

DAFFODILS OR NARCISSUS

(Ready Early October)

In describing Narcissus reference is made to the "perianth" and the "trumpet" or "cup." The latter is the funnel or cup-shaped center and the perianth is the collar of encircling petals.

Classification Names Following Variety Explained Below:

- BARRI:** Cup or crown is less than one-third the length of petals.
POETAZ: Bunch-flowering and definitely fragrant.
POETICUS: White petals with flat cups of yellow or red.
INCOMPARABILIS: The crown or cup measures from one-third to nearly the length of the petals.
LEEDSI: Petals white; cup short, mostly cream-white or pink.
TRUMPET: Trumpets as long as or longer than the petals of perianth.
TRIANDRUS: Tiny trumpet flowers, several on a stem.


