ARTICLE III

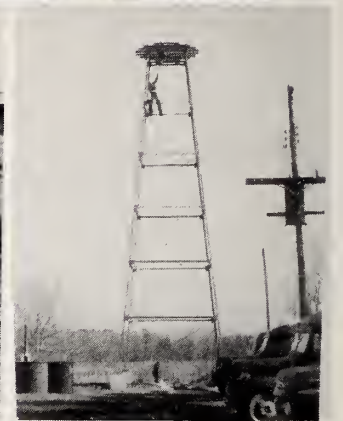
