We take pleasure in presenting to the Trade, this special March edition, 1929, and are pleased to say, we are so organized that we can execute all orders with reasonable promptness, but we especially recommend our Florist customers to send in and accept delivery of their orders for Seeds, Plants and Bulbs as early as possible, not only to avoid the usual Spring rush when delays are unavoidable, but also to insure securing their full requirements of such stocks of which supplies may be short.

We again call the especial attention of our customers to the rule of the trade that all orders for growing crops and stock not actually in hand are accepted subject to crop failures, shortages, or other causes beyond our control, and the right to advance prices without notice.

SHIPPING

By our careful and thorough system of packing it is customary for our patrons to receive their orders from us in perfect condition, but all shipments are made at purchaser's risk, our responsibility ceasing after we deliver the goods in good order to the transportation company.

PARCEL POST—We will be pleased to send such items as can be mailed by Parcel Post if customers will remit for postage. We do not deliver any goods free at Wholesale Prices.

PRICES—This list cancels all previous offers. The prices quoted in this list are net, and subject to no discounts. Articles offered in our Retail Catalogue and not offered in this list will be supplied to florists at retail prices less the following discounts, viz.:

Vegetable and Flower Seeds 33 1/3%. **Small Fruits** 20%. All other plants not offered in this list 33 1/3%.

No order for plants or bulbs amounting to less than \$1.00 will be filled and packed at wholesale prices. Orders received from the trade for Plants or Bulbs amounting to less than \$1.00 will be charged for at retail prices, less 10 per cent.

TERMS OF BUSINESS—Unknown correspondents desiring to open an account will please furnish three references to parties in the trade with whom they have had credit relations, and sufficient time to investigate same, otherwise cash must accompany order.

Remittances should be made by Post-office Money Orders, Drafts on New York or Philadelphia banks, or Express Money Orders. Where it is not possible to obtain these, the letter should be registered. We cannot guarantee receipt of money sent in any other way.

Goods desired C. O. D. must be accompanied by a partial remittance to guarantee acceptance. No perishable stock will be sent C. O. D.

All goods are offered subject to crop failures, shortages or other causes beyond our control and to being unsold on receipt of order, and we reserve the right to advance prices without notice.

No charge is made for boxes or packing, nor for delivery to Freight Depots or Express Offices in Philadelphia.
