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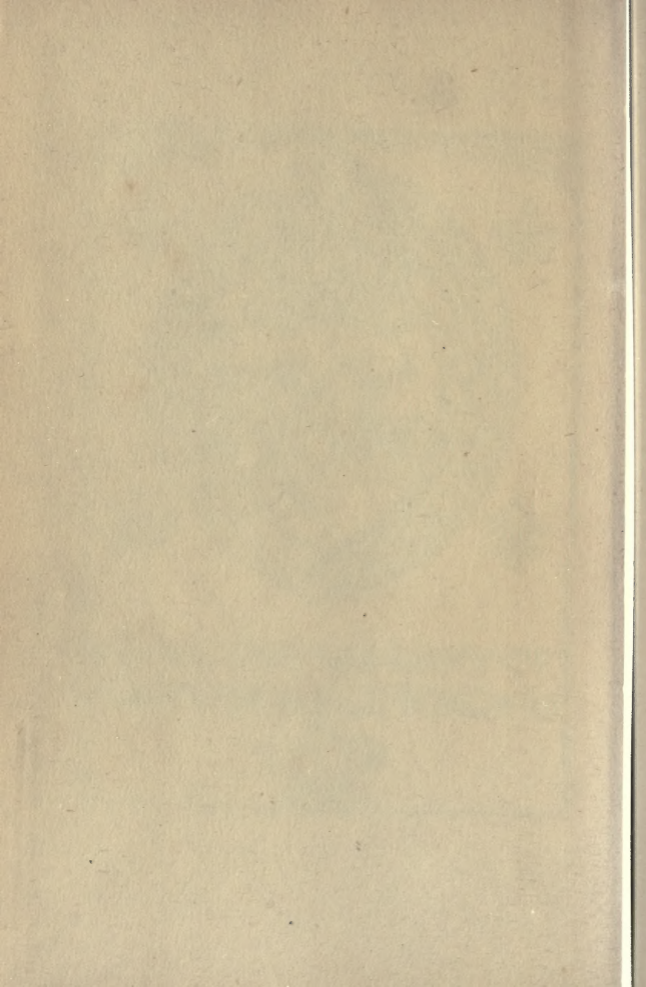

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PREFACE.

THIS little book needs, I think, no recommendation. It will both explain and commend itself, and I hope and augur for it a very grateful reception from very many. But as the writers think that a prefatory word from one who bears my office may help it, I give this, with a deep sense of unworthiness to touch such a thing, but willingly alike for friendship's sake and from much gratitude for their gift to the Church.

For such a book as this comes to us as one encouraging sign the more, amidst our difficulties and controversies, of the deepened life of our Church, and of those spiritual forces out of sight to which perhaps we owe it that in spite of all our faults and follies the Church's work is allowed to continue and to go forward. From two of the quiet places which remain in our noisy time—from a country parsonage and a religious community—it comes to us for our help. New and old meet in it : the fragrant treasures of devotion bequeathed to us by the centuries of the Church's past, together with the stress and complexity of the modern struggle, and the practical desire to pray requickened by the blessed revival of life and work. We cannot but have good hope for the Church in which such work is doing, and such worship is being offered.

Devotion which is heart-language must needs take many moulds, suited to differences of temperament and training, and the same forms will not suit all equally. But in this book there is room for considerable variety. There is fulness in the number and detail of special collects ; greater swiftness and concentration in the litanies ; extreme brevity for the very busy in the "general" prayer for each day ; and freedom with guidance, in the schemes or heads of intercession, for those who wish only to be reminded methodically what to pray for, and then to be left to pray in their own words, or without words.

Particularly do I wish to ask attention to the treatment here given to Thanksgiving and to what is said about it. I think there are some to whom this may

come almost as a discovery of a new and sunny country near their home : I am sure that all of us have need in this as much as in any matter to grow in grace.

I hope that the little book may travel a way of peace. I think that there is nothing in it that should offend, and that it may be widely accepted, even if here and there some omit what others delight to use.

The Prayers for the Departed in particular are taken chiefly from ancient sources, and have the reserve and modesty which becomes those who remember our great ignorance, and in the lack of open revelation can do little more than mutely put before the mercy and care of GOD those whom, behind the veil, we think of, in that "holy keeping," to which we must so soon trust ourselves. The book, it will be remembered, is one of private devotion, and private devotion, guided by the precedents of antiquity, the practice of many loyal sons of the Reformed Church, and the instincts of the Christian heart, need not and will not bind itself by the austere rule of reticence which, under the strong stress of reaction from mediæval abuse, the Church thought well to impose upon herself in this respect in public worship. The matter is eminently one for the Apostolic rule of mutual toleration.

The Kalendar (itself again for private use) claims no authority, and no two people would draw exactly the same list.

May GOD of His grace give us less controversy and more devotion, and draw more of His people into that nearness to Himself in which there is indeed boldness and access with confidence through JESUS by the SPIRIT, but also the reserve of the veiled face, and the kept foot, and the tongue that fears to utter what it understands not, things too wonderful for it which it knows not !

And may each to whom this book comes gain from it some treasure, greater or less, of help, to be returned through prayer to the Treasury of the Church !

EXPLANATORY PREFACE.

THE following scheme of Intercession is not intended to be used by any one person in its entirety. The endeavour has rather been to provide for the varying needs of different minds, or of the same mind on different occasions.

Thus, some may prefer simply to use the outline prefixed to each day, as a guide and reminder to their own mental prayer.

Others will doubtless find it more helpful to use the collects as allotted, word for word, dwelling carefully on them until they become the natural expression of their own thought and desire.

While there are others again to whom a litany more especially appeals, and for their use each day's intercessions have been thrown into that form.

A division has been made in each outline as a suggestion to those who may prefer to make the scheme a fortnight's rather than a week's exercise; and the whole of this first part has been interleaved in the belief that, if each person will insert the names and needs best known to himself, the supplications for the whole world will become more real and concrete.

The Thanksgivings which form the second part of the book have also been arranged for a week, and follow a threefold order, each day having one distinct idea embodied in it. But they may, as has been suggested for the Intercessions, be fitly spread over a fortnight, or even three weeks, rather than a week. This part of the book has not been interleaved, but there is room in the margin for such personal notes as may serve to make the

forms of thanksgiving living realities, and reminders of actual facts, rather than mere words.

In Section I. the thanksgiving is for mercies corresponding to the prayers offered on one of the days of intercession. In Section II. are subjects of personal thanksgiving of the same character. And in Section III. the thanksgiving dwells on some particular revelation of GOD to man, which seems most to bear on the subject of the day.

The acts themselves are mostly taken from the book of Psalms, and thus unite those who use them with the countless multitude of holy souls, including our Blessed LORD Himself, who have made these very words the vehicle of their prayers, of their thankfulness, and praise.

Besides these forms of Intercession and Thanksgiving, some additional matter is given. First, a few prayers for special occasions, and a number of collects for communities and societies: additional blank pages are left in order that other prayers for special objects may be filled in by hand, to suit each person's need. Secondly, such collects from the Book of Common Prayer as are suitable for intercession, and do not occur in the ordinary daily services of the Church, have been numbered and printed at the end, and are referred to in the body of the book as alternatives to the other prayers. Thirdly, an Horology is inserted as a suggestion by means of which the day, as it passes, may be used systematically for the purposes of intercession, by those who through press of work have not much space of time which they can devote to that purpose; and appended to this are some additional forms and suggestions for Intercession.

