



Only a few more days are left to us, are left to our senior year—but there it is—the Junior-Senior Banquet, the Senior play, the dances and parties, the gatherings at Worth's, the clubs, and many other things taken part in for the last time.

But when we walk down the aisle, in our dignified grey we'll know for certain that we can never forget . . .
