### CLASS HISTORY

September 9, 1943 had a very special meaning to the seventy-two boys and girls who entered the home rooms of Mrs. Washburn, Mrs. Abernathy and Miss Nunn. This was our first year in high school and it proved to be a very exciting venture. As soon as we became accustomed to this change from elementary to high school we selected the following officers: President, Carlton Clinard; Vice-President, Irene Biggs; Secretary, Jackie Bulla, and Treasurer, James Wall.

The next year we were Sophomores and we were divided between the rooms of Mrs. Ivey and Mrs. Clodfelter. We elected as officers: President, Carlton Clinard; Vice-President, Irene Biggs; Secretary, Jackie Rush; and Treasurer, Doris Allen. The biggest event of the year was the Sophomore-Senior Banquet held March the 30th, at the Emerywood Country Club.

The fall of '45 came and found us Juniors and entering the room of Mrs. Gurney Peace. We also had a new principal, Mr. L. H. Koon, replacing Mr. Abernathy. As officers we elected President, Herman Deaton; Secretary, Jackie Bulla; and Treasurer, Betty Jo McDowell. During the fall we enjoyed a wiener roast on the school campus. Betty Jo McDowell, our class representative, won the title "Harvest Queen." Stationery, magazines and Christmas cards were sold by the class. Christmas came and Mrs. Peace gave us a party at the Home Economics Building. Perhaps the happiest day of all the year was February 6th, the day our class rings arrived. A play "The Girl From Missouri," with the cast frem our class, was presented in the spring.

August 29, 1946 found fifty-one boys and girls again entering Mrs. Peace's room but this time as Seniors. We found that we had several new members, two former students, Irene Biggs and Clementine Monroe, and five veterans of World War II. They were: Jack Hall, Jack Hayworth, Leo Hughes, David Warren, and James Peele. We re-elected Herman Deaton, Jackie Bulla, Betty Jo McDowell as President, Secretary, and Treasurer respectively. Jack Hall was elected as Vice-President. On September 28th, forty-three seniors accompanied by Mr. Koon and Mr. and Mrs. Coble enjoyed a trip to Chapel Hill as guests of the school on the annual "High School Senior Day." During the year we sold stationery and flavoring. Christmas came and the class again enjoyed a party at the Home Economics Building with Mrs. Peace as hostess. The Annual Staff was selected and pictures made for the annual. Many members of the class were active in sports, playing football, basketball, and baseball. During the year three students left leaving thirty girls and eighteen boys to finish the year. We are very proud of Mae Taylor who has a perfect attendance record for thirteen years.

Now, with our class flower, white carnation; our colors, blue and gold; and our motto "Tomorrow we launch—where shall we anchor?" We are looking forward to a happy and successful future and to a happy reunion at our annual alumni meetings.


A new venture has been started, it is a day nursery under the management of Betty Jo McDowell and Carol Mitchell. I understand it is progressing nicely.








We made a profit of \$1,650. Many thanks to all who helped to make our Harvest Festival a success.




