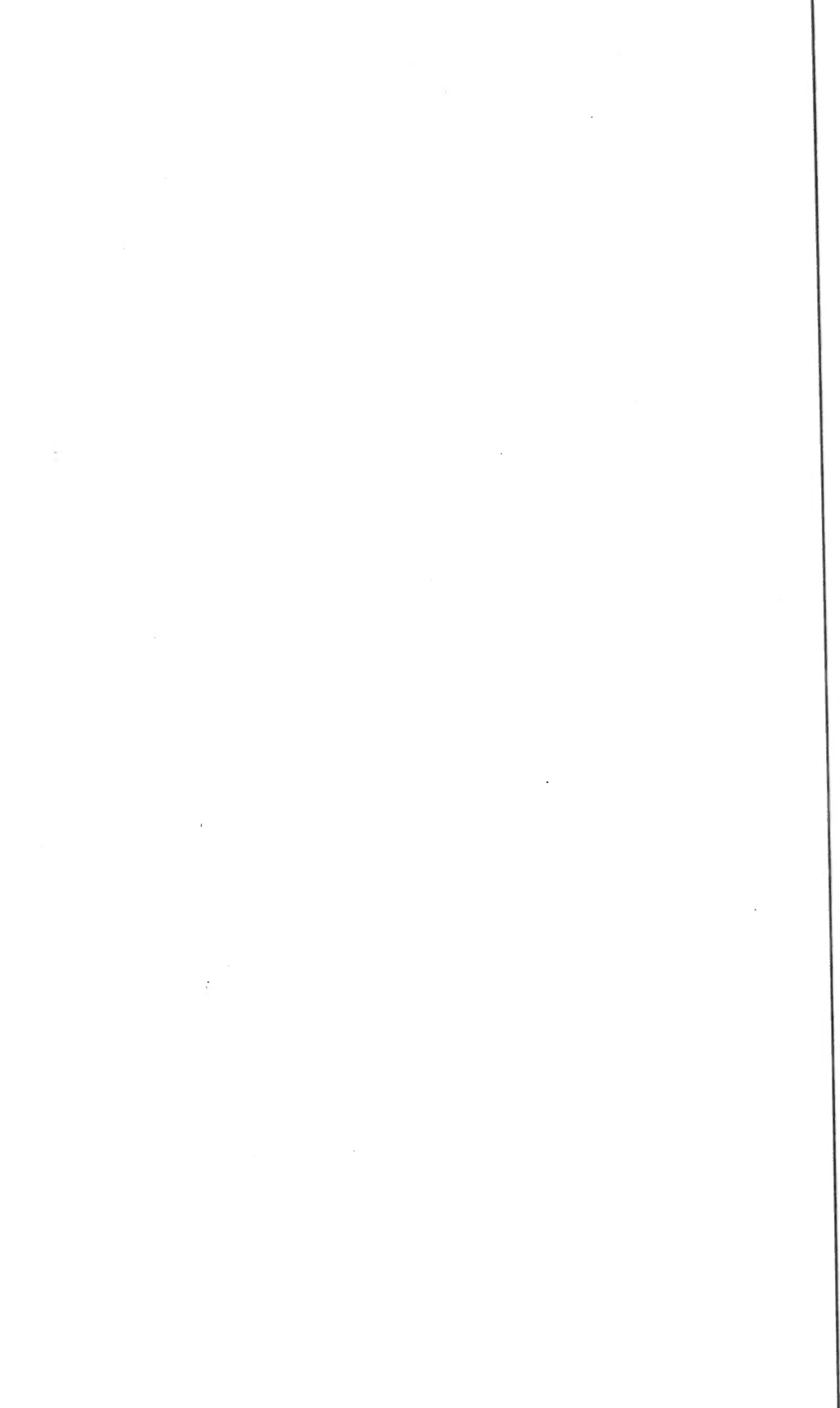


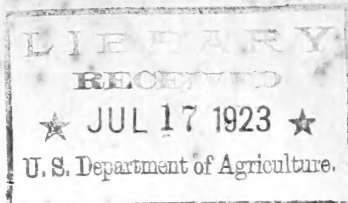

We will book orders now for June Buds for 1889 at the following prices, all grades to be taken:

Under 2 feet, \$25.00 per 1,000; 2 to 2½ feet, \$30.00 per 1,000; 2½ to 3 feet, \$35.00 per 1,000; 3 to 4 feet, \$40.00 per 1,000; 4 feet and up, \$60.00 per 1,000.

These prices are for Peach, Plum, Apricot and Nectarine on Peach, or on Plum stocks, as preferred.

We can control the grade to a great extent, as wanted. Please mention in ordering the size preferred.

Parties at a distance having new varieties which they wish June Budded next season, should, if possible, send on small trees this Fall to be planted out here, from which to cut buds, thereby insuring a stand.
