NOTICE TO CUSTOMERS.

E would say to those unacquainted with our establishment, that this is the thirty-second year of our nursery, that we have over six hundred acres devoted to the business, about three-fifths covered with Nursery Stock, and twenty-one Green and Propagating Houses, over 120,000 cubic feet of cellar room, with a most complete assortment of Fruit and Ornamental Trees, Shrubs, Vines, Roses, Green-house Plants, etc. We solicit correspondence and personal inspection of our stock, confident that it will compare favorably with the best.

CONVENIENCES FOR PACKING

Are most complete. A wind-mill and steam pump supply an abundance of water, and a good stock of moss kept constantly on hand.

THE PACKING SEASON.

In the Spring, we usually commence digging and shipping from the twentieth of March to the first of April, and continue through May; and in the Fall usually from the first to the middle of October, continuing until cold weather sets in. Our new cellar, 50 by 150 feet, more than doubles our capacity for winter storage of Trees, Vines, Shrubs, etc., from which we can make shipments at all times during the Winter, except in the very coldest days.

TERMS OF SALE TO THE TRADE ONLY.

1st. We reserve the selection of varieties to ourselves, but will always give the purchaser his choice so far as consistent with our stock.

2d. When dealers pack with us we heel in their entire stock by itself, and furnish labels and tying material free. Boxes and packing charged as follows: 8 to 9½ feet long, 30x30 inches, \$3.00; 28x28 inches, \$2.50; 24x24 inches, \$2.25; 20x20 inches, \$1.75; 16x16 inches, \$1.50; 12x12 inches, \$1.00. For second-hand boxes, 50 cents will be deducted from the three larger sizes, and 25 cents from each of the three smaller sizes. Bales, 25 cents to \$2.00, according to size. Burlaps, for wrapping roots of Evergreens, etc., 10 cents per yard. After deliveries are billed up, help will be furnished free by us to pack in the boxes and mark for their destination, but the owner must superintend all, and assume all responsibility for any error that may occur. No stock will be counted back from the heeling-in grounds. No extra charge for delivering packages at Express Office or Railway Stations.

3d. The terms of payment must invariably be cash down, or satisfactory note, payable at some bank, for amount of bill, unless with established Nurserymen, when, if unknown to us, a satisfactory reference will be required before shipment.

4th. Those ordering will please to give plain and explicit directions as to the route and manner in which goods are to be forwarded, as our responsibility ends on delivering at Railway Station or Express Office.