This handbook owes very much to the *Manual of Intercession*, published by Father Benson, which has been of so great service to the Church, and still remains the great storehouse of intercessory prayer. A great debt of gratitude is due to the S.S.J.E. for leave to draw freely upon it; also to the various communities who gave leave

for the insertion of their own special collects, and to others whose labours have been utilised. The list of collects and their sources given in the index is both an acknowledgement of indebtedness to previous books and in itself an interesting historical table.¹

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INTRODUCTION.

IT is an undoubted part of every Christian's duty to pray for others; and, like many another duty, intercession is an ever widening one: it grows with the growth of the Church and her needs: it grows with the growing complexity of human society, as new classes and objects rise up to claim its help: it grows with the advance of human knowledge, as new mysteries of GOD's work and ways are revealed to us: it grows with every acceleration in locomotion, and every advance in intelligence—in fact almost every step forward in civilization seems to demand some correlative advance in intercessory prayer.

The duty of intercession is also an ever widening element in each individual life: as a man's interests and experiences widen, so must his prayers: at first his horizon is narrow, limited to a small home circle: then he goes out into the larger world, and that too claims his intercessions: and bit by bit, as friends, acquaintances, and interests grow, he must keep pace with all this expansion, not only in the activity of his outer life, but also in all the hidden energy of his life of devotion and supplication.

Again, if he is a man of GOD, there must be a development in his view as to what is a proper subject for intercession: he begins, alas, too often with a narrow view: he does not see how centrifugal and wide-reaching is this power of intercessory prayer: he looks to other things to accomplish his objects, to advance his interests, and to fulfil many of his best projects. But gradually, as he is a man of GOD, he learns otherwise: he finds that he accomplishes more of GOD's purposes and of his own best hopes by a short quiet half-hour of prayer than by days of restless activity: he no longer denies a place in his intercessions to certain parts of his aims and desires on the ground that they are unsuitable subjects

for prayer ; on the contrary, he insists on finding a place there for them all, for he finds how prayer, far more than anything else, brings him into effective touch with the widest circles of his fellow-men, the largest range of human interests, and with his own best and highest aspirations, no less than with the eternal purposes of GOD.

He seizes with new zeal upon this power, hitherto left so woefully dormant ; and as he gives himself more and more to the exercise of it, still more his horizon widens and his sympathies extend, until he sets himself at last to do no less a task than to embrace all men and all things within the 'sphere of his prayer, defying the narrow limits of home and friendship and country and race, defying the restrictions of time and space, the distinctions of earth and paradise and heaven ; and reaching out yet unsatisfied into the infinite with an extravagance of minute and ardent affection, whose only justification lies in this, that it is some poor copy of the boundless love of Almighty GOD.

All this implies that intercession is a very difficult and exacting task, and one that will often strain severely the powers of any man who seriously gives himself to it.

But, on the other hand, it is full of its own joys and encouragements. Things look their best and hopefullest when a man has prayed over them ; the characters which are so discouraging and baffling are lit up with a new gleam of unsuspected possibilities : circumstances which seemed inextricably confused look simpler, and ways open out to view where before there seemed to be only a dead block.

Again, intercession takes the sting out of anxiety : a man's thoughts when he is anxious must continually revert to the cause of his anxiety, and rest upon it : and this is bound to be extremely wearing unless he has learnt to turn worry into intercession, and transmute every anxious troubled thought into an anxious but

confident prayer. But when he has learnt this, his anxiety is no longer wearing, but on the contrary, uplifting and inspiring: whenever it confronts him, he turns the worry into prayer, and having done so he can then afford to dismiss the thought for the time: no doubt it will revert to him again later on, but only so as once again to force him to raise up his anxious heart Godward, and find in that action the welcome lifting of his immediate load of care, as well as the ultimate solution of all his trouble.

Intercession is thus an absorbing occupation; because of its greatness and because of its minuteness it makes immense claims on all who will recognize them. But the rewards which it offers are proportionately great; for it enriches abundantly the man who prays as well as those for whom he prays, and renders a parched and gasping world more able to receive the refreshing showers of GOD'S blessing.

Side by side with Intercession there are here given some parallel schemes of Thanksgiving. These two religious exercises must always lie close together; not merely because prayer is heard and answered, and therefore in itself it entails of necessity a corresponding act of gratitude, but also because of the close kinship which exists between intercession and thanksgiving, as joint factors in the development of the life of holiness in the soul.

As Intercession is the sovereign remedy for selfishness, so thanksgiving is the sovereign remedy for despondency.

It is only through a delusion that we can ever imagine that there is more in the world to cause us depression than there is to evoke our thankfulness: it is only an attempt of the devil to magnify himself and his works above Almighty GOD and His works.

If we would avoid being victims of this delusion and be able to refuse to be bullied into depression about the world at large or the salvation of our own souls, we must learn and practise the art of thanksgiving.

Here too we must look for a growing and a widening process.

A man will often begin his conscious religious life with no clear method or system of thanksgiving : such bits of thanks and praise as he offers to GOD are merely the spontaneous outcome of a generous heart, unregulated and fitful : his thanksgiving, being thus unmethodical and emotional, is liable to fail him just in the moments when it is most needed to keep true within him the balance of his soul. The time will probably come when he finds himself inevitably confronted with the terrifying mysteries of sin and sorrow and death, and then he may realize that he has nothing to oppose to them, except, it may be, the animal buoyancy of youth, and nothing wherewith to protect himself except a thin covering of semi-christianized stoicism. These soon fail him, and then what has he left to prevent him from being the victim either of a jaundice of sour disappointment or a palsy of selfish indifference ?

Happy is he who long ere this has laid the foundation of a growing and deepening habit of detailed and systematic thanksgiving ! For thanksgiving is the true cure for depression.

In thinking of depression and its cure it is well to recognize that there are two sorts of depression, the legitimate and the illegitimate. It is legitimate that a man, as he finds himself confronted with sin for which he is not responsible, or with sorrow which he cannot alleviate, should feel a real grief weighing down his heart : indeed he can do no less, and GOD would have him sorrow over all this : but He has given him thanksgiving as a legitimate counterpoise to the sorrow, so that at one time he may turn from bewailing the blight of sin to rejoicing in the triumph of Redemption, or at another time may dispel the lowering clouds of sorrow by thankful recognition of GOD's over-ruling providence and the glory of His invincible Love.

It is legitimate too that a man should be downcast at

his own sins and his own sinfulness ; but here again thanksgiving is GOD'S counterpoise. It is correlative to penitence ; for, when the sins are forgiven, penitence has done its work and thanksgiving takes its place. Not that there is no place left for penitence after forgiveness has been assured ; for sinfulness still remains only too apparent in the present, to say nothing of the indelible memory of past guilt ; but when sin is forgiven, then penitence has a new place and work, and, instead of claiming the first place in the penitent's heart, serves rather as a foil to the thanksgiving. It comes about in this way ; the forgiven sinner thanks GOD for all His past mercies : even as he does so, there rises up in his heart a deep sense of shame at his own past wrongdoing, which forms such a hideous contrast to GOD'S mercies : for a moment the shame may threaten to overpower the thanksgiving ; but this must not be : the shame must only be permitted temporarily to colour the thanksgiving, and finally, far from overpowering, it will even intensify it. The thanksgiving must overpower the sense of shame, because GOD'S mercies are after all so much greater even than our sins : and the thanksgiving will emerge from this conflict of emotions only intensified, purified, and made more exultant by the conflict.

