The waiters and waitresses then welcomed everyone by singing "Welcome, Sweet Springtime", after which a delicious barbecued-chicken dinner was served.

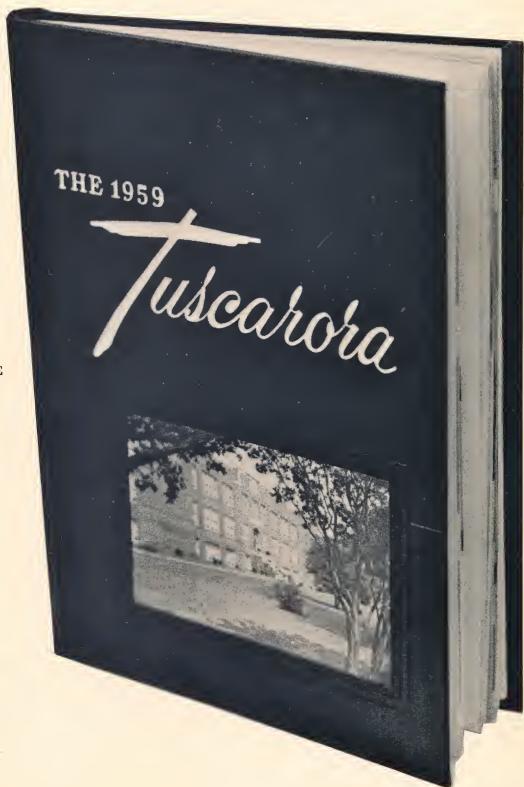
