

We have produced this, the 1965 Shield, to offer only a hint of our hardships and to present tangible evidence that we had "the time of our lives!"























We Came, We Saw,


Right: A cubbyhole of an art room is the environment that inspires the SHS artists. The walls are always covered with "originals" and the room could pass as an art museum.


Left: Mrs. Frances Creech, typing instructor, shows novice Joe Morgan how to correctly place paper into the complicated machine.





It Rained and Rained . . .


The rain started coming down slowly on a Thursday in early October. It rained continuously for four days and nights, and turned the area into an American "Venice."








