The pods of a medium dark green color, are produced in great abundance, and measure from 4 1/2 to 6 in. in length; they are broad, thick, very fleshy, and entirely stringless. The pods retain their rich, tender and stringless qualities until nearly ripe, and at all stages unsurpassed for snap shorts, being peculiarly luscious. Each pod contains from six to eight round, white beans, which make excellent winter shell beans. The plants stick well to the poles, and the vines are covered all summer with clusters of handsome pods. They have also yielded well planted among corn. Most highly recommended. A distinctive feature of this squash is that the ripe squashes vary in color, some of them being pale yellow with still paler yellow stripes in the hollows, while others are green mottled, and faintly striped with lighter green. It is of superior quality without regard to size or whether it is ripe or green, and may be used either as a summer or winter squash, specimens having been kept in perfect condition until April and May.