The triumph of GOD'S mercy is, that it outdoes man's sin : and so the triumph of thanksgiving consists in this, that it outdoes a man's feeling of penitence, and raises him out of himself to forget himself in the all-absorbing effort to render unto GOD His due return of love and praise.

But there is also the illegitimate form of depression, for which thanksgiving is the cure :—that fog of gloom which seems so unaccountable, but which nevertheless is very real and common.

There is the depression which does not come from a healthy realization of the horror of sin or the tragedy of sorrow : it is an unexplained mood, which may be

found to have many unsuspected causes, if one has the wisdom to trace them, but at bottom is nothing else but a malicious delusion of the devil, who knows how by his enchantments to bring on a thick darkness, that in it the unwary may stumble and fall.

If a man treats this state as a serious reality, and questions himself about it, and gives it credit and attention, he is likely enough only to fall into worse perplexity and depression. He must test it then to see whether it is a real thing or an unreal delusion, whether it is legitimate or illegitimate. The test will be to confront it with thanksgiving; this will not only be its touchstone to show whether it is real or unreal, lawful or unlawful, but will also be in either case its cure.

If the depression is a groundless delusion of the devil, it cannot stand before a strong sober act of divine thanksgiving; it will vanish into the nothingness out of which it came. If it is a real and legitimate depression, it has been already pointed out how thanksgiving will prove its corrective.

Much might be said of the growing need of habits of thanksgiving as a cure for depression; it is increasingly easy nowadays to be overwrought and overdone in body mind and soul, and so to put oneself at the mercy of despondency both legitimate and illegitimate. It is increasingly easy to seek for the remedy of this contagion in the wrong place, that is, to have recourse to the dangerous palliatives of pleasure and excitement, rather than to the sound specific of thanksgiving.

GOD grant that this little book may do something to point out and apply the true cure!

But it would be very derogatory to think of thanksgiving merely as a cure for depression, as a mere remedy to be stored up and held in readiness against the cloudy and dark day. Rather it must be the constant companion of every day and hour, by its continual presence brightening what is dark, and lightening up that which is already bright with an unearthly radiance.

It is strange to reflect that gratitude is such a difficult thing, and that thanksgiving needs so much cultivation. It seems almost insulting both to GOD and to man alike to have to recommend thanksgiving as desirable either for its own sake or for the joy that it brings with it: it ought to be spontaneous, inevitable, an irrepressible fountain welling up out of love and gratitude and flooding its whole surroundings. But the fact is that it is not so; the natural heart of man is hard and insensible to GOD's mercies, is cold and ungrateful even when it is conscious of them. So thanksgiving has to be recommended, has to be doggedly practised, has to be laboriously learnt.

But he knows nothing of happiness who has not at least begun to learn how he is in everything to give thanks: and he knows little of the nature and will of Almighty GOD who does not recognize that in so doing he is not merely consulting his own selfish interests but performing also one of his highest duties to GOD.

For in giving thanks the thankful heart not only comes to realise its own profound capacity for drinking in unfailing happiness, but also it begins to overpass the measure of its own feeble powers, to soar aloft above the limits of its own narrow surroundings, drawn upward by ties of duty and love to the throne of majesty and mercy.

And so the personal act of thanksgiving, arising from gratitude for particular mercies, runs up into the more impersonal act of worship, wherein, as the world recedes out of sight, and the clogging details of material life disappear, we lose ourselves in the presence of GOD in glorifying GOD for being what He is.

INTERCESSION.

That intercession is a great and necessary part of Christian devotion, is very evident from Scripture.

The first followers of CHRIST seem to support all their love, and to maintain all their intercourse and correspondence, by mutual prayers for one another.

S. Paul, whether he writes to Churches or particular persons, shows his intercession to be perpetual for them, that they are the constant subject of his prayers. . . .

Apostles and great Saints did not only thus benefit and bless particular Churches and private persons, but they themselves also received graces from GOD by the prayers of others. . . .

This was the ancient friendship of Christians, uniting and cementing their hearts, not by worldly considerations, or human passions, but by the mutual communication of spiritual blessings, by prayers and thanksgivings to GOD for one another. . . .

A frequent intercession with GOD, earnestly beseeching Him to forgive the sins of all mankind, to bless them with His providence, enlighten them with His SPIRIT, and bring them to everlasting happiness, is the divinest exercise that the heart of man can be engaged in.

Be daily, therefore, on your knees, in a solemn, deliberate performance of this devotion, praying for others in such forms, with such length, importunity, and earnestness, as you use for yourself; and you will find all little, ill-natured passions die away, your heart grow great and generous, delighting in the common happiness of others, as you used only to delight in your own. . . .

This is the natural effect of a general intercession for all mankind. But the greatest benefits of it are then received, when it descends to such particular instances as our state and condition in life more particularly require of us.

Remember, O LORD, all those who join this day in common worship before Thy throne of grace: let none be absent through coldness or carelessness: let all be enabled to do Thee hearty service: multiply our opportunities, and give us grace to use them with unflinching steadfastness and fervent devotion.

Remember, O LORD, the ministers of Thy Church for their labour in word and sacrament, and in the proclamation of Thy glorious Gospel : endow them with wisdom for their high task, with learning for the setting forth of Thy truth, with loving zeal and devotion for Thy glory, and the salvation of souls : with humble self-surrender, lest they themselves be cast away : and both by their lives and their labours do Thou vouchsafe to enrich mankind and advance Thy heavenly kingdom.

Remember, O LORD, Thy covenant of grace, whereby new souls are daily adopted as Thy children, are sealed with the unction of the SPIRIT, are restored to holiness by the power of absolution, and refreshed and strengthened by the Body and Blood of Thy dear SON ; that no human weakness may mar the operations of Thine unfailing loving-kindness.

Remember, O LORD, all those whom Thou art calling to serve Thee hereafter in Thy ministry, that none may spoil or lose his vocation, but that many may go forth as devoted labourers in Thy vineyard.

Remember, O LORD, all those who with heart and hand and voice bear their part in the services of Thy holy place, that they may have grace to serve Thee acceptably with reverence and godly fear.

Remember, O LORD, all those in Thy Church who bear good fruit and do good works, and are mindful of the poor, the widow, the orphan, the stranger, and the destitute.

