Class History

August, 1945. Remember? Maybe to most people that date is insignificant, but to 50 girls and boys of Trinity, it meant the beginning of new life—a wonderful, exciting life; for this was our Freshman year. We entered high school with a feeling of awe, adventure, and curiosity; but soon we knew what was expected of us and settled down at last. The girls entered Miss Crouse's home room and the boys that of Mrs. Ivey who resigned after the first semester, and Mrs. Riddenhour came to take her place. THIS had a May Day celebration, and Nancy Lambeth, Linda Cook, Kathleen Wade, and Martha Smith represented our class as attendants to the May Queen.

Our Freshman Year was very exciting, but just as exciting, if not more so, was our Sophomore year. We weren't the "babies" anymore, and we, too, were amused at the blunders of the Freshman, bringing to mind our own experiences of the past year. Our home rooms were those of Miss Freeland and Miss Laura Davis. Officers for the year were Roy Frazier, president; Jackie Shropshire, vice president; Jewel Ward, secretary; and Rueche Sexton (now Mrs. Herndon), treasurer; in Miss Freeland's room. In Miss Davis' room the officers were as follows: Bobby Lawrence, president; Bill Price, vice-president; Martha Smith, secretary; and Eva Hill, treasurer. Miss Freeland entertained her class with a Valentine Party at the Home Ec. building on Friday, February 14th. Perhaps the biggest event was the ordering of class rings, an event which thrilled each and every one of us.

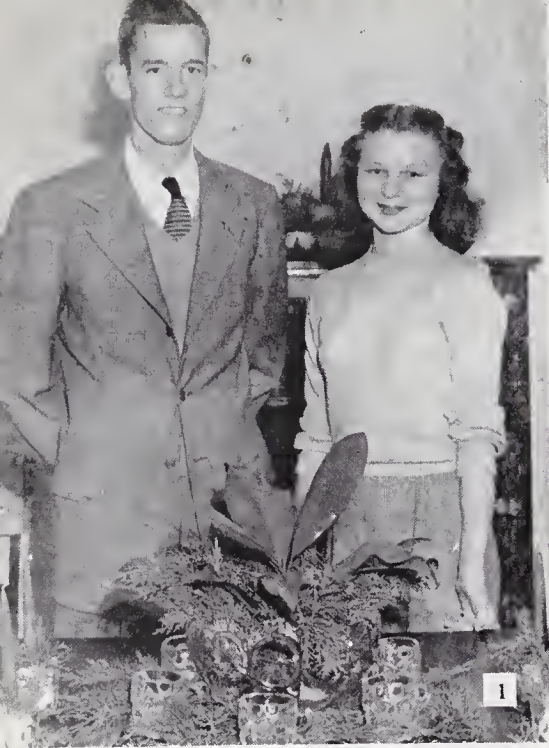
Whoopee! Juniors! A dream realized at last. Miss Cress was our home room teacher, and officers were Bobby Lawrence, R. S. Davis, Jackie Shropshire, and Eva Hill president, vice-president, secretary and treasurer, respectively. We had a year full of excitement, starting off with the arrival of our class rings in October. Everyone was thrilled to death and declared they were "the most beautiful rings ever." They are very pretty, and something to be mighty proud of. During the first of December twelve of our classmates were initiated into the Beta Club, and six of these went to the Beta Convention at Raleigh on Easter week-end. Miss Cress entertained us with a Christmas party at the Home Ec. building. Jewel Ward did a wonderful job of keeping up with all the worries when we sold magazines to help add to our treasury. Also adding to our treasury was the school store which we operated this year, and also last year; we are very grateful to Nancy Lambeth and Martha Smith for serving as clerks. That "something to talk about" came on April 9th when we entertained the Seniors and Faculty at the annual Junior-Senior Banquet at the Woman's Club in Thomasville; the theme being "Moonlight and Roses." On Friday, May 21, a few days before commencement, we presented a play, "My Heart's In High," a three-act comedy, under the direction of Miss Elsie Cress, in the school auditorium. We closed our year looking forward to becoming "Dignified" seniors.

On September 16, 1949, a delayed opening due to the Polio Epidemic, we entered the home room of Mrs. Gurney Peace. It took a while to get us settled, as we were so excited at the thought of being seniors. We got off to a busy start, however, by selling flavoring and stationery. As usual, we formed contests, and the flavoring contest was won by Jewel Ward, Bobby Comer, and Peggy Ann Hall with first, second, and third prize, respectively. Thanks go to Peggy Ann, too, in the Stationery Contest for selling sixty-six boxes to come out the winner. On December 13, '48, we had the first basketball game in the new gym, and all of us were going around swelled with pride to know that at last Trinity High had a gym, and we're so glad we get to play in one season before we join the "Alumni"! Mrs. Peace entertained us with a Christmas party at the Home Ec. building, and we are certainly grateful to her for it, for we all thoroughly enjoyed it and had a wonderful time.

Our class colors are green and white; our flower, the red rose, and our motto: "We have crossed the bay; the ocean lies before us." The mascots chosen this year were Patsy Hill and Kenneth Orr. We are looking forward to a happy, successful life as we go into the world, away from the protecting arms of our beloved Alma Mater—a place dear to all our hearts.
