuies, Grampian in Sep was also notable (it should be noted that this species is still rare in many parts of Northern Scotland, and all reports will be welcomed); Lothian/Borders showed a continued increase in numbers and range.

Magpie Pica pica Breeding: Grampian a continued spread was noted; Strathclyde showing signs of range expansion in S Ayrshire; Dumf & Gall some increase was indicated. Elsewhere: Shetland 1 on Fair Isle from 22-25 Apr, and later on Foula was the first record for Shetland; Orkney 2 birds on Sanday and North Ronaldsay from 13-21 Apr were the 1st since 1976; Grampian 40 at Countesswells on 6 Jan; Central 40 at Kinneil Woods on 2 Jan.

Chough Pyrrhocorax pyrrhocorax Strathclyde/SW Scotland a pair was present on Mull from 23 Jun-1 Nov, and a pre-roost flock of 60 was seen on Islay on 14 Feb, 2 seen at a mainland coastal site in Apr, and possibly up to 3 during Jul-early Aug, also 2 at another site represent the first mainland reports for many years. Elsewhere: 3 were seen on Eigg, Highland on 24 Jul.

Jackdaw Corvus monedula Breeding: **West Isles** breeding recorded at Howmore, S Uist was the 1st recorded breeding outside Stornoway. Birds showing characteristics of **Scandinavian** monedula: **Orkney** had 4 on 24 Mar and 1 on 9 Apr.

Rook *Corvus frugilegus* Breeding: **Orkney** a survey produced 1419 nests; **West Isles** 200 nests were counted in the Stornoway rookery. Counts: **Shetland** 180 at Gott on 6 Feb; **Grampian** 5500 at Montgarrie on 20 Dec.

Carrion Crow Corvus corone Counts: Shetland 200+ C c cornix at Sullom Voe on 5 Mar; Orkney 260 C c cornix at Durkadale on 20 Dec.

Raven Corvus corax Breeding: Shetland 9 pairs on Fetlar, and 3 pairs on Fair Isle; Orkney 58 breeding or territorial pairs were reported, 46 young were reared from 18 successful nests on Mainland; Tayside 10 successful pairs reared 23+ young; Borders 3 pairs were recorded, 2 of which bred successfully; Central 13 pairs were successful, and 8 pairs reared 26 young; Strathclyde at least 56 occupied nests on Mull, but a decrease to 13 pairs on Arran, 6 successful pairs reared 16 young in Ayrshire; Dumf & Gall stability in inland areas but a continued lack of breeding on the coast. Counts: Shetland the highest counts were 40 on Fair Isle on 11 Apr, and 130+ at Rova Head on 2 May.

Starling Sturnus vulgaris Counts: Highland 15-20,000 at Thurso on 30 Aug; Grampian 10,000 at L Spynie on 13 Nov, and 10,000 at Ellon on 30 Nov; Tayside 5000 in the Perth roost on 29 Nov; Lothian 3000 on Craigleith on 18 Nov; Strathclyde 13,000 at Heart Loch, Maybole on 31 Oct, and 11,000 roosted on Glasgow bridge on 20 Dec.

* Rose-coloured Starling Sturnus roseus Grampian adult at Glen Rinnes from 13 Jun-5 Jul (MJHC et al), and another adult at Turriff from 8-10 Aug (ASD); Strathclyde an adult at Portnahaven, Islay from 10 Aug-3 Sep (MGC,MAO).

House Sparrow *Passer domesticus* **Shetland** the post-breeding population on Fair Isle stood at 340 on 4 Sep; **Orkney** a high count of 550 on North Ronaldsay on 4 Oct seems notable; **Strathclyde** 360 were counted at Cumbernauld on 28 Jul.

Tree Sparrow Passer montanus Breeding: Highland 5-10 pairs nested on Canna. Counts: Shetland singles on Fair Isle on 9-11 May, another till 14 May, and 1 on 25 May; Grampian 60 at Milton Brodie on 22 Nov; Tayside up to 100 at Carnoustie early in year; Fife 80 at Freuchie on 10 Aug; Lothian Aberlady had 120 on 24 Nov; Borders 130 at Reston from 1 Nov-15 Dec; Strathclyde 120 at Inchinnan on 16 Jan.

