

PREFACE.

In this the golden age of all kinds of Sporting, and it may be added of all kinds of Sporting Hand-Books -when some dozen Turf Guides and Calendars woo the would-be-wise to study pedigree and performance; when Coursing Manuals offer their aid to the Lover of the Leash in his random recollections of the doughty deeds of Long, Long Ago! or the glories of Waterloo; when spirited publishers politely send forth pocket Pilots to steer the stranger Snob, or stranger Swell, through a wonderful run with any Hounds and over any Country; and when, too, the Cricketer goes to Book for his wonderful runs-some scores scored up in a Match of the M. C. C. versus any Country or All the World. At a period when hundreds, from gallant Colonels down to humble servants, from Lords who boast of their manors to keepers who cultivate them, give us as many recipes for becoming fly to Shooting Flying; at a time when the courteous Chessman revels o'er the pages of his peculiar Magazine; when the Billiard-room Hero patronizes "a clever little work" that shows him

how to make his hits and mind his pockets; when Boxiana, Fistiana, with Owen Swift and other worthies, display their portraits and their practice for the honor of the Ring and the public edification. At a season, in short, when almost every pastime, however trivial, puts in a claim for a separate establishment, "and has that claim allowed," it does appear rather extraordinary that one of the most popular and prominent should so long have been neglected.

Not acting solely upon this idea, but guided rather by the opinion of many practical men, and encouraged, they must say, by the ready and characteristic assent given by the Noble and thorough Sportsman whose name they have the honor to prefix to the Work, the Publishers determined on [the present undertaking; in carrying out which it has been their aim to preserve every feature of interest in a somewhat condensed and not expensive form. To pack well together is the key-stone of success in most pursuits, but more particularly in one of so all-spreading a nature as this; and in returning, as in duty bound, their grateful acknowledgments for the assistance thus afforded them, the Publishers make their bow, with a sincere wish that the Line they have taken may not prove impracticable, or the cause of damage, either in body or estate to any gentleman sportsman who has taken a fancy to look over it.

THE RULES OF STEEPLE CHASING.

The aim, object, and practice of Steeple Chasing correspond in the main features so exactly with Racing, that the same Rules and Regulations have generally been found equally applicable to either sport; in some minor particulars, however, the Laws of the Steeple Chase differ or go farther than such as have hitherto been deemed amply sufficient for flat-racing, and the following suggestions have consequently been drawn together from the usual articles appended to Steeple Chase announcements, or from decisions given on disputed points.

- 1. Any rider during a chase going upwards of one hundred yards on any high-road, lane, or public thoroughfare, will, in the event of his coming in first, so disqualify his horse from being considered the winner, on an objection to that effect being substantiated.
- 2. Any rider during a chase opening any gate or wicket, or passing through any gateway, or purposed and common passage from one inclosure to another, will so disqualify his horse, though placed first, from being considered the winner.
- 3. Any rider wilfully crossing, jostling, riding at, or driving another from his point while going at a fence, will be disqualified on such a charge being proved by two or more competent witnesses.
- 4. Any flag, post, or boundary mark placed in the course, no matter by whose order, after the riders have been shown over the ground, or the line pointed out and explained to them, not to be considered binding or of any effect, unless such alteration or addition shall have been particularly named, previous to starting, to all engaged in the chase, by the Steward, Clerk, or some other generally acknowledged and authorised person.
- 5. In the event of two or more horses running a dead heat, and their owners agreeing to a division of the stakes or plate, a formal walk over the course as in flat-racing, shall not be deemed necessary, but every horse participating in any such division, to be considered, and carry extra weight henceforth, as a winning horse.

- 6. Conditions using merely the term "Winning Horses" in reference to those liable to extra weight, to be considered as applying only to winners of public steeple chases, advertised or announced as such; and no winner of hurdle or flat races, or match of any kind to be considered liable to carry the extra weight as a winner, unless words to that effect shall be fully specified in the articles.
- 7. The term "Maiden Horse" to be considered applicable to any horse which never won a steeple chase, and a "horse that never started," to one which never started for a steeple chase.
- 8. The term "Gentlemen Riders," if used solely, a custom that should be carefully avoided, to apply or allude only to persons generally received in society as gentlemen; Members of the London leading Clubs, Fox-hunting or Racing Clubs, Officers in the Army or Navy, Barristers, Solicitors, Medical Men, or others so considered by position and profession, and who do not and never have been in the habit of receiving remuneration for riding, either directly or in form of travelling expenses, or any other indirect manner.
- 9. Any rider falling from or suffering his horse to get away from him, to be at liberty to re-mount in any part of the same field or inclosure in which the accident occurred; but should his horse not be caught until he had entered another field, then to be ridden or brought back to the one in which he parted with his rider. Any jockey so losing his horse may be assisted in catching and remounting by the spectators or any other person engaged in the chase, without risk of disqualification; and in the event of a rider being disabled, his horse may be ridden home and take his place the same, by any person of sufficient weight, providing he mount or go back to the same field the first rider fell in.
- 10. The state of the weather and the ground, in the event of any doubt as to the fitness or safety of running, to be left entirely to the discretion of the Stewards, who may order the chase or chases to be then and there decided as originally fixed, or postponed according to the best of their judgment,—all engagements standing, whether decided or put off, just as when first subscribed to; save only with regard to bets, which shall not stand (except by mutual agreement) unless the chase on which they were made be decided on some day in the same week for which it was first fixed; or on some other day named in the original conditions of the chase.

