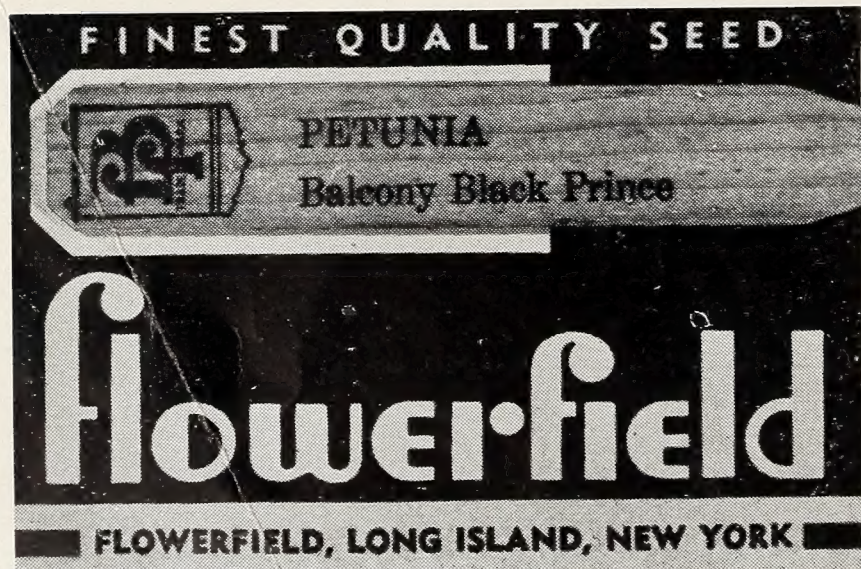

AGERATUM

Adapted to either full sun or part shade. Plants bloom through the entire summer. Unexcelled as an edging plant.

Blue Ball Pkt. 15c, ¼ oz. 50c
Deep periwinkle-blue flowers of feathery texture, clustered together to form a ball-like head on mounded plants 6 to 8 inches tall, and 12 inches across.

Fairy Pink Pkt. 25c
A pale rose colored variety from Mexico. The flower clusters are freely produced on plants 5 inches high. Compact habit. Exquisite with pastel petunias.

Midget Blue Pkt. 20c
A. A. S. 1940. Silver medal winner. Dwarf plants 4 inches high with a spread of 15 inches. The tiny violet-blue flowers almost hide the foliage during the blooming period. Use it next to deep blue pansies in a mixed ribbon border, in front of marigolds.

ALYSSUM - Sweet Alyssum

Easily grown, free flowering plants popular for use in beds, borders, edgings, rock gardens, and window boxes. In bloom all during summer months and fall. Delicately fragrant.

Carpet of Snow

Pkt. 15c, ¼ oz. 40c
Pure white flowers fairly cover the foliage of the dwarf plants, that seldom grow over 5 inches in height. Of spreading habit, useful for an informal edging or ground cover.

Little Gem Pkt. 15c; ¼ oz. 35c
Pure white, growing 4 inches high, but compact in habit. Ideal for use as a ribbon border and where a neat edge is desired.

Violet Queen Pkt. 20c, ¼ oz. 60c
Deep blue-violet, dwarf, sweetly scented. A completely new variety, free-flowering and unusual in color. It creates a wonderful effect as a border for white bedding petunias.

RUST-RESISTANT ANTIRRHINUMS (Snapdragons)

Bloom all summer until frost. Lovely plants with glossy, clean foliage above which the flower spikes hold their heads with proud beauty. Tolerant of full sun or part shade. Excellent for cutting.

SUPER GIANTS—3 feet tall (Maximum)

Alaska Pkt. 20c
Handsome, pure white blooms well displayed on large attractive spikes. The best tall white Snapdragon. Try it in a blue and white border.

Apple Blossom Pkt. 20c
Delicate rose-pink with a blotch of yellow on the lip. Enchanting color for cutting and flower arrangements.

Indian Summer Pkt. 20c
Autumnal colors of coppery orange with scarlet blotch. Effective note in the mixed border.

Red Cross Pkt. 20c
Interesting variety, dark red florets with a pure white tube. Commands attention because of vivid color contrast.

SUPER GIANT ANTIRRHINUMS
INDIAN SUMMER and ALASKA

Yellow Giant Pkt. 20c
Clear deep yellow with white tube. Looks sparkling and clean in the garden.

