ORDERS.

SHIPPING.

All goods delivered to nearest wharf or depot free of charge.

Purchasers will confer a favor by giving *plain* and *particular* instructions for MARKING AND SHIPPING PACKAGES; naming the route by which they wish their goods sent. When the whole or any part is left to us we forward to the best of our judgment, but in no case do we assume any responsibility after the goods are shipped, unless for mistakes on our part.

All packing is done with the utmost care, for which a charge is made, merely to cover cost of material and time.
