#### Introducing Our Principal

Our Principal, Mr. M. H. Pattillo received his early education here in Tarboro. He completed his education at Shaw University and was awarded a B.S. degree. He did his graduate work at Columbia University. In the summer of 1936, Mr. Pattillo took a course in school administration at A and T college in Greensboro. He was supervisor of the Pamlico County Schools for a period of ten years. For nineteen years, he was principal of the Pamlico County Training School, from which position he came here to Tarboro. He began his administration at Pattillo High School in 1946.

He is vitally interested in all youth movements. Since his coming, greater strides in education have been made. The lunchroom Program has been reorganized and improved. The faculty has been increased and more faculty advisors have been assigned to assist in the many students activities. Through his efforts, The Athletic Program has been expanded, a high school band has been formed, a Veterans Training Project has been inaugurated, all of which have been done since, Mr. M. H. Pattillo arrived on the scene.

From Student observation, it may readily be seen that Professor Pattillo has a keen sense of humor. Through the cooperation of teachers and students with Professor Pattillo in all phases of life, a well knitted organization has been achieved.

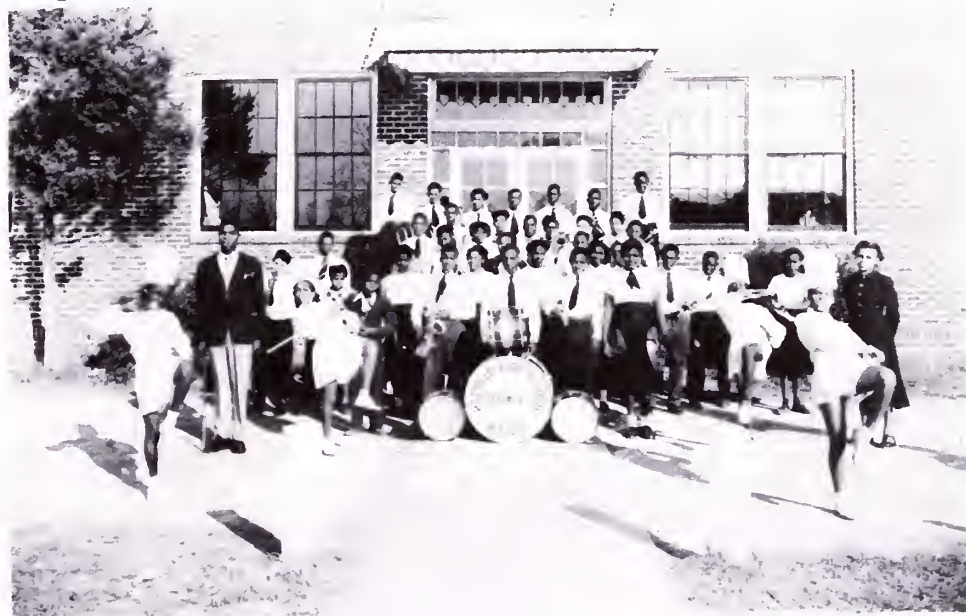
## PUBLISHES "THE PATTILLO STAR"
