FOREWORD

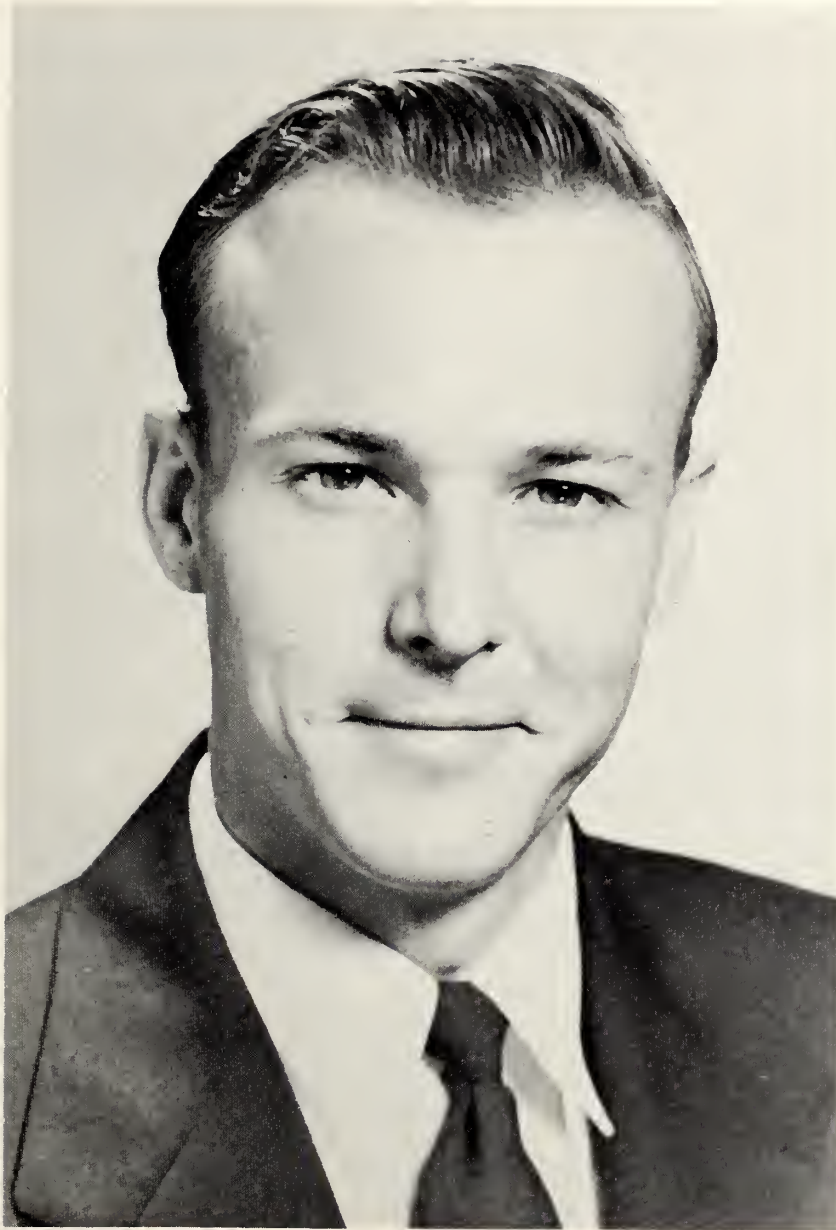

The girls had an overall record of 5 wins and 21 defeats. They had 3 wins and 15 defeats in conference play. They won one of two games in the tournament.