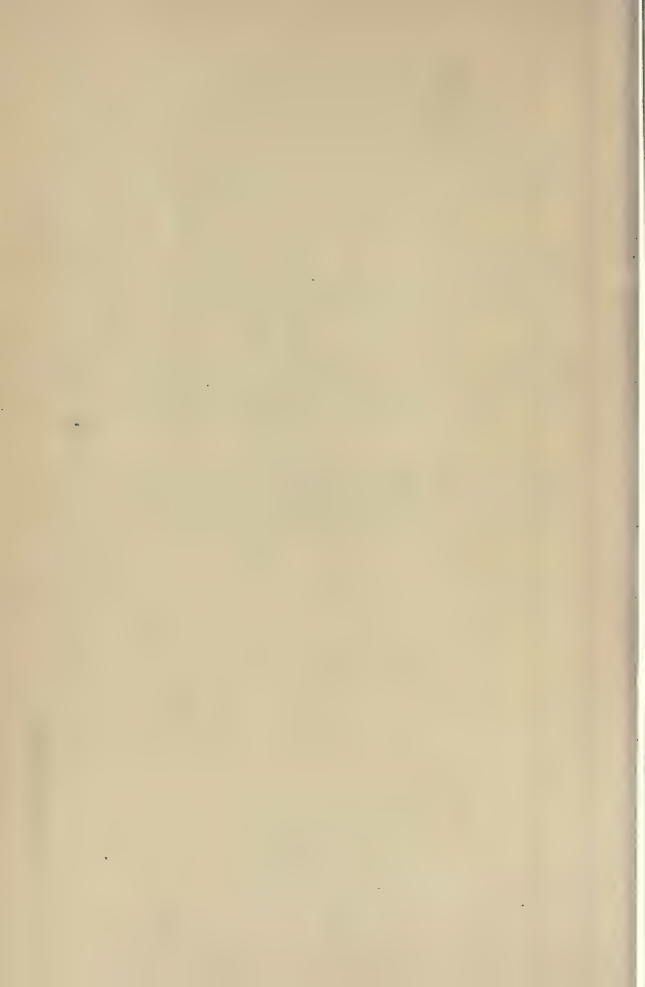

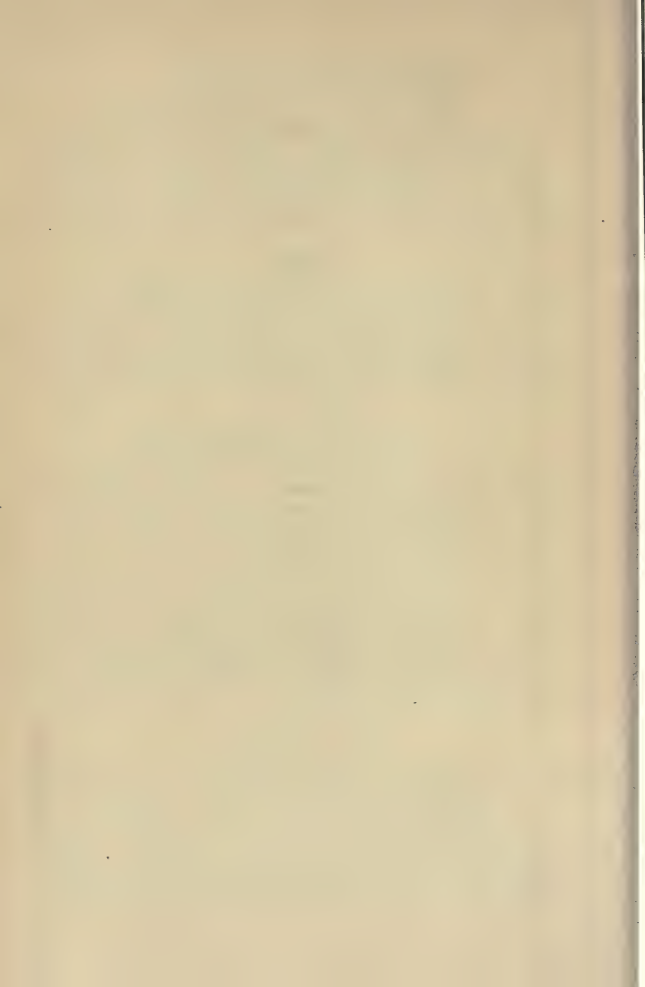
For Employers and Employed.

For our Homes.

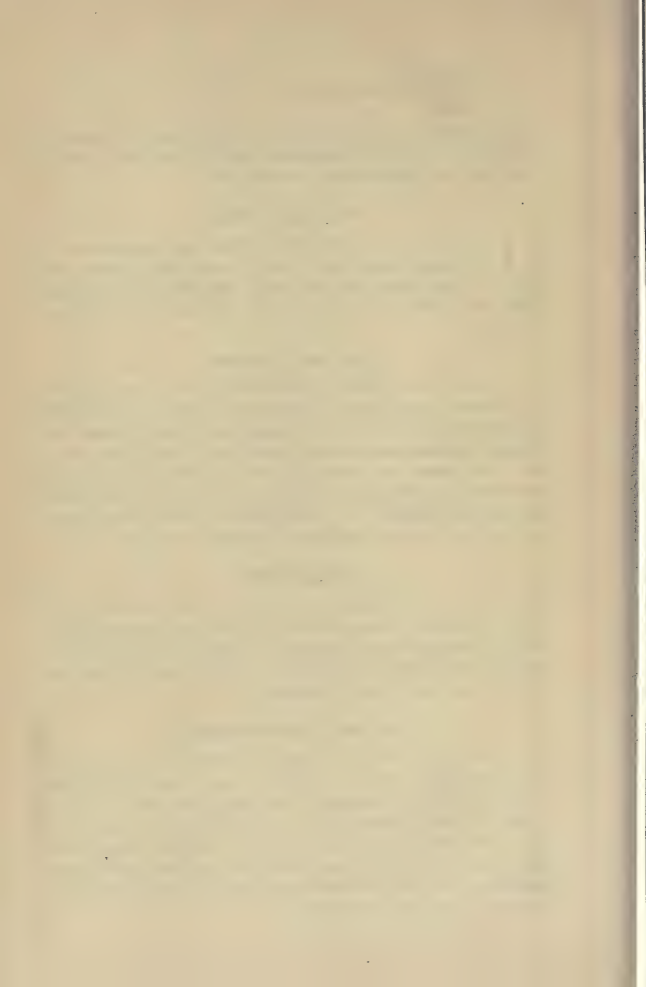

For a Special Mission.