Mixed Giants Pkt. 15c
Superb mixture of many colors of Super Giants. Unexcelled for cutting.

BEDDING VARIETIES—24 inches (Majus Grandiflorum)

Defiance Pkt. 20c
Brilliant scarlet flowers; a much desired color.

Reveille Pkt. 25c
Deep luminous yellow with the upper lip of each floret toning to a lighter lemon-yellow. Individual florets are unusually large and are tightly grouped on the spike.

Rosalie Pkt. 20c
A rich deep rose with an underlying tone of topaz. Tube and lip are self tones. The warm old rose shade of the bloom is extremely pleasing.

Shasta Pkt. 20c
The best white in this new strain. Plants are symmetrical and base branching.

Majus Exquisite Mixed Pkt. 15c
All colors of this wonderful strain of rust-resisting Snapdragons. Splendid for the garden; bushy plants of an excellent height.

DWARF GIANTS (Nanum Grandiflorum)

18 inches tall, very free-flowering;
ideal for beds and edgings

Amber and Gold Pkt. 25c
Buds appear as a soft rose-pink, but as the spikes open to full bloom they show florets with full golden yellow lips, and hoods of golden amber.

Du Barry Pkt. 25c
Similar in habit to Amber and Gold, Du Barry is a flaming salmon-rose of self shading except for a golden yellow spot on the lower lip.

Ruby Pkt. 20c
Bright velvety carmine-crimson color. Its brilliant tone makes it most desirable to achieve sharp color contrasts.

Nanum Jewel Mixed Pkt. 20c
A wonderful mixture of all colors in this strain of large flowering dwarf Snapdragons.



WILT-RESISTANT ASTERS

Asters are magnificent cut flowers as well as lovely border subjects. While most easily grown, they prefer a rich, well-drained soil and plenty of sunshine. It is well to plant in new soil each year. Flowerfield offers only wilt-resistant strains.

SUPER GIANT ASTERS

Somewhat later in blooming than the Early Giant, this magnificent new introduction is the largest of all. Flowers from 6 to 8 inches across, made up of long curled fluffy petals, creating flowers that rival Giant Chrysanthemums in beauty. Plants are 2½ feet tall.

El Monte Pkt. 25c
Deep glowing crimson throughout. A wonderful color in this large flowered Super Giant class. Flowers are borne on unusually strong stems that rise right from the base of the plants without branching.

Los Angeles Pkt. 25c
The huge size of the flowers is made even more striking by the color, which is pure shell-pink. No disbudding is necessary to secure these wonderful flowers.



EXTRA EARLY GIANT CREGO NAVY BLUE A. A. S., 1943

First of a new race of large flowered early Asters. Blooms are 4 to 5 inches across, of dark midnight blue, with gracefully curled and twisted petals. Plants are of branching habit and grow 2 feet tall. Can be had in bloom in June if seeds are started early indoors. Wonderful cut flower. Pkt. 35c

IMPROVED GIANT CREGO

Blooms early September. Plants robust, branching, about 2½ feet tall. Flowers large, double, curled and interlaced. One of the finest varieties for all purposes.

GIANT CALIFORNIA SUNSHINE

Mixed Colors Pkt. 25c
A fascinating Aster type. The large Daisy-like flowers, 4 to 5 inches across, are composed of a single row of long narrow petals, surrounding a small yellow quill-like disc. Branching plants are 2½ feet tall with strong stems, fine for cutting. Bloom in midseason. We offer a fine blend of pastel shades.

EARLY GIANT ASTERS

The finest early large-flowered, heavy stemmed wilt-resistant Aster. Flowers large and full, composed of long fluffy petals that curl over. Bloom in mid-August, growing to a height of 1 to 1½ feet.

Dawn Blue Pkt. 25c
A pastel shade of definite character, best described as light lavender with a bluish cast.

Rose Marie Pkt. 25c
Beautiful flowers of full rich color, desirable to use with other color arrangement. Typical habit of this Early Giant class.

