Future Farmers of America

From its one hundred twenty-five members, the Whitley F. F. A. Chapter picked teams to represent the chapter in contests sponsored by the National Future Farmer Foundation. The Tool Identification Team placed first in the Tool Identification Contest. Members also supplied and supervised exhibits in the Children's Barnyard at the North Carolina State Fair. In November, the Freshmen in Vocational-Agriculture were properly initiated as Greenhands. In all other Federation Contests, the chapter members made a good showing.

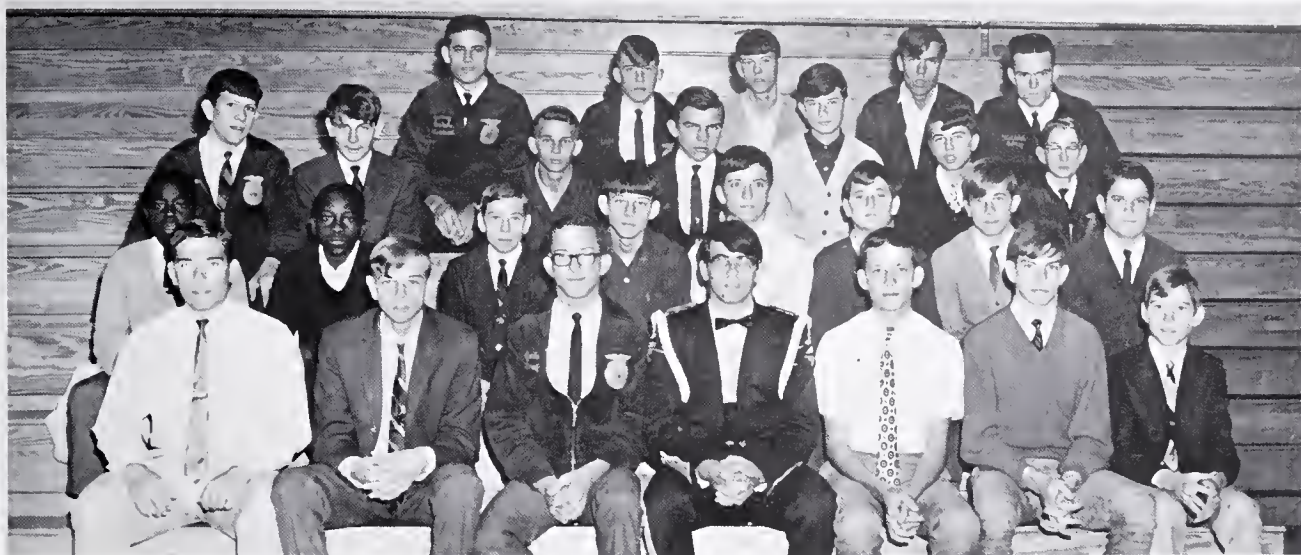

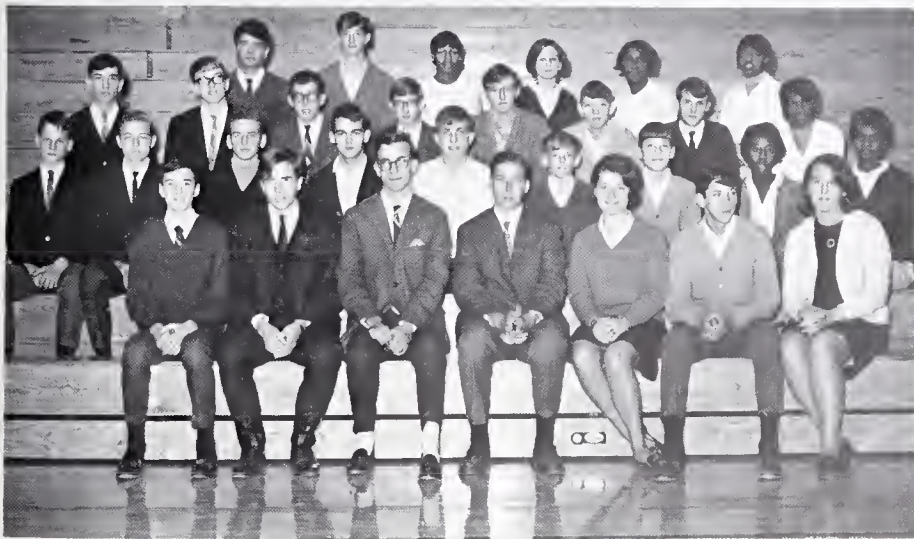

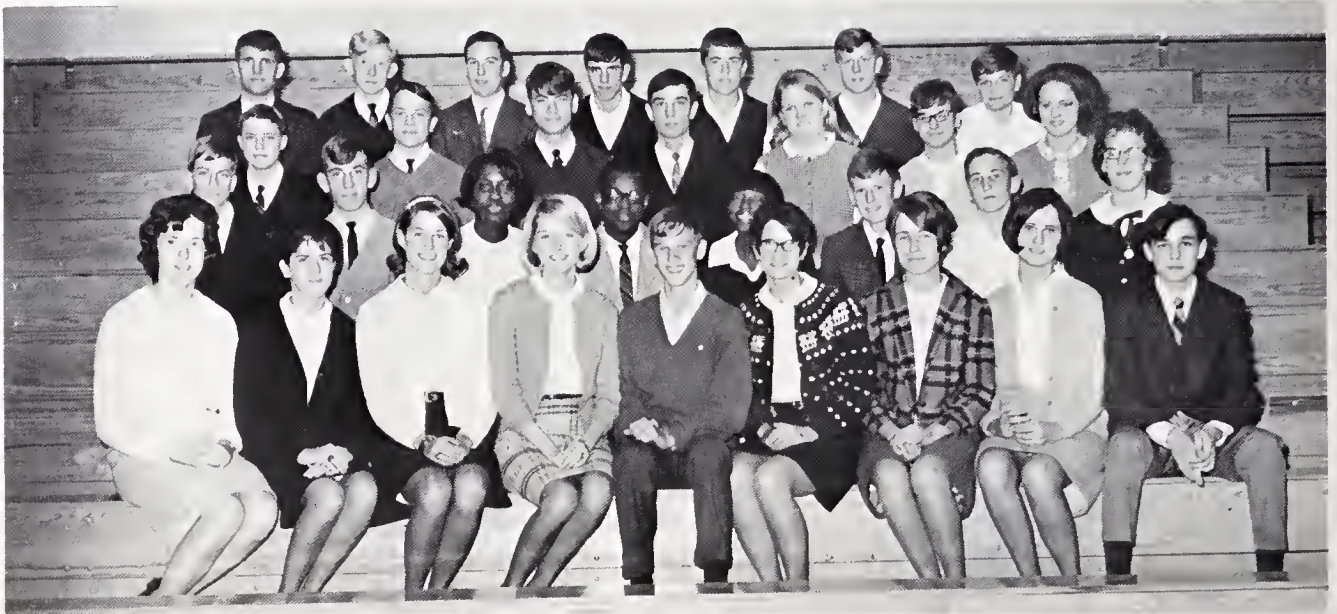
Spanish Club

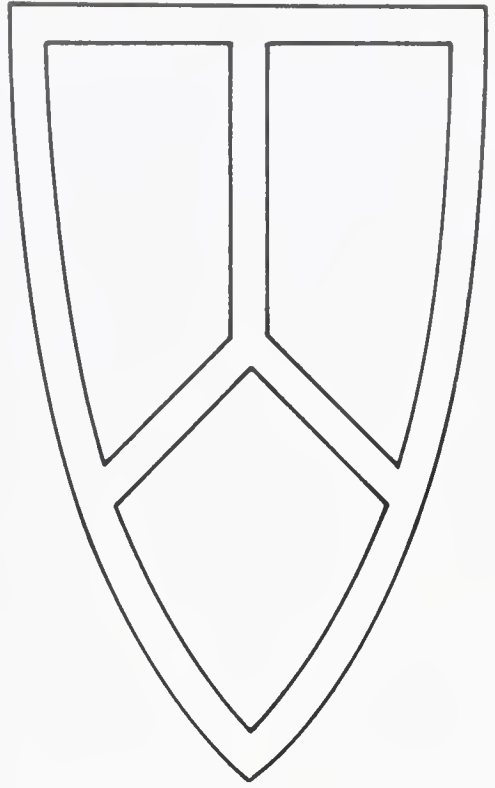

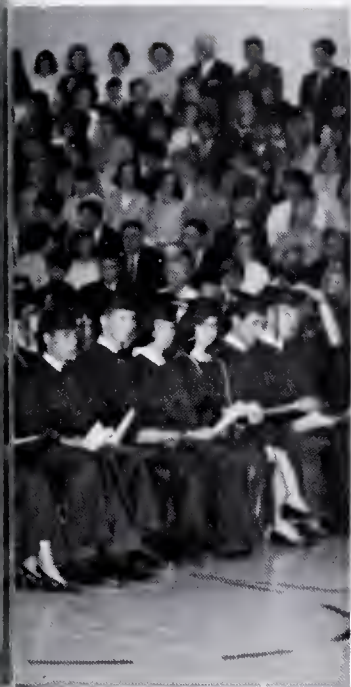

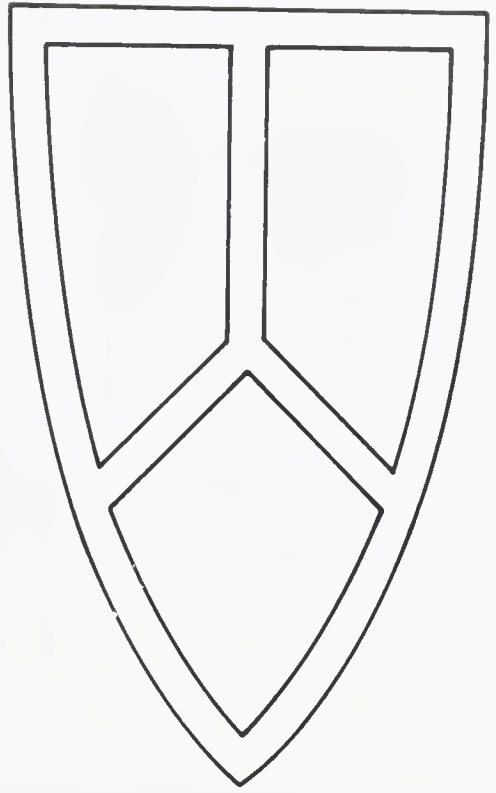

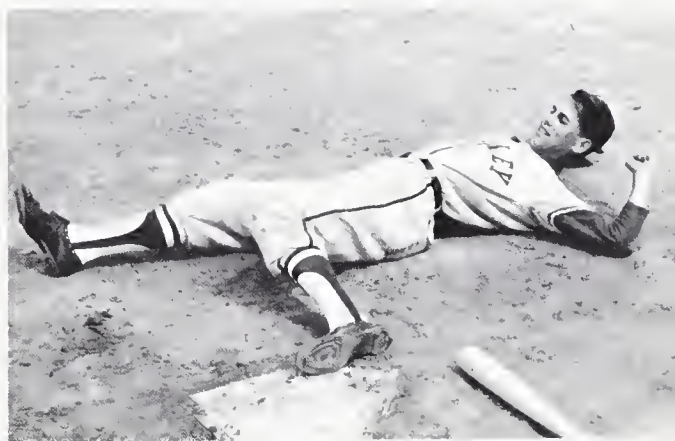
