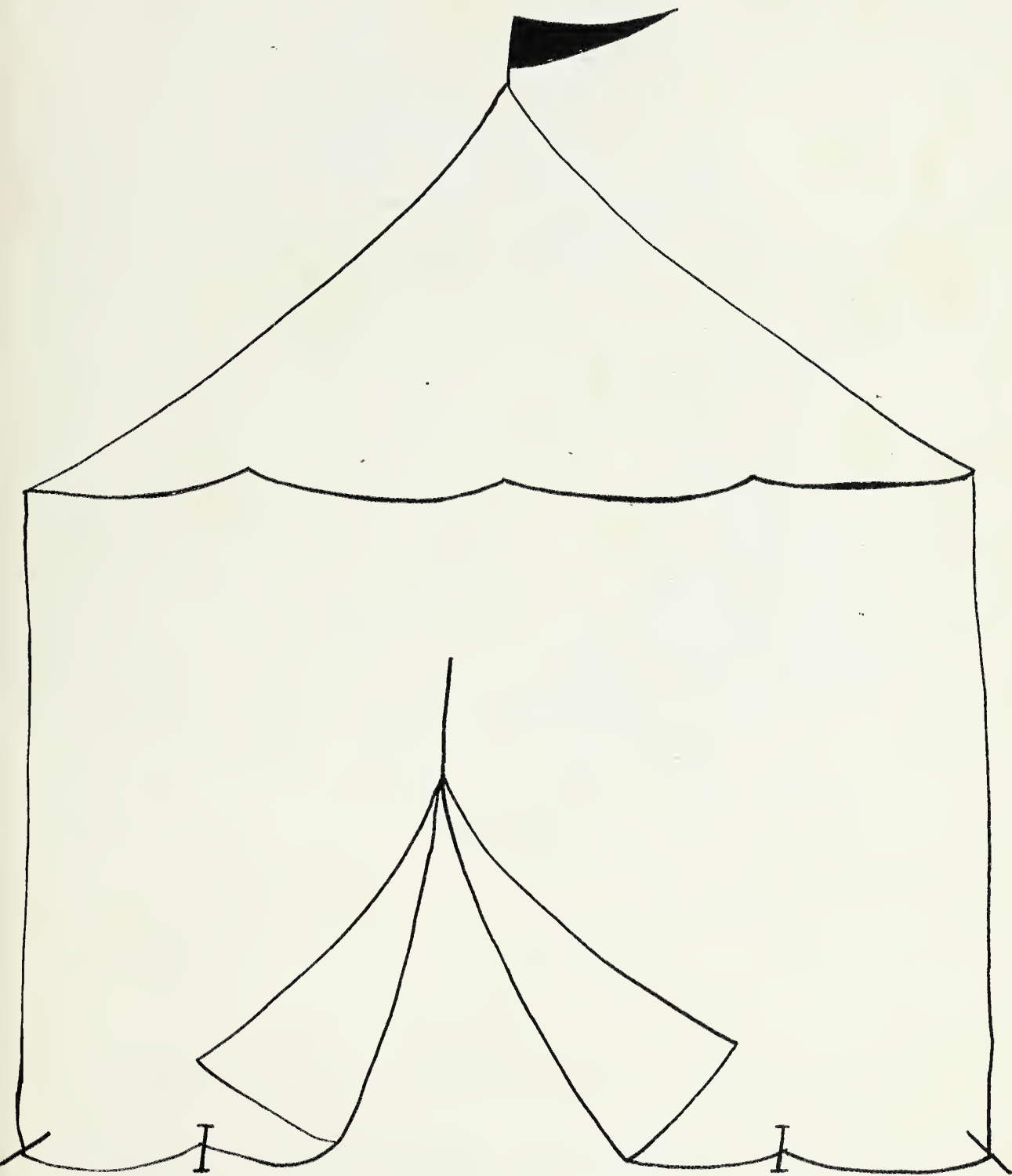

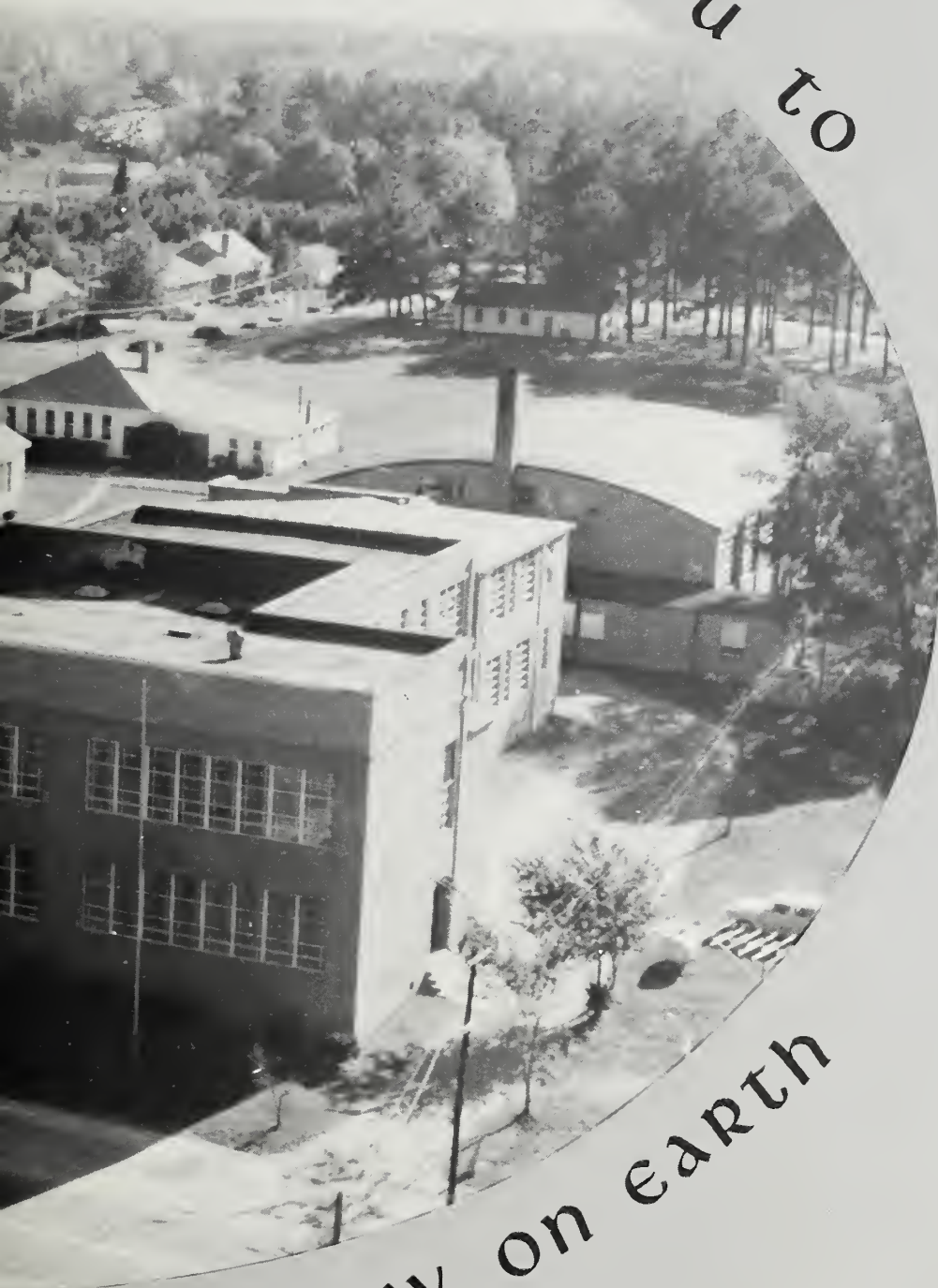

