Without the sponsors, the yearbook would not be possible. They bear the legal responsibility of the contract. The two editors also share in the matter of responsibility.





The Student Council's main project was bringing to Henderson a foreigh student, Marianne Blom. Also initiated this year was a Student-of-the-Week Program.