ASTER VICTORY GIANTS MIXED COLORS



An extra early Aster of the well-known Crego type with long ribbon-like gracefully curled and twisted petals. Very large double flowers four to five inches across, on stems 1½ to 2 feet long. The vigorous, freely branching plants grow 2 to 3 feet tall. Bloom from midseason to frost. Pkt. 35c

AMERICAN BEAUTY ASTERS

Begin to bloom in early September with prettily incurved broad petals making up full, globular flowers four inches across. Noted for long stems that make them one of the best sources of good fall flowers. Branching in habit, growing 2 to 2½ feet.

PRINCESS ASTERS

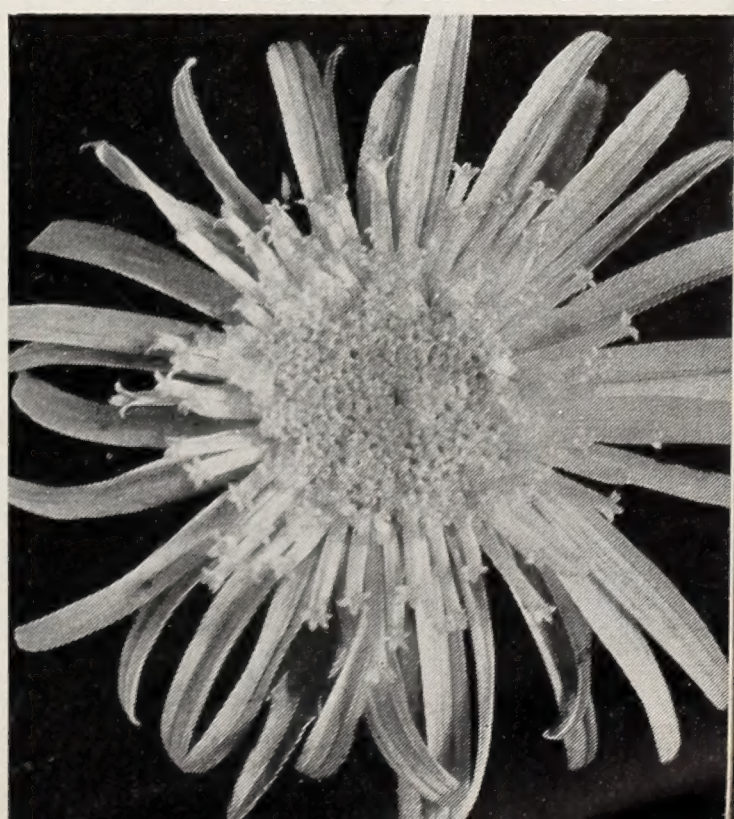

Marigolds


Marigolds thrive with a minimum of care. Plant the taller sorts like Sunset Giants and Yellow Supreme in the background. Then group the Mission Giants in front and use the Harmony types for borders. Give them a location in full sun and they will reward you with an abundance of bloom.

TALL GROWING MARIGOLDS

MISSION GIANTS

A new personality in Marigolds. The Chrysanthemum-shaped flowers are fully double and form almost a perfect ball. Plants 2 to 4 feet high.

Goldsmith Pkt. 20c
All-America Selection, 1941. Golden orange blooms 2 to 3 inches across. Plants are strong and bushy, base branching, with many excellent blooms. Height, 3 feet.

Yellowstone Pkt. 25c
 Bright, clear yellow Chrysanthemum-shaped flowers, forming almost perfect balls. A new color in the Mission Giant strain, forming luxurious large plants, growing up to 3 feet. A most welcome addition because of its clear, true color. Blooms until frost. Excellent for cutting.

Mission Giants Mixed Pkt. 25c
The colors in this mixture are many and varied, ranging from deep, medium and golden orange to bright lemon-yellow.

SUNSET GIANTS

Mixed Colors Pkt. 15c
A new, sweet-scented, large double-flowered type. Flowers 4 to 5 inches across, ranging from lemon-yellow to orange. 4 feet tall.

CARNATION-FLOWERED MARIGOLDS

Guinea Gold Pkt. 15c
Selected strain. Beautiful shade of deep orange, flushed with gold. Odorless foliage, and stems 2½ to 3 feet tall, make them fine for cutting.


Yellow Supreme Pkt. 15c
Practically odorless foliage, with large, rich lemon-yellow flowers that are 100 per cent double. Blooms are quite fragrant, with stems 2½ feet long.

CHRYSANTHEMUM-FLOWERED HYBRIDS

Mixed Colors Pkt. 15c
New incurved Chrysanthemum-flowered type, with fully double blooms on plants 3 feet high. Range from palest primrose to deep rich orange. Bloom in 16 weeks.


