We worked hard as we progressed through the year, and we participated in sports, cheerleading, band, glee club and student council. As the year came to an end, we realized that all work and no play makes Jack a dull boy, so we terminated the year with a Sophomore Ball.

We launched into our Junior year with many plans and ideas regarding the Junior-Senior Prom.

Sec. Juanita Williams; Assistant Sec. Florence Arnold; Treas. Gladys Harrell; and under the guidance of Miss L. M. Berry and Mr. D. E. Smoot we had a successful year. 




P.7.A. Evokes Parental Interest