Chaffinch Fringilla coelebs Counts: Shetland the highest numbers on Fair Isle were between 2 and 21 Apr, with the peak of 150 on 9 Apr, a large passage on the main islands from 12 Oct-early Nov had a peak of 280 on 19 Oct: Orkney the peak count on North Ronaldsay was 250 on 19 Oct: Grampian 800 at Mill of Cammie on 6 Dec; Tayside 900 in Glen Quaich on 28 Sep, and 1000 at Braco on 7 Nov; Borders the highest count was 1200 Lochurd on 13 Dec: Strathclyde 1200 at Blanefield on 8 Nov, and 1000 in Glen Afton on 14 Nov; Dumf & Gall had the only exceptional flock of 3500 at Challoch, Wigtown District in mid-Dec.

Brambling Fringilla montifringilla Summer: Shetland had 1 on Fair Isle on 3-8 Jul. Winter/spring: Shetland a heavy passage from 14-24 Oct with a peak of 260 on 19 Oct; Grampian 300 at Bridge of Don on 17 Jan; Tayside 200 at Madderty on 1 Feb, and 300 at Muir of Orchill on 22 Mar; Fife 250 near Elie on 18 Jan; Lothian peaks were 700 at Silverburn on 15 Feb, and 600 at Mount Lothian on 4 Mar; Borders 2000 at East Loch from 29 Jan-11 Feb; Strathclyde 1000 at Dunsyre on 4 Apr, and the last report was on 28 Apr; Dumf & Gall a huge flock of 5000 was at Southerness on 11 Jan. Autumn: Shetland main passage on Fair Isle from 13-30 Oct, maximum 120 on 14 and 19 Oct; Orkney the peak count was 100 on North Ronaldsay on 20 Oct; Fife 300 on the Isle of May on 19 Oct; Borders 700 at Kilbucho on 29 Nov; elsewhere numbers were low.

Greenfinch Carduelis chloris Counts: Grampian 500 at Aboyne in late Oct, and 450 at Rothes on 30 Dec; Tayside 400 at Braco on 19 Dec; Fife 800 at Anstruther on 18 Jan; Borders 420 at Duns on 9 Feb; Strathclyde 800+ at Ladykirk on 10 Jan; counts of 300 were returned from Highland, and Lothian.

Goldfinch Carduelis Carduelis Breeding: Grampian had good numbers and a successful breeding season. Counts: Shetland had a good year, with an unusual flock of 8 on Fair Isle on 1 Nov; Grampian 40 at Spey Bay on 7 Jan was also unusual; Tayside 50 at Scone on 6 Apr; Lothian 120 at Aberlady on 19 Sep; Strathclyde 60 at Kingscross, Arran on 28 Sep, and 60 at Calderbank on 17 Nov; Dumf & Gall 150 at Earlstoun on 24 Oct.

Siskin Carduelis spinus Breeding: Strathclyde/Dumf & Gall numbers were fairly low, but early nesting occurred in some cases. Counts: Shetland autumn maxima were 45 at Skaw, Unst on 15 Oct, and 40 on Fair Isle on 19 Oct; Tayside 200 at Killiecrankie in Dec; Fife 120 on the Isle of May on 12 Oct; Dumf & Gall 150 at Laurieston on 26 Oct; counts of 100 were returned from Grampian, Lothian, and 2 areas in Strathclyde.

Linnet Carduelis cannabina Counts: **Orkney** 200 at Crantit, St Ola on 27 Sep; **Lothian** Musselburgh held 680 on 2 Sep; **Central** 900 at Kinneil on 17 Jan; **Dumf & Gall** large flocks were reported including 1000 at L Ken on 10 Jan, 1000 in the Cree Valley on 13 Mar, and 1500 at Challoch on 25 Dec.

