THESE PRICES are in effect for Fall 1938 season.

PRICES named in this Trade List apply only to orders placed by nurserymen, florists and dealers.

PACKING. All goods are packed in boxes or bales for which we charge sufficient to cover cost of material used.

CLAIMS, if any must be made immediately upon receipt of goods, and if just, made satisfactory, but in no case are we responsible for more than the purchase price of the stock in question. We will not be responsible for failure to fill orders in full or for any damage or delay to stock after delivery to the transportation company.

TERMS: We offer the usual terms; net 30 days from date of shipment to those of known responsibility but must have satisfactory business references from others or remittance must accompany order. Those desiring stock shipped by express C. O. D. will please remit ¼th the amount of their purchase when ordering. Other terms by special arrangement.

NON-WARRANTY. We give no warranty expressed or implied, the purchaser assuming all risk and responsibility of transportation, growth, planting, life of stock or any other matter on any stock we sell. We send out good stock carefully grown and packed but cannot control conditions after it leaves our care. We exercise the greatest care to keep our stock true to name and are willing to replace on proper proof any stock that may prove otherwise, or refund the amount paid us for such stock, but it is mutually agreed that we shall not at any time be liable for any greater amount.

TELL US HOW TO SHIP. Whether by freight or express and give railroad delivery if by freight. This may help in getting the stock to you with the least delay possible.

TIME OF SHIPMENT. We ship every week in the year with the possible exception of during winter when bad weather makes it impossible, although this is very seldom. Of course, there is a regular season for shipping the different plants but if you want them out of season and are willing to take the risk of good delivery we will pack with the utmost care and get them off to you at most any time you want them.

KURUME AZALEAS

The Kurume Azaleas have been known to America only about 16 years, but in that time they have made wonderful progress as hardly a garden but what has one or more varieties of this wonderful type of Azalea. They are also well adapted to forcing—thousands of them being sold for Mother's Day, Easter and Decoration Day. In England there are Yews more than a hundred years old, but unfortunately the English Yew (*Taxus Baccata*) is not reliably hardy in the north and many do not realize that the Japanese and many forms of *Media* are perfectly hardy in and around Boston, and the Japanese even in northern New England.

They are not so particular as to character of soil excepting it should not be too wet, but they do appreciate a plenty of good plant food. They are immune to many plant diseases and insects so destructive to many other evergreens.

The Yew in its many species and forms can be well used in most all places where any other evergreen will do well.

PATHFINDER. A new variety originating at the New Jersey Agricultural Station. This berry has attracted much favorable attention among growers and others who have seen it in fruit. Especially recommended where Premier does well and is a few days later in fruiting. We suggest you push it.

PREMIER. For a good many years this has been the best plant seller of them all, hence, has been a profitable one for the berry grower. Early, almost frost resistant, always producing good crops, attractive, good grower, productive, medium to large berries, and if not too wet at picking time a good shipper but if there is a lack of sunshine the berries do not keep well. In some sections they will not plant anything else for a crop of early berries.

SENATOR DUNLAP. For many years this has been very heavily planted in the middle west and continues to be in heavy demand. Early midseason. Good grower.

WM. BELT. This is one of the best flavored of the late berries. The berries are irregular in shape, fairly large, bright glossy red with a green cap. For a home garden or local market Wm. Belt is still good.

WYONA. One of the latest of the regular season varieties and especially worth while on this account. Of the Gandy type but later.

FALL BEARERS. These berries are now so generally known that it is hardly necessary to say much about them. **Mastodon** is recognized as being the best for commercial purposes. **Champion** or **Progressive** is the old standard one and probably the best flavored. **Gem** is one of the newest and very highly recommended by the introducers, and is doing well with us this season. **Lucky Strike** is the spiciest of all strawberries, and it is also fairly productive.

Native Peat or Wood's Mold

To grow Azaleas and Rhododendrons successfully you must have leaf mold, peat in some form or some similar substance. We have used Russian, German and Holland Peat, leaf mold collected from under trees in our local forests, but by far the best material we have ever used is a form of native peat, a deposit of which we have found near here. It runs from twelve to twenty four inches thick and is composed of thoroughly decayed leaves and other material from hardwood trees which has been generations in the making. We fully recommend this for use in growing stock and to use in a mixture of soil and sand in which to sow seeds but we do not recommend it for use in propagating evergreens and other soft wooded shrubs by cuttings.

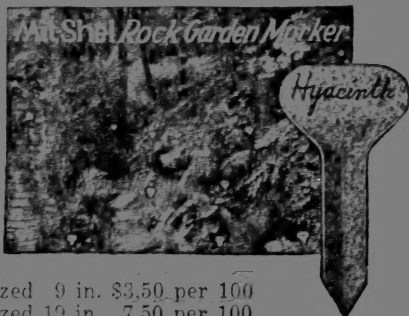

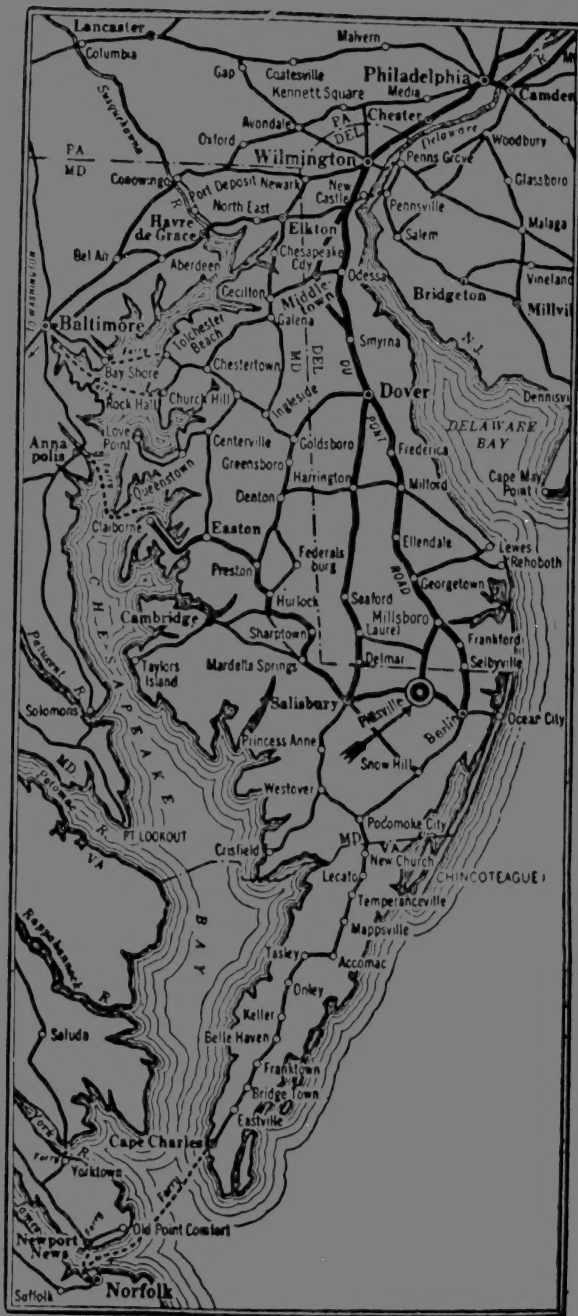