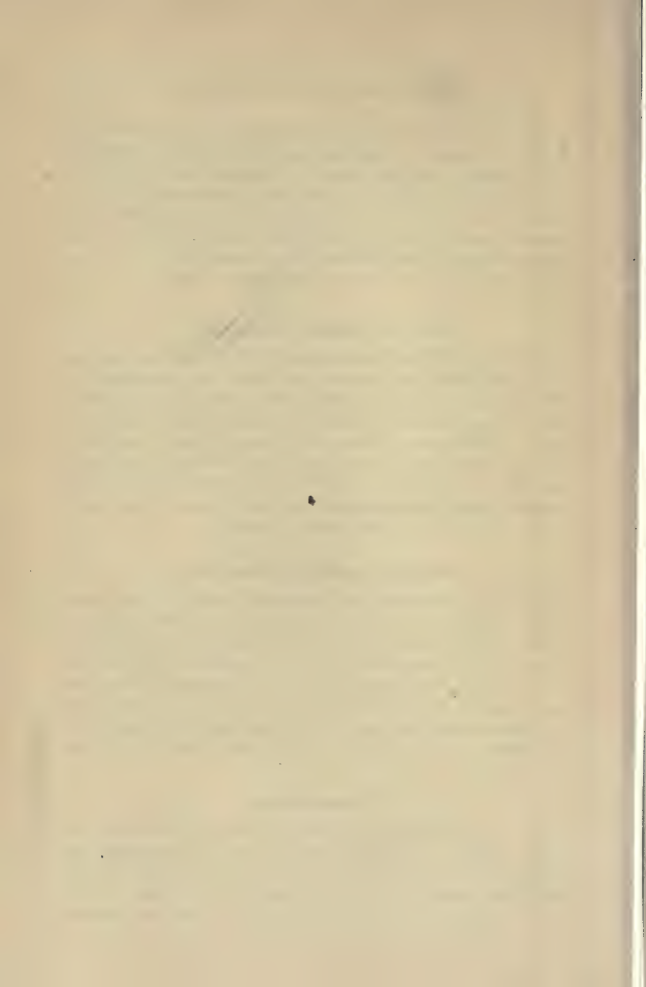

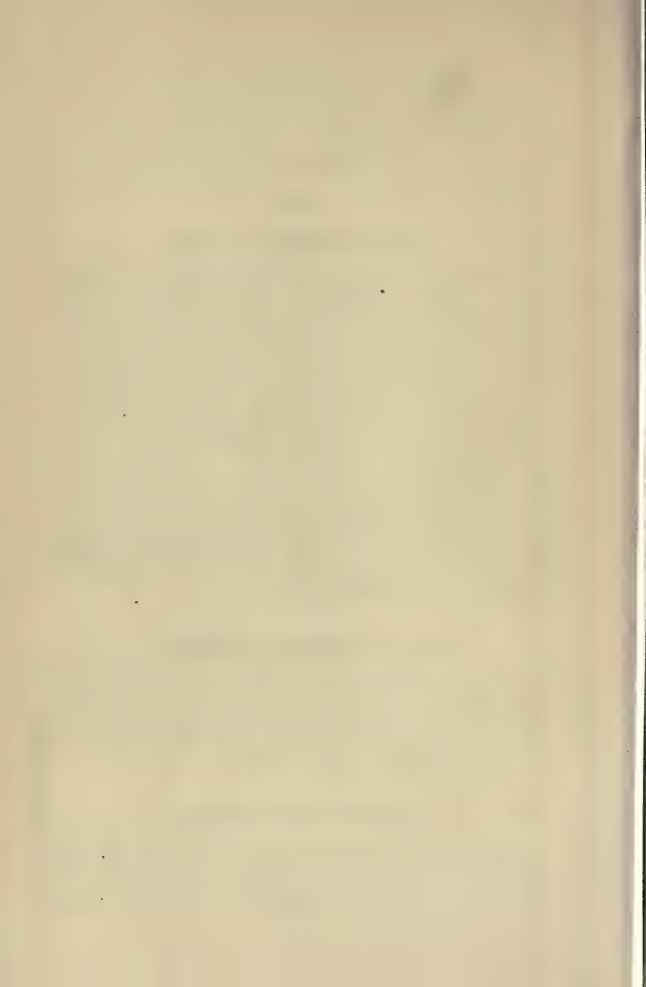

Spiritual Benefactors.

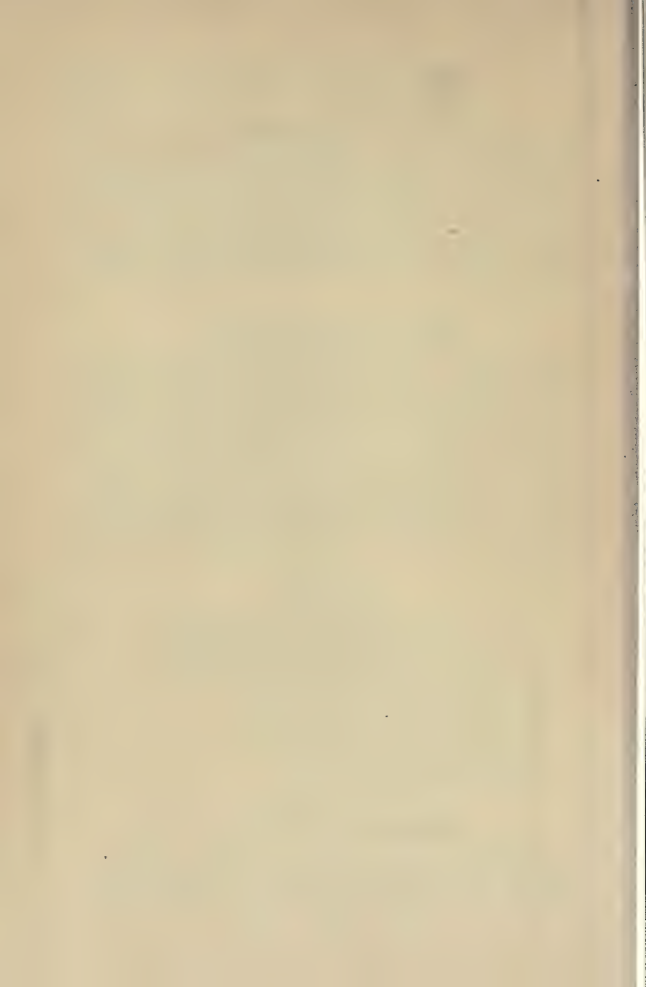

For the Lapsed.

O ALMIGHTY GOD, Who didst have mercy upon the race of man after the forfeiture of our original righteousness; have mercy, according to the fulness of Thy long-suffering, upon those who, having been once renewed by Thy compassion, are yet again fallen by their own frailty. Let Thy SPIRIT strive within them, and the remembrance of His former inspirations excite in them such hatred of their sin, and such vengeance against those earthly lusts by which they have been carried captive, that they may no longer hesitate to obey Thy divine call, but may cast themselves upon Thy mercy; and, returning again with penitence to the embrace of Thy love, may walk in the way of Thy commandments; through.



Careless.

REMEMBER, O loving LORD, all those that forget Thee: grant that they may consider their latter end and the coming of Thy fearful judgment, ere Thou pluck them away and there be none to deliver them.

Ungodly.

BREAK down, O LORD, the hostility of the ungodly and malicious, that they who make boast of their own heart's desires, and in their thoughts and their deeds deny Thee, may come in penitence to discern Thy judgments, and to acknowledge Thy wisdom, Thy power, and Thy love; through.

Ignorant.

O LORD, Thou GOD of knowledge, by Whom actions are weighed, have pity on all who know Thee not: let the arrogant talk no more so proudly, but bring Thou them low, that they may be lifted up: let the simple that stumbled be girded with strength and be made to inherit the throne of Thy glory: that all may know that there is none beside Thee, the rock of our salvation and the guardian of Thy saints, now and for evermore.

Worldly.

O LORD, Who hast promised a blessing to all who seek first Thy kingdom and the righteousness thereof; enlighten, we pray Thee, the hearts of those who are entangled among the things of this world; teach them, as men who are risen with Thee, so to set their affections on things above, that their life even now may be truly hid with Thee, O CHRIST, in GOD: with Whom in the unity of the HOLY GHOST Thou livest.

SHEW them, O LORD, the path of life, the fulness of joy in Thy holy presence, the eternal pleasures at Thy right hand; that they may set Thee always before themselves and have no good beyond Thee, the true portion of our inheritance and our GOD.



Proud.

HUMBLE, O LORD, the lofty looks of men, and bow Thou down their haughtiness ; that they may not presume upon wealth or birth, the pride of position, of intellect or of attainments, but tremble before Thee for the glory of Thy majesty, and contend only in a rivalry of lowliness in Thy sight.

Cruel and Tyrannical.

LOOK down, O LORD, upon all the earth, that is full of darkness and habitations of cruelty : break the power of the oppressor and deliver his victims ; and unite them together in a common submission to Thy most gentle and easy yoke, O LORD of tenderness and pity.

Purity.