DWARF GROWING MARIGOLDS

DWARF FRENCH DOUBLE

Butterball Pkt. 25c
 Butterball is an exquisite little jewel which bears dozens of flowers of a lovely butter-yellow shade. Of the Harmony strain, the dwarf plants are compact in habit, about 8 inches high, and literally covered with blooms 2 inches across. Early blooming. Would combine beautifully with Nierembergia for a border.

Harmony Hybrids Pkt. 20c
Wide and varied range of striking color combinations. Scabiosa type flowers with crested center, and wavy guard petals. Fully double flowers 2 inches across, on plants 1 foot high.

Spry Pkt. 20c
The cutest little compact plants you have ever seen, growing only 9 inches high, and spreading 15 inches. Flowers 1½ to 1¾ inches across, almost completely covering the plants. Center crest is bright, clear yellow, and guard petals mahogany-red. All-America Silver Medal, 1941.

Sunkist Pkt. 25c
 A. A. S., 1943. Developed as an orange-colored sport from last year's winner, Butterball. It is a dwarf, compact, very early, continuous blooming, dwarf double French Harmony type.

Early Royal Scot Pkt. 15c
Lovely Dwarf French Double Marigold, with flowers made up of rich mahogany and gold in uniform stripes. Plants are dwarf, but of spreading habit.

Scarlet Glow Pkt. 25c
Opening brilliant scarlet, turning to rich tangerine, as they age. Fully double flowers, two inches across, on plants 10 inches high, with a spread of 18 inches. All-America Selection, 1941.

DWARF AFRICAN "LITTLE GIANTS"

Gypsy Jewels Pkt. 25c
New strain of "Little Giants." Blooms measure four inches across, produced on compact plants 15 inches tall. The huge flowers are so freely produced, 15 to 25 at a time, that the plants will form a neat hedge of solid bloom of variegated colors.

Limelight Pkt. 15c
Lightest in color of all the Marigolds, and almost identical to florists' Chrysanthemums in form. Exquisite flowers, 2¾ inches in size, on plants 20 inches in height.

Pot o' Gold Pkt. 25c
Large, tight 4-inch flowers in warm orange tones. Plants grow 15 inches high in erect hedge fashion. Ideal for bedding or for edging flower beds of other plants.

FOR EARLIEST BLOOM

All annuals will flower from seed planted in the open ground when the weather is warm. However, many annuals will flower much earlier by planting indoors, or in a hotbed or cold frame.

For planting indoors, use a shallow receptacle or flat having holes for drainage, filled with an equal mixture of good garden soil and clean sand. The seed should be sown on the surface and lightly covered with sandy soil. Do not cover very fine seed, just press lightly into the soil. (We supply a printed wooden name stake with each packet.)

Keep soil moist but not wet. Use only a fine spray to water. Transplant 2 inches apart after seedlings have made their second leaves. Plant outside in the garden when the ground is warm.



DOUBLE CRESTED COSMOS, PINK LADY

CALENDULAS

Large-flowered annuals, superb for cutting. Bloom from July to hard frost on stems 12 to 18 inches in height. Flowers 3 to 4 in. across, are either fully double or with extra petalage showing open attractive centers. All shades of yellow and orange, from light straw color to deepest orange tones.

Yellow Colossal Pkt. 20c
Immense bright yellow flowers, 4½ inches and more across. Very profuse in bloom. Petals are long, loose, and gracefully curved. Bushy plants 1½ feet high.

Orange King Pkt. 15c
Brilliant orange flowers with open centers. Blooms are large and flat, of formal formation, carried on sturdy stems excellent for cutting. A favorite florist's variety.

Chrysantha Pkt. 15c
Canary-yellow blooms with wide and long petals gracefully curled like greenhouse Chrysanthemums. Splendid for cutting.

Orange Fantasy Pkt. 20c
New crested Calendula. Long outer petals with curved inner petals. Deep copper-orange with attractive brown center.

Orange Shaggy Pkt. 15c
Has the appearance of a shaggy chrysanthemum. Petals long and deeply fringed. Deep orange shadings, lighter at center.

Art Shades Pkt. 20c
Many fine colors formerly not obtainable in Calendulas. Colors range from white to cream, and buff to yellow and deep maroon.

