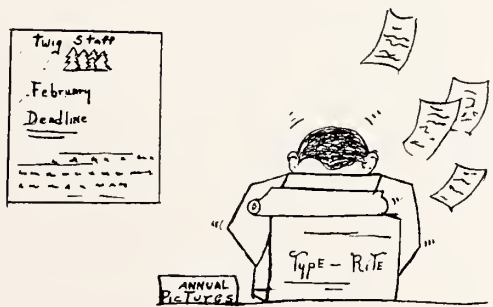
The executive staff along with the rest of the staff has worked very hard this year trying to bring to you an annual that you will treasure the rest of your life.

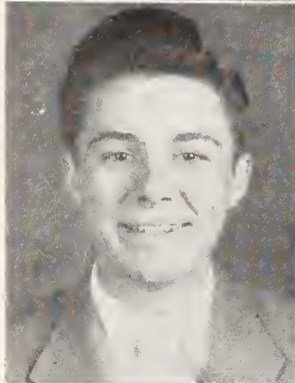

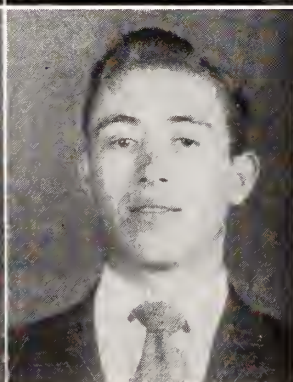

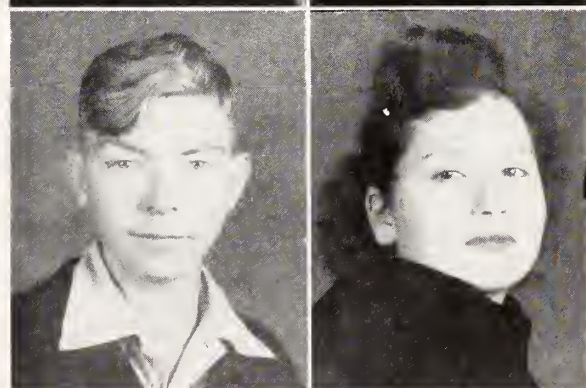

For instance, there was that day in 1936 that we all saw our fellow classmates for the first time. We were only tiny tots then.

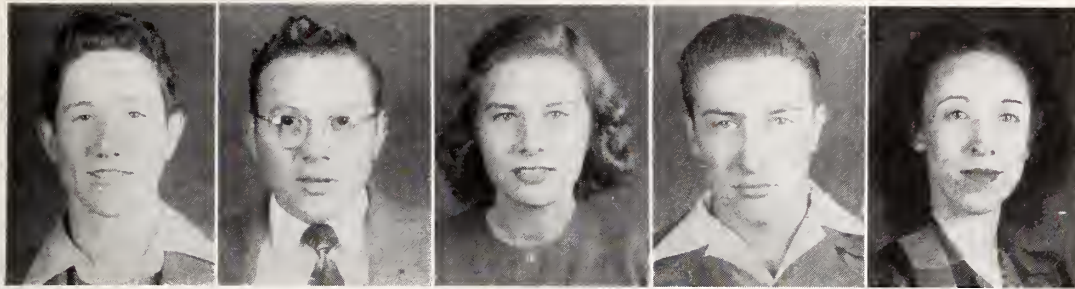
