We enjoyed many parties that year and were beginning to feel as if we were big boys and girls.

Even though we hated to leave the Grammar

Grades, we could hardly wait to enter high school in the fall of '51. With our entry into high school, with 53 students, we held the record of being the largest Freshman Class in the school's history. Mr. Richardson and Miss Tait were our sponsors, and we enjoyed hayrides and wiener roasts that year. We were teased and called "Green-Freshmen" by the upperclassmen, but we didn't mind, for we were having a wonderful time. Near the end of our freshman year, the present high school building was completed and we moved into it with pride.

The next year was just as much fun with Mrs. Finley as our sponsor. As Sophomores, we were becoming more familiar with high school, and we were having a nice time.

When we became Juniors, we really felt like upperclassmen with Mr. Russell as our sponsor. This was the year we had long awaited. On January 12, 1954, a very exciting thing happened—we received our class rings! We worked hard the latter part of the year planning the Junior-Senior Banquet, which we gave on April 30, and about which we surely kept the Seniors guessing.

By this time we had begun to think seriously about our future. When we returned to school the next year as "dignified" Seniors, almost everyone had decided what he was going to do after graduation. Now in 1954-1955, forty grown-up boys and girls are reigning as Seniors. Our dreams are coming true with Mrs. A. D. McNeill as our sponsor, whom we all love and adore sincerely.

We are looking forward to graduation with much gladness, and yet with sadness, because we will have to leave the place where we had so much fun. Looking back over these past twelve years, we see that many of our hopes and dreams have come true. We, the Seniors of '55 will always treasure those happy and wonderful days.