Twite Carduelis flavirostris Breeding: **Strathclyde** Southern Upland sightings continued with a σ at Wandel on 25 May, and a pair in the Crawford area. Counts: **Shetland** the highest counts were 380 at Toab on 7 Feb, 340 on Fair Isle on 12 Sep, and 300+ on Fetlar on 31 Oct; **Orkney** 480 on Sanday on 18 Dec; **Highland** 500 at Glengolly on 30 Dec; **Tayside** had a huge flock of 1200 at Braco on 19 Dec; **Lothian** 200-270 at Gladhouse till 28 Mar; **Strathclyde/Dumf & Gall** had low numbers, especially in autumn.

Redpoll Carduelis flammea Counts: Highland 100 at Tarradale on 8 Nov; Central 100 at Doune in Oct; Lothian 100 at Pefferside in Oct; Dumf & Gall 150 at L Ken on 19 Sep. Mealy Redpoll Cf flammea: Shetland a scatter of Fair Isle records involved 2 on 1 Jan, 1-3 between 11 Apr and 17 Jun, and 1-2 between 7 Oct and 2 Nov; Grampian 6 at Donmouth on 16 Jan; Tayside 2 at Vane Farm on 12 Jan; Lothian 2-3 at Aberlady on 10 Jan, and 5 at Gladhouse on 7 Mar; Strathclyde 1 on Islay on 13 Feb, 4 at East Kilbride on 12 Nov.

- * Arctic Redpoil Carduelis hornemanni Shetland 1 on Foula on 23 Apr (RWGC), another on Whalsay from 30 Apr-1 May (JLI,BM), 1 on Fair Isle from 25 Sep-2 Oct (KO,NJR), with another on 12 Oct (SJA et al).
- * Two-barred Crossbill Loxia leucoptera Shetland an unprecendented influx to the Northern isles brought the following records (all juveniles unless specified):- 1 on Out Skerries on 9 Aug (ET)Ø, adult P killed by a cat on Fetlar on 9 Aug (per MAP)Ø, I found dead at Wester Quarff on 10 Aug (JND,DBP)Ø, 1 at Bigton from 11-19 Aug (JM et al), 2 at Basta, Yell from 11-13 Aug (T & VL)Ø, Foula had an incredible count of 12, with 3 on 11 Aug, 10 on 15 Aug 2 on 16 Aug, and 1 on 18 Aug (RWGCJDO,MAP)Ø 3 at Voe on 13 Aug (MSC)Ø, and 4 from 14-18 Aug (MAP et al)Ø, Fair Isle had 3 on 15 Aug, 2 till 16 Aug, and a P on 28 Aug (per NJR)Ø; Orkney a juvenile on North Ronaldsay on 13 Aug, and 2 at Finstown 22 Aug (MR,MGP)Ø.

Crossbill Loxia curvirostra Breeding: Highland moderate numbers bred in Glengarry in Mar-Apr, with good numbers in the Great Glen spruces in Jul-Oct period: Strathelyde/Dumf & Gall low-moderate numbers early in year, but more with the good cone crop later in the year, and late nesting. Counts/migrants: Shetland only 4 individuals were recorded between 31 May and 22 Aug; Central 90 in the Achray Forest on 6 Dec; Lothian had poor numbers; Dumf & Gall 52 at Merton Hall Moss on 3 Nov.

Scottish Crossbill *Loxia scotica* No data was received on breeding. Counts: Highland 25 in Glen Affric on 13 Feb, 50 at L Garten on 27 Feb, and 60 at Coylumbridge on 22 Aug were the highest counts; Grampian the highest count was 20 in Glen Tanar on 8 Aug.

- * Parrot Crossbill Loxia pytyopsittacus Highland of at L Garten from 11-22 Mar (RHD,RP).
- *Scarlet Rosefinch Carpodacus erythrinus A good year with about 52 individuals. Shetland 1 on Fair Isle on 23 May preceded 4 on 25 May, and 1-3 birds between 31 May and 14 Jun, 1 on 13 Jul was joined by another on 20-21 Jul, 1 staying till 22 Jul, on main islands c18 birds were recorded between 24 May and 21 Jun, 9 birds were seen in autumn between 21 Aug and 10 Oct, while Fair Isle produced 1-2 on 26 Aug-10 Sep, and 16-30 Sep with 3 on 20 Sep, the last 1 being on 7 Oct; Orkney 4 spring singles between 31 May and 3 Jun, and 2 singles in autumn on Hoy on 8 Aug, and Holm on 4 Nov; Highland single singing $\sigma \sigma$ at different sites during early-mid Jun; Grampian 1 at Rattray from 3-4 Sep; Fife singles on the Isle of May on 14 Jul, 10 Oct (see below), and 19 Oct; Lothian 1 at Pefferside on 11 Oct had been ringed on Isle of May on 10 Oct.