FOREWORD

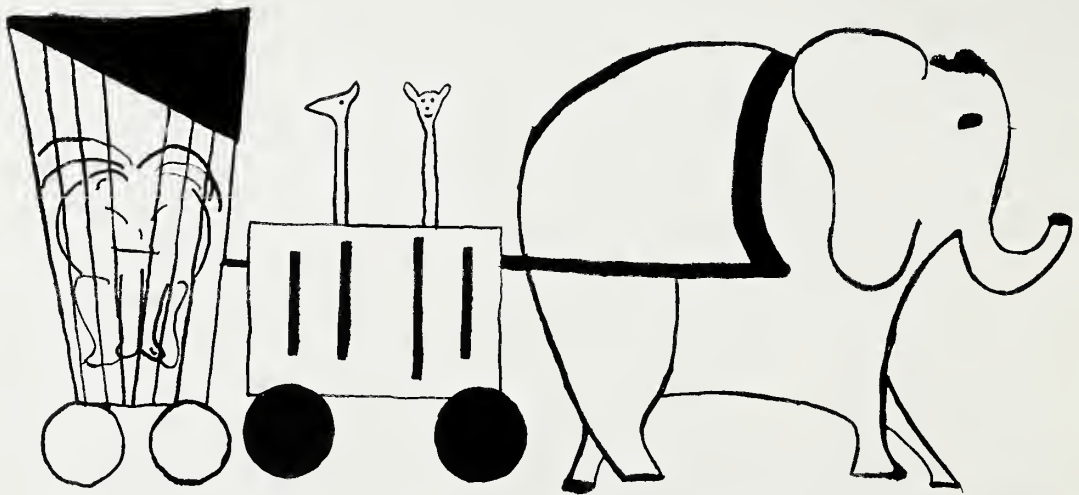

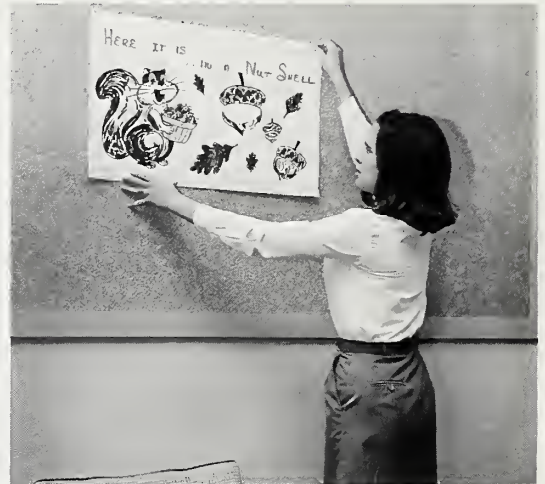
