## FOOTBALL

 1957Smithfield's 1957 Football team became the first in the history of the school to have an undefeated season. This most successful record should be attributed to high spirit and an intense desire of each player for team success. This year the Red Devils placed 7 boys on All Conference teams and, along with Wallace, were Co-Champions of the East Central Conference. In eight games, Smithfield scored 207 points to 38 for their opponents and rolled up 2,315 yards rushing. The highlights of the season were the $6-6$ tie with Wallace and the $27-0$ win over arch-rival Selma.