CALLIOPSIS

Dwarf Varieties Mixed Pkt. 20c
Both single and double flowers, all colors from cream-yellow to orange, crimson, maroon, mahogany and gold. Ideal for edgings and rockeries. Height 9 to 12 inches.

GIANT HYACINTH-FLOWERED CANDYTUFT



CALIFORNIA POPPY

(Eschscholtzia)

Native Poppies wide-spread on the Pacific Coast and grown in gardens all over the country. Height 1 foot.

SINGLE FLOWERING

Aurantiaca (Orange King). Rich orange; true California Poppy.

Carmine King. Deep carmine-red.

Golden West. Large deep yellow flowers with brilliant orange blotch.

Brilliant Mixture. A special mixture of colors from pale buff to dark reds.

DOUBLE FLOWERING

Sweetheart Pkt. 15c
Gorgeous, flaming rich rose on cream ground; beautifully crinkled and fluted petals. Height 8 inches.

Flambeau Pkt. 15c
Large semi-double flowers of deep scarlet. The inside of the flower is a glowing flame color.

Double Mixed Pkt. 25c; ⅓ oz. 60c
A special mixture of the best named double varieties. Many colors.

CANDYTUFT

Profuse blooming plants for edging rockeries or beds. Compact in habit, growing 1 foot high, quite showy and desirable.

Giant Hyacinth Flwd. Pkt. 15c, ½ oz. 50c
Large, white flowers resembling hyacinth spikes, often measuring 7 inches long.


The Gem (Miniature) Pkt. 15c, ½ oz. 50c
Plants about 3 inches high, smothered with snow-white flowers. An excellent plant for the rockeries and edging.

Mixed Umbellata Pkt. 15c, ¼ oz. 35c
Mixed pastel shades, including white, together with brighter tones of carmine, crimson and deep pink.

CARNATIONS

Chaubaud's Improved Giants Pkt. 15c
Large and beautifully formed flowers, many of them elegantly fringed and in some instances as large as our best greenhouse Carnations. They bloom in three months from seed and continue blooming until frost. Mixed colors of crimson, white and pink.

CLEOME

Pink Queen Pkt. 25c
 This beautiful Spider Plant grows from Maine to Florida. It is never out of bloom. A tall and attractive border plant that is free from insects and disease. With huge heads of delightful and refreshing pink without a trace of blue or magenta, Pink Queen reaches over 4 feet. Airy foliage with blooms from June until frost.

CENTAUREA CYANUS (Cornflower)

A perfected strain of this popular flower. Fully double, with long stems ideal for cutting. Plants grow 2 feet high. Bloom all summer and fall.

Blue Boy Pkt. 15c
The true cornflower blue that is so well liked.

Black Boy Pkt. 15c
A dark maroon-red, nice for boutonnieres and mixed bouquets.

Snow Man Pkt. 15c
Pure glistening white flowers of dainty form.

Jubilee Gem, Dwarf Pkt. 15c, ½ oz. 85c
Compact plants covered with double dark blue flowers. Grows 12 inches high and is a lovely border plant.

FAVORITE COSMOS

Beautiful summer and fall blooming plants, decorative in the garden and wonderful for cutting. One of the easiest to grow, succeeding best in a well-drained soil and a sunny location.

Giant Sensation Dazzler Pkt. 25c



A. A. S., 1943. A new, extremely early flowering Sensation Cosmos with 3- to 4-inch flowers of richest deep amaranth-crimson. A sturdy, well-branched plant, ideal for garden display, and the flowers are long-stemmed beauties ideal for cutting.

Giant Sensation Pinkie Pkt. 20c

Clear rose-pink flowers of enormous size, 4 to 5 inches across, carried on long wiry stems. Airy and graceful, the 4 feet high plants make a lovely border subject.

Giant Sensation Purity Pkt. 20c

Pure white flowers of this Giant Sensation class. Excellent addition to the all-white garden or the popular blue and white gardens so much in vogue.

Giant Sensation Mixed Pkt. 20c

Giant single flowers of pink, white and crimson, 4 to 6 inches across, are borne on strong plants growing 4 to 6 feet tall. Remarkably quick growing, bearing flowers 10 weeks after seed, and continuing right to hard frost.

