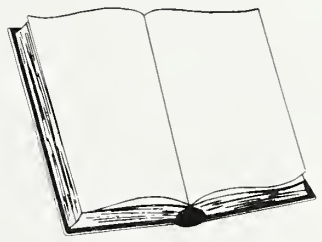

Although graduation took a good number of the squad, the Rebels plan to rebuild and hope for a good comeback.

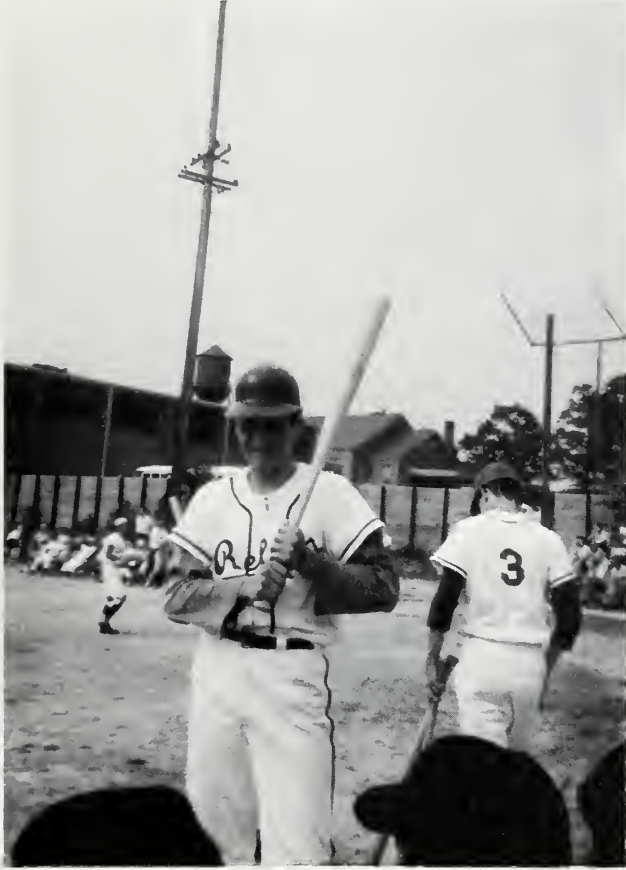