ALMIGHTY GOD, Who by Thy divine power hast given unto us all things that pertain unto life and godliness : grant that we fail not of Thine exceeding great and precious promises : but, escaping the corruption that is in the world through lust, may be made partakers of the divine nature : through the knowledge of Him that hath called us by glory and virtue, Thy SON JESUS CHRIST our LORD.

O GOD, the glory of the saints and the rewarder of the just, Who art above all and through all and in us all, Who acceptest the sacrifice of a contrite heart and the pure incense of our prayer : grant that we (and those for whom we pray) may be hallowed in heart, fervent in spirit, and chaste in body ; that we may mortify the lusts of the world, and be enabled in purity of body and spirit to offer unto Thee an unceasing oblation of praise ; through.



Liars.

O SPIRIT of truth, reprove and recover all those who sin by deceitful lips : that putting away lying they may speak every man truth with his neighbour, and bring all their words under the control of Thy holy inspiration.

Passionate.

O RIGHTEOUS Judge, provoked every day, but strong and patient and slow to anger ; refrain the fierce wrath of passionate men, give gentleness to the irritable and meekness to the ill-tempered ; that we, who have no hope but in Thy pardon and Thy mercy, may ourselves be slow to judge, slow to speak, and slow to wrath.

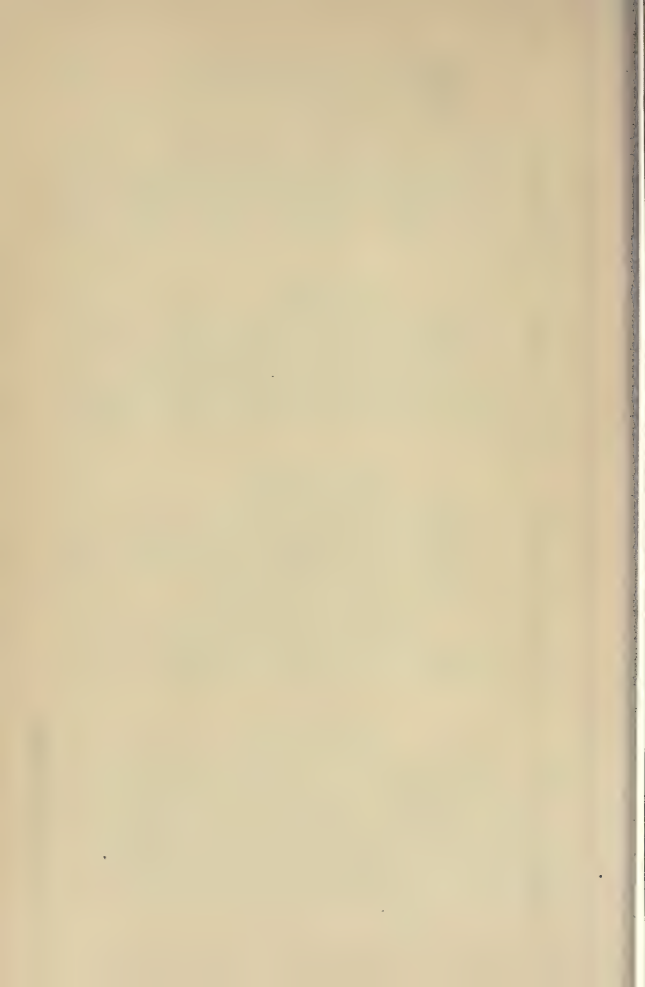
Quarrelsome.

GRANT unity, dear LORD, and a peaceful spirit to all who are tempted to be quarrelsome : that we may learn that we are members one of another, because all alike are members of Thee ; Who livest.

The GOD of patience and consolation grant you to be like-minded one toward another, according to CHRIST JESUS our LORD.

Intemperate.

DELIVER our land, we beseech Thee, O LORD, from the crying sin of drunkenness, whereby it is so grievously defiled ; and grant that they, who indulge in excess of drink, may have grace to check themselves, ere they have lost the power of self-control ; and finding the unsatisfying nature of all earthly excitement, may come to hunger and thirst after righteousness, and attain to salvation ; through.



Unbelievers.

O JESU, Word and Wisdom of the FATHER, Whom the natural heart cannot receive because it is corrupt and become abominable through wicked works, we beseech Thee for all those that are aliens to the faith, that they, by the power of Thy HOLY SPIRIT, may be made partakers of Thy heavenly knowledge, and rejoice with Thy people in the hope of Thy perfect vision in everlasting glory ; through Thy mercy, O our GOD, Who livest and governest all things, blessed for evermore.

For the Double-minded.

O EVERLASTING GOD, Whose unchanging will is the law of all creation, have mercy upon those who are drawn aside from a holy persistence in the works of their calling, whether by a restless spirit of dissatisfaction or a desire of novelty (. . .) ; and grant that they, resolving to carry out Thy will, may be indifferent to outward circumstances, and steadfast in the execution of the charge committed to them ; through.

Heresy and Schism.

O MOST blessed SAVIOUR JESUS, Who art the Way, the Truth, and the Life ; bring back to the fold of Thy Church all those who are in error ; instruct those who are in ignorance ; and subdue the pride of man to the obedience of Thy holy laws. Let not Thy mysteries be sullied by the admixture of impure and heretical doctrines, nor Thy religion destroyed by the substitution of human fancy for Thy commandments ; but grant that Thy truth may be so publicly maintained, constantly taught, humbly believed, and zealously practised by all men in their several stations, that we may dwell together in faith and charity, and glorify our FATHER which is in heaven ; to Whom.



Faction.

HAVE mercy, O LORD, upon those who would stir up strife in any portion of Thy Church, and grant that they may abandon their self-will, and may return to unity and concord in humility and contentedness, according to the law of Thy most holy faith, and the brotherhood wherein we have been gathered ; through.

Undenominationalism.

O GOD, Who hast revealed to us the whole gospel of salvation, and wouldest have all men go on unto perfection in the full knowledge of Thy revelation, have mercy on those who know only the bare elements thereof ; and grant that they, laying aside prejudice, may strive to advance in the realization of Thy truth ; and rising above human compromises may fully believe Thy divine teaching, and seek no other basis of Christian unity than the fulness of the faith once delivered to the saints.

Enemies of Religion.

O CHRIST, the SON of GOD, Who didst bear the revilings of unbelieving men when they carried Thee away to judgment ; hear our prayer, and show Thy power, we beseech Thee, towards the enemies of Thy Church ; that they who persecute Thee daily in Thy members, being converted to the mystery of the faith, may gratefully acknowledge along with us that Thou wast delivered for the ungodly, and that the ungodly attain to righteousness by the glory of Thy passion ; Who livest.

WHILE Thine enemies, O LORD, shall feel Thy hand in vengeance against those who bend not their necks to Thy cross, let the right hand of Thy mercy find out them that hate Thee, but yet have not forfeited



their claim upon Thy pity: that in time of Thy wrath and the revelation of Thy countenance they may not be made as a furnace of fire, but translated with us to receive their crown in the kingdom of life everlasting.

For Convicted Criminals.

VOUCHSAFE, we beseech Thee, O LORD, unto all such as are under sentence of punishment a true sense of their crimes, true repentance for them, and Thy gracious pardon, that their souls may be saved in the day of the LORD JESUS; for His sake, Who underwent for them the death of the cross; Who now liveth.

For Penitentiaries and Rescue Work.

