







Twelve years ago, Mr. C.H. Aderholdt, owner of a large plantation named Meadow High School, in the southern part of Johnston County, North Carolina, took us from our parents and promised that we could have our freedom in twelve years if we had worked hard enough to earn it.

The first eight years as workers on the plantation, we had many leaders who worked patiently helping to prepare us for the last four most important years.

With the beginning of the ninth year we floated down the "Swanee River" grabbing the opportunities which came our way, and we began to realize how much fun it really was to be a slave on a southern plantation. As the freshmen of 1950, we were such a large group that we had two advisors, Mr. Thomas Garland and Mr. Worth Braswell.

During the tenth year, which was one big quilting party, we began to realize the responsibilities which go along with earning the freedom for which we were all working - graduation. Mr. Thomas Garland and Mrs. Mafalda Aman were our overseers for the year.

Mr. G. W. Harriett bought the plantation at the beginning of our eleventh year. As the Juniors of 1952 we needed only one leader since so many of our big family had been taken by other people. She was Mrs. Ruby Stewart, who led us through a busy and exciting year. Riding in beautiful carriages and wearing "Golden Slippers", we honored the seniors of 1952 at a banquet, carried out with the truest southern hospitality, at Johnson's Restaurant.

Not until we were seniors did we become hard-working slaves. It was then that we learned an "Old Man River" could never earn his freedom from Meadow without work. Mrs. Ralph Smith, a wonderful lady, taught us that.

Now that the time is up and we have almost earned our freedom, we can hardly believe that twelve years have passed. In the years to come as we dream, "In the Evening by the Moonlight", our dream will be of the days, good or bad, at Meadow High School.



Seated before a television set meditating upon the future of the class of '53, I dial station MHS - but - I cannot recognize my classmates. Why - oh -, because of a unique discovery, (could it be the results of Senior Chemistry) I have seemingly been transported ten years into the future. The program title, "The Most Outstanding Citizens of Johnston County for the year of 1963" flashes upon the screen. The scene is Mercy Hospital, Charlotte, N.C.