Bullfinch *Pyrrhula pyrrhula* Breeding: **West Isles** an increase was noted in Stornoway. Migration/counts: **Shetland** had a good spring passage with 18 birds at 5 locations on 3-16 Apr and 5 on Fair Isle on 6-8 Apr; **West Isles** 1 on Taransay on 26 Oct; **Highland** 1 Northern race bird at Noss Farm on 22-24 Oct.

Hawfinch Coccothraustes coccothraustes Breeding: Tayside the species was recorded breeding at Pitlochry and St Phillans with other reports of birds in surrounding area from Aberfeldy-Blairgowrie; Lothian 1-2 at the usual sites in Feb-May. Migration: Shetland 10 singles were recorded between 27 Mar and 9 Jun; Orkney 1 on Sanday on 4 Apr; Fife 1 near Lindores on 21 Nov; Strathclyde 1 at Giffnock on 19 Mar.

- * Savannah Sparrow Ammodramus sandwichensis Shetland 1 on Fair Isle from 30 Sep-1 Oct was the first record of this species for Scotland (PJE, NJR et al).
- * White-throated Sparrow Zonotrichia albicollis Shetland 1 at Norwick from 13-15 May (GG,MSi,IS), and another at Kergord on 16 Jun (C & DKL).

Lapland Bunting Calcarius lapponicus Winter/spring: Orkney 1 on North Ronaldsay on 21 May; West Isles 1 at Balranald on 3 Apr; Central 4 at Kinneil on 10 Jan; Lothian a peak of 48 at Musselburgh dropped to 4 by 8 Apr; Borders 30 at Eyemouth on 9 Jan. Autumn: Shetland 1st bird on Unst was on 26 Sep, then good numbers on Fair Isle with peaks of 70 on 11 Sep, 35 on 22 Sep, and 25 on 3 Oct; Orkney 1st on Stronsay on 3 Sep, with a peak of 40 on North Ronaldsay on 28-29 Sep; West Isles 1 on St Kilda on 9 Sep; Lothian Aberlady had 55 on 28 Nov; Borders 27 at Eyemouth on 19 Dec; Strathelyde 14 at Kilchoman, Islay on 31 Oct, and an unusual record of 1 at Cumbernauld on 2 Nov.

Snow Bunting Plectrophenax nivalis Breeding: Highland/Grampian high numbers were reported from the Cairngorms plateau, 13 juveniles seen at one site on 25 Jul. Migration/counts: Shetland a large autumn arrival on Fair Isle on 7 Nov with 320 birds, Yell had 240 on 1 Nov, while Fetlar held 200 on 3 Nov, and Gulberwick had 200 on 8 Nov: Orkney peaks included 400 at Sandwick on 1 Jan, 500 at Deerness on 17 Feb, and 500 on Eday on 16 Nov. 1st of autumn on North Ronaldsay was on 10 Sep: Highland 1000-1500 at Bardnaclavan on 29 Mar, and 900 at Glengolly on 31 Dec were the highest Caithness counts: Grampian 1000 at Cairnorrie in Jan, 500 at Gask on 18 Feb; in the South numbers were lower, with 100-150 at a few sites, while in Dumf & Gall 1 at Upper Craigenbay. Stewartry District on 5 May was very late for SW Scotland.

* Pine Bunting Emberiza leucocephalus Shetland a σ on Fair Isle from 11-20 Oct (RJ & SJA.KO.NJR), preceded a Ω /immature on 22 Oct (SJA), and perhaps the same from 29 Oct-13 Nov (SJA.NJR); Orkney a 1st winter σ on North Ronaldsay from 19-20 Oct (AED.MGP et al), and another 1st winter σ from 3-9 Nov (MGP et al).

