





#### History of Wilson's Mills School

There are several present day villagers who recall that the days of Wilson's Mills one-room school passed into oblivion when on May 10, 1904, a tract of land containing 1-2/3 acres more or less was sold at 2 P.M. by W. G. Wilson and Mary R. Wilson to the County Board of Education of Johnston County.

Soon thereafter on this said land located on a knoll at the upper edge of the village a wooden school building was erected. Its size in contrast to a one-room structure was the most forward educational step the community had ever undertaken. There were five classrooms and an auditorium. An outside wooden stairway at the back of the building provided the only means of entrance to the auditorium. In later years the frame structure that during a period of time had been damaged by severe wind storms was condemned. It was on June 5, 1923, bids were let for a more substantial and a larger establishment.

Mr. Walter Clark, of Wilmington, North Carolina, was the low bidder at an estimate of \$50, 124, and he became the contractor. The brick structure was ready for use September, 1924. At the present time there are 15 acres in the school property.

There were sixteen classrooms in the new building. A lunchroom was provided in 1950. An Economics Department was ready for use in 1954. A gymnasium with space added for two classrooms was constructed in 1955. An agricultural plant was first occupied in 1958. The elementary school was accredited in 1953.

These are the principals of Wilson's Mills School, supposedly in order: Mr. Frank Taylor, 1904; Mr. H. M. Lilly, 1905; Mr. Purcell, Miss Coleman, Mr. McLeod, Mr. Eason, Miss Mamie Moore, Miss Laura Jones, Mr. Gentry, Miss Celeste Penny, Mr. Veasey, Mr. Ralph Pope, Mr. Nathan Womack, Mr. Solon Cotton, and Mr. J. T. Uzzle.

Aside from these principals there have been six county superintendents; Mr. Ira T. Turlington, Mr. J. P. Cannady, Mr. Hipps, Mr. L. T. Royal, Mr. H. B. Marrow, and Mr. E. S. Simpson. As for the Board members of the school, Messrs. B. A. Turnage, L. F. Uzzle, and W. G. Wilson were the first, followed by Parker Barbour and R. W. Montague and W. T. Wilson. These men served quite a while. More recently Ray Casey, Ralph Cox, Nelson Wilson, Willis Creech, Harvey Casey, Ayden Lee, Linwood Johnson, Howard Parrish, Max Stephenson, Mrs. N. R. Wilson, Bill Wilson have served as advisors to the principal very conscientiously.

Many of these same patrons have served as P.T.A. presidents. Others that have presided over our school patrons are W. J. Woodard, Alton Wood, Dwight Youngblood, Mrs. A. A. Corbett, Mrs. Ralph Cox, Mrs. Norman Strickland, and Charlie Wood. This organization has through its barbecue supper financed many projects for the school such as gym clock, seats, and goals; library books; agriculture equipment; Home Ec. supplies; lunch room program; drapes and curtains for auditorium, twice; with the help of the class of 1965.

Wilson's Mills High School has offered throughout the years a curriculum that would prepare children for college, and it has never wavered from its high standard. As evidence, graduates of this school have produced ladies and gentlemen who have provided, and are providing, special services that are outstanding in this complex world in which we live. We are proud of them!

There are doctors, accountants, engineers, registered nurses, ministers, attorneys, principals, musicians, home economists, merchants, prominent farmers, secretaries, real estate agents, and teachers - many who came back to teach in their own school.

Extra-curricula activities have enriched the lives of our high school students. In addition to Varsity Basketball and J.V. Basketball, we have both Junior and Senior Beta Clubs, Library Club, Student Council, F.H.A., F.F.A., Monogram Club, Annual Staff, Newspaper Staff, Glee Club, and Math Club.

As for a few high lights of activities that most remember, the high scoring of Edna Cole, Billie Ann Johnson, Frank Cole, Billie Wood, Ann Weaver, Linwood Hicks, and Wilbert Weaver. County Championships were Wilson's Mills honors once for both teams. Many sportsmanship banners came to this school.

Our vocational departments have brought first and second prize money home from the fair. Our F.F.A. boys are getting recognized district and state wide for soil judging. Our Library Club has had a state vice-president, David Reeder, and a State treasurer, Mike Lee, as well as a district vice-president, Felton Stephenson. Our school had its first Teen Age Club and annual in 1949, with Rosamond Puckett as the first Treasured Memories editor. This same year, we had our last baseball and soft ball teams.

Senior classes have left much to the school, particularly the school sign, curtains, for stage, bell system, mimeograph machine, a portrait of Atwood Sloan Uzzle, Mrs. Carl K. Parrish, and J. T. Uzzle. Our oldest graduate in the original school was Rena Lee; the first two graduates in the building now standing were Imogene Murray and Lloyd Batten.

Our summer program of 1967 was a highlight in a year round program; this is when headstart came into our school. The Federal aides also were added that year, and they have been a vital part of the school since then. The reading consultant and a full time librarian complete these added staff members to our school faculty.

As the high school closes its doors, it is with pride and sadness that it is done, yet it is with great anticipation for the progressive opportunities ahead for our boys and girls. Thanks for a job well done, goes to the many who have been a part of this closely knit institution.

The greatest disappointment that I have known during these years is that we have failed to reach some of our students, and, as a result, I have often wondered what I could have done that might have reached these students to help them prepare to be better citizens in the communities in which they live.

In conclusion, I can safely say that the many pleasant experiences that I have had outnumber by far the unpleasant ones, and these pleasant experiences will be the ones that I shall always remember and cherish.