MOST gracious FATHER, I beseech Thee to bless with Thy special care all penitentiaries and homes of refuge (. . .). Look down in pity on those who are sheltered in them. Guide and protect those who have again gone into the world. Give them all true contrition for their past sins. Strengthen them in their good resolutions. Lead them onward from grace to grace, that by Thy HOLY SPIRIT guiding them, they may persevere in the paths of obedience and humility and in striving against evil thoughts and desires.

And to those engaged in teaching and training them give Thy HOLY SPIRIT, that they may have a right judgment; and that in deep humility and singleness of purpose, purity of heart and life, and real zeal for Thy glory and the salvation of souls, they may labour for the love of Thee. Give them faith and hope to sustain them in disappointment, love and patience towards those under their charge; and in Thine own good time crown their labour with an eternal reward. Grant this, I beseech Thee, for our LORD JESUS CHRIST'S sake.



Reformatories and Juvenile Crime.

ROOT out, O LORD, all the seeds of evil wheresoever they have been sown in youthful hearts. Prosper all that is done to reform young offenders, that, apart from surroundings and companions of vice, they may learn to live as befits Thy children, and may be imbued and fortified with habits of obedience and piety ; through.

For the Penitent.

O GOD, Who cleansest the penitent heart, and loosest the tender conscience from the bond of iniquity ; pardon the guilty, heal the wounded, forgiving their sin by Thy sacramental grace, that they may suffer no eternal loss, but serve Thee henceforward with a true and lasting devotion.

Or,

NOW the GOD of peace, that brought again from the dead our LORD JESUS CHRIST, that great Shepherd of the sheep, through the blood of the everlasting covenant, make you perfect in every good work to do His will, working in you that which is well-pleasing in His sight ; through.

RELIEVE and comfort all the persecuted and afflicted; speak peace to troubled consciences; strengthen the weak; confirm the strong; instruct the ignorant; deliver the oppressed from him that spoileth him, and relieve the needy that hath no helper; and bring us all, by the waters of comfort, and in the ways of righteousness, to the kingdom of rest and glory; through.

The Lonely.

LORD JESUS, we beseech Thee by the loneliness of Thy suffering on the Cross, be nigh unto all them that are desolate in pain or sorrow to-day; and let the magic of Thy presence transform their loneliness into comfort, consolation, and holy fellowship with Thee, LORD JESUS, Thou pitiful SAVIOUR.

The Desperate.

OLORD, Whose sovereignty over all maketh Thee to be gracious unto all, reveal the almighty power of Thy grace to souls now sunk in the depths of despair: that they who have ceased to hope may begin to trust, and they who have lost all other confidence may be brought even by despair to confide in Thee, as Thou openest their eyes to behold Thy might, and their heart to respond to the persistence of Thy love, our gracious LORD and our GOD.

For the Poor.

Losing Faculties or Disabled.

COMFORT, O LORD, the troubled soul of Thy servant . . . and by this trial draw more closely to Thyself one who longs to be entirely Thine.

For the Suffering.

O GOD of all grace, Who hast called us into Thine eternal glory in CHRIST : look mercifully upon these Thy servants, and after that they have suffered a little while, make them perfect, stablish, strengthen, and settle them.



For the Sick.

GOOD JESU, physician of souls and bodies, make all sickness a healing medicine to the soul ; soothe by Thy presence each ache and pain ; hallow all suffering by Thine all-holy sufferings, and teach sufferers to unite their sufferings with Thine, to be hallowed by Thine.

O GOD, Who hast granted to mankind the medicine of salvation and the reward of eternal life, award unto Thy servant such a gift of healing power as may invigorate *him* both in body and soul ; through.

For the Dying.

For the Blind, Deaf, Dumb, Crippled.

WE implore Thy mercy, O LORD, the giver of all health, on behalf of our brethren who are troubled with manifold diseases by reason of the infirmity of the flesh (. . .), that Thou, Who alone canst relieve them, wilt be pleased to visit them with Thy gracious presence ; through.

Lunatics and Imbeciles.

O LORD, Whose ways are past finding out, we pray Thee to look upon Thy servants whom Thou hast afflicted with weakness of mind. Grant them to be strengthened and enlightened by Thy HOLY SPIRIT in the inner man, that they to whom Thou hast denied earthly wisdom may be filled with that knowledge of Thee which passeth all understanding.

Women in travail.

LORD JESUS, Who wast pleased to be born of a Virgin, let the grace of Thy blessed incarnation rest upon all who are in travail, that abiding in faith and holiness, they may be saved in child-bearing by Thine own most tender loving-kindness.



Workhouses, Asylums.

POUR Thy blessing, O LORD, upon all institutions designed for the care of the destitute, the lunatic, and the aged. Be Thyself the portion of those from whom Thou hast withdrawn the comforts and enjoyments of the world: reconcile them to their position, that they may be content therein to abide Thy gracious pleasure, and to learn such submission to Thy holy will as shall enable them hereafter to rejoice in Thy glory.

Infirmaries.

ALMIGHTY and everlasting GOD, Who canst banish all affliction both of soul and of body, shew forth the power of Thine aid upon those who need Thy succour, that by the help of Thy mercy they may be restored to serve Thee afresh in holiness of living; through.

Hospitals.

O LORD, let Thy perpetual providence guide and direct the conduct of hospitals: that doctors and students and nurses alike, together with the patients committed to their care, may be brought through contact with the mystery of suffering into union with Thee, where alone it is solved.

For Sick Nurses.

O GOOD JESU, Who hast said, "Inasmuch as ye do it unto one of the least of these My brethren, ye do it unto Me," look upon those of Thy servants who have been called by Thee to tend Thy sick and suffering children (*especially . . .*). Give them patience and tenderness, wisdom and truthfulness, and the special guidance of Thy HOLY SPIRIT in their work; so that they may faithfully minister to those to whom Thou shalt send them, in Thee and for Thee, and may be found worthy, at the last, to receive Thy eternal reward; for Thine own merits' sake.



Medical Men.

O LORD, the healer of all our diseases, Who knowest how the sick have need of a physician : bless all whom Thou hast called to be sharers in Thine own work of healing with health alike of body and soul : that they may learn their art in dependence upon Thee, and exercise it always under Thy sanction and to Thy glory ; Who livest.

For the Dead.

ALMIGHTY, eternal GOD, to Whom there is never any prayer made without hope of mercy, be merciful to the souls of Thy servants departed from this world in the confession of Thy name, that they may be associate to the company of Thy saints ; through.

WE commend unto Thee, O LORD, the souls of Thy servants and handmaidens (. . .), and of all the faithful departed, that being dead to this world they may live to Thee : and whatsoever sins they have contracted through the frailty of their conversation in this world do Thou through the forgiveness of Thy most merciful pity wipe away.

QUICKEN, O LORD, our departed in Thy compassion, and set them at Thy right hand. Clothe them with excellent glory in Thy kingdom, and join them to the just and righteous who fulfil Thy will in Jerusalem which is above : O LORD of our death and of our life, FATHER, SON, and HOLY GHOST for ever.

THANKSGIVING.

Would you know who is the greatest saint in the world? It is not he who prays most, or fasts most; it is not he who gives most alms, or is most eminent for temperance, chastity, and justice; but it is he who is always thankful to GOD, who wills everything that GOD willeth, who receives everything as an instance of GOD's goodness, and has a heart always ready to praise GOD for it.