Double Crested Sensation Peerless White Cloud Pkt. 35c

Gorgeous double and semi-double flowers of pure white that measure 4 to 5 inches across. Of the same habit of growth as Peerless Pink Lady. This pure white variety will be a welcome addition to the garden.

Double Crested Peerless Pink Lady Pkt. 35c

A lovely new variety and the first separate color of the famous Double Crested Sensation strain of Cosmos. Flowers will average 5 inches across, and are of lovely soft salmon-pink, with fluffy crested centers. The petals are prettily fluted and somewhat overlapping. Plants grow over 3 feet tall, and carry a multitude of gorgeous blooms for cutting.

Double Crested Sensation Mixed Pkt. 25c

Large, fully double flowers, 4 to 6 inches across, in tones of white, pink and crimson. Flowers are very freely produced, on long stems excellent for cutting.

Early Klondyke Orange Flare Pkt. 20c

Well-branched plants, 3 feet tall, with showy orange flowers on long stems, fine for cutting. Very popular in northern states because of its early and free bloom. Erect, requiring no staking.

Early Klondyke Yellow Flare Pkt. 25c



The blooms are large sized and of a clear golden yellow never before seen in a Cosmos. This delightful new tone is especially welcome as it gives us a fine bright color, cheerful in the garden and very desirable for cutting. The stems are long and wiry and the whole plant is similar to Orange Flare. Like that variety, it is very well suited as background planting or in the wild garden. Height 4 feet.

CELOSIA - Cockscomb

Gorgeous, showy plants of brilliantly colored combs or plumes. Most effective when used in beds or borders. Often combined with cannas. Blooms from midsummer until frost.

CRESTED COCKSCOMB (*Celosia Cristata*)

The flower heads resemble the form of a rooster's comb with a chenille or velvet-like texture. Plants grow about 12 inches high. Splendid for use as borders and also for pot culture. Does well in a light soil. Easily dried for winter use.

Nana Aurea Pkt. 20c

Deep gold flower heads with bronzy foliage. Lovely as foreground planting when combined with white Canna Eureka.

Glasgow Prize Pkt. 20c

Compact plants, growing 12 inches high, with tight clusters of dark crimson flowers, resembling a rooster's comb, contrasting with green foliage.

FEATHERED COCKSCOMB (*Celosia Plumosa*)

Pride of Castle Gould Pkt. 25c

Large, fluffy, ostrich-feather-like blooms. The very finest strain of these wonderful plummy Celosias in existence. All tints and tones of yellow, scarlet, crimson and orange. 24 inches.

CHINESE WOOLFLOWER (*Celosia Childsii*)

A long time favorite, originated by our founder, John Lewis Childs. Effective splashes of color on the well-branched plants, each branch tipped with a round, woolly flower head. Height 2½ to 3 feet.