The following General Rules apply equally to Racing and Steeple Chasing:-

For Stakes or Plates decided in Heats.—When three horses have each won a heat they only can start for the fourth, and in which there is no distance; a dead heat goes for nothing, unless it be between two horses that had already each won a heat; when a plate is won at two heats every horse takes his proper place as he ran in for the second; for the best of the race or chase for which three heats are run, the horse is second that wins one heat; while for the best of the heats, the horse is second that beats the other horse twice out of the three heats, even if he should not win a heat; bets made on a chase run in heats are not decided until the chase be also, except it be specified that the bet was laid on one certain heat; bets made after a heat are void, if the horse or horses betted on be drawn; and all horses so drawn before the event is decided are distanced.

FOR WEIGHTS .- Catch and feather weights exonerate the riders from weighing either before or after the chase. "Give and take weights" are fixing a certain weight on horses 14 hands high, while all above carry extra at the rate of 7lb. for every inch, and all under are allowed in the same proportion. Jockeys to ride their horses to the appointed place for weighing, and any who dismount before arriving at or opposite the scales are distanced, unless disabled by accident or fatigue, when they may be led or carried. Complaints of foul riding or any objections to or allegations of acts committed during the chase which would cause disqualification, to be made at the time of weighing, to the Steward or Stewards, Judge, Clerk of the Chase, or some other person in authority. In weight for age chases horses starting without producing a proper certificate of their age (if required) to carry the same weight as aged horses. horses distanced that do not bring in their proper weight, to make up which their shoes or plates will not be taken, neither their bridles or any other article the jockey omitted to take in with him, should his horse be led away previous to his calling for it.

FOR BETS AND STAKES.—Bets and stakes made in guineas are paid in pounds; bets made between two particular horses are void if neither win, or if made on the best of the race between the two, also void should neither of them be placed by the judge; a party laying odds has the choice of a horse or the field; "play or pay" bets are such as are decided whether a horse start or not, and all double events are "play or pay," as are bets on horses mounted and gone to the post; bets are off on the horses on which they were made becoming the property of the same person, party, or confederates; and bets may be declared off on either of the parties refusing to make stakes on being called upon to do so; but no confirmed bet can be declared off on any other ground without the mutual consent of the parties making it; bets on horses disqualified through some omission in or act annulling the entry or nomination are void, except in cases where horses so disqualified start, when bets are determined as the horses come in; bets made by sign or signal on a chase after it has been decided, or on a horse after he has been declared not to start, are void; bets made between horses that run a dead heat and divide, must be taken in the same proportion as the stakes; and if a bet be made on one of the horses running the dead heat against another beaten in the chase, the backer of the former wins half his bet; if the dead heat be the first of a double event, or occur in running a match, all bets on such are void. All stakes to be paid to the clerk or treasurer before starting, or not entitled to receive though coming in first, yet still liable for the whole stakes as beaten horses: on the other hand, bets made on such horses stand and are decided as the horse or horses are placed, the carelessness or culpability of the owner or manager not affecting the mere betting by others on his horse. Any person entering his horse in the name of another, or one altogether false and fictitious, will be equally liable to the stake or forfeit as if entered in his own, and to any consequences or penalties that may arise from such engagements not being paid.

FIFTH DRAGOON GUARDS' CHALLENGE CUP.

At page 38, in the sport of the year 1839, will be found under "York" the winners of the Fifth Dragoon Guards' Challenge Cup, from the first contest for it in 1834 down to the close for that season; since then, just in fact as this sheet was going to press, we were favoured with a communication from an Officer of the regiment, which adds the winners to the concluding chase in 1841, when, having been won three times by Capt. J. W. King, it became according to the conditions his property. As our account differs in one or two minor particulars from the one forwarded, and to make the epitome complete, we give it entire.