All prayer and devotion, fastings and repentance, meditation and retirement, all sacraments and ordinances, are but so many means to render the soul thus divine, and conformable to the Will of GOD, and to fill it with thankfulness and praise for everything that comes from GOD.

If anyone would tell you the shortest, surest way to all happiness, and all perfection, he must tell you to make a rule to yourself to thank and praise GOD for everything that happens to you. For it is certain that whatever seeming calamity happens to you, if you thank and praise GOD for it, you turn it into a blessing.

I exhort you to this method in your devotion, that every day may be made a day of thanksgiving, and that the spirit of murmur and discontent may be unable to enter into the heart which is so often employed in singing the praises of GOD.

Let us "in everything give thanks, whether we eat or drink, or whatsoever we do." What holy whispers would pass to and fro between the FATHER and us, if,

at every heart's beat and at every pulse of breath, we could repeat our untiring hallelujah with them on high, who, again and again, at each pause, at each close of GOD'S unceasing display are ever saying, again and yet again, "Hallelujah." Here is the secret of Christian cheerfulness; and no power on earth can break it down when once we have discovered that there is absolutely nothing but sin itself which is not fitted to renew and to replenish the delight of giving thanks. Why, then, are any Christian faces clouded and thick? Why are there any Christian hearts that are sullen and tired? Call upon your spirits to give thanks unto the LORD GOD. That door of escape is ever open, that gateway into gladness can never be shut; and, day after day, you can "magnify the LORD, and worship His name, ever world without end." "Lift up your hearts unto the LORD," for, indeed, "it is meet, right, and our bounden duty, that we should at all times, and in all places, give thanks" to GOD for His great glory.

S. Paul's Christianity is a religion of thankfulness. . . . The secret of this thankfulness is that he looks straight away from himself and his surroundings up to GOD. He measures the value of human life and work, not by what immediate experience suggests, but by what he knows of the purpose of GOD. In spite of all the obstacles opposed by human wilfulness and weakness and sin, He knows that His purpose will effect itself: therefore he "rejoices in the LORD always," and no discouraging circumstances can quench the springs of his rejoicing. Our Christianity is apt to be of a very "dutiful" kind. We mean to do our duty, we attend Church and go to our Communions. But our hearts are full of the difficulties, the hardships, the obstacles which the situation presents, and we go on our way sadly, down-hearted and

despondent. We need to learn, or learn anew, from S. Paul that true Christianity is inseparable from deep joy; and the secret of that joy lies in a continual looking away from all else—away from sin and its ways, and from the manifold hindrances to the good we would do—up to GOD, His love, His purpose, His will. In proportion as we do look up to Him we shall rejoice, and in proportion as we rejoice in the LORD will our religion have tone and power and attractiveness.

MERCIFUL LORD, we beseech Thee to cast Thy bright beams of light upon Thy Church, that it being enlightened by the doctrine of Thy blessed Apostle and Evangelist Saint John, may so walk in the light of Thy truth, that it may at length attain to the light of everlasting life ; through JESUS CHRIST our LORD. Amen.

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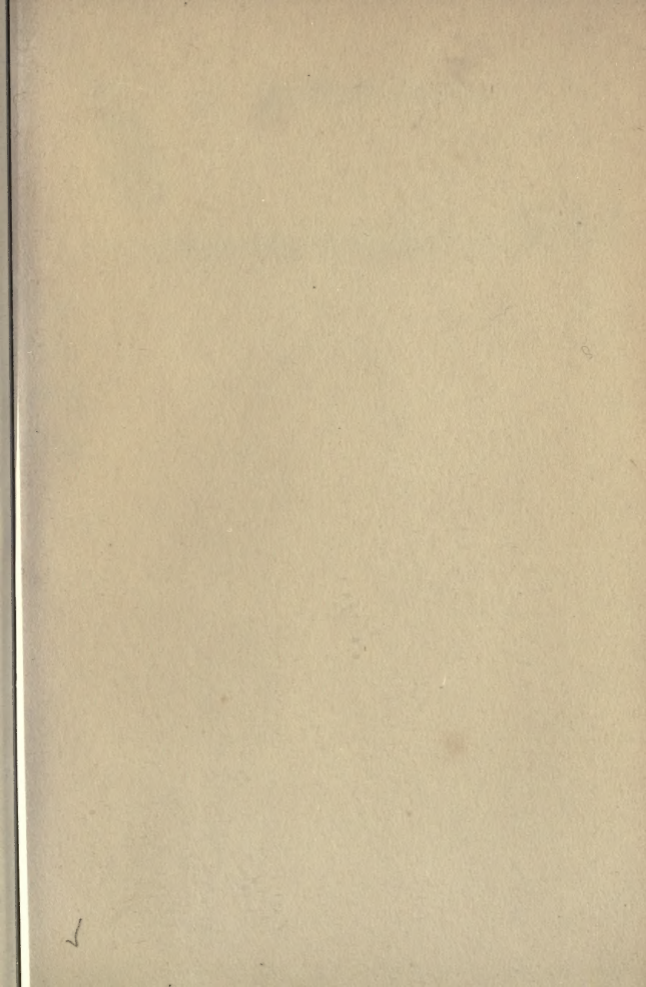
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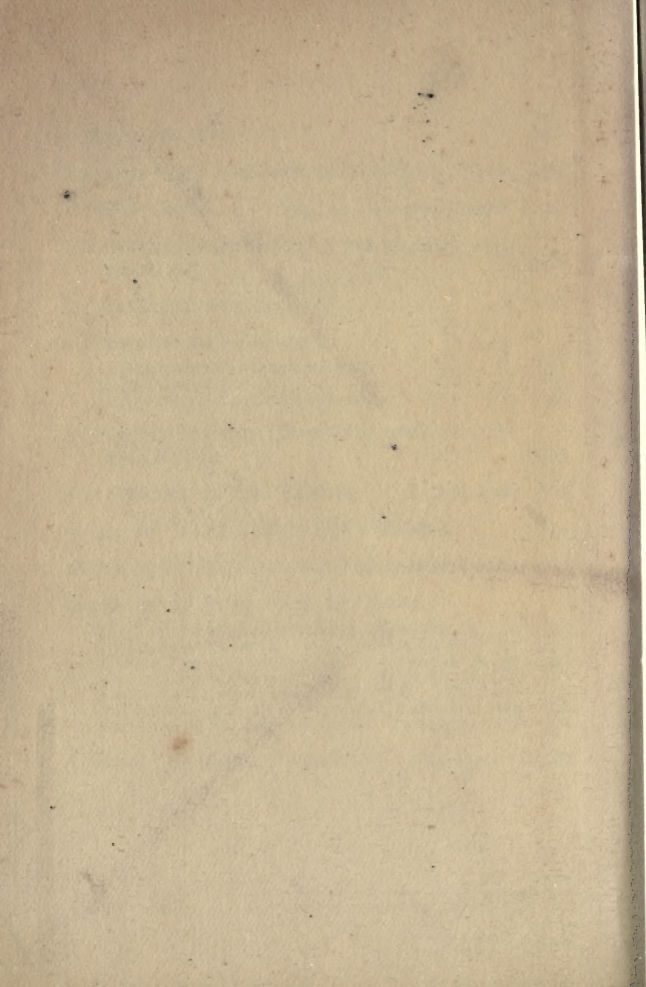
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