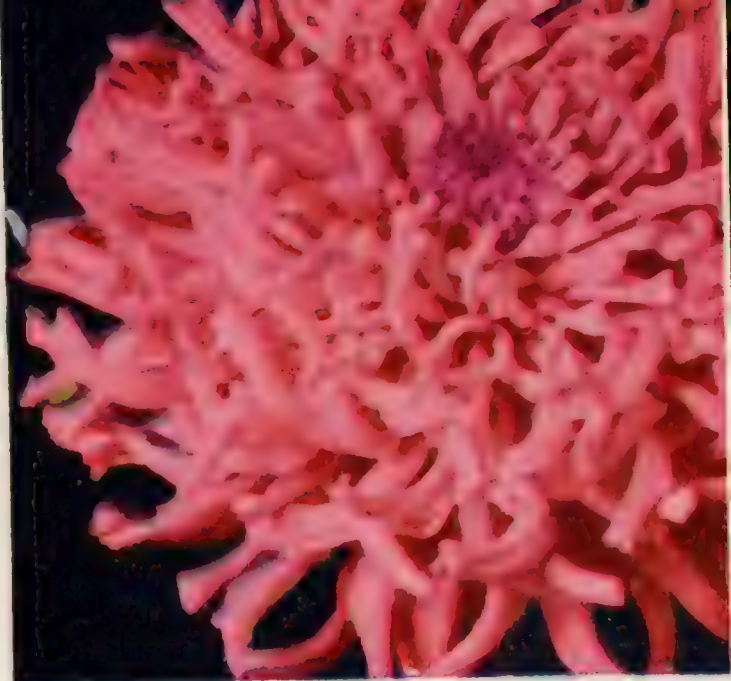

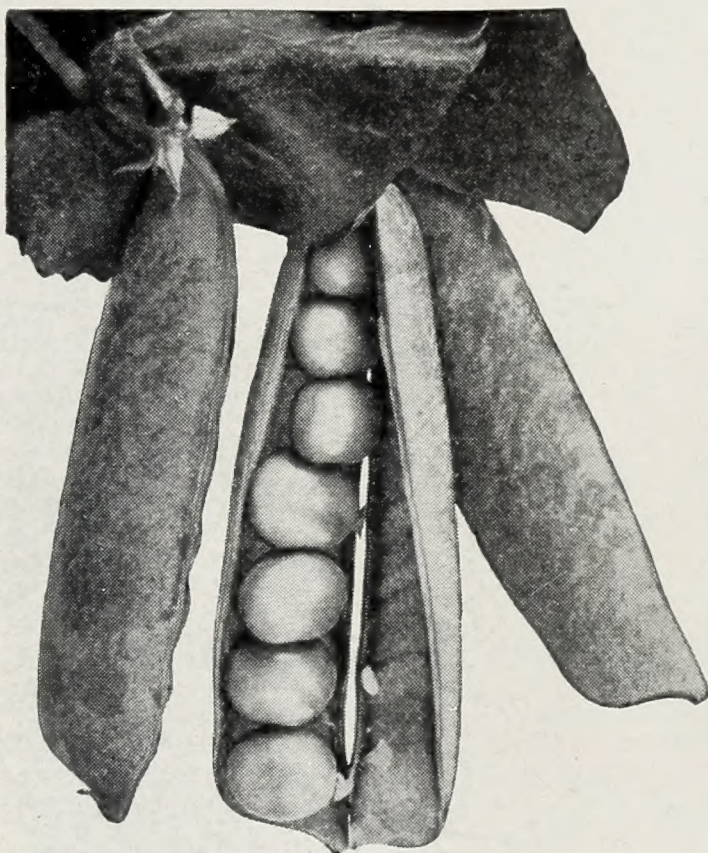

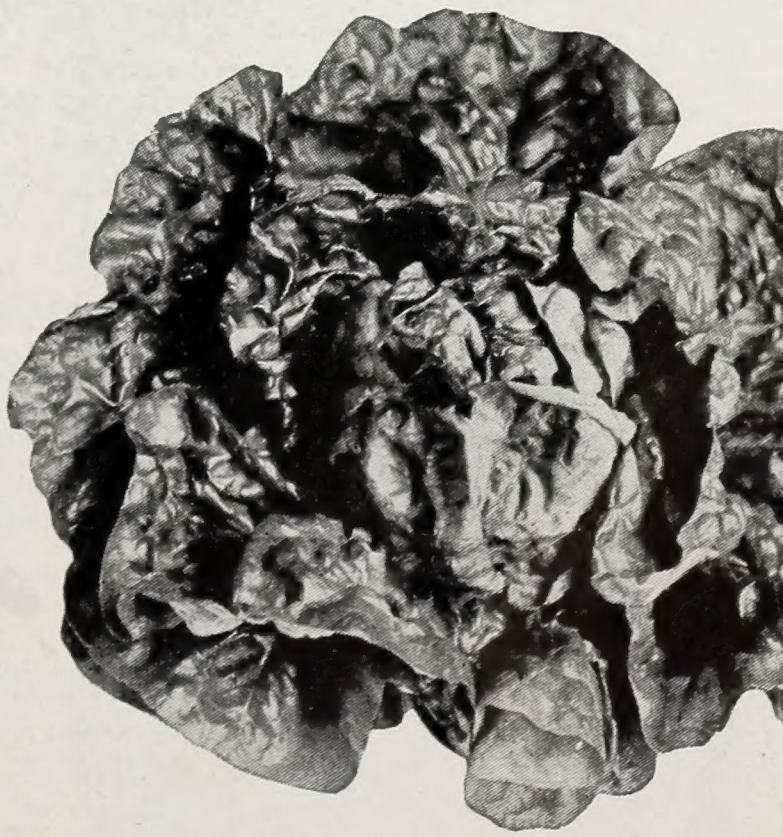
