Lettermen at Saratoga Central spend many of their free Saturdays selling doughnuts to increase the funds of the athletic department.

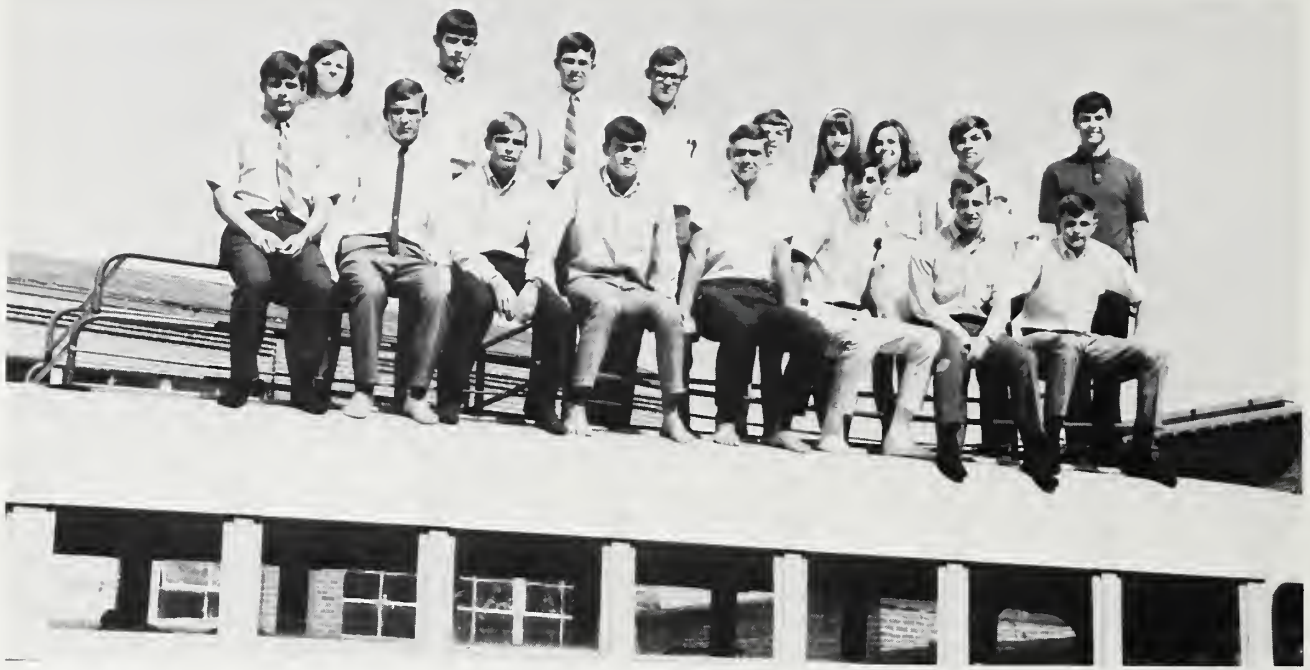
