September 4th, 1940! To some this was just the beginning of another year of school, but to the eighty boys and girls who wandered around in the hall looking for the eighth grade rooms of Miss Jennings and Mr. Wall, it was something new and exciting and very puzzling. We couldn't understand how the other students seemed to take for granted changing classes and all the new things that go with high school and seem so difficult to starry-eyed Freshmen.

Later, when we became more organized we elected officers. They were: President, Richard Fields; Vice President, Jack Hall; Secretary and Treasurer, Dorothy Rimmer. Spencer and Faye Steed were reelected as President, Vice President and Secretary. Dorothy Rimmer was elected treasurer. This proved to be a busy year. Marshals were selected, class rings ordered and Mrs. Ivey's room representative in the popularity contest, Lucille Everhart, was chosen "Miss Trinity". The highlight of the year was the Junior-Senior Banquet held April 28th, at the Emerywood Country Club.

The fall of '44 came like a thunder-bolt and with it the realization of our long cherished dream. Seniors at last! Thirty-three girls and twenty-three boys entered the senior room of Mrs. Gurney Peace. A careful selection of officers was made. We chose: Larson Davis as President, H. S. Spencer as Vice President, Doris Royals as Secretary and Colleen Parks as Treasurer. During the fall we enjoyed a weiner roast and hamburger fry at the Archdale Methodist Hut. A football team was organized for the first time in a few years with many members of the class playing on the team. Our representative in the popularity contest, Colleen Parks, won the title "Harvest Queen". Stationery and Christmas cards were sold by the seniors. Christmas came and Mrs. Peace gave us a party at the Home Economics building. Then came the new year and time to choose the Annual staff. Dorothy Rimmer was elected editor-in-chief and the following were chosen as members of the staff: Business manager, Larson Davis; circulation manager, Braxton Elliott; sports editors, Colleen Parks and H. S. Spencer; advertising manager, Dorothy Jean Coltrane; feature editor, Doris Royals; class editor, Jewell Pless; snapshots, Janie Tuttle; activity editor, Bessie Reddick; managing editor, LeVonne Douglas; production manager, Nancy Sheppard; typists, Mildred Davis and Maxine Hill. Pictures have been made for the Annual, invitations, calling cards, caps and gowns selected. Our class flower, white carnation and our class colors blue and white, chosen. Now with "Happiness our aim; Success our goal" we are looking forward to the time when we shall stand, with our diplomas in our hands, on the open road of life.