Yellowhammer Emberiza citrinella Breeding: Dumf & Gall noted a reduction in numbers in recent years. Migration/counts: Orkney 2 singles on 4-6 Apr, another on 20 Oct; West Isles singles on St Kilda from 21-23 Apr, and Ardvule on 25 Apr; the largest flocks were in Central with 150 at Gartmorn on 15 Feb, and Strathclyde with 150 at Linwood on 18 Jan.

- * Ortolan Bunting Emberiza hortulana 9 individuals were recorded. Shetland \circ on Fair Isle on 29 May, and 2 \circ on 30 May were the only spring records, 3 singles in autumn on 7, 10, and 12-15 Sep, also singles were seen at Toab on 22 Sep, and Fetlar on 2-4 Oct; Orkney 1 on Papa Westray on 19 Jun.
- * Rustic Bunting Emberiza rustica Shetland 1 on Fair Isle on 22 May (JRA,PATC,NJR), a σ at Quendale on 26 May (DRB,DS)ø, a σ on Fair Isle from 4-5 Jun (JRA,SJA,NJR), a \circ from 8-9 Jun (JRA,NJR), a σ on Foula on 11 Jun (RWGC)ø, 1 on Fair Isle from 23-24 Sep (MC,NJR), and another on 2 Oct (BR,NJR), 1 on Out Skerries from 3-21 Oct (BM,ET), and 1 on Whalsay from 8-10 Oct (CFM,BM)ø; Orkney σ on Stronsay on 21 Oct (JFH,DP); Lothian \circ at Skateraw on 26 May (GA,AB,PRG); Strathclyde σ on Tiree on 4 Jun (MJE,MG,AK et al).

- * Yellow-breasted Bunting Emberiza aureola Shetland single \$\partial \text{jmmatures} on Fair Isle on 27-28 Aug (SJA), 2 Sep (SJA,MO'R), 15-16 Sep (DRWG,JPH,RJM), 16 Sep (JND,SJMG), and 20 Sep (RJA,NJR), 1 at Scatness on 21 Sep (DRB,PME)\text{\text{\text{g}}; Orkney} adult \text{\text{\text{o}} on South Ronaldsay on 25 Apr (KH)\text{\text{\text{\text{\text{\text{g}}}}}

Reed Bunting Emberiza schoeniclus Migration/counts: **Shetland** a strong passage on Fair Isle from 13 Oct-13 Nov with a maximum of 15 on 20 Oct. **Highland** high counts of 200 were recorded at Hastigrow on 3 Jan, and Brabsterdorran on 5 Jan; **Strathclyde** 150 roosted at New Cumnock on 18 Oct.

Corn Bunting Miliaria calandra Breeding: Shetland perhaps still breeds with records from 2 former haunts; Orkney 7 singing \$\sigma\$ noted; Grampian a survey revealed 23 singing \$\sigma\$\$ in Moray District; Fife no apparent change in stable population; Central only 4 recorded between Jan and May; Lothian no confirmed breeding but at least 8 singing \$\sigma\$\$ as in 1986; Strathclyde regular breeding in Argyll now only on Tiree, and down to c6 territories in Ayrshire; Dumf & Gall now close to extinction as a breeding bird in Galloway. Migration/counts: Orkney 24 on Stronsay from Oct-Nov was the highest count there.

*Yellow-headed Blackbird Xanthocephalus xanthocephalus Shetland a & at Norwick on 10 May was also seen at Mid Yell on 13 May, Burrafirth on 11-12 May, and Cullivoe on 12 May (DC,RD,CMG et al). While there must be a possibility of escape with this species, it is currently under consideration for upgrading to Category A.