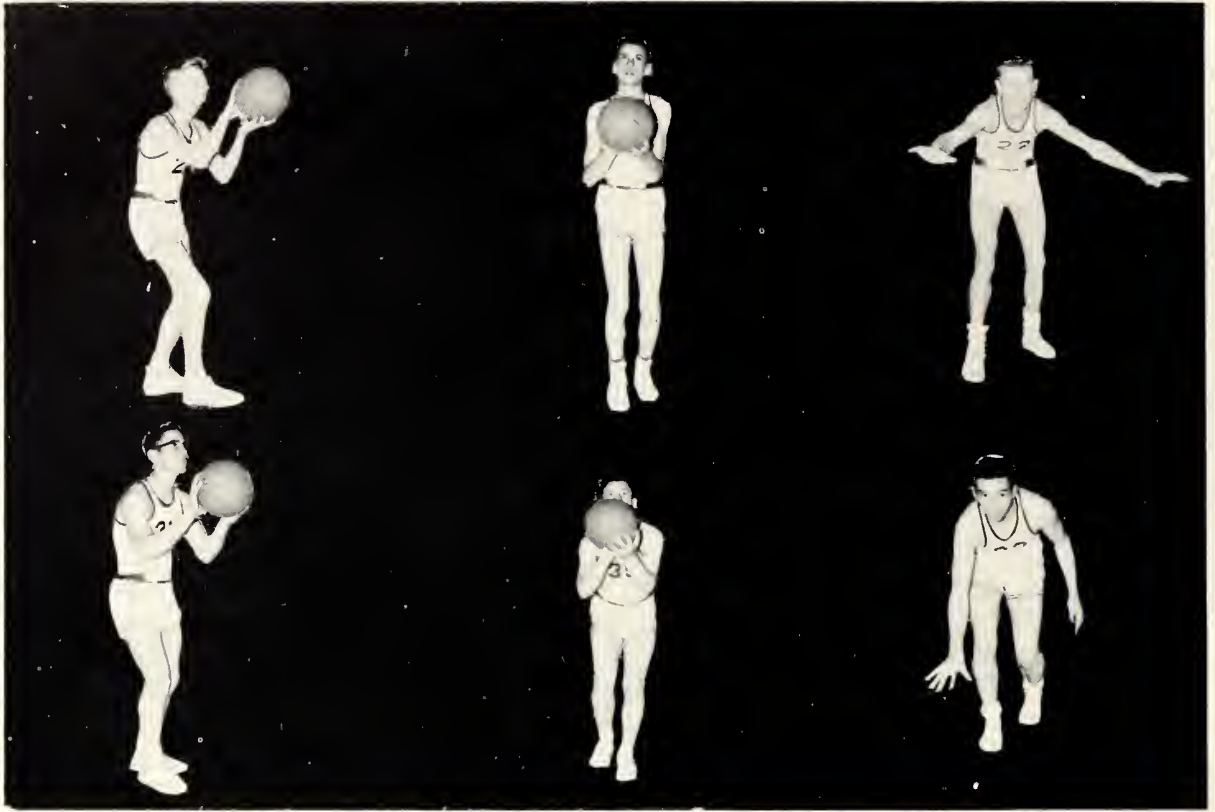
Belinda Sutton, a transfer from Turkey, led the team in scoring with an average of 17 points per game.

Jimmy Adams, a senior, led the team in scoring with a average of 21.7 points per game.

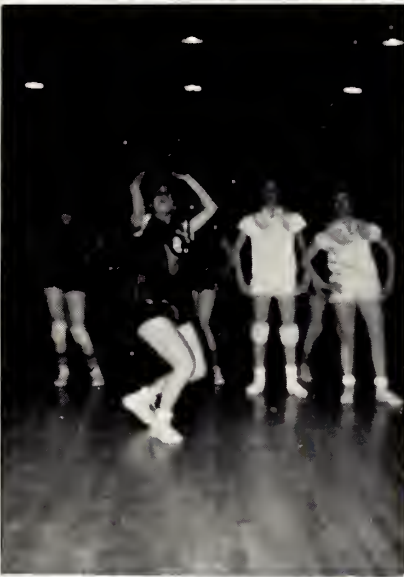

I, Bruce Ann Price, do hereby will my hard time devoted to Algebra II to anyone who takes it next year.

