## Class History

In August, 1947, a group of excited girls and boys entered school, like other girls and boys. But to them it was something different. It was an outstanding day in their lives - this was their first day of school! A day long looked forward to! This was the beginning of our high school days - the Class of ' 51.

On September 29, seventeen of the juniors were tapped and taken into the Beta Club. One October 28, everyone was excited, because our class rings had come. We operated the Book Store, to make money. Our class had a Christmas party at the Home Economics Building in December. In January, the Junior Marshals were taken in, in an impressive ceremony. The most important and unforgettable occasion of our Junior vear was the Junior-Senior Banquet, held on the Balinese Roof Garden, Hotel Robert E. Lee, in WinstonSalem. On May 20, our Junior play, "A Case of Springtime", was presented, with Mrs. Rothrock as director. On May 25, we closed our Junior Year, with it's happy memories, looking forward to becoming dignified Seniors.

Seniors at last! The time we had for so long awaited. On September 3, 1950, 48 young men and women entered the Senior Class, with Mrs. Peace as their teacher. Our officers were: President, Harold Kinney; Vice-President, Donald Hancock; Secretary, Edna Farlow; Treasurer, Margie Wall; Room Manager, Doris Hurlocker; Devotional Chairman, Louise Farlow; Bulletin Board Chairman, Phyllis Hill; and Patrol Chairman, Lewis Stroud. On September 29, four of our Seniors were taken into the Beta Club. In the King and Queen Contest at the Fall Festival, the Seniors had their King and Queen, Belva Frazier and Donald Hancock, as Winners. During the year, we sold flavoring and stationery to increase our treasury. On October 25, our class visited the Morehead Planitarium at Chapel Hill. Our Good Citizen to be represented in the Alexander Martin Chapter of the D.A.R. was Edna Farlow, who deserved the title very much. On October 30, we chose our superlatives. December the 20, Mrs. Peace gave a Christmas party in the Home Economics Building. The Senior Betas enjoyed the State Beta Convention which was held in Ashville on April 20 and 21. On May 3, bright and earlv, a group of happy Seniors left for a tour of our Nations Capitol in Washington, D.C. We had a wonderful time arriving home Sunday night May 6.

Our class colors are Maroon and White; class flower, White Rose; Motto, "Take the World as You Find it, but Leave it Better", and Mascots are: Carla Croker and Jimmy Hill. As we look forward to our commencement, we are anticipating with joy, and are full of life and vigor as we leave our footprints and go from our dear Alina Mater to our place in life.
