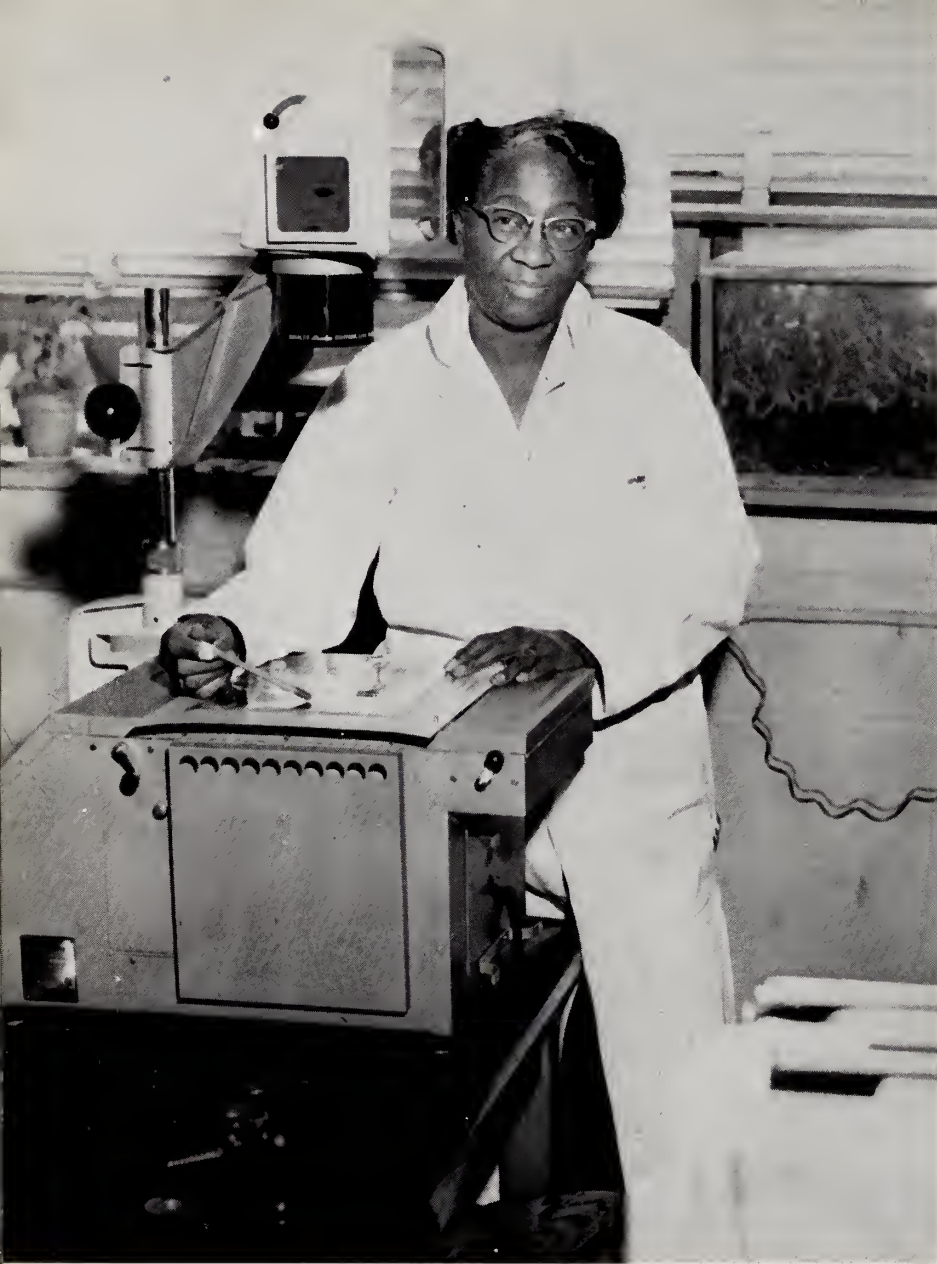

# *School History*

The school that we now know as Pattillo High began in a six room frame building in the township of Princeville in 1888. There were six teachers and six grades at Princeville Colored School. Mr. John Jones served as Principal until 1907. Tarboro Colored school was standardized under Mr. William A. Perry in 1907. In 1909 that school held its first eighth grade graduation. In the spring of 1920 Mr. W. A. Pattillo was appointed principal. 1920 brought the last eighth grade graduation and the institution of high school for Negroes in Tarboro.

After two years Tarboro Colored School was enlarged to meet the demands of a growing Negro population in East Tarboro. The W. A. Pattillo High and Elementary School was established in East Tarboro with Mr. W. A. Pattillo as Principal.

This new Colored School erected with funds allotted by the School Board had 12 teachers, 12 classrooms and a principal who shared his attention with the school in Princeville. The schools grew rapidly. In 1931 a new building with 17 rooms was added, along with more teachers, making a grand total of 700 pupils, 34 classrooms, 38 teachers, one principal, and two schools.

1933, enrollment boomed and our scanty curricula expanded enough to include athletics. We played our first football game in the fall of '33. It was much later in 1947 when we had our first basketball team, and the following year '48 we added baseball.

In 1941 the school was officially christened W. A. Pattillo High to honor our first Principal Mr. W. A. Pattillo. '46 was a big year for Pattillo. With the growing prosperity of the post-war period the school was finally consolidated. Mr. W. A. Pattillo, the founder, retired and his son Mr. W. H. Pattillo was appointed.

Enrollment continued to increase at such an astronomical rate that make-shift classrooms were erected on Pattillo's campus out of pre-war barracks. Also in '46 the W. A. Pattillo High School Marching Band was born.

The school progressed with state and government aid. In 1950 a building which is referred to as the Gymnasium, Vocational and Science Building was erected on Pattillo's campus. This meant that Physical Education Teachers would never more be dependent on "atmospheric conditions." For the first time our beloved Trojans could participate at night in the popular sport, basketball.

This stepped-up athletic program inspired the football team to win their first, and at present, only Eastern Conference Championship in 1952.

Pattillo High and Elementary School was really on the move. Mrs. Foster and the Senior Class were so inspired that they composed our Alma Mater, "Pattillo High." The student body was elevated to such a point that the first Student Government Organization was established to assist the Administration.

Enrollment in Pattillo High School was at an all time high. Pattillo acquired a new high school building in 1955. It provided nine classrooms and a library along with a full time librarian, and a commercial department with a full time teacher.

1960 brought about a change in administration, the resignation of Mr. W. H. Pattillo and the assignment of Mr. R. H. Cherry. He was full of plans for the growth and development of the school's potentials. A year later, in 1961, the Cafeteria and Music Department were added to our school.

From a six-room wooden building with four regular teachers, one of which was principal, to two modern educational centers, Tarboro Colored Schools have grown. We can all feel proud, for today Pattillo and Princeville Schools are establishments where one may send his children to obtain those skills so necessary in a changing world.
