### CLASS HISTORY

On September 9, 1937, a group of ambitious youngsters entered various schools for the first time. Only 4-Edward Bizzell, Gordon Price, Jr., Donald Price, and Atlas Price, Jr, of the 38 beginners here have completed their school careers in the Seven Springs School. Miss Ella Gillerlain, our first grade teacher, helped us off to a good start.

Roger Price, McKinley Griffin, Linwood Hill, and Norwood Hinson joined the class in the fifth grade. Norwood Mozingo entered the class in the seventh. Annie Doris Mozingo, Vara Hines, Lucille Grant, Patty Gray Creech, and Frank Kilpatrick transferred to our class in the seventh grade from the Indian Springs School.

Some of our classmates moved away to other schools during our first few years in school.

In the fall of 1946, we entered High School as Freshmen. Our class was smaller that year than in the lower grades, but we spent an enjoyable and successful year under the guidance of Mrs. John Shine, our home room teacher.

Soon examinations were over and we were promoted to the tenth grade.

Mr. J. O. Waters, our new principal, gave us Miss Vertie Noble for our home room teacher. She was unable to teach the entire year. Mrs. Wright and Mrs. Maxwell taught us the remainder of the year. There were only eighteen members in the class. We overcame the difficulties and made a lot of progress.

In September 1947, we entered the Junior class. Miss Ellen Williams, our new teacher, was very nice to us and we made a lot of progress. Our new officers were: Pres. Edward Bizzell, Vice Pres. Norwood Hinson, Sec.and Tres. Atlas Price Jr.

During the year we enjoyed class parties, and the Junior-Senior Banquet. We were very successful in producing our Junior play, "Pleased-ta-Meetcha".

Rachel Moye, one of our old classmates, and Josephine Smith, our newest member, were married and stopped school.

One year later we returned to school as Seniors. This being our last year in school, we realized that we must begin to think about the future. The class officers were: Pres.Edward Bizzell, Vice Pres. Norwood Hinson, Sec. Lucille Grant, and Tres. Gordon Price, Jr.

Soon we began organizing to publish the second edition of THE SESPRISCHOAN. We topped our goal of \$500.00 for advertising sales. Each member took an active part and we successfully published 100 copies.

We are very thankful to Mrs. Scott, our sponsor for the many kind deeds she did for us during the year, which helped us progress in many ways.

The class of 1949 was very cooperative during its school years. Prepared to meet whatever comes in the future, we graduated from the twelfth grade on June 1.





Interest in athletics runs high among students at Seven Springs. Baseball and basketball are the favorite sports, and on this page we are going to try to give you a brief review of these activities, along with several others of lesser importance.

Last year during baseball season, the Thunderbolts won five and lost five. Pitching hero for Seven Springs was "Lefty" Joe Outlaw, who won four and lost one. Kermit Wade and Mark Herring Jr. rounded out the mound staff. Herring lost a heartbreaker to Nahunta in the hardest fought game of the season. Leading batting averages for the season were sported by W. C. Sanderson and Mark Herring Jr. McKinley Griffin was the leading long ball hitter for the group, slugging away for doubles and triples on numerous occasions.