RED-EYED VIREO 1985 Highland a 1st winter bird at Wick from 13-16 Oct is the 1st record of this species for Scotland. Two-barred Crossbill 1986 Central Q at Carron Valley was seen on 19 Apr. CHESTNUT-SIDED WARBLER 1985 Shetland a 1st year bird on Fetlar on 20 Sep is the 1st record of this species for Britain. Little Bunting 1986 Shetland 1 on Whalsay from 8-12 Oct. **Bobolink 1986 Western Isles** 1 on St Kilda on 28 Sep is the 2nd Scottish record, preceding the 1986 Fair Isle bird by one day.

The following record has been rejected by BBRC:- Gyrfalcon 1986 Shetland 1 on Fair Isle on

20 Feb.

The following corrections and additions to the 1986 SBR should be made:- King Eider Fife the first date for the R Tay individual should be 12 Jan; Greenish Warbler Highland the observers of the presumed hybrid Greenish x Willow Warbler at L Vaa should be DED and RHD.

Blackpoll Warbler on Whalsay

7.10pm on 30 Sep 1985 JLIrvine arrived at the house of BM with a bird in a bird bag. It had been caught in a heligoland trap a little earlier, but had been seen since 11.00am that day. When it was removed BM realised that it was an American species, and thought immediately of Blackpoll Warbler. It was examined, ringed, and roosted overnight, being released at first light on the following morning. It remained in the area of the trap till the afternoon of 3 Oct.

Description: (in the hand and in artificial light which affected the colour tones slightly) Crown, nape, mantle, back, rump, upper tail coverts, and scapulars were dull olive green (possibly even greyish olive green). The crown was faintly streaked darker, and the nape was unstreaked. On the mantle some feathers with blackish centres gave prominent darker streaks. The scapulars were similar to the mantle. Only very faint streaking was suggested on the back. The streaking on the rump and upper tail coverts was intermediate in density between mantle and back. The upper tail coverts were very long - longest tail feathers projected only 13mm beyond them. The outer tail feathers were longer than the inner ones by 4mm. Tail feathers were blackish, all pointed, and had pale fringes to all webs. The outer two tail feathers had white on the inner webs. A poorly defined buff supercilium did not reach the base of the bill and became extremely narrow above the orbital ring. It extended to the width of the eye behind the eye where it merged into the crown. A faint dark line ran from the front of the eye to the lores. There was a more pronounced dark olive line behind the eye along the lower border of the supercilium. The ear coverts were dull olive green with a few buffish feathers admixed. The lesser coverts appeared similar to the scapulars. but more grevish olive with black subterminal crescents and some black shaft streaks. The median coverts were blackish with broad white tips up to 3mm wide. The alula was blackish, the feathers having very narrow faint olive fringes to the outer webs. The greater coverts were as the medians, but with even broader white tips (4-5mm), and a white fringe on the outer web extending further proximally. The primary coverts were blackish. All except the first and second primaries, and all secondaries were blackish. The first and second primaries had had pale tips to the outer web and very fine olive fringes. The chin was buffish with a yellow cast, and the throat faint yellow with a grevish wash. The upper breast was yellower than the throat, and had diffuse grevish streaks. The belly was yellowish buff. The area from the legs to the vent was white with a faint yellow wash, and the flanks were streaked greyish with a little yellow admixed. The bill was fairly strong with a dagger-like tip. The upper mandible was greyish horn, and the lower was similar at the extreme tip, but becoming rapidly paler towards the gape, by which area pinkish vellow with just a trace of grevish white could be seen along the cutting edge. The iris was blackish, and the orbital ring incomplete but forming a pale buffish are above and below the eve. The legs were brownish anteriorly, pinkish at the rear, and the soles were flesh.

When BM saw the bird in bright sunlight in the field on 2 Oct, it looked much brighter. It fed actively, perching on fence posts and walls with its tail slightly cocked, before dropping to the ground to pick up food items. The legs appeared yellowish when seen from behind, and light brown from the sides, while the feet were quite bright yellow. The upperparts were a brighter olive, with fine dark streaks on the mantle. The underparts showed bright yellow with a hint of green, the chin and centre breast were free of dark streaks, while the sides of the breast had fine dark streaks. The flank streaking looked finer and well defined. The under tail coverts were white, and the supercilium seemed brighter and more yellow, though still narrow. The white areas in the

tail, wing bars and tertial edges were all obvious.
