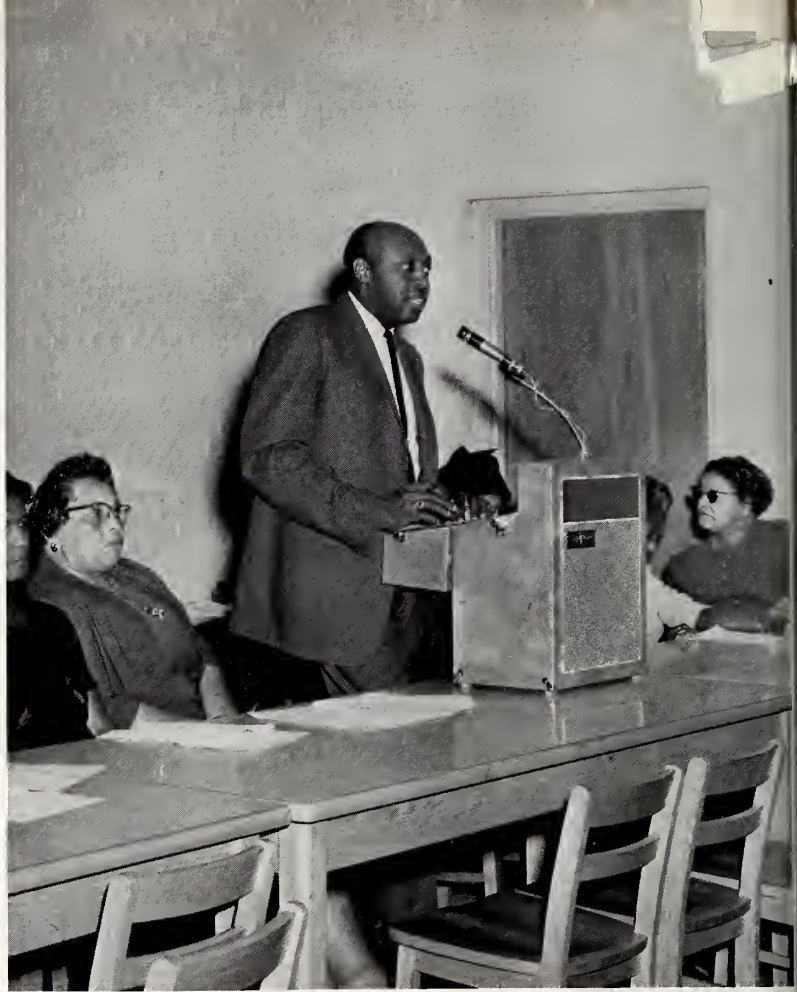


P.T.A. Evokes Parental Interest
