## CLASS HISTORY

Despite all the gayety, grim preparations are going on, to the end that those who are now stars remain so and that others may continue in the cast. All hearts are weak with anxiety. The play ends in a burst of glory, with flowers, music, and congratulations in short, graduation exercises; and we have the well-known and ever popular happy ending.

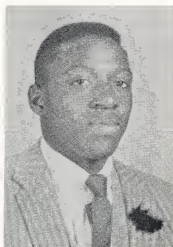

I peeked in Good Samaritan, I was stopped by Lucy Berry, head nurse of male surgery and Louise Henderson, who was in the baby ward.

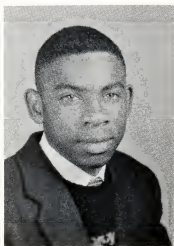