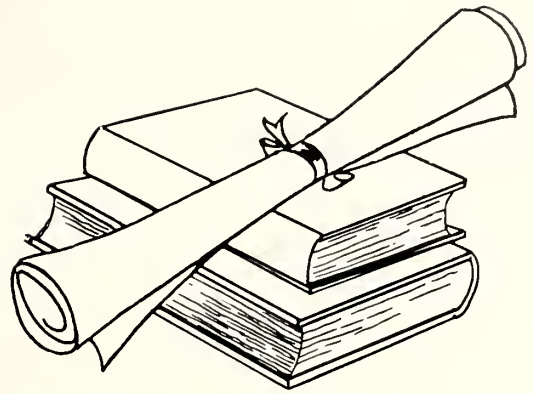

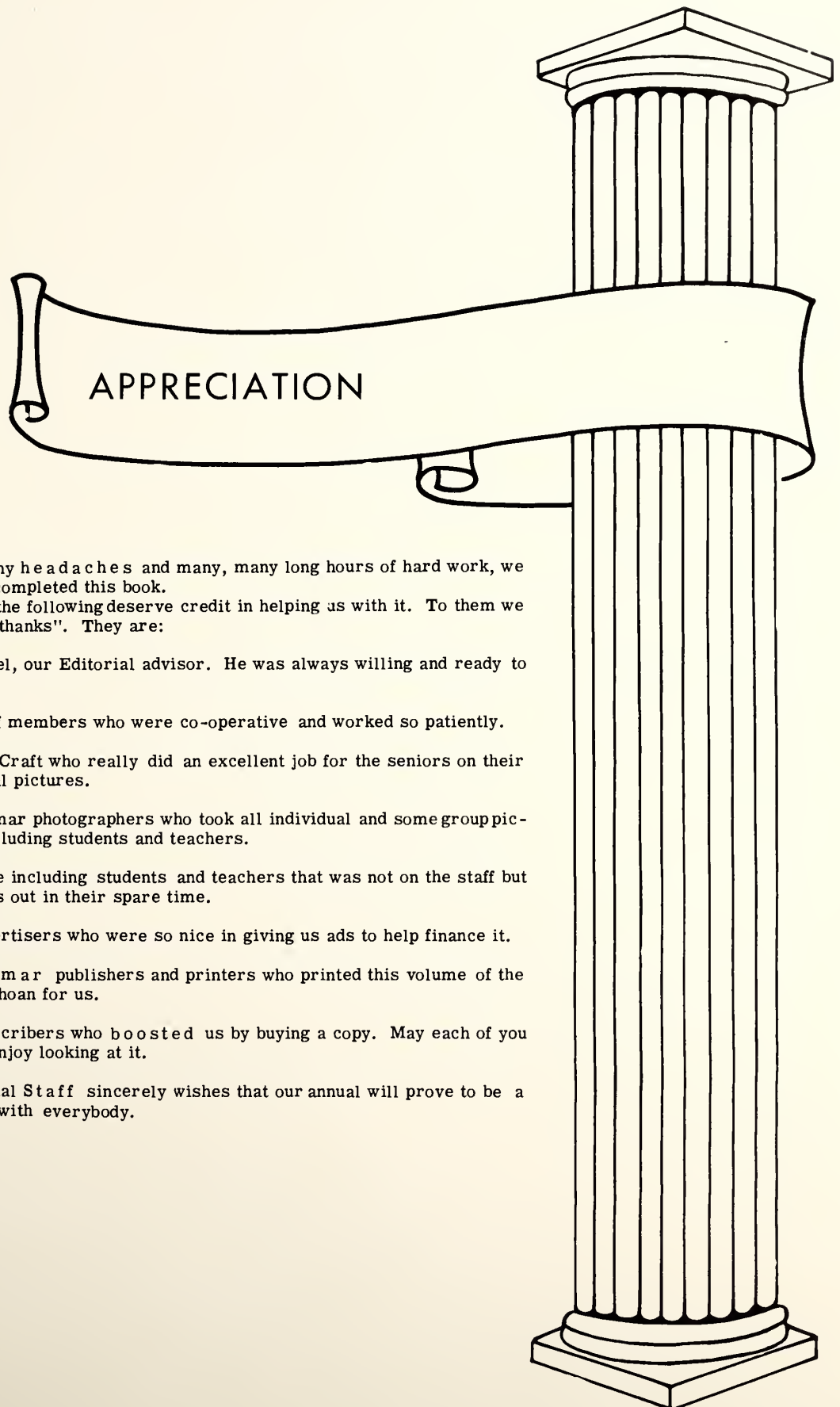
Friends, may you recall only our virtues, forgetting our faults, and may the future bring you nothing but kind recollections of those who are graduating tonight.
